Touchdown Club Officer Charged with Embezzlement

The Tishomingo County School Touchdown Club dealt a serious blow this week when one of its officers was arrested for allegedly embezzling funds from the booster club that supports the Braves football team.
Last week, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department arrested and served an arrest warrant for Heather Nicole Potts, of Burnsville, for felony embezzlement. The sheriff's department received a report from the Touchdown Club requesting investigation to be conducted on some funds that seemed to be misappropriated or missing. The ongoing investigation indicates that at least \$40,000 is missing from the club's accounts, which Potts was the treasurer for the past few years. Investigation is still looking into the case for more information may be forthcoming, said Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Investigator Greg Mitchell.
The Touchdown Club, like other athletic booster clubs that support TCHS sports, is com-

pletely separate from the school, and operates as an independent club to buy things for the athletes in addition to the basics the school provides. They also do several promotional activities for the team. The Touchdown Club is well-known for their annual \$10,000 giveaway drawing for which they sell \$100 tickets each season. Through hard work last year, reports are they may have raised as much as \$75,000 last year alone.

According to Mitchell, during the investigation it was revealed that Potts was indicted for embezzlement in 2003 in connection with her position at Southern Apprenticeship and Training under the name Heather Flack. According to court records, she paid back restitution in the full amount of \$23,774.87 as directed in the January 29th, 2004 Tishomingo County Circuit Court order, but has not yet come back to court to get it expunged from the record. She pled under the Mississippi statute known as 99-15-26, which allows (usually) first-time offenders to fulfill the requirements of the order and then have it expunged from the record.

Mitchell said they hope to present the entire case to the May Grand Jury.

Braves Getting New Head Football Coach

Tishomingo County High School has hired Ray Weeks as its new head football coach, according to a release from Athletic Director Jeremy Reece today.
Ray Weeks, who last coached at Hamilton High School, is replacing Preston Pritchard who recently accepted a position at Northwest Rankin High School in Jackson, Mississippi. Weeks has been principal at Nettleton Junior High since 2011, but before that spent 11 years as head football coach at

Hamilton High School. He also spent two seasons as the defensive coordinator at Aberdeen.

Weeks will begin his coaching duties with the Braves during spring practice.

"My family and I are very excited and blessed to have the opportunity to join the TCHS family. We look forward to getting to know the people of the community and school and making an impact on the students at TCHS," said Weeks.

Weeks was approved in a 7 a.m. Tuesday "special meeting" at the District Office.

They have feelings and they do get hungry and scared.

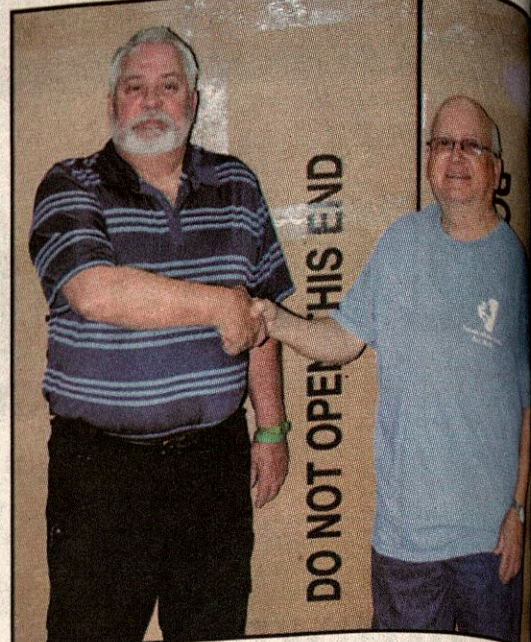

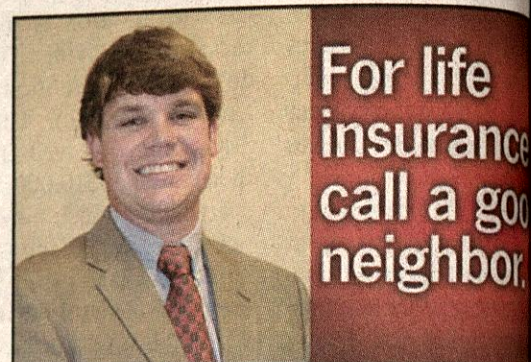

Did You Know?

January 26th, 1892 – April 30th, 1926

Bessie Coleman, "Queen Bessie", "Brave Bessie" was the first African American Women to earn a pilot's license in 1922. Bessie, a world-renowned aerobatic pilot, skydiver, and air show performer, opened the frontier of aviation for African-American and continued the quest to remove gender barriers in aviation. In 1921, she became the first African-American individual to receive an international pilot's license from the Federation Aeronautique Internationale in France. In 1923, Coleman purchased a small but crashed on the way to her first scheduled West Coast Air Show. The plane was destroyed and Coleman suffered injuries and was hospitalized for three months. Returning to Chicago to recover, it took her another eighteen months to find financial backers for a series of shows in Texas. "Brave Bessie" flights and theater appearances in the summer of 1925 were highly successful, earning her enough to make a down payment on another plane. Ms. Coleman had been scheduled by the Negro Welfare League in Jacksonville, Florida to perform. Coleman left Orlando, Florida, by train to give a benefit exhibition for the Jacksonville, Negro Welfare League, scheduled for May 1st, 1926.

Ms. Bessie ignored family and friends concerns for the upcoming

performances. This plane "Jenny" Curtiss J N A

wasn't safe. She, her mechanic and publicity agent, piloting the plane for her stunts, within minutes the plane would not pull out or dive, went into a spit. Bessie was not wearing a seat belt and was thrown from the plane at a height of 2,000 feet, the plane burst into flames. The pilot and mechanic died on impact from the burning plane to ground. Bessie was 34 years old, the aviator was dead.

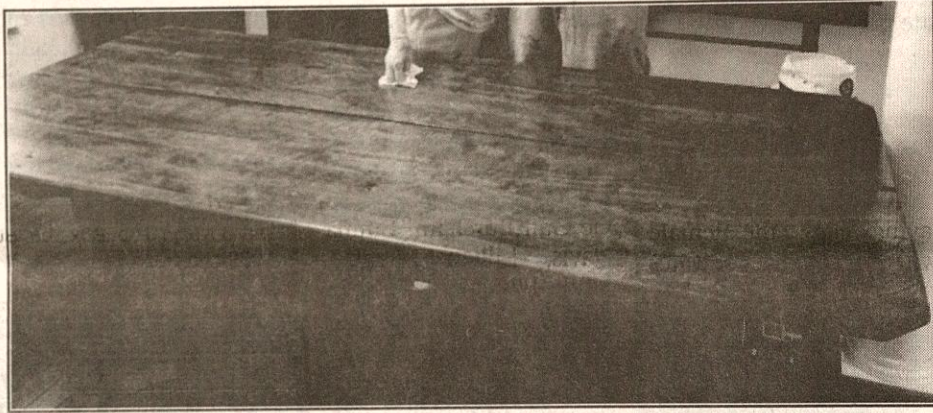
I want to thank Louise Biggs and Ann Wiley for helping identify the ladies in the photo. Ann reported that she went to work at the Shirt Factory after grad-

A Dining Table Made Out of Two Planks

Jerrell McNutt of Grovetown, Georgia (a native of Dennis) is sharing a collection of some of his stories about growing up in Tishomingo County with our readers.

Our farm home near Dennis, Mississippi needed a larger dining room table. So my father, Tom McNutt, took a large pine log to the sawmill. He hauled it on his log wagon which was pulled by four mules. The planks were one inch thick and 19 inches wide.



This table was built in 1912. Only two ten foot planks were needed for the top. The four legs were made out of popular wood. A bench that five people could

sit on was used on one side of the table. Ten of us children and a few friends could enjoy a good meal together. In some families the adults eat first and children

had to wait. In our family we all ate at the same time and never had to, TAKE A COLD TATTLER AND WAIT. At a very early age I enjoyed eating "Cut

Up." This was a corn meal flap jack browned on both sides. Add butter and molasses before cutting it into bite sized pieces. If I was hungry and raising a ruckus my older brothers would say, "give that boy some CUT UP."

In the family that I grew up in there is truth to the saying, "EVERY TIME A BOY LEAVES HOME A FOOT IS CUT OFF THE TABLE!" I AM DELIGHTED TO SAY THAT THIS TWO PLANK TABLE

IS IN OUR DINING ROOM. It is now 100 feet long. Our daughter who lives near us in Augusta, Georgia, lightly sanded the table and then added a coat of polyurethane. While sanding it was the circular marks made by the sawmill. Now in this year 2017 I am 90 years old. It is indeed wonderful to sit at this two plank table and enjoy the fellowship with my children, grandchildren and great grand-

The Two Beasts Of Revelation Chapter Thirteen (part XI)

I was looking at Daniel chapter 12 in the last article, but I will not go back to it, except to say that it sheds much light on Revelation 13:16-18 concerning the mark of the beast. I think that Daniel chapter 12 shows us that those who will really, and more fully, understand the mark of the beast will be those who are in the tribulation, especially the saved Jews of that time, as well as the saved Gentiles. What great need do we have to fully understand the mark of the beast, if we who are saved of the church age will not be on earth when that mark is given? I do want to give some other things about Revelation 13:16-18, which says, "And he causeth all, both small and great, rich

and poor, free and bond, to receive a mark in their right hand, or in their foreheads: And that no man might buy or sell, save he that had the mark, or the name of the beast, or the number of his name. Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number is Six hundred three score and six."

I have heard some people speculate that the social security number

will be the mark of the beast, so some people do not want a social security number; others have said in more modern days that the computer will be involved in the mark of the beast, with a small computer chip being implanted under the skin of every person, either in the forehead or in the hand. Still others have said Sunday worship is the mark of the beast (these were Saturday worshippers). Have you noticed that human beings are usually good at

speculating, but many of them fail to say that they are speculating. When we get into what could be possible, all kinds of things may be involved, but when we speak what we really know, our list of information becomes quite a bit shorter! We do know some things about the mark of the beast from Revelation 13:16-18. We know that everybody in the tribulation will have to receive this mark to buy or sell, however, there will evidently be many who will get food and supplies other ways, for many will be saved during the tribulation, and no saved person will take the mark. We know that there will be some kind of mark "in the right hand or forehead", but whether or not a literal

mark is made, or a mental number is memorized, or a card is offered by the hand, we do not know. We know that there can be either a mark; the name of the beast or the number of his name used to buy or sell. So, there may not be a number "under the skin", as some suppose. Those who have understanding, as Revelation 13:18 mentions, may be those of the tribulation who have more understanding than we have. We do know that the number 666 is said to be the number of the beast, and also the number of a man. This could mean that his number is a number familiar to men. Some people are afraid to write the number 666, because of these words, but that is not to be feared, for we are

not in the tribulation mark of the beast here yet and all of the church age raptured before it comes. You and I do not know any more we did when I stand on this subject, but we will be embarrased by wild speculations that prove untrue! The of 666 being the of a man may mean that the whole system of the beast (the antichrist) is a manmade scheme is not from God or good angels; the antichrist will be a man, even if empowered by Satan. he is no match for God's Son, Who will come to render him powerless.
