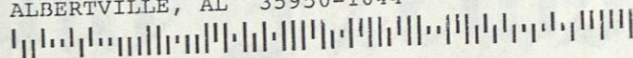

## Lieutenant Governor Tate Reeves and Legislators Visit Vanleigh RV and Mississippi Silicon

Burnsville, Mississippi, October 11, 2017. Lieutenant Governor Tate Reeves, area legislators, the board of supervisors, and other officials toured Vanleigh RV and Mississippi Silicon.

Vanleigh RV is a manufacturer of high quality fifth wheel recreational vehicles. Producing four to five units per day, the company employs around 200. The company plans to increase production to eight units per day in 2018.

Mississippi Silicon is a manufacturer of industrial grade silicon, an element used in over 5,000 silicone products from shampoo to sealants to paints to cosmetics; as an alloy in aluminum products, especially for auto parts; and for polysilicon which is further processed into computer chips and solar cells. Mississippi Silicon employs over 140 and has plans to continue to grow.

Senator Rita Parks reported that "we try to plan visits like this one to keep state officials informed of our progress and

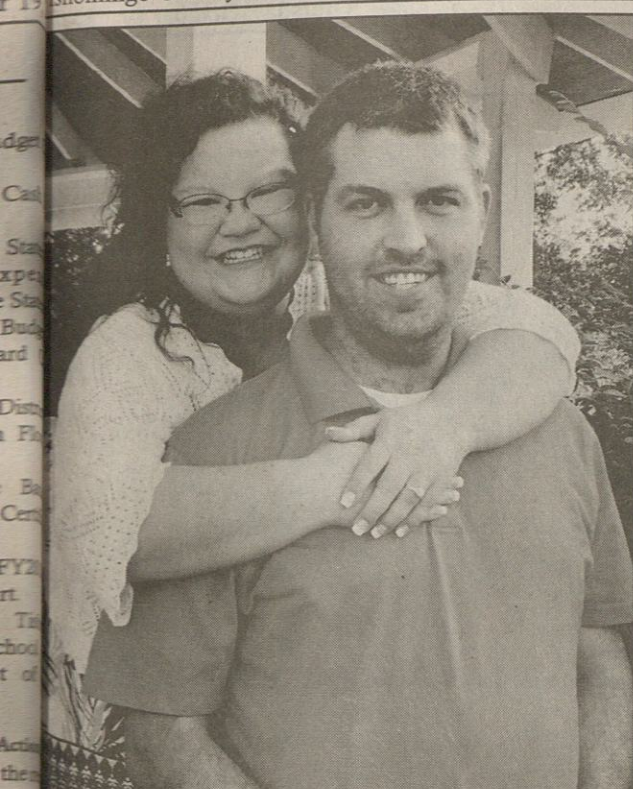

## Take Back Old Drugs to Sheriff's Department

On Saturday, October 28, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration will give the public its 14th opportunity in 7 years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your pills for disposal to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 1208 Bettydale Drive, Iuka, MS. (The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches.) The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Last April Americans turned in 450 tons (900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at almost 5,500 sites operated by the DEA and more than 4,200 of its state and local law enforcement partners. Overall, in its 13 previous Take Back events, DEA and its partners have taken in over 8.1 million pounds—more than 4,050 tons—of pills.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

### Shiloh National Military Park Announces Chickasaw Heritage Festival at Shiloh Indian Mounds National Historic Landmark

SHILOH, Tennessee — On October 28, Shiloh National Military Park will host the Chickasaw Heritage Festival at the Shiloh Indian Mounds National Historic Landmark, located on Shiloh Battlefield.

The one day festival will bring together traditional Native American music, demonstrations, storytelling, and scholarly presentations. Tribe members from the Chickasaw Nation will return to their ancestral homeland for a day of cultural demonstrations that include stickball, the Chickasaw Nation dance, archeology, and storytelling. National Park rangers will also be demonstrating pre-historic weapons of the Native Americans.

"The Shiloh Indian Mounds National Historic Landmark preserves remnants of a Mississippian Era Indian village that is culturally affiliated with the Chickasaw Nation," said Superintendent Jeff Wilkerson. "We are pleased to partner with our friends at the Chickasaw Nation and the Indiana Foundation to present a variety of American Indian activities to our visitors."

Shiloh is one of the few places in the eastern United States where remains of pre-historic houses are still visible on the ground's surface. About 800 years ago, a town occupied the high Tennessee River at the eastern edge of the Shiloh plateau. Between two steep ravines, a wooden palisade enclosed the earthen mounds and dozens of houses. Six

mounds, rectangular in shape with flat tops, probably served as platforms for the town's important buildings. These structures may have included a council house, religious buildings, and residences of the town's leaders. The early inclusion of the mounds area within the boundary of the national military park has protected the site from any modern use. Because the Shiloh site has never been disturbed by the plow, the daub of collapsed walls still stands as low rings or mounds.



Performing onsite will be the Native American flute band "Injunuity," whose songs promote the introduction of Native American music and history into popular culture. "Native Americans have profoundly helped shape the United States. The music of Injunuity helps revisit these times and keep them alive through song," writes Injunuity.

Throughout the day, scholarly talks on Indian culture and site archeology will be provided by Dr. Brad Lieb, Tribal Archeologist for the Chickasaw Nation; John Cornelison, Archeologist for the National Park Service; Dr. David G. Anderson,

Professor and Associate Head of Anthropology at the University of Tennessee at Knoxville; and Paul Welch, Associate Professor of Anthropology at Southern Illinois University, Carbondale.

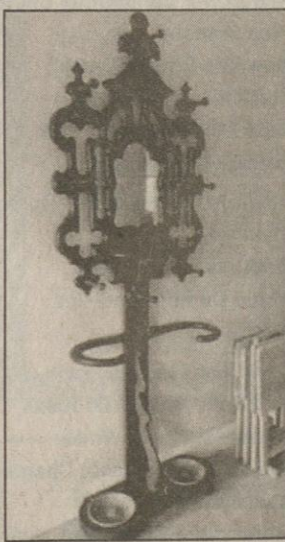

# The Judgment of the One World Church

There has been much talk, and also much action, for several decades concerning the matter of getting all religions, or at least all churches, together. The problem is that not all religions, nor all churches, believe the same things. Moreover, there are true and false elements in all churches and religions, for none of us knows all the truth of God. There is no perfect church or religion, but that does not mean that we should make efforts to get all churches and religions together. There will be a time when all of these will come together, but it will be after the rapture of the church, as I see it, and it will be a move of Satan, not an act of God! It is interesting that God has always called on His people to be a separated people. No, this does not mean that we are to stand aloof from everybody who does not believe exactly

like us, but it does mean that we should know what the Bible teaches, at least the main themes, and we should not align ourselves with a religious group that stands against those.

There has been a movement, especially among some churches, to get everybody together around a certain central doctrine. There is no problem with getting together around a Bible doctrine, as long as there is also general agreement on the rest of the clearly taught doctrines in the Bible. One problem that I see in modern day churches is that some people seem to think that all services that can arouse the emotions of

people must be under the influence of the Holy Spirit. I think it is high time that more churches get back to what is taught in Scripture, instead of seeking to "feel good" in their emotions. Emotions are a gift from God, but we still have to learn to allow the Spirit of God to control those emotions, not some bar room music that has a few "Christianized words" in it! I am coming to my subject; I am just trying to lay some groundwork for what I want to say about the one-world church. You see, the devil is not against religion; he is only against biblical religion, and there is such a religion, for James men-

tions a certain side of it in James 1:26-27. The devil is a master at picking out the parts of man's religions that will fit his program, and he is going to put those together to form a world religion that has nothing to do with salvation by the blood of Christ! Can you not see it on the horizon? The moves that are taking place in even some good churches are helping to pave the way for one big, false church. A part of that move is a departure from Scripture and doctrinal studies in churches; another part of that movement is music that is sensual and has no message about a risen Savior, if it does have a message, the movement and music of the song may drown it out, so that only the "fleshly emotions" are moved, with the spirit left standing in a dry, cold spot where no real movement of the Spirit of God is welcomed!

Revelation chapter 17 will be our chapter concerning the "one-world church". No, the chapter does not use that term, but the content of the chapter shows clearly that there is something "religious" in this movement, but there is nothing really "spiritual" in it, at least not in the right spirit. Man's spirit can be moved in many directions that are not necessarily God's directions. It seems that many churches and religions of our day have overlooked this point. There is certainly a distinction to be made between the human spirit and the Holy Spirit, but some people have never been "scripturally trained" to discern which is which. In the next article I will get to Revelation chapter 17, but I thought it necessary to lay this groundwork first.

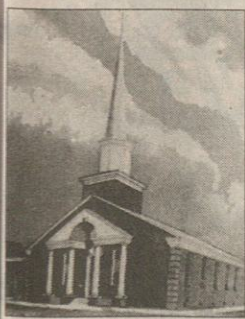

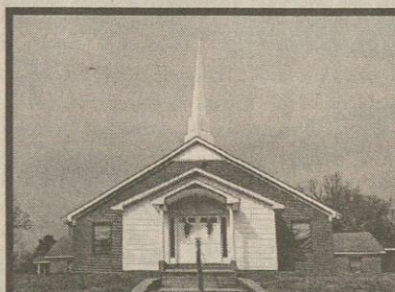

# Mississippi County Native, Engineer Jerry Bostick, and Apollo Astronauts Share Lessons from Space at MSU

STARKVILLE, Miss.—Three men who helped America soar to new heights with NASA's Apollo space missions shared their stories Wednesday [Oct. 11] with the Mississippi State community.

To celebrate Mississippi State's admission into the prestigious Astronaut Scholarship Foundation, astronauts Charlie Duke and Fred Haise, along with MSU alum and Apollo engineer Jerry Bostick, spoke to a large crowd in Hall's Betterworth

Auditorium about their journeys during a time when astronauts were completing missions that captured the imagination of the American public.

For Duke, the Apollo 16 mission he went on became a family affair. He took a family photo of himself, his wife and two kids with him when he went to the moon in 1972. As one of his last acts before he left the moon, he left the photo on the lunar surface, where it remains today.

"I was able to take a

picture of my picture on the moon," Duke said. "It ended up becoming kind of an iconic image."

All three men discussed the intense training and planning that was required to send a crew to space and back safely.

"Most of the time, the missions were a breeze compared to all the simulations we did," said Bostick, who served as a flight engineer on the Apollo missions.

The Apollo 13 mission Haise flew on was an example of a mission becoming

more difficult than the training and simulations. The mission's goal was a third lunar landing, but an oxygen tank explosion forced the crew to abort the lunar landing and devise a new plan to return safely to Earth. The mission was chronicled in a suspenseful 1995 feature film, in which Bill Paxton played the role of Haise. A Biloxi native, Haise said everyone involved with every mission was ready for a wide range of difficult situations.

Duke was a backup astronaut for Apollo 13 and was the capsule communicator, or CAPCOM, during the Apollo 11 mission, serving as the astronauts' link to mission control while man attempted to land on the moon for the first time.

"We practiced every possible failure we could see," Duke said. "We knew which issues we couldn't recover from. The training was so good that you instantly respond with

the correct emergency response."

When Haise and Duke were on their missions, Bostick was at mission command working as a flight engineer. The Golden native studied civil engineering at MSU and joined NASA after a chance encounter with a recruiter from NASA's Langley Research Center led to a change of post-graduation plans in 1961. He said 22 MSU alumni were involved with the Apollo missions.

MSU is joining 35 other top research universities nationwide and is one of five institutions recently added to the ASF. MSU is the only university in Mississippi included in the ASF program, which aims to help the U.S. retain its world leadership in science and technology by providing scholarships to the very best and brightest college students pursuing degrees in science, technology, engineering and math fields, commonly

known as STEM.

During his introduction of the featured speakers, MSU President Mark E. Keenum praised the new partnership with ASF and thanked Ray Gildea, an MSU graduate and former assistant director of the John C. Stennis Institute of Government, for his generous contribution to support the permanent scholarship for MSU students.

Wednesday's event was sponsored by MSU's Judy and Bobby Shackouls Honors College, College of Arts and Sciences and Bagley College of Engineering.

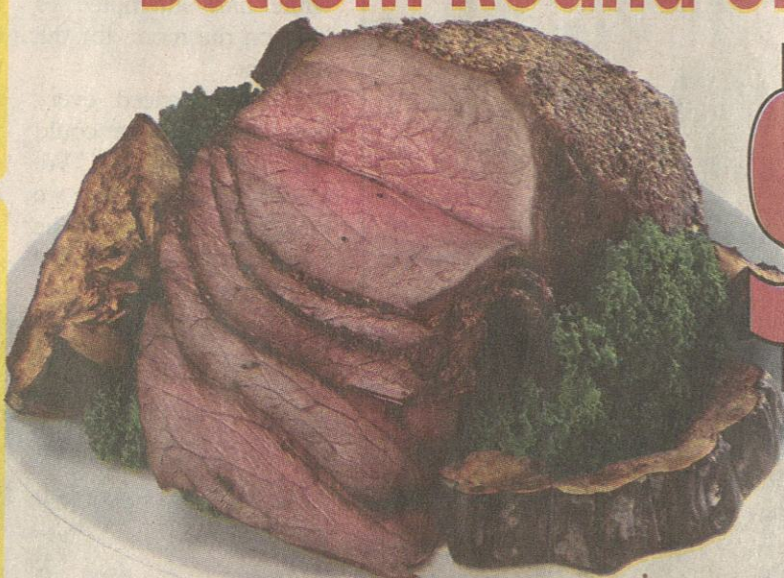

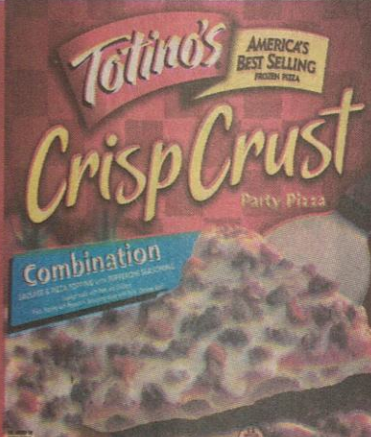

## Another Successful Year for the Tishomingo County Soil and Water Conservation District

The mission of the Tishomingo County SWCD is to effectively guide and promote the conservation, development, protection and proper utilization of the soil, water and related resources of our county. This purpose is achieved by working along the USDA/Natural Resources Conservation District, the Farm Service Agency, Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors and local landowners.

For Fiscal Year 2017 (October 1, 2016 – September 30, 2017) more than \$220,000.00 was invested by into our county for conservation practices to help save our soil and water. These funds were cost shared with landowners to carry out conservation practices. These best management practices not only help to save the soil and water but also increases the value of the land and helps keep the beauty of Tishomingo County from washing away.

These funds were used for grade stabilization, heavy use area for animals, fencing to keep animals out of our creeks and streams, and hoop houses to extend a farmer's growing season to name a few.

What is most important about the funds used for these projects, this money was spent in Tishomingo County for supplies & labor. So not only were these funds used for con-

servation but they were also used to invest in our local economy.

The Tishomingo County Soil and Water Conservation District is governed by a group of volunteers/Commissioners who are voted on by local landowners to serve and help carry out conservation practices. Your local Commissioners are:

1st District Commissioner: Mrs. Dorothy Farr Deputy Commissioner: Harold Lomenick. 2nd District Commissioner: Jesse McDuffy Deputy Commissioner: Tom Hodum. 3rd District Commissioner: Adam Gray Deputy Commissioner: Paul Whitlock. 4th District Commissioner: Gary Taylor Deputy Commissioner: Willie Robinson. 5th District Commissioner Don Thompson Deputy Commissioner: Danny Owen. The leadership of these Commissioners has lead the TCSWCD in the successful year that we have had.

The TCSWCD is not only about bringing funds into our county. It is also about education. Each year District Administrator, Delta Datsis, works with teachers, students, and homeschoolers to help teach and guide on the purpose of conservation and its usefulness to our local economy and ecology.

The Teacher Conservation Workshop held



each year at J.P. Coleman Park, teachers from all over the state comes to Tishomingo County not only to learn conservation but to enjoy the beauty of Tishomingo County. At this event teachers are taken out on the river to take clarity readings and learn about not only conservation but the history behind conservation and Pickwick Lake.

Other events held each year. The annual Tree Sale/Give away, Hazardous Waste Collection Day, & Sammy Soil Day at the Fair.

We are now making plans for our annual Farm Tour to be held November 2, 2017. On this tour you will be able to see some of the conservation projects car-

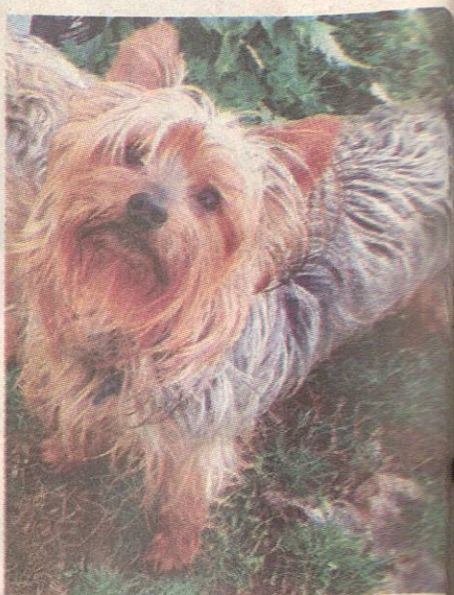

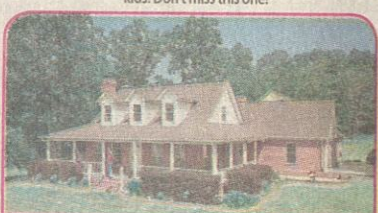
