Iuka Storm Warning System to be Upgraded in May

Iuka will soon have a new storm/emergency warning system installed, announced authorities this week.

In late May, Iuka will have a new \$27,000 operating system to activate the storm sirens they already have. The replacement works, and the installation of the new system will be in time for storm season, Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom said.

They worked last time they tested them, but Saturday, when bad weather was moving through the area, they were not able, and we are not sure they said Grissom.

Until the new system is operational, Grissom urges everyone to get a way to be more weather-aware on their own. Get a weather radio, an app on your phone that issues alerts, or pay attention to the weather and tune into television broadcasts.

The updated new system will serve approximately 1,250 households plus the commercial and industrial district of Iuka, using the same infrastructure, new controls that will allow the system to be activated from different places: Tishomingo County 911 office, the IFD Chief's vehicle or Iuka Fire Department.

On a clear day, the warning sirens reach as far as New Pros-

pect Church to the south, and the First District Shop on Harmony Road, said Grissom.

The new equipment is scheduled to ship from Federal Signal to Integrated Communications in Tupelo May 15th. In-

tegrated Communications won the bid to provide the equipment for the City of Iuka. The city approved Grissom to seek bids in March, and allotted the funding in April, he said.

Dennis Woman Survives Five Copperhead Bites!

A Dennis woman who recently survived five snake bites is thankful to be alive!

Nina Thorn, 43, lives near McDougal Branch and Highway 4, and on April 11th she survived everyone's worst nightmare — multiple snake bites — and amazingly saved herself.

Nina said she went toward the edge of her yard, where her yard joins the woods, to get a ball left there by her grandchildren the day before. On the way, she bent to pick up a piece of glass, and a copperhead snake hiding in some leaves struck out at her, biting her hand twice and her arm three times before she even had time to react.

She immediately started yelling, "Snake!" bringing her brother and a friend running to her. Thinking amazingly quickly, she headed to the shower to get the bitten area under hot water while her brother dispatched the snake with a shotgun.

Nina was not only quick thinking enough to tourniquet off her arm, first with her headband and then with a blood

pressure cuff, but she also managed to effectively suck out the venom from her own arm — she said she recalls spitting out three mouthfuls! She said she could tell numbness was setting in and knew she had to do something.

Then her family members carried her (and the snake!) via the Natchez Trace to North Mississippi Medical Center emergency room, where she was treated and observed overnight. Medical professionals were suitably impressed with Nina's quick thinking and did not even have to administer anti-venom, she said.

Thorn has some medical background, she nearly finished a radiological degree, which explains her ability to assess the situation quickly. She says she is just so glad it was her instead of her three grandchildren, because they would have never made it.

Thorn has recovered from the bites, but Tuesday doctors treated her for a marble-sized cyst in her mouth that probably was caused by contact with the snake venom.

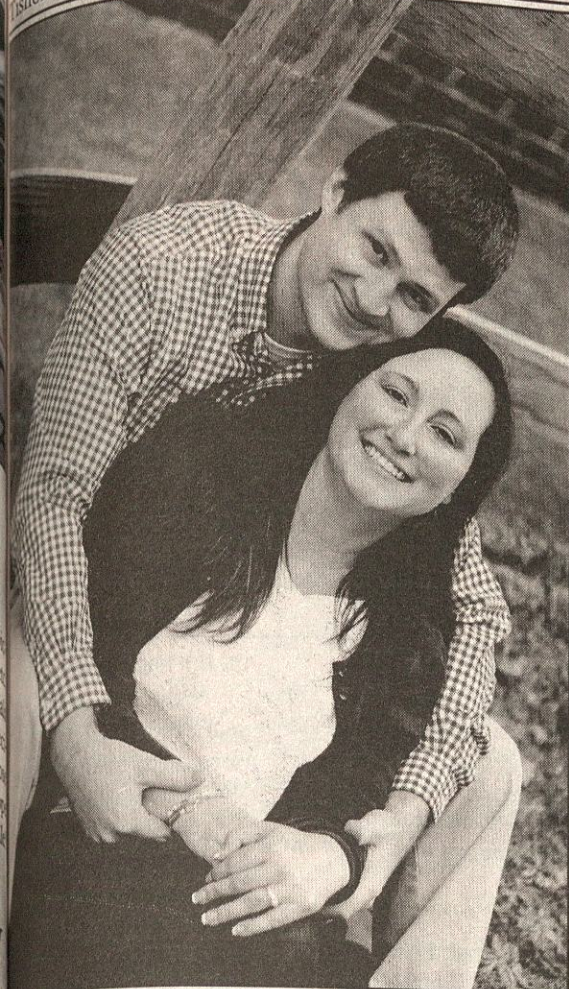

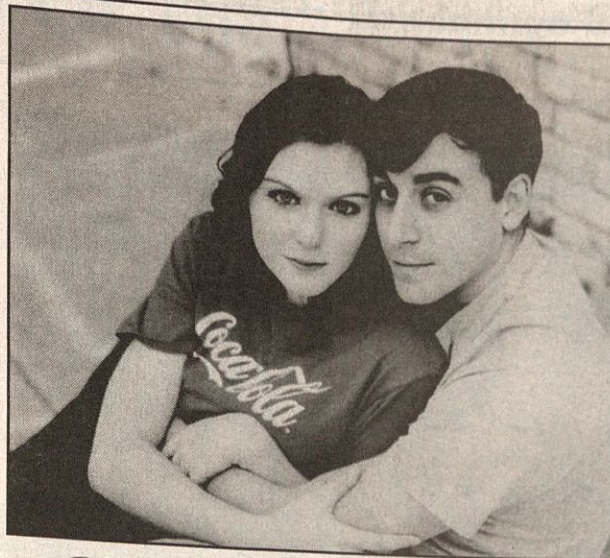

Cooking with a Dutch Oven

Jerrell McNutt of Grovetown, Georgia (a native of Dennis) is sharing a collection of some of his stories about growing up in Tishomingo County with our readers.

My Grandmother Willie Rose Flynt Skinner gave this Dutch oven to my mother, Lula McNutt. Some people call it a "fireplace skillet." Regardless of what it is called the food cooked in it is always delicious.

This oven was made out of cast iron. The short legs on the bottom make room for the live coals that cook the food. Also the lid has a rim around the edges that keep the coals from falling off the top. Food in the oven is heated from both the bottom and top.

Every time I look at this oven I think about Hot Biscuits, Cornbread and baked Sweet Potatoes. Besides thinking it makes my mouth water. In fact as soon as I finish this story I will fire up some charcoal and cook a "Pone of Cornbread." My fireplace has a gas log and this requires me to use charcoal

on the back porch.

When I was years old we moved our farm near Burnsville. We rented a farm that belonged to Dr. Joe White. One room in the house lived in was built of logs. It was a big house with a large rock fireplace. The opening inside the house was five feet and six feet wide. The rock hearth extended three feet which made it very easy to use the oven.

This big log was large enough for our kitchen and table and two beds. My brother Orville and a bed in a side room was attached to the room. One morning I woke up and found a snow on the floor of my bed. It fell through a large hole in the roof. We were pleased and just said "OH goodie we have to go outside for snow for snow cream."

If you have never eaten food cooked in a Dutch oven try it one time. You will be hooked on bread and sweet milk. I call it "SOUL FOOD."

A Preview Of The End-Time Events (part III)

Babylon is a name that occurs many times in the Bible, sometimes indicating the physical kingdom of Babylon, and sometimes perhaps being a "generic name" for the wicked system of Satan and his helpers. It seems that Revelation 14:8 has the latter usage in mind: "And there followed another angel, saying, Babylon is fallen, is fallen, that great city, because she made all nations drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication."

The actual story, with details, of the fall of Babylon is in Revelation chapter 18, but we have a preview of that fall in this verse. Although there is evidently a physical city that is called Babylon that is in view here and in Revelation chapter 18, this may not be at all the same city that was in power and

then was destroyed during the times before Christ. The word "Babylon" and "Babel" are actually the same word in the Hebrew language; the meaning is: "confusion". At the tower of Babel, in Genesis chapter 11, God confused the language of the people trying to build the tower, so that they could not understand one another. In the name of the city "Babylon" we have perhaps a different kind of confusion, but it is confusion, none the less. The city called Babylon actually has two parts, a religious

part (Revelation chapter 17) and a political-commercial part (Revelation chapter 18). In Revelation 17:5 we have what is called "mystery Babylon" Here is that verse: "And upon her forehead was a name written, MYSTERY BABYLON THE GREAT, THE MOTHER OF HARLOTS AND ABOMINATIONS OF THE EARTH."

Perhaps Revelation 14:8 has the destruction of the great city, with its two parts, in view. So, this verse is saying by preview that the religious system

of men and the commercial system of men are both going to fall by the hand of God, for an angel announces that fall. It will be a great day for all who really know God when He has toppled all of the kingdoms of men, both religious and commercial. Revelation 11:15B gives more light on this matter: "... The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christ; and He shall reign for ever and ever." This will be a great day when it comes, for even the announcement of the fall of the world's kingdoms in Revelation 14:8 is good news for the believer. Yes, God has ordained human government, as well as organized religious activity, but not the kind that we are seeing in many cases in our day! We are obligated to obey the laws

of our land, as long as they do not clearly conflict with the things taught in the Word of God! Revelation 14:8 says that Babylon made all nations drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication. The word "fornication" is most often used of wrong physical, sexual activity, but here it is used of illicit activity of various kinds, evidently even including the physical side of fornication, but not limited to it. Notice that all nations are involved in the wrong actions of Babylon, so this will be a "city" that will have control during the tribulation period (after the rapture of the church) and which will seek to force its way into the lives of all people on earth at that time. Even with this being true, there will be a

remnant of people who receive the Lord and do not follow the illicit of Babylon. Notice "wine of the wrath" used in our verse, showing that this city, with its activities of various kinds will move in wrath against all who do not follow lead! Do you see any in the world, and even our country, that seem to be headed in the direction of a one-world government? It is interesting that the "play for power" in the world has been throughout the ages, it is escalating in our time. Could we be getting to the end of this system? I hope so!

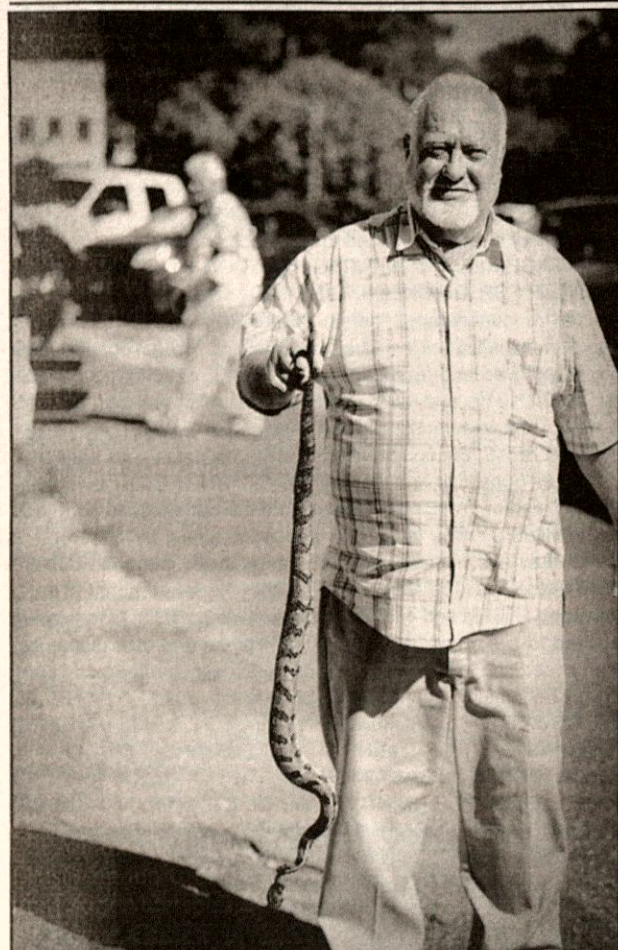

Did You Know?

The Unrecognized First

December 29th, 1881 – December 2nd, 1958

Emory Conrad Malick, The Flying Dutchman grew up in Central Pennsylvania, first in Seven Points, then in nearby Sunbury, where he built his own gliders, flew then across the Susquehanna River to his job as a farmhand and carpenter on Cattle Weiser's farm and also became a Master Tile Layer in Philadelphia. Malick worked in Philadelphia. Malick worked for the Flying Dutchman Air Service, which he offered flight instruction, passengers flight and he took Aerial Photography for Dallin Aerial Survey.

In March, 1928, at the Camden, New Jersey Air Show, Malick took two passengers for a quick hop in his Waco three-seater. They were barely aloft when the engine died, the Waco crashed, the two passengers were injured. Later that year, Malick crashed again – this time injuring himself and killing his passenger. Emory never flew again. He remained interested in Aviation; Malick displayed the



60-Horsepower Engine that powered his 1914 flight over the town at the Flying Club Banquet.

At the age of 77 in December, 1958, Malick slipped and fell on an icy sidewalk in Philadelphia. He died later in the hospital. With no identification on him, his body lay unclaimed in the morgue for more than a month until identity could be established.

Since the September 1982 opening of the Smithsonian Institution National Air & Space Museum, "Black Wings" exhibit where the first black male American aviator is recognized for his contributions to American Aviation History. One of the joys of researching America's first black pilot is that another story like Emory Conrad Malick may be lurking around the corner.

When a nonresident contractor submits a bid for a public project, he shall attach thereto a copy of his resident state's current law pertaining to such state's treatment of nonresident contractors. Any bid submitted by a nonresident contractor which does not include the nonresident contractor's current state law shall be rejected and not considered for award.

The right is reserved, as the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors may require, to reject any and all bids that waive any informality in the bids received.
