## Courthouse in Iuka Will Now Lock Doors After Hours

Until now the courthouse in Iuka's doors have always been open given that it is considered a community storm shelter, but now that is changing. The doors will be locked at 5 p.m. and open

again at 7 a.m. Monday through Friday. Saturday and Sunday the doors will be locked at all times.

The Tishomingo County Board of supervisor's report this change is due to liability

and safety concerns. However in the event of inclement weather, the downstairs area will be unlocked for continued use as a storm shelter.

## McCay Named Head Football Coach at TCHS

The Tishomingo County High School administration has made the decision to name Jim McCay as head coach of the Tishomingo County High School Football Program.

He is a 1992 graduate of Ole Miss where he was a football letterman during the 1990 season. Prior to his time at Ole Miss, he played football at East Mississippi Junior College and earned two letters. He also earned a letter in baseball at East Mississippi. In high school, McCay played football for two years and

baseball for three for the Meridian Wildcats.

McCay, is a four-year veteran at TCHS, who took over as interim head coach on September 11, 2017. As interim head coach, he led the Braves to a homecoming win over Holly Springs and the first division win in 46 tries over Byhalia on senior night.

McCay has served 26 years as a coach and teacher in Mississippi's public schools. He has previously served as wide receivers and defensive backs coach

## Pet of the Week

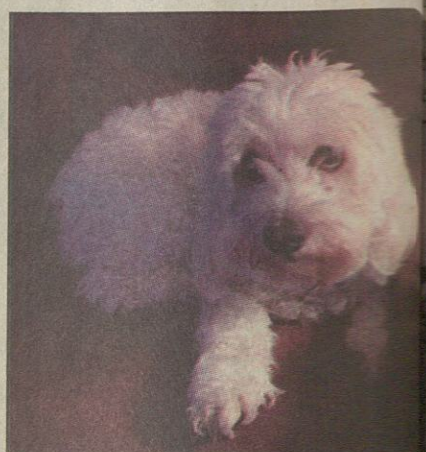

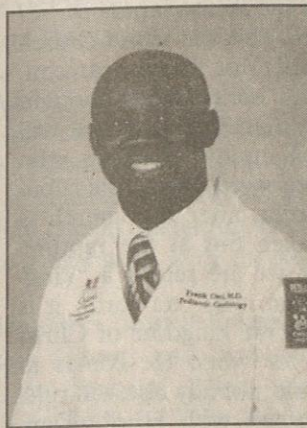
## Children's of Mississippi Offers Iuka Pediatric Cardiology Outreach Clinic

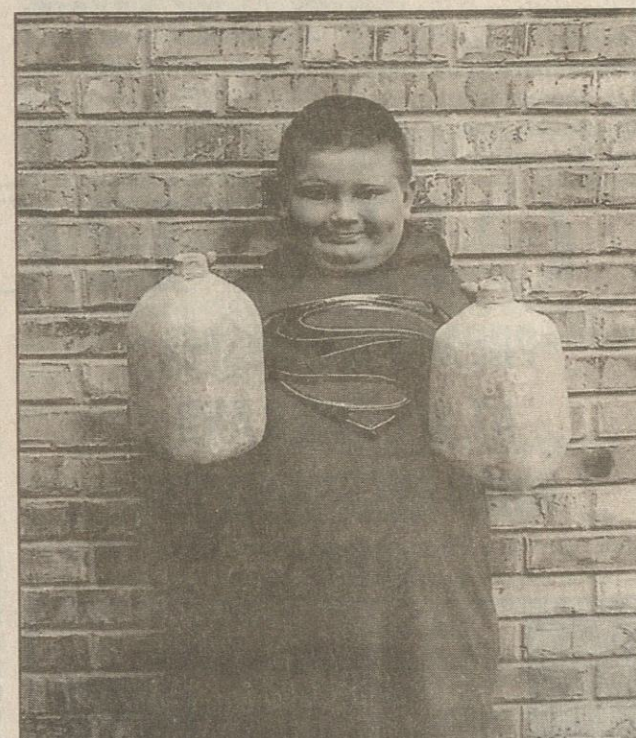

Revelation 17: 6 says, ".....and when I saw her, I wondered with great admiration." The word "admiration", as used in the Greek dictionary, means: "to wonder"; it comes from a word that means: "to look closely at", so the writer John is not admiring the false religious system, rather he is scrutinizing it! By the way, it would pay all of us to scrutinize what the Bible says on any subject, but especially about a religious system that takes charge of the religious world! You may not see it now, but perhaps you will see that we have a religious movement that is speaking about a "kingdom now" kind of religion. My dear friends, the kingdom of Christ cannot take charge of the earth until the King gets back. Luke 19:11-15 gives a parable of Jesus that shows the truth of His coming back to earth and His earthly kingdom

that follows: "And as they heard these things, He added and spake a parable, because He was nigh to Jerusalem, and because they thought that the kingdom of God should immediately appear. He said therefore, A certain Nobleman went into a far country to receive for Himself a kingdom, and to return. And He called His ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come. But His citizens hated Him, and sent a message after Him, saying, We will not have this man to reign over us. And it came to pass, that when

He was returned, having received the kingdom, then He commanded these servants to be called unto Him, to whom He had given the money, that He might know how much every man had gained by trading."

Yes, this is a parable, but it teaches what Jesus wanted to teach men about the kingdom of Christ. Notice first that the Jews thought that the kingdom of God should immediately appear, but Jesus told a parable to show that such was not the case. Jesus showed a nobleman going into a far country to receive for Himself a king-

dom and to return, which is exactly what Jesus did, for He is now in heaven receiving the kingdom. When He has received the kingdom, He will return to establish that kingdom on earth for a thousand years. The calling of the servants is the work of Jesus now, for He has given us a work to do until He returns with the kingdom. The message is that the servants should "occupy till I come", which means that believers are to use what Jesus has put into their hands until He comes back for His kingdom. The people, especially the Jews, hated Jesus and did not want Him to reign over them, but He will reign over them and the entire earth. Notice that it is when He returns, having received the kingdom, that He will call for a report of how His servants have invested what He has put into their hands. So,

the kingdom is not now on earth, at least not in the literal sense that it will be when Jesus comes.

The one-world church will think that she can control all religious thought and activity, thus she will kill many of those who are saved during the tribulation after the church is taken out at the rapture. If we are seeing a "kingdom now" on earth, it is not the kingdom of Christ, for when He comes to rule, nobody else will rule, except with Him! Daniel 2:44 is still relevant to our situation: "And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever." Revelation 11:15b also is helpful on this point: ".....The king-

doms of this world shall come the kingdom of the Lord, and of His Christ, and He shall reign for ever." So, the kingdoms must be broken to pieces, before the kingdom of Christ comes. Since the world's kingdoms are still in full, the kingdom of Christ is not a "kingdom now" kind of thing, as some religious people might claim. May it be that some people are sincere in their about the "kingdom of philosophy, but the wrong and out of with what Scripture ally teaches through Some of them are saved, but they are students of the book gives the right information about a future king Christ on earth.

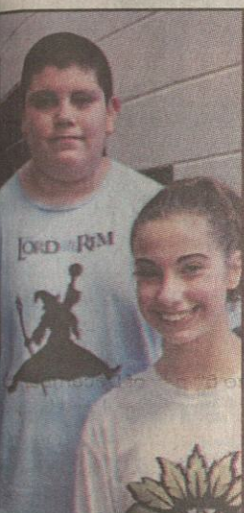
