

Snow, Ice and Cold Temperatures Hit Area for the Second Week

Tishomingo County became a winter wonderland this week as two different fronts brought snow to the area. Schools, government offices and some business closed on Friday, January 12th as the first front brought snow throughout the day with small accumulation. Closings and delays occurred again this week on Tuesday and Wednesday during another cold front that brought from 1 to 3 inches of snow and ice.

This being the first major weather event of 2018, icy roads caused hazardous driving conditions for our local residents. Fire departments, law enforcement, wreckers, and other first responders were out in full force assisting all of the drivers who slid off of the roadways during this winter storm.


Temperatures fell into the single digits on Tuesday night. The wintery mix of ice and snow transformed the landscape as it gave everyone in school (press time Wednesday) six straight days off with the weekend and Martian Luther King Jr. Day on the 15th of January.

Local residents have undoubtedly been affected by the continuous freezing temperatures and the margin of ice present so far this season. Problems with pipes freezing and the need for increased heat have been problematic for some. Travel

conditions have been less than favorable, this has also brought about issues for those who must get out and drive. "The Mississippi Department of Transportation's response to winter weather events is largely based what the National Weather Service (NWS) is forecasting," said Melinda McGrath, P.E., MDOT executive director. "Our crews will monitor weather conditions and respond accordingly."During a typical winter MDOT's workers use an average of 3,500 tons of salt, 2,200 tons of sand and 4,650 tons of slag, in addition to a combined 30,000 gallons of salt brine and calcium chloride.

MDOT offers these tips to stay safe when traveling in icy conditions to help everyone "survive your drive" during the winter weather. Buckle up for safety; slow down, allow more space between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of you. Remember to brake early to allow plenty of time to stop and brake gently to avoid skidding and never slam on the brakes. Always turn on lights to be more visible to other motorists and do not use cruise control or overdrive on icy roads. It is important to stay alert and look farther ahead in traffic than you normally do.



God Who judgeth her." I may not have space to cover all of the material in these two verses, but I needed to give them both, since they go together. Notice that one of the sins of Babylon will be that she glorifies herself. The Greek meaning of this word is: "to render glory or esteem; to magnify". All of these words are good, if used properly, but Babylon will bring glory to herself; she will hold herself in high esteem; she will magnify



the entire world, yet she

will be brought down by

the Master of the uni-

verse, the Lord Himself!

Notice that our verses say that the judgment of the one-world government will be in proportion to the glory herself. May I say that I am concerned for our nation and the nations of the world in our day, for we are making things glorious that may not be glorious at all in the eyes of God. We praise beauty, handsomeness, strength, ability to win at sports, shrewdness in business and a dozen other things that do not rank nearly as high on God's honor roll as some other things. We praise those who get a contract for millions of dollars to play a game, but we forget those who train extensively to be able to bring health care to those who cannot help themselves. We laud the shrewd politician, but we take little thought about what he or she may be like on the inside! We have all kinds of gimmicks and gadgets to attract the attention of young and old, but we have forgotten that nothing is as important as a right walk in the eyes of God. Our world manufactures all kinds of beauty aids, but spends little time teaching people how to be beautiful in the eyes of God. I am not surprised that our world has become filled with selfish people, for they have been trained well by other selfish people. God says that He is going to judge the very capitol of the one-world government for its glorying in itself! She will live deliciously on earth, which means, from the Greek word, luxurious

Representatives Repor

Because it is early in the session, most legislative work is currently happening in committees where bills must be approved before they are introduced to the House as a whole. The deadline for bills to be filed is Monday, Jan. 15, so many committees are waiting until all bills are filed to hold meet-Only one bill made it

out of committee to be introduced to the House this week. In yet another effort to improve the state's infrastructure, House Bill 722 would ensure that 35 percent of the use tax collected by the Department of Revenue would be distributed for the repair, maintenance and reconstruction of roads, streets and bridges. The 35 percent would be split three ways, with 15 percent given to municipalities, 15 percent given to counties and five percent given to a grant program administered by the Mis-Development sissippi Authority to assist the municipalities and counties with improvements. Overall, this would mean that approximately \$108 million would be dedicated solely to improving the state's infrastructure. The bill passed the House by a bipartisan vote of 118-0, and will now be sent to the Senate for consideration.

Additionally, infrastructurerelated legislation, House Bill 354 and House Bill 357, were sent to the Sen-

On Tuesday, Governor Phil Bryant delivered the State of the State address, where he talked about job growth, education, the opioid epidemic and the Mississippi Bicentennial. EdBuild, the consulting group hired last year to revamp the state's education funding formula, also visited legislators this week to further discuss their rec-

ommendations. Groups from across the state that visited the Capitol included members of the Mississippi Municipal League, the Mississippi Board of Nursing and a number of Mississippi's fire chiefs from different areas of the state.
