Heroin Arrest Among Recent Busts

Sheriff's deputies made the first heroin-related arrest in some time for this area when they conducted a traffic stop for careless driving on Highway 72 on June 19th. During the traffic stop, deputies found Jason Scott Boles, 42, of Smyrna, Tennessee had a suspended license for DUI conviction in Tennessee. Deputies placed him under arrest and during a search of the driver, deputies found a clear bag in the front pocket of the driver, allegedly containing heroin. Bond was set at \$7,500.

The Iuka Fire Department was at sunset Tuesday evening checking hoses on the truck. Once a year they inspect the hoses, ensuring they are ready for action.




Letters to the Editor...




Keep The Iron Red Hot

My father built a large blacksmith shop on our farm near Dennis, Miss. It had three sections. The forge and other equipment were in one area. On the other side was a place for the mule drawn wagon. The center was a work and storage area.

There were seven of us boys in the McNutt family. All of us enjoyed working in the shop. On rainy days and other odd times some of us could usually be seen and heard hammering in the shop. Being the youngest assured me of having many who could and did teach me the art of working with metal. My first task was pulling the rope that was attached to the "Bellows." It was an air pump that was mounted high above the forge. This air pump forced air into the fire pot in the forge. To properly bend and shape metal it must be "Red Hot." It has been said "Beating on cold iron will cause one to go to the bad place." Another mortal sin is charging too little for objects that have been made.

In the photo above is a lever operated forge. I picked it up in Southwest Missouri. You can see this forge in the museum in the old Court House in Iuka, Miss. Also you will find a large well used anvil



and a post vise. I found this anvil in an antique store in Georgia. I rebuilt the post vise by adding a new spring and with liquid steel new threads were installed inside so that the jaws of the vise could open and close. For many years blacksmithing has been one of my favorite hobbies.

My grandfather William Thomas McNutt had a water mill near Iuka. He also had a blacksmith shop. When he was not busy grinding corn for corn meal he worked in his shop. My son has a woodworking shop and also has some blacksmith equipment. I have given a hand powered forge to a grandson. His son who is my nine year old grandson seems to enjoy turning the air blower on my forge. So the McNutt blacksmithing tradition continues.


With no further business the meeting adjourned at 11:45 a.m. Freida and Joyce served refreshments.

Entries are Being Accepted in Shelter Calendar Fundraiser

The Corinth-Alcorn Animal Shelter 2018 pet photo contest calendar fundraiser recently launched at www.calendar.alcorn-pets.com.

With a \$6,500 fundraising goal set for the project, the funds raised from the photo contest and calendar sales will go directly to the no-kill animal shelter to help continue providing care to the thousands of abused, neglected, abandoned and injured animals in Corinth and Alcorn County in north-east Mississippi.

"This is our fifth year hosting a calendar fundraiser and it's always our biggest fundraiser of the year," said volunteer director Charlotte Doehner. "We can't wait to see the many cute pet photo entries we are sure to receive this year."

The online-based contest allows pet lovers to enter a photo of their cat, dog, horse, small mammal or bird. Each entry is \$15 and includes a guarantee that the entered photo will appear somewhere in the full color, full-sized wall calendar. Entrants can then vote for their photo for \$1 per vote with a five vote minimum or share their photo on social media and ask for votes.

"We set a goal this year of \$6,500," added Doehner. "It may seem high, but in 2017 the same contest raised \$6,492 not including sponsor contributions which helped offset printing costs."



The photo with the most votes at the end of the contest period will be the grand prize winner.

The pet will receive a professional photo session with local photographer Bill Avery. Shelter staff will select two photos from the photo session to be featured on the cover of the calendar and as a pet of the month inside the calendar. The original winning photo will also appear in the calendar.

The grand prize winner will also receive five free calendars and be the featured pet in all promotions for the shelter's 2019 calendar fundraiser.

The next 11 photos with the most votes will be featured as a pet of the month inside the calendar.

All eligible photo submissions not placing in the top-12 will appear in the calendar as inset squares on the monthly calendar pages. Each entrant will also receive one free calendar.

Photos entered must contain only pets, as those submitted with humans will be disqualified.

Although the online method of entry is pre-

ferred, the shelter will also accept mail-in and in-person entries through July 25 at 3825 Proper Street in Corinth, MS. 38834.

Each photo submission must include a note with name, phone number, pet's name and a brief description of the pet attached to the back of the photo.

Those photos will appear online for voting within 48 hours of receipt. The 2017 calendar featured former shelter rescue Rupert Sayre, a small terrier mix belonging to Cotter and Linda Sayre of Corinth.

Rupert received more than 770 votes in last year's calendar submission and voting contest. The 2018 calendars are expected to be available by November. Calendars will be \$15 each.

The shelter is also offering other ways to help with the calendar project. Friend of the Shelter sponsors allows a person to reserve a day in the calendar to honor their ani-

mal. "One idea is to celebrate your pet's forever home day," said Doehner.

Each day is \$25 and entrants will receive a free calendar.

Calendar sponsorships will also return this year.

For a \$50 donation, the sponsor will receive a 2x2 square block which will appear along the bottom of each month.

After attending the University of Chicago, he entered the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York in 1932. He was sponsored by Representative Oscar De Priest (R-IL) of Chicago, at the time, the only black member of Congress. During the four years of his Academy term, Davis was racially isolated by his White classmates, few of whom spoke to him outside the line of duty. He never had a roommate. He ate by himself. His classmates hoped that this would drive him out of the Academy. The "silent treatment" had the opposite effect. It made Davis more determined to graduate. Nevertheless, he earned the respect of his

classmates, as evidenced by the biographical note beneath his picture in the 1936 yearbook, the Howitzer:

The courage, tenacity, and intelligence with which he conquered a problem more difficult than plebe year won for him the sincere admiration of his classmates, and his single minded determination to continue in his chosen career cannot fail to inspire respect wherever fortune may lead him.

He graduated in 1936, 35th in a class of 276. He was the academy's fourth black graduate after Henry Ossian Flipper (1877), John Hanks Alexander (1887), and Charles Young (1889). When he was commissioned as a second lieutenant, the Army had only two black officers - Benjamin O. Davis Sr. and Benjamin O. Davis Jr. After graduation he married Agatha Scott.




