PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 on June 19, 2017, 6:00 p.m., at the Superintendent's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$29,632,273. Of that amount, 22% or \$6,632,147, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$29,012,372. Of that amount, 24% or \$7,016,650, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal years, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax effort, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

That little boy was me when I was four years old. I was extremely glad to have my very own chair. Being in a family of ten children finding a place to sit was not easy. But this chair assured me of always having a seat.

A man who lived across Bear Creek in the Valley Community made this chair for me. On most Saturdays he and his wife took a wagon load of chairs to Belmont, Golden and sometimes Red Bay, Alabama. Usually they would stop at our farm home near Dennis, Mississippi to rest and visit.

This man was very nice and friendly. He would let me climb up in the wagon and sit in the special spring seat. My endless ques-

tions and comments did not annoy him. In fact he seemed to enjoy talking about how he the made rocking chairs and the straight back chairs.

On his next trip he stopped and guess what? He gave me

chair this that he had made for The seat is ten me. inches tall. The arm rests on both sides are five inches higher than the seat. The straight twenty-four back is inches tall. The seat is made out of small cane strips.

He only used hand tools to make his chairs. My chair was made out of hickory wood. Some-

times he used oak. The trees on his farm were his primary source for wood. He used green wood which caused the joints to tighten as the wood dried.

This 86 year old chair is still in excellent condition. It has been used and enjoyed by our children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

I do not think it is right for anyone to take his own life, or to live in such way that he shortens his life. There will be a time on earth called the tribulation in which it will be a blessing for one to die, if he is saved. Our verse

above says that those who die in the Lord from a certain point and forward will be blessed, because they will be able to rest from their labors. It is the Spirit of God Who said this, so we should be careful never to criticize anything He has said or done! The labor of many believers during the tribulation will be very hard, because no one can buy or sell without the mark of the beast, at least from the midway point of the tribulation and onward.
