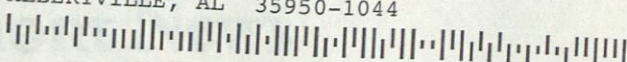

Ray Weeks, was the former principal of Nettleton Junior High, and spent 11 years as the head football coach at Hamilton High School.

The duties of head coach are now being taken up by Jim McCay.

Tourism Tax Defeated by Large Margin Throughout County

Small Turnout in Tuesday's Special Election

The voters of Tishomingo County have spoken again, the 2% Tourism Tax did not pass in the special election that was held on September 12th.

There was a very low turnout for the special election which had stirred much controversy, especially on Social Media. Out of the 12,219 registered voters only 1991 ballots were cast in this election which accounts for 16.29% of voters. 672 or 33.80% of the qualified voters cast their votes for the tax increase while 1,316 or 66.20% of voters said no to the tax increase.

This is the second time a tourism tax vote did not pass for Tishomingo County; the last time it was voted on was during the 2012 regular election.

During that election 40% of the votes were for a tourism tax.

Body Recovered from Bear Creek

Jordan Flanagan, 23, of Iuka was pronounced dead on September 10th at 4:48 p.m. after an extensive search of Bear Creek Lake near the Alabama - Mississippi State Line. The search for his body started Saturday evening, however unfavorable weather conditions caused the rescue workers to disband the search until the following morning.

Reports indicate that Flanagan and another individual had climbed onto the train tracks which cross over Bear Creek after securing their boat to the trestle; at this point it seems likely that he was struck by an oncoming train and fell into the water. The Colbert County Coroner, Justin Gasque stated that the investigation into this matter is on-going and could take several weeks to obtain all of the details; an autopsy is being performed to determine the exact cause of death.

The body was located in approximately 8 to 10 feet of water around 100 yards away from the train tracks by using sonar and underwater cameras; divers were called in to retrieve the body once it was found.

Jordan was employed at Johnson Construction out of Savannah, TN. He enjoyed life to the fullest. Spending time with his friends was his favorite thing.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, September 16, 2017 at 3:00 P.M. at New Salem Baptist Church. Cutshall

Skull Identified

The human skull which was found on August 31st at a residence on County Road 247 has been positively identified as the partial human remains of Susie Rena Lanier, 43 of Iuka. Lanier was reported missing on June 6th 2017 from Whitfield Trailer Park in Iuka.

Sheriff's Office responded to the report of the skull being found and dental records obtained by Sheriff Daugherty confirmed that it did in fact belong to Lanier. The search continues at this time though currently, no more human remains have been located.

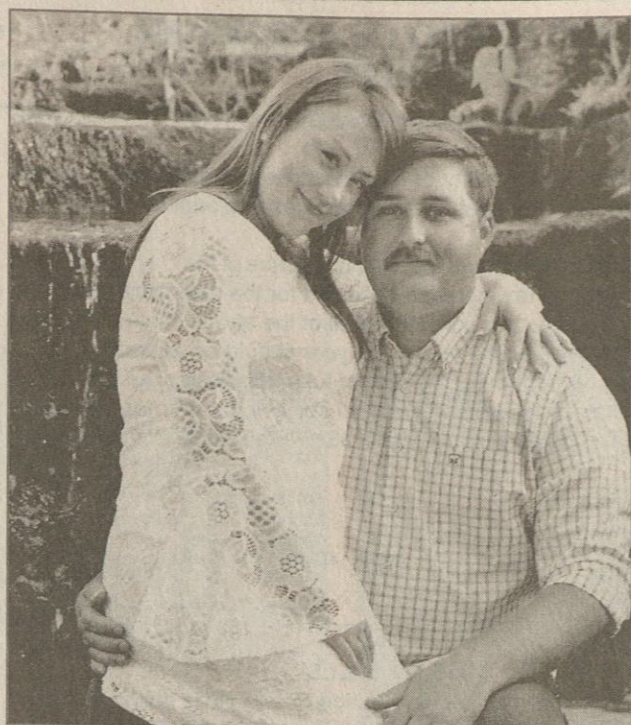

The couple will exchange vows at 6:00 pm, September 23, 2017 at Quail Hollow in Ramer, Tn. Friends and family are invited to attend.



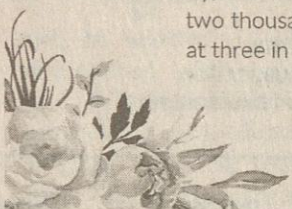

Tishomingo Evaluates the City's Trees and Obtains a Grant to Preserve Them

The Town of Tishomingo has recently engaged tree preservation specialists to evaluate all of the trees growing along city streets and in public areas.

Matt Copley of Fulgham's Inc. was recently in town going from tree to tree to access the health of each checking for disease and damage. Mr. Copley is an International Society of Arboriculture Certified Arborist. The ISA requires an advanced degree in arboriculture, horticulture, forestry or landscape architecture with at least 3 years of supervised experience to award this certification. Mr. Copley works out of Tupelo for Fulgham's, which serves 10 Southeastern states providing tree care for individuals, businesses, communities, and most campuses of the SEC. They work to restore mature trees, remediate urban soil decline problems, and address disease management using a patented aeration technology process if needed.

Mr. Copley has provided the town with a detailed evaluation that identifies trees that need to be removed or pruned, treated for disease, or fertilized. The town has obtained a \$20,000 grant to help with this care. Included in the grant is funding to remove 6 trees that are in danger of falling, so called "killer trees", that will be cut immediately. In addition, others are being pruned and treated to improve their overall health. The grant includes money to purchase 18 trees to replace those removed and add others in public areas. Mayor Tennyson said, "We have a beautiful community with many mature trees and it is important that we do all

we can to maintain those trees and continue to re-plant trees for the future as we did with the Centennial Tree Program."

Trees are important for not only the beauty they provide, but for the cooling value and water run-off protection they provide. According to energy scientists, one tree equals ten room air conditioners running 20 hours per day in its air-cooling ability. Tree roots and the canopy protect the soil and help control water run-off in heavy rains, which in turn helps the operation of town drains and sewer systems. In addition, property values are increased by up to 20% with the presence of mature trees. Tishomingo hopes to preserve and protect the valuable resource found in our trees.

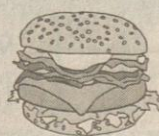

Today it has been taken down to be the new home of Subway.

Frank's Dairy was a thriving business in Iuka in the 1950's and 60's. It was owned and operated by the late Frank Shoffner and was a frequent tour spot for local school children. The night of the fire two young men, John Huffman and Doug Murray, who had been working late helping to dismantle the Fair that was in town, spotted the fire and set off the alarm. The swift action of the all volunteer fire department saved part of the structure.

Seven Angels With The Seven Last Plagues (part VIII)

prince of the power of the air, so the pouring out of this vial is to be understood as a judgment on the kingdom of Satan, both in the heavens among his fallen angels and on earth where the antichrist is controlling Satan's final kingdom. The voice from the throne of God and out of His temple shows that God is the One in charge of the judgments of the seven angels with the seven vials. When God says, "It is done", this means that the

seven vial judgments will be done when the last one is poured out.
