Incumbents Rule in City Elections Throughout County

Every Vote Counts: One Iuka Alderman Seat Still in Play

In a day of very low voter turnout, incumbent mayors and aldermen retained their seats throughout the county.

In Iuka, only about 28 percent of 1,980 registered voters showed up to vote. Incumbent Mayor John Castleberry, and incumbent aldermen Joel Robertson, Johnny Southward, James Grisham earned the votes to stay on the board of aldermen.

Newcomers Kenny Carson and Nancy South Stripling also earned enough votes to be on the board, but a final count won't be available until late in the afternoon on Wednesday, according to clerk Benny Gray.

There are five outstanding

affidavit ballots, which the Iuka Election Commissioners have to look at to determine if they are valid and count toward the election. Apparently the commissioners (Nancy Brown, Sue Scott and Joyce Lambert) were unable to look at them Tuesday night, and won't be meeting to look at them until 1:30 Wednesday.

At least one of those ballots appears to be someone voting from outside the city limits, said city officials. So four votes are in play, and that could change the aldermen election results in a significant way.

Be sure to "like" the Tishomingo County News Facebook page to get the final results

as soon as they are available Wednesday afternoon.

In Burnsville, Golden and Belmont, all the incumbents won their seats back, according to reports from the city clerks.

In Paden and Tishomingo, all the incumbents qualified, and no one challenged them, so there will be no election.

School Officials Respond to Parents; Jerry Long is New Fast-Pitch Coach

Sometimes, the voice of the people, if it makes enough noise, results.

That voice, this time in the form of nearly a dozen softball parents at a county school board meeting, managed to bring long-time Tishomingo County coach Jerry Long back to coaching in the springtime at Tishomingo High School.

In recent weeks at Tishomingo County High School, fast-pitch softball coach Jeremy Long resigned to take the Iuka Middle School principal job. A committee consisting of TCHS principal Pete Howland, assistant principal Monica Dax and TC Athletic Director Dax Glover brought a recommendation to the board for someone to fill the position. But nearly a dozen parents attended the special meeting last Thursday night and spoke to the county school board to convince them to consider hiring Coach Jerry Long. He has long worked with softball girls as the slow-pitch coach, and was baseball coach from the school's founding until 2013.

Last spring, Long took a head coaching job at the Cherokee High School, Alabama baseball program, and took them into post-

Iuka PD Arrests Two for Arson, Burglary Charges

Two men face arson and burglary charges for a series of crimes last Wednesday night and Thursday morning that resulted in fire damage to the old black Masonic Lodge on Pike Street in Iuka.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, Jordan Watts, 19, and Kevin Rawlings, Jr., 20, went on quite a crime spree late Wednesday night and have several charges of burglary and larceny and arson to show for it.

Stringer said the two face charges of burglary and larceny for breaking into Bian Garden Asian restaurant on Battleground Drive, where they allegedly took a cash register and a laptop. They also allegedly broke into Care Cutters

Salon and tried to break into Chuck Wagon restaurant and did damage there, too. They also took a 2005 Cadillac Escalade owned by Greg Durham, and face charges of felony taking of a motor vehicle.

They are charged with arson for a fire that Iuka Fire Department responded to about 2 a.m. Thursday, June 1st, thanks to a passerby calling in the fire. The fire did some

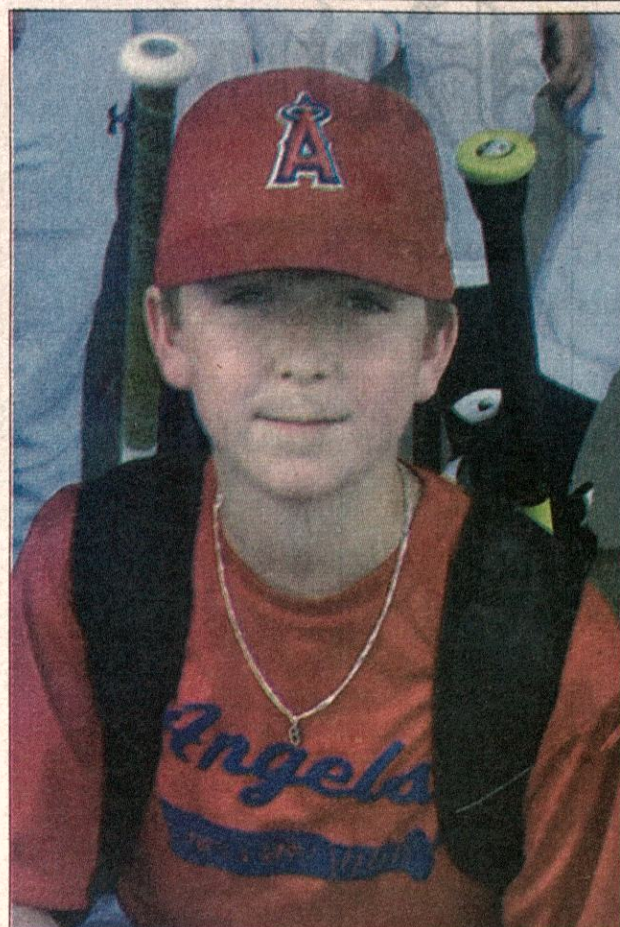

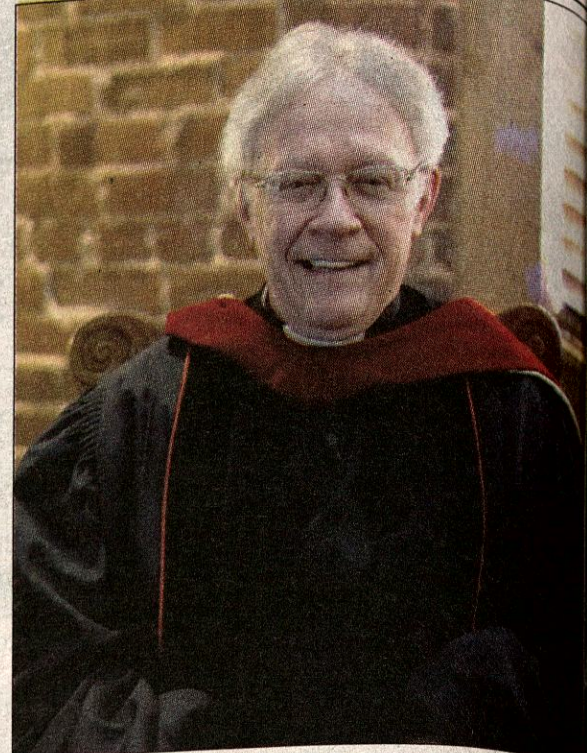
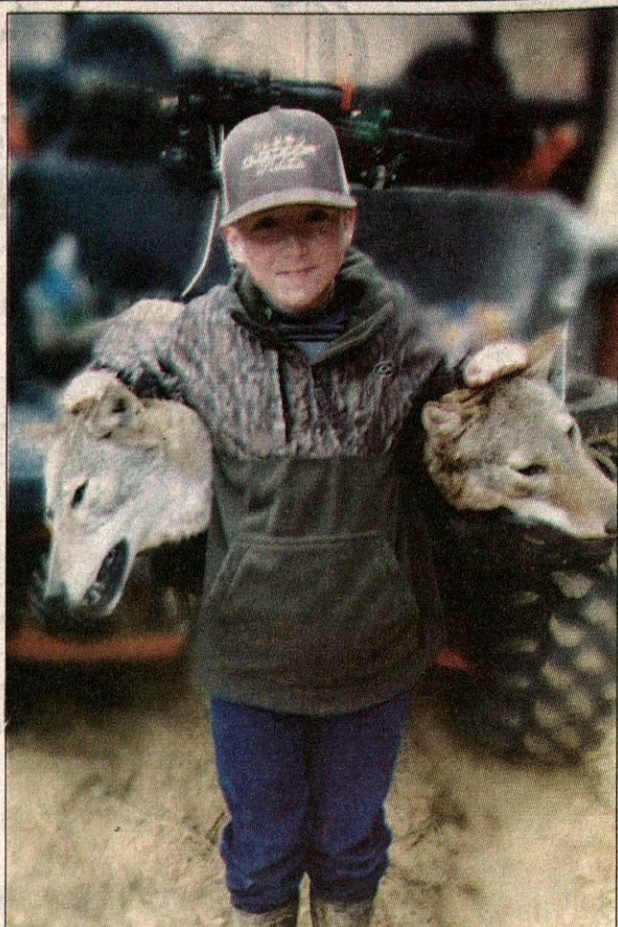

Nick Phillips Receives Doctor of Ministry Degree

Nicholas B. Phillips was one of three people who recently received a Doctor of Ministry degree from Eden Theological Seminary at its 167th commencement service. Among the other degree recipients were twenty-eight who were granted the Master of Divinity and six who were awarded the Master of Theological Studies.

The commencement was held on Friday, May 19, 2017, at the Pilgrim Congregational United Church of Christ in St. Louis, Missouri. The Rev. Dr. Laurie Hafner delivered the commencement address, which was titled "The Mischievous, Magical, Marred World of Ministry." Eden Theological Seminary is one of six theological schools of the

United Church of Christ and is located in Webster Groves, Missouri, a suburb of St. Louis. Throughout its history, Eden has been ecumenical in its witness with ministers of many walks of faith making up its student body. Among the denominations represented are United Methodist, United Church of Christ, Presbyterian Church (USA), Episcopal, Disciples of Christ, Lutheran, and Roman Catholic. Nick has served the New Hope Presbyterian Church in Biggersville, Mississippi, for over twelve years and is currently the Moderator of the Presbytery of St. Andrew, covering north Mississippi. He is also a lawyer and has practiced in Iuka since 1989.

season play – something they had not seen in a long time. It made people start talking about bringing him back to TCHS if he was interested in coaching baseball.

When the fast-pitch job was looking open, softball parents started an online petition to get Jerry Long to coach the girls – many of whom play slow-pitch for him. According to the hiring committee, Long did not indicate interest in the job until after they had already found someone.

Last Thursday night, several parents attended a specially called meeting of the school board, who have been meeting nearly weekly to approve hiring decisions presented by administrators of the various schools. While the school board can not actually hire staff, they do get to approve hiring, stressed board member Emily Wadkins.

When a dozen parents attend a school board

meeting, the board members are definitely interested, and when parent Doug Johnson spoke on behalf of current softball players and parents asking the board to hire Jerry Long, it went into executive session with their comments in mind.

They came out of executive session and president of the board Dr. Jim Perkins asked for a motion to hire the proposed candidate, but no one made a motion. The board went back into executive session, and came out to vote 3-2 to ask the hiring committee to reconsider their recommendation. The softball parents waited around through both executive sessions (they had to wait in another room, as executive sessions are allowed under Mississippi law to discuss personnel hiring issues and are closed to public.)

Monday night, in another called meeting, the board approved Jerry Long 5-0 as the fast-pitch

softball coach for TCHS.

"We are always, first and foremost, about the kids, and Coach Long is a great history teacher, and has been a fantastic coach for more than 30 years," said Assistant Principal

Monica Moss. "We are pleased he was interested, and it was an easy recommendation for us to make. He has a loyal following for a reason, and the parents, students and players just love him."

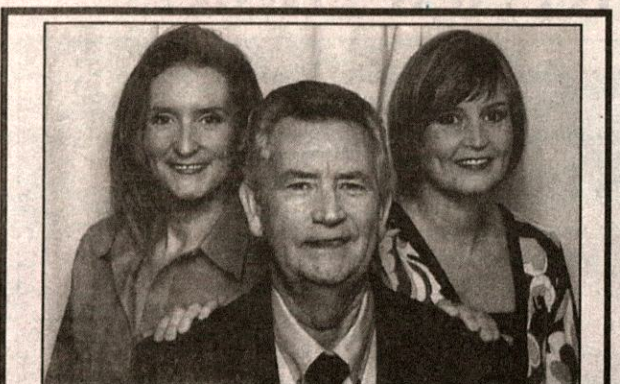

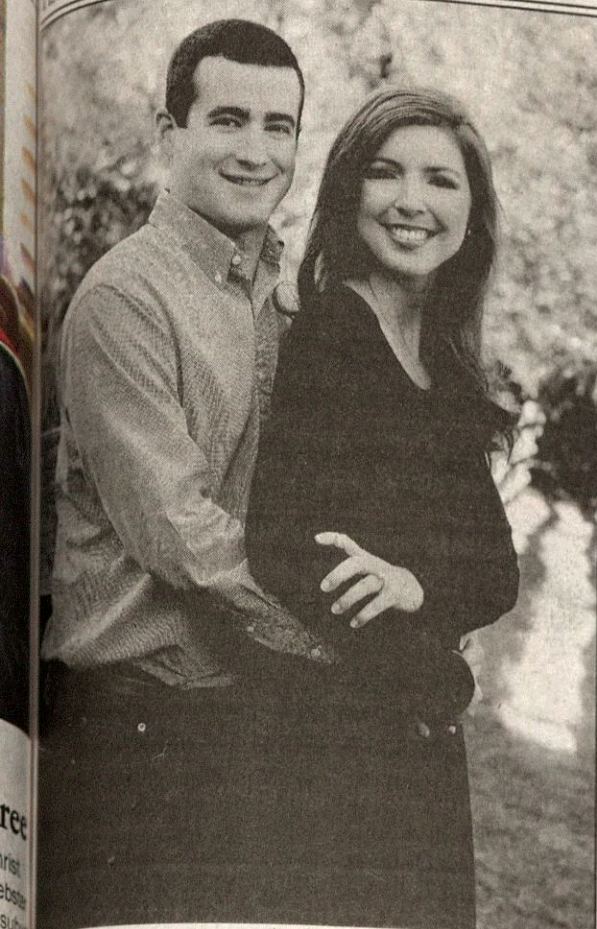

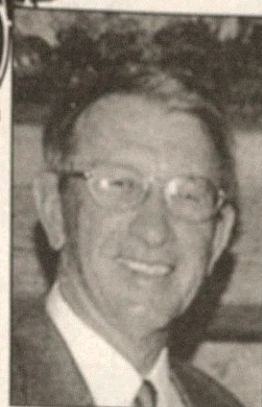
The M.H.V. State Council was held May 15th-18th at MSU Campus at Starkville. Barbara Pardue the voting delegate and Joyce Borden alter-

NOTICE OF PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 on June 19, 2017, 6:00 p.m., at the Superintendent's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$29,632,273. Of that amount, 22% or \$6,632,147, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$29,012,372. Of that amount, 24% or \$7,016,650, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal years, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax effort, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

That little boy was me when I was four years old. I was extremely glad to have my very own chair. Being in a family of ten children finding a place to sit was not easy. But this chair assured me of always having a seat.

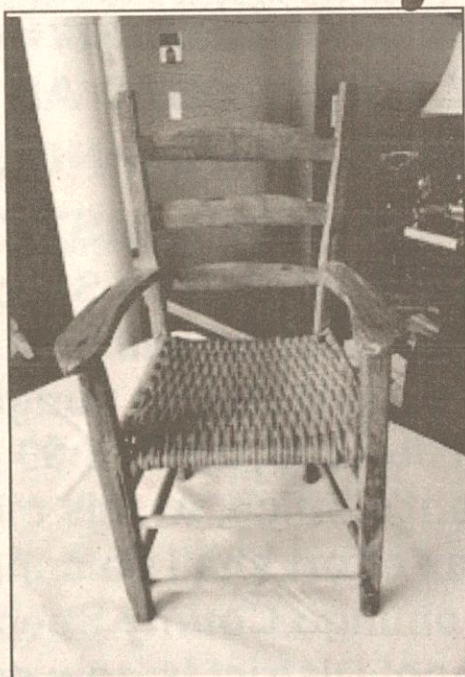
A man who lived across Bear Creek in the Valley Community made this chair for me. On most Saturdays he and his wife took a wagon load of chairs to Belmont, Golden and sometimes Red Bay, Alabama. Usually they would stop at our farm home near Dennis, Mississippi to rest and visit.

This man was very nice and friendly. He would let me climb up in the special spring seat. My endless ques-

tions and comments did not annoy him. In fact he seemed to enjoy talking about how he made the rocking chairs and the straight back chairs.

On his next trip he stopped and guess what? He gave me this chair that he had made for me. The seat is ten inches tall. The arm rests on both sides are five inches higher than the seat. The straight back is twenty-four inches tall. The seat is made out of small cane strips.

He only used hand tools to make his chairs. My chair was made out of hickory wood. Some-



times he used oak. The trees on his farm were his primary source for wood. He used green wood which caused the joints to tighten as the wood dried.

This 86 year old chair is still in excellent condition. It has been used and enjoyed by our children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

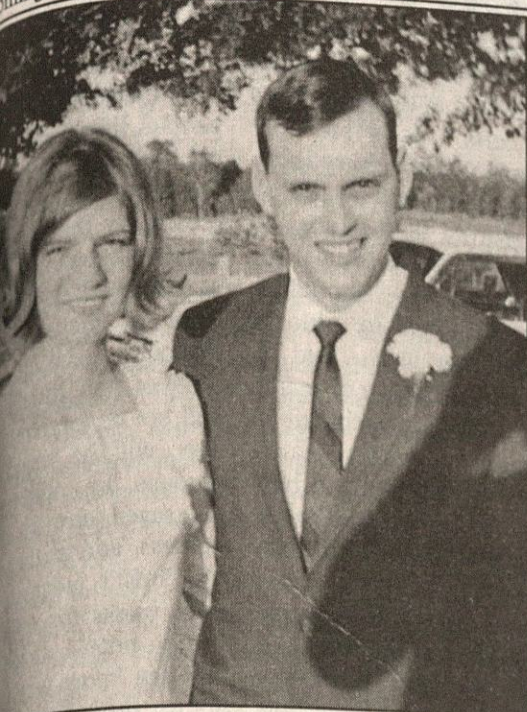

It will take great patience for any saved person to be a witness for Christ during the tribulation, because there will be great persecution against the saved, especially during the second half of the tribulation. Great faith will also be required during this time, for the wicked will be doing whatever they can to discount the truth of Christ and salvation through Him. Many

will be saved through the witness of the 144,000 Jewish evangelists and will keep the commandments of God and the faith (meaning the doctrine, or teaching) of Christ. Many professing Christians in our day see little need to teach and preach the doctrines of the Bible, but they are wrong, for doctrine is the "skeletal system" that holds the body, the church, together!

Revelation 14:13 says, "And I heard a voice from heaven saying

unto me, Write, Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them." Many people in our day think it strange that some Christians who are suffering, either physically or otherwise, wish they could die and go on to heaven. I have not been there, but I am not sick either! I think it is right for us to be willing to live on earth as long as God has planned for us to live. I do not think it is right for anyone to take his own life, or to live in such way that he shortens his life. There will be a time on earth called the tribulation in which it will be a blessing for one to die, if he is saved. Our verse

above says that those who die in the Lord from a certain point and forward will be blessed, because they will be able to rest from their labors. It is the Spirit of God Who said this, so we should be careful never to criticize anything He has said or done! The labor of many believers during the tribulation will be very hard, because no one can buy or sell without the mark of the beast, at least from the midway point of the tribulation and onward. Those who do not take the mark of the beast will have to get their food through a black market, or secretly, and perhaps live in hiding, so that they will not be killed. Believers will not take the mark of the beast, for all who take it are lost for-

ever. We know also there will be righteous people living in physical bodies at the end of the tribulation, for this is proven by the judgment of the nations shown in Matthew 25:31-46.
