As their name would suggest they are breaking the boundaries of mainstream bluegrass, but their connection to the genre is undeniable and beautifully portrayed in the sound and themes in their music.

Iuka Methodist UMW Makes Sleeping Mats for the Needy

Last fall after Mary Baldwin visited the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) warehouse in Decatur, AL, the Iuka United Methodist Church (UMW) decided to undertake a project to make homeless mats from recycled plastic bags. These mats are lightweight, easy to carry, cool in the summer, retain body heat in the winter and dry quickly. We hosted a luncheon meeting and Mary invited Freida Betterton from Hartselle, AL, who had been making mats for several years and we also invited UMW ladies from the local Parish Church-Kass. During the past 8-10 months, bags were collected, smoothed, folded, cut into strips, joined into chain, rolled into "yarn"

balls and crocheted into fifth-five mats. Tuesday, June 12th, fourteen ladies representing Iuka UMC, Mt. Evergreen and Harmony toured the facility and presented the mats.

UMCOR is instrumental in providing disaster relief supplies (hurricanes, tornados, floods, fires, earthquakes), including cleaning supplies, tools, tarps, and personal items, nationwide as well as supplies to underdeveloped countries as not only much needed assistance but also outreach. Assistance is also provided in times of personal crisis to the homeless and others, including the Children's Casket Ministry which helps young couples unprepared emotionally and financially who deal with

the loss of an infant or small child.

Afterwards, we enjoyed a delicious lunch and period of contemplation and discussion of the amazing ministry we had observed. Following a short tour of historic Decatur, we returned safely home.

We wish to extend a special thank you to the ladies of Iuka Baptist Church, who made several mats, and to the students of TCHS Beta Club, patrons of Iuka Wellness Center, and the numerous people who came out and supported me.

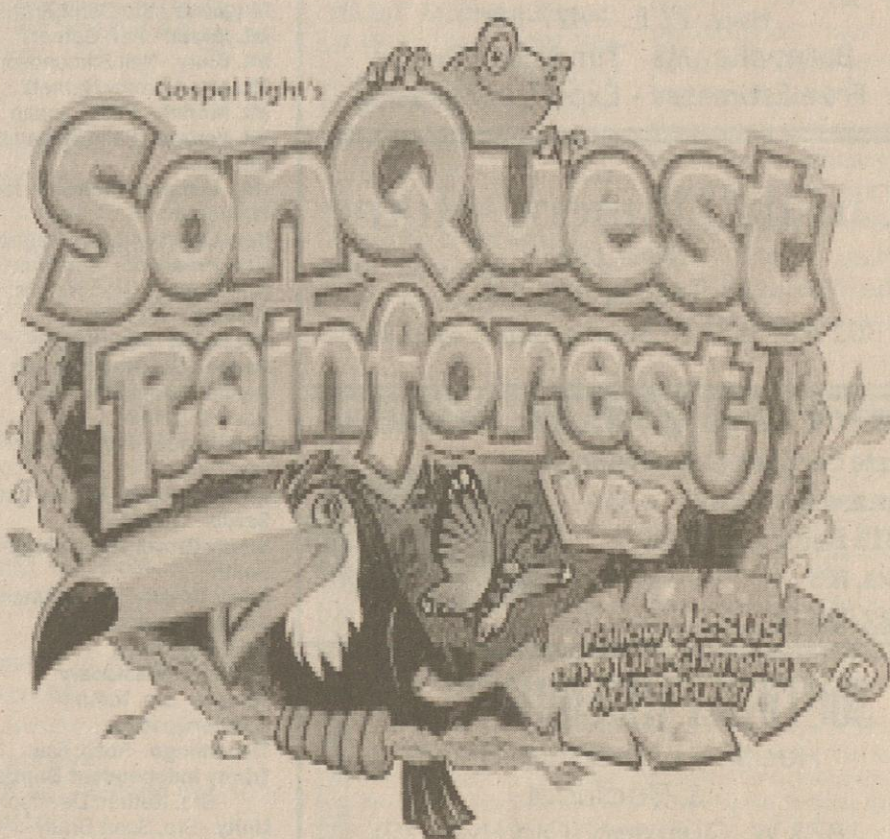

A Preview Of End-Time Events (part IX)

Most of us would never say that the Book of Revelation is easy to understand, and most of us would admit that we do not understand all of it. This, however, does not let us off the hook, for God has pronounced a blessing on those who "read, hear and keep the things that are written in this Book" (Revelation 1:3). I think it is wise to obey what God has said, and even then we do not perfectly obey or perfectly understand many things that God has said. With that said, I will return to Revelation 14:17-20: "And another angel came out of the temple which is in heaven, he also having a sharp sickle. And another angel came out from the altar, which had power over fire;

and cried with a loud cry to him that had the sharp sickle, saying, Thrust in thy sharp sickle, and gather the clusters of the vine of the earth; for her grapes are fully ripe. And the angel thrust in his sickle into the earth, and gathered the vine of the earth, and cast it into the great winepress of the wrath of God. And the winepress was trodden without the city, and blood came out of the winepress, even unto the horse bridles, by the space of a thousand and six hundred furlongs."

Judgment is a word that many people hate! They say that nobody has a right to judge others. Although God has not given final judgments into our hands, we are to be able to "judge" in some

sense, as is taught clearly in I Corinthians chapter six. None of us will ever be involved in the judgment that brings eternal doom to unbelievers, for that is given into the hands of Jesus Christ (John 5:22, 27; II Timothy 4:1). In our verses above we see angels used in bringing men to the place to be judged, but the "Judge behind the angelic judges" is still the Son of God! Revelation 14:14-16 does show Jesus reaping the ripe harvest

of the earth by judging wicked men. We saw an angel (Revelation 14:15) crying with a loud voice to the Son of man to thrust in His sickle and reap the earth. Now in Revelation 14:17-20 we see a different angel calling to another angel to thrust in his sharp sickle and to gather the vine of the earth. Some commentators think that this is the last remnant of unbelievers among Israel, which sounds logical. The third angel reaps the clusters of the vine of the

earth and thrusts it into the winepress of God's wrath. The winepress is used to trample under foot the ripe grapes and press the juice out of them. Symbolically this is saying that Christ is going to trample unbelievers under His feet. This particular trampling will be the battle of Armageddon, which men start and the Son of God finishes. Blood will run for 200 miles, the distance from Jerusalem to the south of Edom in Bible days. The blood will run as deep as a horse's bridle in some places. The language used in Revelation 14:20 says that the "winepress was trod without the city", meaning Jerusalem. The One doing the treading will be Jesus; the area will be the valley

of Jehoshaphat, according to Joel 3:2: "I will gather all nations, and bring them down into valley of Jehoshaphat, and will plead with them there for My people and for My heritage Israel, whom have scattered among nations, and parted the land." If it is correct to assume that the cluster of the vine means Israel, this would be the people of Israel that never came to faith in Christ, along with other nations indicated in Revelation 14:14. A scam is a dishonest way to make money by deceiving others. Dictionary definition is a fraudulent scheme performed by a dishonest individual, group or company in an attempt to obtain money or something else of value from unsuspecting persons.

Words associated with scams include fraud, swindle, racket, trick, double-cross or dupe.

One of the strangest scams I have heard of lately is especially perplexing for senior citizens who spend a lot of time keeping medical appointments. A caller calls your home phone asking to verify a medical appointment. This person then asks for your doctor's name and tells the person called that she must verify other medical information.

Hang up immediately, anyone calling about a medical date will know your doctor's name and all your information should be in their files. This is just a way to obtain your history for fraudulent purposes.

This is an addition to the many other scams using Social Security, IRS, credit card information, debit card purchases, and advising of the death of someone you might know.

Every person I have come into contact with has been a victim of a scam of some kind. The IRS and Social Security will not call you regarding a debt. Most likely they will send a certified letter requiring your signature. I have heard of bank accounts being cleaned out completely. Large purchases made on debit cards and a lot of strange hang-up calls.

It is easy to become a victim if you let your guard down. Stay alert for any call out of the ordinary.

Recently I received a letter stating that I had won two and a half million dollars. I needed to contact the sender immediately. This looked official and had several Hispanic names on signature lines. I showed this letter - not believing for a minute that it was real - to several friends. We had a laugh and for a moment I wondered what poor me would do with all that money. I did the sensible thing, tossed it in the garbage can. Another day, my debit card was declined at Piggly Wiggly. Lucky for me, I had other means of payment. I called the telephone number on the back of my card learning that the card was declined because someone had tried to charge \$700.00 on it claiming to be Barnes & Noble. I cut that card into many pieces. Thanks to smart bank personnel, I averted a disaster.

I now let the machine answer my telephone on my desk at home. My friends have my mobile phone number. I do not answer calls from out of our area. Also, I have had a call supposedly from Publishing Clearing House telling me that they had reviewed the packet of information I had sent them and that I could now claim my prize. Since I had not sent a packet of information, I hung up the phone.

Be cautious when someone offers something that is too good to be true. And remember Social Security, Internal Revenue, and Medicare do not call for personal information. These times are unusual for all of us lets do what we can to avoid being a victim. Diligence on our part may keep us from going bankrupt.

Black American in Aviation
 Benjamin O. Davis, Jr.
 Dec. 18, 1912 - July 4, 2002
 continuation

At the start of his junior year at West Point, Davis had applied for the Army Air Corps but was rejected because it did not accept blacks. He was instead assigned to the all-black 24th Infantry Regiment (one of the original Buffalo Soldier regiments) at Fort Benning, Georgia. He was not allowed inside the base officers' club.

He later attended the U.S. Army Infantry School at Fort Benning, and then was assigned to teach military tactics at Tuskegee Institute, a historically black college in Tuskegee, Alabama. This was something his father had done years before, as a way for the Army to avoid having a black officer in command of white soldiers.

Early in 1941, the Roosevelt administration, in response to public pressure for greater black participation in the military as war approached, ordered the War Department to create a black flying unit. Captain Davis was assigned to the first training class at Tuskegee Army Air Field (hence the name Tuskegee Airmen), and in March 1942 earned his wings as one of five black officers to complete the course. He was the first black officer to solo an Army Air Corps aircraft.

In July that year, having been promoted to lieutenant colonel, he was named commander of the first all-black air unit, the 99th Pursuit Squadron.

The squadron, equipped with Curtiss P-40 fighters, was sent to Tunisia in North Africa in the spring of 1943. On June 2, they saw combat for the first time in a dive-bombing mission against the German-held island of Pantelleria as part of Operation Corkscrew. [2] The squadron later supported the Allied invasion of Sicily.

In September 1943, Davis was deployed to the United States to take command of the 332nd Fighter Group, a larger all-black unit preparing to go overseas. Soon after his arrival, there was an attempt to stop the use of black pilots in combat. Senior officers in the Army Air Forces recommended to the Army chief of staff, General George Marshall, that the 99th (Davis's old unit) be removed from combat operations as it had performed poorly. This infuriated Davis as he had never been told of any deficiencies with the unit. He held a news conference at The Pentagon to defend his men and then presented his case to a War Department committee studying the use of black servicemen.

Marshall ordered an inquiry but allowed the 99th to continue fighting in the meantime. The inquiry eventually reported that the 99th's performance was comparable to other air units, but any questions about the squadron's fitness were answered in January 1944 when its pilots shot down 12 German planes in two days while protecting the Anzio beachhead.

Man Walks Across America to Raise Awareness for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder

Veteran Joe Copeland, 39 of Austin, Texas is walking from Virginia Beach, Virginia to Long Beach, California to raise awareness for those veterans who experience P.T.S.D.

Beginning the walk on March 20th 2017, it is Joe's goal to walk around 10 miles a day until he reaches his destination. He was joined by his 72 year-old mother, Tonya Copeland, in Nashville; she wishes to support him along his journey and walk with him to Hurricane, Mississippi.

He is also traveling with his devoted service dog, Mollie. She is a special breed, Blue Lacy; these breeds are available only in Burnett, Texas. Mollie is an emotional support service animal and will be traveling with him as far as Pontotoc, Mississippi, which will be a total of 1022 miles that she has traveled with Joe.

Moving through town to town they reach out to people they meet along the way; they sometimes seek lodging and shelter in churches, people's homes

and sometimes rest stops. They travel with camping gear and supplies in carts. He has replaced the wheels on the carts three times so far. They choose the path where they will be able to meet with the greatest population and educate the people on Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. As a kid Joe was obsessed with the idea of traveling west as the wagon trains did and this idea of long treks developed into a way for him to bring light to a cause that he is passionate about. He is a veteran of a naval construction battalion who shipped out with the marines; he served two tours in Iraq and has personal experience with P.T.S.D. Statistically 22 veterans commit suicide every day; that equals out to a death by suicide every 80 minutes.

July 4th was Joe's birthday and the staff of the Tishomingo County News wishes him "Happy Birthday" and safe travels.

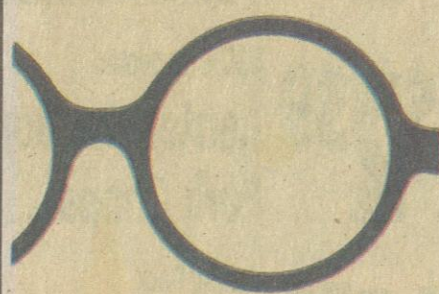

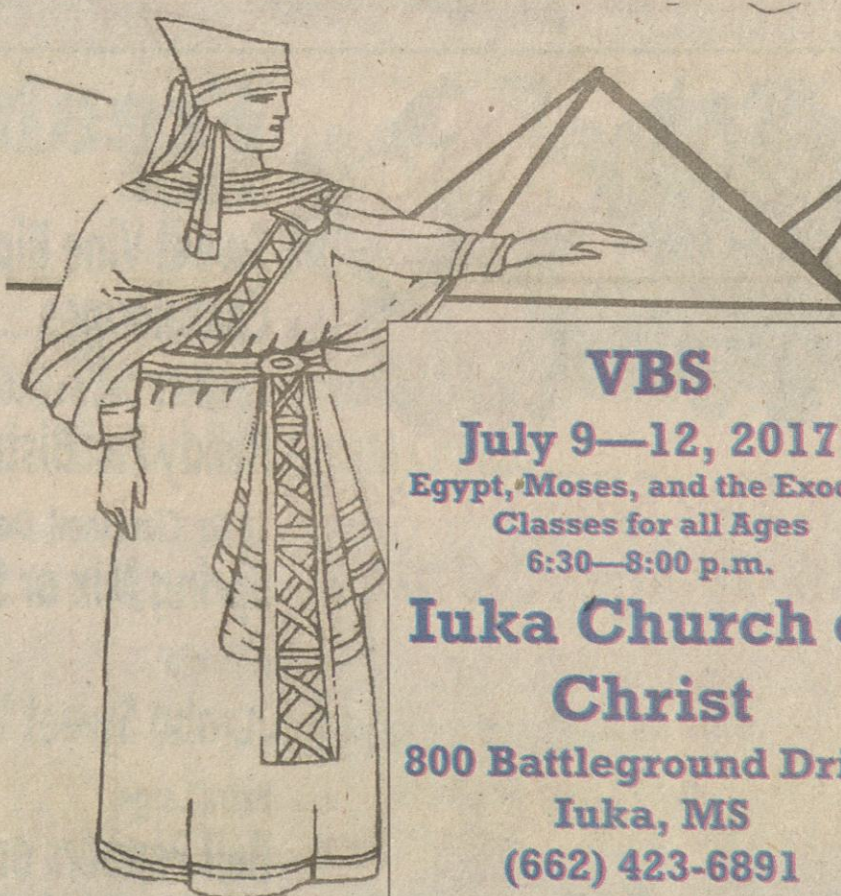

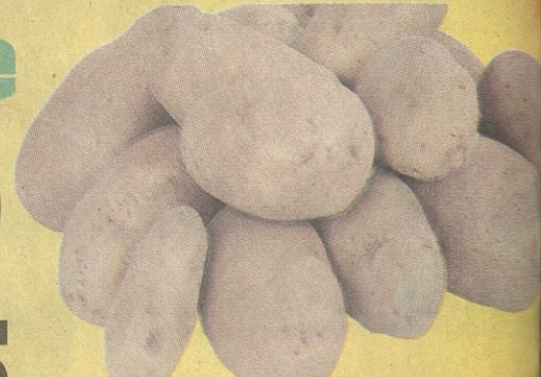
