





hearing for Tuesday night regarding the city taking action to demolish and clear the burned out building site that has been an eyesore to neighbors near downtown since it burned early one morning in April 2016. In a fire so hot it burned the siding on neighboring homes, the law office burned, coincidentally

within hours of Locke's lakeside home at Mill Creek. Since the fire, the site was designated a crime scene as city and state investigators built the arson case.

Locke was indicted on arson charges by a Tishomingo County grand jury in early March 2017, nearly a year after the fire. She has reportedly retained Ashland, Mississippi defense attorney Tony Farese to defend her in the criminal charges of arson.

Since the property owner has not cleaned up the mess, the city was prepared to take action to have it cleared. This expense would be put on the property owner's taxes. A neighbor of the property had submitted a petition a couple months ago asking for the city to take action. Tues-



day night was the public hearing required by the ordinance before nuisance properties are cleaned up by the city.

The city of Iuka investigated the case, along with the state fire marshal, but now the case is in the hands of Assistant District Attorney Ray O'Neill, according to Iuka city board attorney Nathaniel Clark

After weeks of trying to contact the defense attorney's office, Clark finally heard from the Fa-



rese firm multiple times on Tuesday morning urging him to stop the city's proposed demolition of the crime scene until their investigators could complete an investigation.

No trial date has been set, and Clark estimated it could be later in 2017, so the burned building would be sitting there for nearly two years before anyone could get it cleaned up:

Voicing the general consensus of all the board members present at the special called meeting, Mayor John Castleberry said, "I want this [clean up of the burn site] to not drag out all the way to the

trial. I don't want to jeopardize the criminal case, but It's been sitting there long enough for investigators to do what they needed to do."

Clark was tasked with coordinating with the district attorney's office to see if investigators could hurry along with the work that needs to happen in the building, which has been sitting in the weather, without a roof for thirteen

months. The building used to be the Iuka Church of Christ, and after that, it housed the WVOM radio

Investigation Continues in Thomas Homicide

Investigators are still interviewing persons and witnesses connected to the May 3rd altercation that eventually resulted in the death of a Tishomingo man, but authorities have still not received conclusive evidence to charge the person who struck the victim, or been able to piece together exactly what happened.

To recap, according to investigators with the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Harry Rod Thomas, III, was involved in an altercation at the home of Karen Kennedy and possibly Keith Letson, near 15 Railroad Avenue in Paden the afternoon of May 3rd.

Thomas was hit in the temple with something very hard (hospital later confirmed,) and his "girlfriend," Alicia McCoy, drove him around for three hours before taking him to Iuka Hospital, where she reported he had been "boxing." So no criminal investigation began until after that time. McCoy also told authorities that she was Thomas' wife, but family members confirmed Thomas was not married.

When he was finally taken to Iuka Hospital around 7 p.m. that evening, family members said he was diagnosed with three "brain bleeds" and he was transported to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo for treatment of a head injury sustained in the altercation. Thomas, who served six years in the U.S. Army and was a sergeant, was in a coma until May 12th, when he died in the hospital. The body was sent for an autopsy and has been returned. Complete autopsy results are not available yet.

Last week, authorities confirmed it was a homicide, but surrounding circumstances have much to do with what and who will actually be charged. Keith Letson was in custody being questioned, but was released this week.

This past week, an extended family member publicly aired her strong feelings about the lack charges and Letson's lease from custody on cial media, bringing case to the attention of public again, and teles sion news picked it up h sponding to these concern takes up time that could used investigating, say vestigators.

"We are still into viewing all the penon surrounding the case b when the stories ke changing, it's hard to cide what to charge any with," explained To mingo County Shens Chief Investigator G "But ther Mitchell. more to look at than per ple realize." Mitchell he is meeting with family members this week to con pletely fill them in on the ongoing investigation

Additionally, tigators are considering an eventual defense ment: would Thomas have died from his injuries if he had received immediate medical attention.

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394, met at the Iuka Public Library, May 16th at 4 p.m. Those present were Vickie Durham, Eunell Handy and Sharon Hairrell

We completed the UDC rituals and the singing of "Dixie" and the meeting was declared open. The minutes were read and the financial report was given and approved. Eunell Handy stated that applications were still being worked on. Librarian Gwen Spain stated the books were in at the library that the club purchased with their donations. The books bought were "Chapter from the Unwritten History of the War Between the States" by R. M. Collins and "The Vazon Pass Expedition by Larry McCluney, Jr.

The program was presented by Vickie Durham and it was from the UDC May program, "Storage Substitutions," by Shirley Woodluck. war dealt hardship on soldiers and citizens both North and South. The people from the South were hit the hardest. The South could not import or trade and because of prices went "sky high." Many items were not available because they could not be produced. Cotton and grains were in short supply because there was no one to work. Livestock was killed, taken or eaten, and grain products

were also taken, eaten or burned. In 1864 coffee was \$7.00 a lb., corn was \$7.00 a bushel.

In 1864 Sherman began his infamous "March to the Sea." What his men couldn't use they destroyed - homes, outbuildings, and stores were burned. Livestock and all grain products were taken, just about everything beneficial to the everyday lives of the southern citizens.

Families and soldiers found ways to substitute, newspapers listed items and ways in the paper to replace them. Clotheswere worn until they were worn out and then they were used for quilts or bandages.

Hairs from raccoons, rabbits, cattle, horses, and does were added to cotton and wool to make them go farther. Dyes were made from plants, fruit and bark. Combs were made from ivory and tortoise shells, shoes were made from old carpet.

Food became scarce, a processed rat sold for \$2.50, other food sources

were domesticated animals, snakes, earthworms, snails, frogs, and locust. In battle horses that were killed were often eaten. Anything that was not poi-

Chopped wood was in short supply. Hickory was the most common because it burned longer. Fireballs were made out of sawdust, pieces of coal, sand, water and clay. It was rolled up into balls and dried and burned as needed.

Salt went from \$12 for a 2 bushel bag to \$100.00. Coffee was made from dried fruits, seed and etc. Molasses, honey, dried figs and sorghum was used in place of sugar. Medicine was made from fruit, wild berries, roots, bark and

The war was relentless. It took many captives, not only on the battlefield but also on the home front. The South lost the war but it survived.

we believe Psalm chapter


23, that says, "The LORD

tion 14:10-11. If we think John 3:16 is a great verse, because it speaks of God's love for the world and His being unwilling that any should perish, then we must take the rest of the Bible at face value. I do not claim to know "all about hell", but I do know some things, and I do want to speak and write about those things, so that sinners will be warned not to go to hell and finally to the lake of fire. I would much rather preach or teach on heaven than on hell, but I must speak of both, if I would be honest about the Word of God. I



sometimes think that God gave about nine tenths of the Bible for no real reason, since most people never see what most of the Bible says and teaches. Of course I know He gave all of it for a good reason, but many make little use of much of it.

The torment of those who go to hell and the lake of fire will be forever. Our verses say that they have no rest day or night. There will be no night in heaven, but hell and the lake of fire will be a kind of "night" that never allows a new and beautiful day to come. Perhaps this language is symbolical to give the truth that those who go to this place of punishment will never rest, for they will not! Yes, there is some mystery about all of this, but we sometimes have to allow some mysteries to be "locked up in the mind of God", for He has not revealed all of them to us. The good news is that He has revealed some things to us, even about future punishment for the unbeliever, so we would be wise to learn as much as possible about what is revealed. Deuteronomy 29:29 is interesting on things that are secret and things that are revealed: "The secret things belong unto the LORD our God: but those things which are revealed belong unto us and to our children for ever, that we may do all the words of this law." I realize that we are not under the law of Moses today, yet the truth of this verse does have an application to us. We cannot know the things that God has chosen to keep secret, but we can know the things that He has revealed, and we can find those things in the Bible. It is not that God has not told us, and warned us, about future punishment for unbelievers, for He has! The problem is that many people are simply unwilling to believe what God has revealed to us on this subject, and on many others.

Revelation 14:9-11 does mention that the punishment here is for those who worship the beast (antichrist) and receive the mark of the beast, but many other Scriptures also warn the rest of the world, who will not live in the time of the mark of the beast, that there place of punishmen those who reject Ch You see, everyby worships something someone. Some per worship their own ies; their intellects; abilities; others work the bodies and brain others etc. Some ship God, while on worship the devil that simple! Did You Know?

Black American Pilot Willa Beatrice Brown January 22, 1906 - July 18, 1992

Willa Beatrice Brown, one of a small group of pre-World War II black women aviators, was born in Glasgow, Kentucky on January 22, 1906. The daughter of Reverend and Mrs. Erice B. Brown, she graduated from Wiley High School in Terra Haute, Indiana. In 1927, Brown earned a Bachelor's degree from Indiana State Teachers College (now Indiana State University) and ten years later a Master's degree in Business Administration from Northwestern University. After briefly teach-

ing at Roosevelt High School in Gary, Indiana, she moved to Chicago, Illinois to become a social worker. It was there, however, that she decided to learn how to fly. In 1934 Brown began her flight instruction under the direction of John Robinson and Cornelius Coffey. She also studied at the Curtiss Wright Aeronautical University and in 1935 earned a Masters Mechanic Certificate. In 1937 Brown became the first African-American woman in the U.S. to earn a commercial pilot's license. Two years later she married her former flight instructor, Cornelius Coffey, and they co-founded Cornelius Coffey School of Aeronautics, the first black-owned and operated private flight training academy in the U.S. In 1939, the Coffey school was awarded a contract by the Federal Government



to train Americans to fly airplanes in case of a national emer-Later gency.

that year, Brown became a co-founder of the National Airmen's Association of America. She also joined the Challenger Air Pilot's Association, the Chicago Girls Flight Club, and purchased her own airplane all between 1939 and 1940. By 1941, hundreds of men

and women had trains under Brown, inch ing many men who lat became members of famed Tuskegee Airmon Brown was the director coordinator of two C Aeronautics Administra tion (CAA) program one at the Harlem Airpon and the other at Wender Phillips High School Chicago.






