Gary had worked 37 years he Tishomingo County Elec-Power Association. He redin 2015 after suffering with knees which impaired his rking ability. He was always ghing, smiling and telling a I tale." I thought of the late bin Williams when I heard

this sad news about my friend, we never know who is hurting and covering it with a smile. All who knew Gary feels in their heart that he never had any intention of hurting anyone but himself.

According to his brother, Harold Lomenick, Gary had fallen off the top of his house recently and had been in severe pain and taking pain tablets. He was going through some personal problems, but this was a horrible shock for the entire family.

North Mississippi Medical Center released a statement on Monday saying, "An unfortunate incident took place at North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka on October 7. We are thankful that no harm came to our staff, patients or visitors. The deceased was not one of our patients or employees. We extend our condolences to the

Editor's note: It is the policy of this newspaper not to use the word suicide in our reporting. The taking of one's own life is a private thing that a grieving family and friends must endure without reading about the details in the local news. Unfortunately this suicide affected innocent people in a public building which made it a news story. Unkind words, rumors and untruths spread fast enough in a small town and on social media without the help of a local news source. Following last week's mass shooting in Las Vegas, fear spread throughout our community long after the situation was over at the hospital after a television source described the incident as "an active shooter." This is a common term used in our national media today. Thank God there was no "active shooter" at our hospital.
