session of meth and family disturbance after called being to a residence in the Tishomingo area in reference to a disturbance. Bond was set at







wedding party included:







# Keep The Iron Red Hor

Jerrell L. McNutt

My father built a large blacksmith shop on our farm near Dennis, Miss. It had three sections. The forge and other equipment were in one area. On the other side was a place for the mule drawn wagon. The center was a work and storage area. There were seven of

us boys in the McNutt family. All of us enjoyed working in the shop. On rainy days and other odd times some of us could usually be seen and heard hammering in the shop. Being the youngest assured me of having many who could and did teach me the art of working with metal. My first task was pulling the rope that was attached to the "Bellows." It was an air pump that was mounted high above the forge. This air pump forced air into the fire pot in the forge. To properly bend and shape metal it must be "Red Hot." It has been said "Beating on cold iron will cause one to go to the bad place." Another mortal sin is charging too little for objects that have been made.

In the photo above is a lever operated forge. I picked it up in Southwest Missouri. You can see this forge in the museum in the old Court House in Iuka, Miss. Also you will find a large well used anvil

and a post vise. I foun this anvil in an antiqu store in Georgia. I rebui the post vise by adding new spring and with li uid steel new threads wer installed inside so the the jaws of the vise coul open and close. For man years blacksmithing ha been one of my favorit hobbies.

My grandfather Wil liam Thomas McNutt ha a water mill near lukal He also had a blacksmit shop. When he was no busy grinding corn for corn meal he worked i his shop. My son has woodworking shop and also has some blacksmit equipment. I have give a hand powered forge a grandson. His son wh is my nine year old great grandson seems to enjo turning the air blower my forge. So the McNu blacksmithing traditio continues.





After attending the University of Chicago, he entered the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York in 1932. He was sponsored by Representative Oscar De Priest (R-IL) of Chicago, at the time, the only black member of Congress. During the four years of his Academy term, Davis was racially isolated by his White classmates, few of whom spoke to him outside the line of duty. He never had a roommate. He ate by himself. His classmates hoped that this would drive him out of the Academy. The "silent treatment" had the opposite effect. It made Davis more determined to graduate. Nevertheless, he earned the respect of his

classmates, as evidence by the biographical no beneath his picture in the 1936 yearbook, the How itzer:

The courage, tenan ity, and intelligence with which he conquered with incomparable problem more difficult than ples year won for him the single cere admiration of classmates, and his single minded determination continue in his chosen ca reer cannot fail to inspire respect wherever fortun may lead him.

He graduated in 1936 35th in a class of 276. He was the academy's fourth black graduate after Hen. ry Ossian Flipper (1877) John Hanks Alexander (1887), and Charles Yours (1889).
