Services Held for Former Iuka Mayor and Businessman

John H. Biggs, 87, former Iuka Mayor, City Judge and businessman died Thursday, July 20, 2017 at Southern Magnolia Assisted Living in Iuka. Born September 26, 1929 in Harmony/Central Community north of Iuka, his ancestors were some of the first settlers in the area and his love for the land and its people was instilled deep in his heart from an early age. After serving in the U. S. Army, he and his wife, the former Daisy Daugherty and daughter, Charlotte, made their home in Iuka and Johnny went to work at the local newspaper in 1953 as a pressman. He continued his career in the newspaper business purchasing the local newspaper "The Vidette" in 1969 and began publishing "The Tishomingo County News - The Vidette." Mr. Biggs' political career began in 1965 when he was elected to the seat of Alderman. Two years later in 1967 he was elected Mayor following the resignation of Mayor George Marshall, who had been elected county sheriff. Beginning his long career in 1969 he served the people of Iuka for 20 years until his retirement in 1989. These 20 years held many promising opportunities for Iuka and its people. With the leadership of Mayor Biggs and his fine record of Aldermen, the city grew, doubling in size and welcoming many new industries. With Iuka's strategic location on the Tennessee River, many projects relating to water were completed. The area became a thriving town during the construction of the Tenn-Tom Waterway

and the construction of the TVA Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant just miles from Iuka. The construction of the Yellow Creek Port and the Natchez Trace Parkway also brought new folks to the area. During this time Governor Bill Waller appointed Mayor Biggs to serve on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway Authority Board, giving him the opportunity to promote Iuka and Tishomingo County throughout the South. When TVA shut down the construction of the nuclear power plant, NASA moved into the area and began the construction of a site to build solid rocket boosters at Yellow Creek. Mayor Biggs continued his leadership of the town in the same personal and "good ole boy style" for which he had always been known. He was a man who spoke his opinion and didn't back down. His word was his bond and everyone respected him for it. He was a crucial person.

Fatal Accident Claims the Life of Corinth Man

A Corinth man was killed in a one vehicle accident in Tishomingo County Friday evening, July 21, around 5:30.

According to authorities, the wreck occurred on the Old Steel Bridge Road, north of Iuka. Orion Hughey, age 25 of Corinth, was the passenger in the car that was killed. The driver of the car, Toby White, of Iuka and another female passenger were airlifted for medical treatment.

The individuals were traveling in a 89' BMW convertible when the vehicle left the road and struck a power pole and then hit a tree while driving through a curve in the road. Reports indicate that one or more of the individuals may have been ejected from the vehicle. The condition of the driver and passenger involved in the wreck is unclear at this time.

Former Iuka Man Killed in Motorcycle Accident in Muscle Shoals on Friday

The Muscle Shoals Police Department is investigating a fatal crash that happened around 9:40 p.m. on Friday evening, July 21 at the intersection of Woodward Ave. and 6th St.

Authorities say that Charles "Cookie" Cook, 41, of Muscle Shoals, AL (formerly of Iuka, MS) was traveling south on Woodward Ave. on a motorcycle when an SUV travelling north on Woodward Ave. entered the left turn lane and turned West onto 6th in front of the motorcycle.

Muscle Shoals Police Chief, Clint Reck confirmed that Charles Cook was pronounced

dead at the scene of the crash.

Police say that surveillance video obtained from a nearby business shows that the motorcycle had a green light.

The crash remains under investigation. Police have not released any information on the status of the driver of the SUV, Michael Franks, or whether there could be any potential charges stemming from the wreck.

Charles Calvin Cook, Jr., of Muscle Shoals, passed away on Friday, July 21, 2017 at the age of 41. The funeral service will be Thursday, July 27, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. at Morrison Funeral Home

Chapel in Cherokee with Jerrell Gillentine and Lance Foster officiating. He will be buried in Oak Grove Cemetery, Iuka.

Charles was preceded in death by his mother, Portia Franks.

He is survived by his loving wife, Labrisca Cook; son, River Cook; father, Charles Calvin Cook, Sr.; stepfather, Roger Helton and wife Donna; brother, Sean Helton and wife Anna; niece, Juliana Helton; and nephew, Quinlan Helton.

Pallbearers will be David Gist, Ryan Boyd, Michael Ricketts, Jamie Smith, Lee Landis, and Blair Davis.

Regional Libraries in Financial Crisis

The Northeast Regional Library System in Mississippi has experienced some devastating cuts to their funding with more expected in the coming year; financial loss may force certain branches to close without support.

A main source of funding for public libraries comes from a portion of the county's budget which is determined and distributed to them by each county's Board of Supervisors; the cities and towns where each library is located is responsible for the upkeep of the grounds and buildings. The Northeast Regional Library System receives certain state funding and a small

portion of their funds comes from the library's fees that they charge their patrons for things like overdue books and making copies.

State funding has been significantly reduced this year; four budget cuts have occurred so far and more cuts are expected. The Libraries in our region are asking the county supervisors to consider increasing their allotted funds by 10% or they will be forced to close some of the smaller branches, and greatly reduce the operating hours for the remaining branches. The closing of libraries throughout our region would be a great loss to the communities they serve.

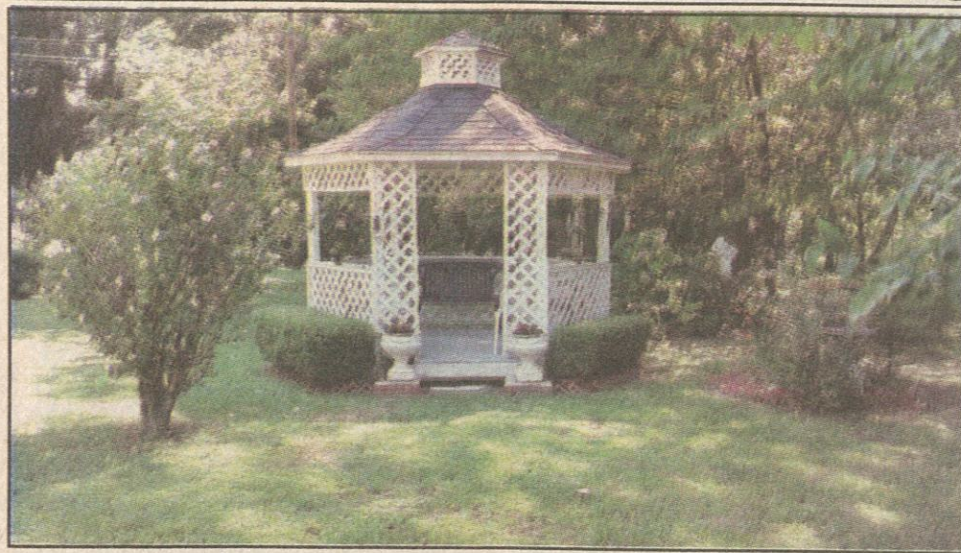

Yard of the Month

The lovely yard of Lela South on Pine Lane in Iuka was recently selected as the July Yard of the Month by the 20th Century Club. Members of the club dropped by to present the award and to take in the early summer growth spurred by recent rains. Mrs. South recalls that 53 years ago, her house was only one of three sitting on a gravel road that was dubbed "Pine Lane" because the subdivision was situated on a former tree farm. Her yard in 1964 was a collection of unruly pine saplings and red clay. Today, time plus many days and hours of yard

work, have transformed the yard into a sprawling garden. Statues of deer peek out from under a canopy of hickory, maple, oak and redbud. Scattered throughout the yard are fully grown trees of all species including hop horn bean, ginkgo and the classic southern tree called the catalpa. Her grancy greybeard tree, which blooms with fragrant white lacy blossoms in the spring, originated from Hattiesburg where extended family members reside. Mrs. South's favorite plants remain the "pass along" plants she has received over the years from friends

and family. Her mother, Rena Nunley, was an avid gardener and lover of roses, and Mrs. Nunley's pink American Beauty rose still blooms next to the South home. Different varieties of buttercups emerge in the spring and hailed from the hill top home of Effie and Jessie Grisham. Very special to Mrs. South are the plants and flowers given to her by her six sisters over the years. Mrs. South continues to feed the birds and squirrels that gather to share the bounty of her yard and to enjoy the serenity provided by her small forest of trees.

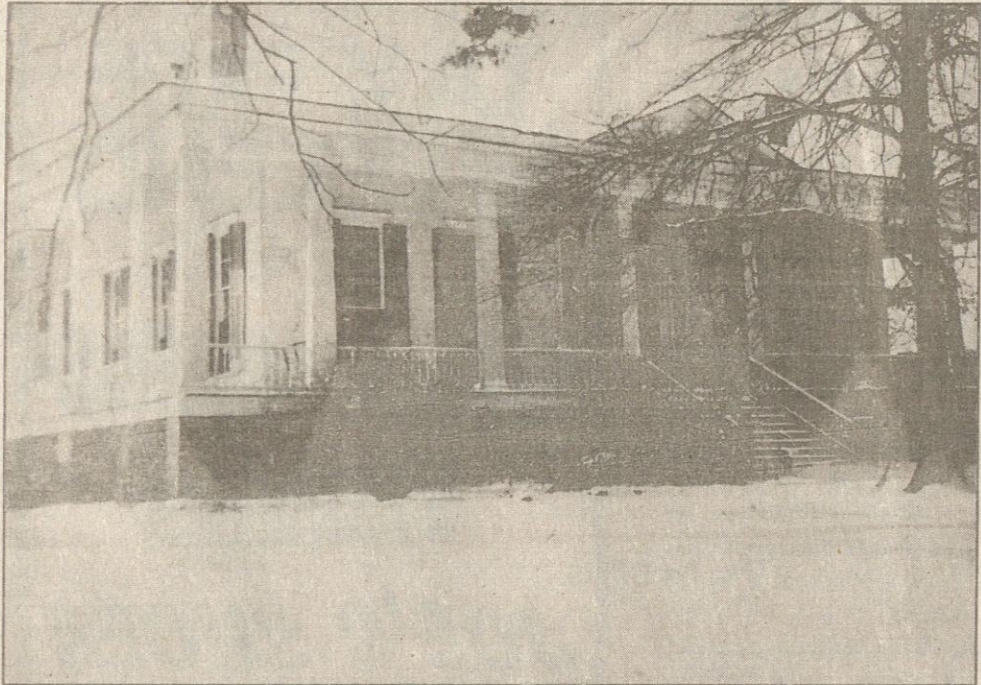

She is sharing this rare photo of the home taken from the east side during a heavy snow. Mrs. Thesmar is a descendant of the Williams and the DeWoody families, early settlers of Iuka and Eastport. She said that the home located next to the McDonald home on the east side belonged to her grandmother Williams and she spent many wonderful times in the house. She said her grandmother always said that her house was in the rose garden of the McDonald home. The house she is referring to still stands today and in the 1950's was known as the Gober home. Little history has been written about the house, so we are hoping Mrs. Thesmar can give us more details of this beautiful old home.

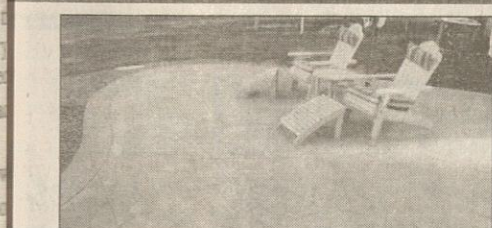

Seven Angels with the Seven Last Plagues

The number seven is used many times in the Book of Revelation, as well as in all of the Bible. This number gives the idea of completion, so God is saying that He will bring His program of judgment by plagues to completion by the seven last plagues, although there will be other judgments and dooms of different natures given in Revelation. Revelation chapters 15 and 16 shows these seven last plagues, then Revelation chapter 17 shows the judgment of "mystery Babylon", or the one world religion; chapter 18 shows the judgment of commercial Babylon, or the one world government, with its commerce and trade. Revelation chapter 19 shows the joy of glorified saints; the marriage of the Lamb to His bride, the church; the

second coming of Christ to earth and Armageddon. having the seven last plagues; for in them is filled up the wrath of God. And I saw as it were a sea of glass mingled with fire: and them that had gotten the victory over the beast, and over his image, and over his mark, and over the number of his name, stand on the sea of glass, having the harps of God. And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvelous are Thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are Thy ways, Thou King of saints. Who shall

not fear Thee O Lord, and glorify Thy name? for Thou only art holy; for all nations shall come and worship before Thee; for Thy judgments are made manifest." There is more here than I can bring out, but I will cover the gist of it. The sign of the seven angels with the seven last plagues is a marvelous thing in the eyes of John, as well as in the eyes of all believers, at least when all believers come to understand what God is doing in judging wickedness and wicked people. Before John gets into the vial

judgments, he shows us how God's judgment looks to those who will live in the tribulation, die as martyrs and thus have victory over the beast, his image and his mark. These will die, but they will stand on the tranquil sea of glass in heaven and praise God for victory over the devil and his henchman, the anti-christ. These victors will stand on the sea of glass, which is mingled with fire, perhaps a reflection of the glory of God.

The song of the victorious believers in view here will be accompanied by harps and will use the theme of Moses' song of victory, as recorded in Exodus chapter 15. I love songs that are worth singing, and here is one for certain! The song glorifies both the Father and the Son (the Lamb) by

speaking of His marvelous works; His mighty power and His just judgment. The Lord is addressing the King of saints, or believers; He is recognized as being just and true as being proclaimed as the One Who is holy. The song says that all nations will worship because His judgment made manifest. We have not seen the end of "show" yet, but it is coming. Walk dogs during the morning or evening when it is a little cooler. Let them walk on the grass instead of concrete or asphalt to protect their pads. Consider providing a kiddie pool for your fur friends so they can cool off. Never ever leave your pet in a car as the temperature rises very quickly and this can be deadly.
