Recent Escapees Found in Nevada

Two escaped prisoners from Tishomingo County were apprehended late Tuesday night in the Las Vegas area.

According to the Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty, Isaac Bennett, 23, and Jonathan Dakota Hamm, were stopped in or near Las Vegas when law enforcement found the vehicle they were driving was one reported as stolen from Missouri. Bennett apparently identified himself, and when authorities called Tishomingo County dispatchers, Corrections Officer Marco Cordoba was able to describe the two and their tattoos, and it was determined the other passenger was Hamm, said Daugherty.

The two fugitives are being held in Nevada and face stolen vehicle charges, as well as drug and paraphernalia charges. The fugitives stole a pickup truck from a parking lot at Mill Street Apartments in Iuka when they escaped a week ago, and it has been located in the Kansas City area.

It was the second time in a month that inmates had successfully escaped from the Tishomingo County Jail. This time, the two inmates escaped by forcing open a door, according to authorities. They then scaled a fence topped with razor wire, and cut another fence before sneaking down the railroad tracks east toward town where they stole a vehicle. They were actually seen by a corrections officer getting past a fence, but by the time he called for assistance, the two were gone.

May 18th, another inmate escaped the county jail by crawling under a fence, and wasn't reported until he had several hours head start on investigators. Chief Investigator Greg Mitchell reported at that time that one correction officer lost his job in connection with that escape, and has said that additional arrests or terminations may follow, but none have been reported.

Burnsville Man Dead for Three Months in Home

An elderly Burnsville man may have been dead three months in his home before authorities found him last week, according to the coroner. Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon explained that neighbors of David Montgomery, 75, who lived on Line Drive in Burnsville had not seen Mr. Montgomery in a while, so they called authorities for a welfare check.

Montgomery was in poor health and had no close family around and his house was locked up securely, said Wilemon. On June 13th, when they breached the home, law officers found Montgomery in bed, and Wilemon said he may have been dead about three months. He had lived in that location since the 1990s, said Wilemon.

Two Killed in Trace Wreck Tuesday

Two persons were killed in a one-vehicle wreck Tuesday night on the Natchez Trace in Tishomingo County. A northbound 2001 Chevy Blazer driven by Nicholas T. Millan, 22, of Antioch, Tennessee, apparently left the roadway and flipped over, near marker 301 on the Natchez Trace about 7:30 p.m. Tuesday evening, June 20th, killing the driver and a passenger.

Female passenger Jamie L. Smith, 22, of Tupelo was thrown from the vehicle when it wrecked between the Highway 4 and Highway 25 exit of the Trace. The accident is under investigation by the Natchez Trace Parkway rangers, said Wilemon.

Jail Improvements Called for After Escapes

Monday morning, Sheriff Daugherty made a presentation to the county board of supervisors on security improvements they are making at the jail after two escapes in the last month. One problem is that there are commercial metal doors installed on fiberglass shells with only regular wood door frames, explained a frustrated Daugherty. The prisoners have been pushing on the doors, which have loosened the frames from the fiberglass, allowing the doors to be forced open if you lean on them. They have even succeeded in removing screws holding the door frames to the fiberglass. A possible solution presented was to have a local contractor build a more secure reinforced concrete vestibule outside the doors with a high security door that cannot be breached. Additionally, strobe lights and alarms will be installed to activate when doors are open, allowing the on-duty jailors to better observe activity from the camera system inside the control "tower" of the jail.

A local contractor was tasked with presenting specifications and consulting with appropriate security professionals for the additions as soon as possible. "Get 'em to us!" said Second District Supervisor Nicky McRae of the plans and specifications to get the repairs made. The sheriff is already installing more razor wire and cutting brush surrounding the jail. Apparently it is pretty common for associates of prisoners to sneak

through brush outside the jail and throw over drugs, paraphernalia, tools and such, and prisoners manage to avoid detection of these activities. The \$7 million jail was built in 2012, and in 2016 and more recently, state inspections showed some considerable maintenance issues throughout with the prefabricated arched fiberglass units. Most issues have to do with the construction of

the fiberglass building, like gaps between the foundation or masonry part of the building and the fiberglass wall sections. The board of supervisors in office at the time specified to designers the fiberglass jail, instead of a traditional construction. First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom said Monday that they did look at a traditional jail, but the cost would have been more.

Board Adopts Policy on School Lunch Debts

If you owe more than \$5 on school lunches, the superintendent will be taking up your case and giving you a call, according to a policy approved Monday night by the Tishomingo County School Board.

Unpaid school lunch charges have gone in to the thousands of dollars at times at all the county's school campuses, and administrators have tried many approaches in recent months to get parents to take responsibility and pay for their own kids' food.

To be clear, this does not include the 60 percent or more students who receive free or reduced-price lunches under the federal lunch programs. This is children of parents who

can, conceivably, pay for their kids' lunches – they just forget, or don't, and the amounts get pretty high.

At the end of the school year, several schools still had balances of more than \$100, despite efforts to collect from parents.

Board members expressed frustration with the situation.

"Can we not take these folks to small claims court or something when it gets to \$75 or \$100?" asked Fifth District Board Member Greg Smith, producing outward groans from some present who want to avoid the appearance of penalizing students for their parents' irresponsible behavior.

At some schools in the country, students with un-

paid charges get bare minimum lunches like a cheese sandwich, or are perceived as otherwise "embarrassed" by cafeteria staff. In Tishomingo County, children are NOT ever refused a lunch, administrators have stressed, but the debt has become significant at times.

First District Board Member Emily Watkins suggested an intensive campaign for people to be urged to fill out the federal school lunch form, or be shown the online payment system through the district website.

"People don't realize how easy it is to pay online, or that they may qualify for free or reduced lunches if they have trouble meeting this expense," said Watkins.

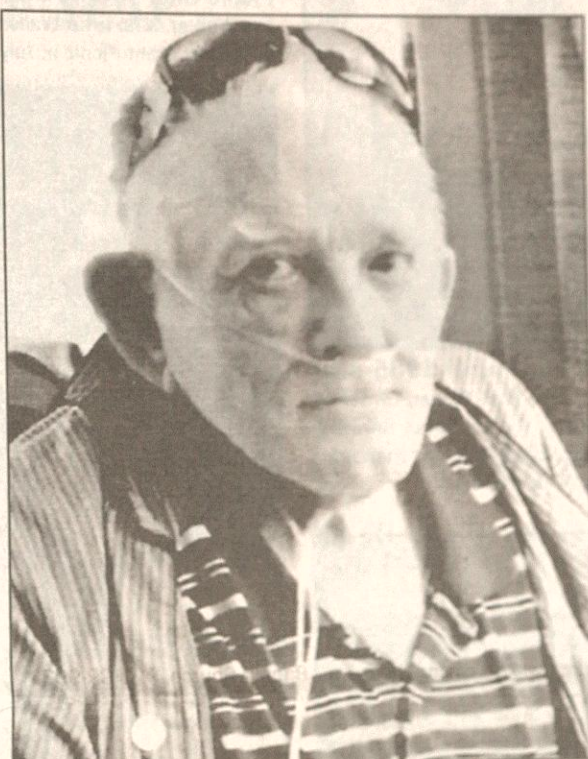

Charlotte's Attic Memories of the Shirt Company

News of the demolition of the old Shirt Factory Building in Iuka has stirred up memories for many people in the area. The building is located on the corner of Ash and Mill Street in Iuka and it was constructed in October 1962 after a devastating fire destroyed the former building that housed the shirt company in the same location. According to our files, the Iuka Shirt Company began operation on June 24, 1955 and in August of that year was dedicated by local officials with tours of the facility and a party in Mineral Springs Park. Bernard Lukoff was the president and general manager at the time. The building was destroyed by fire in June 1962, with Dalton Cooper as manager, and the new building opened in October of 1962. During the shutdown the factory continued work in three locations, the VFW Hut in Iuka, the colored school building in Iuka, and the Holcut gym.

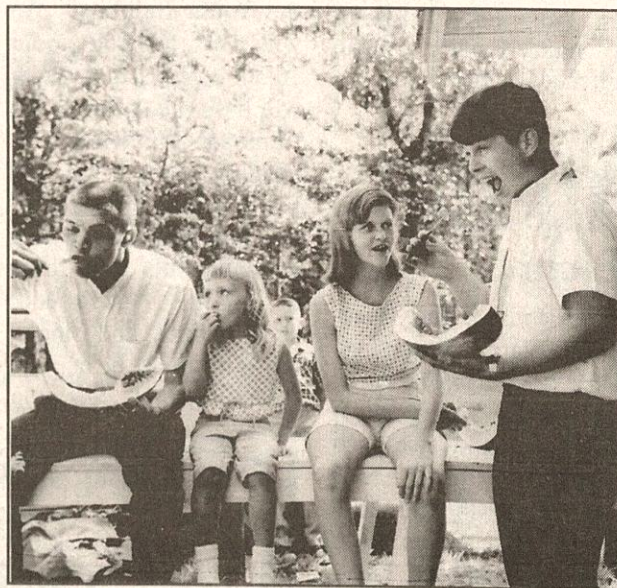

Several ideas were discussed for upcoming events and goals for Iuka at last Thursday's IDEA group meeting.

About a dozen folks met at Iuka Hospital to discuss "making Iuka a better place to live and do business," which is the motto of Iuka Development & Economic Association. IDEA started several years ago with several business owners and volunteers interested in working with the city to beautify the town to enhance existing businesses and attract new businesses.

With past successes like the Back to School Bash, Music in the Park, Pre-Prom in the Park, and the Old Time Christmas celebration, IDEA wants to do even more to build up ALL of 38852. The IDEA group, which included two aldermen, some business owners, and some representatives of Iuka civic clubs discussed several projects they will concentrate on in coming months.

IDEA members want to involve more volunteers and businesses from throughout "38852," Iuka's mailing zip code. Though many people think that it is just a downtown group, IDEA is all about the larger community. Often events happen

downtown or in Mineral Springs Park because those are the city's main public spaces. Urban renewal consultants have repeatedly told the city government and groups like IDEA the value of their historic downtown, and how they should promote it. Plus, if something is good for Mineral Springs Park or downtown, it attracts people to all of Iuka and the economic impact is positive for everyone.

The Back to School Bash in August of 2015, done in conjunction with Meet the Braves was a huge hit, and IDEA and the Touchdown Club plans to do it again August 10th this summer, with a rain date of August 17th. Touchdown Club President Holly Garner said she is excited to work with IDEA again to do this popular community gathering in Mineral Springs Park. Touchdown Club and IDEA will be coordinating with community and school officials in coming weeks to make the August 10th event happen, but make plans now to come out to Mineral Springs Park for a big community event!

Members also talked about working with Iuka city officials to bring the Christmas Parade back through Iuka's Historic Downtown, like it used to

come years ago. With the super-successful example of the TCHS Homecoming Parade, and how it now safely comes through downtown, IDEA hopes to coordinate with the board of aldermen to bring back more of a community feeling to this annual event by letting it go through the heart of Iuka - the downtown, where people can actually circulate and visit together before, during and after the parade, instead of sitting in cars along Battleground Drive in December. After the 2016 Christmas Parade, crowds flocked to downtown Iuka for the Old Time Community Christmas, and many raved about how nice it was to get together during the holiday season. It also benefits business owners who stay open during such events, and parade-goers appreciate being able to get snacks and goodies.

IDEA would also like to see a Jaybird Market presented a few months each year, with artists, craftsmen and food vendors gathered on a Saturday morning, similar to Corinth's successful Green Market. Organizer Brady Steen of Corinth's Green Market will be speaking at the next IDEA meeting, June 29th, to help spur on this potential event.

include:

Setting up a Farmer's Market downtown

Getting some seating downtown

Drink machines downtown

More Music in the Park, and movies downtown

Chalking/painting parking spaces downtown for different events

Getting a snow-cone stand set up again in Mineral Springs Park for enjoyment of visitors

Getting a simple splash pad, maybe on the City Hall end of Jaybird Park

Getting public restrooms downtown - the lack of which are always a hindrance to downtown events.

Additional Information for Lead

Black American in Aviation

Benjamin O. Davis, Jr.

Dec. 18, 1912 - July 4, 2002

Benjamin Oliver Davis Jr. (December 18, 1912 - July 4, 2002) was an American United States Air Force general and commander of the World War II Tuskegee Airmen.

He was the first African-American general officer in the United States Air Force. On December 9, 1998, he was advanced to four-star general by President Bill Clinton. During World War II, Davis was commander of the 99th Fighter Squadron and the 332nd Fighter Group, which escorted bombers on air combat missions over Europe. Davis himself flew sixty missions in P-39, Curtiss P-40, P-47 and P-51 Mustang fighters. Davis followed in his father's footsteps in breaking racial barriers, as Benjamin O. Davis Sr. was the first African-American general in the United States Army.

Benjamin Oliver Davis Jr. was born in Washington, D.C. on December 18, 1912, the second of three children born to Benjamin O. Davis Sr. and Elnora Dickerson Davis. His father was a U.S. Army officer, and at the time he was stationed in Wyoming serving as a lieutenant with an all-white cavalry unit. Benjamin O. Davis Sr. served 41 years before he was promoted to brigadier general in October 1940. Elnora Davis died from complications after giving birth to their third child (Elnora) in 1916. At the age of 13, in the summer of 1926, the younger Davis went for a flight with a barnstorming pilot at Bolling Field in Washington, D.C. The experience led to his determination to become a pilot himself.

School Not Requesting Tax Increase

The county board of supervisors actually sets the millage rate for the county, based on the total assessed value of the county. The school district just asks for a dollar amount to operate with, and they are legally allowed to ask for up to a 4 percent increase each year, but they are not this year, and didn't last year.

Last year, the total assessed value of the county was \$146,221,463, and a mill was \$146,000 (a mill is 10 percent of the assessed value). This year the total assessed value has improved to \$157,917,248, so, since each mill is worth more, the district can do with the existing mills.

Reasons the value of the county has increased is due in part to increased value of property, and more industry, like the Mississippi Silicon plant.

The district spends about \$1.8 million per month keeping the district running.

Local school board policy requires the district to keep a balance that would pay at least two months of expenses, which is about \$4,479,350. The projected ending fund balance for June 30th is \$6,125,401. The board plans to use the extra amount next year to cover expenses; the district is budgeted to expend \$594,952 more than it receives from all sources. The shortfall will be covered with fund balance reserves.
