## Snow, Ice and Cold Temperatures Hit Area for the Second Week

Tishomingo County became a winter wonderland this week as two different fronts brought snow to the area. Schools, government offices and some business closed on Friday, January 12<sup>th</sup> as the first front brought snow throughout the day with small accumulation. Closures and delays occurred again this week on Tuesday and Wednesday during another cold front that brought from 1 to 3 inches of snow and ice.

This being the first major weather event of 2018, icy roads caused hazardous driving conditions for our local residents. Fire departments, law enforcement, wreckers, and other first responders were out in full force assisting all of the drivers who slid off of the roadways during this winter storm.

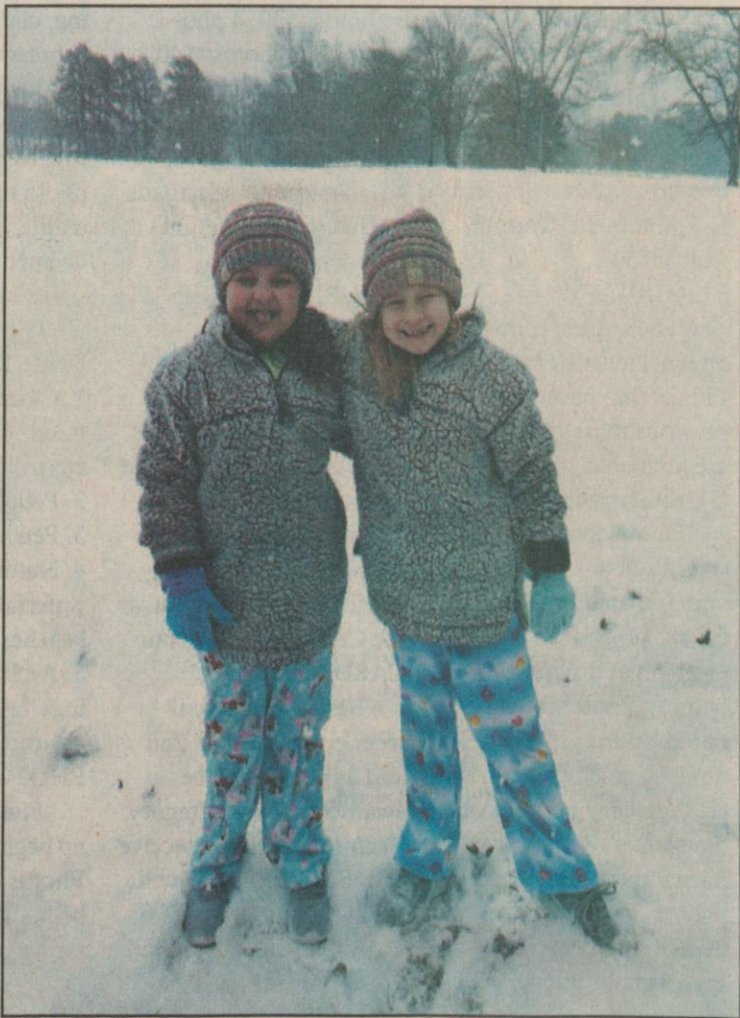
Temperatures fell into the single digits on Tuesday night. The wintry mix of ice and snow transformed the landscape as it gave everyone in school (press time Wednesday) six straight days off with the weekend and Martin Luther King Jr. Day on the 15<sup>th</sup> of January.

Local residents have undoubtedly been affected by the continuous freezing temperatures and the margin of ice present so far this season. Problems with pipes freezing and the need for increased heat have been problematic for some. Travel

conditions have been less than favorable, this has also brought about issues for those who must get out and drive. "The Mississippi Department of Transportation's response to winter weather events is largely based what the National Weather Service (NWS) is forecasting," said Melinda McGrath, P.E., MDOT executive director. "Our crews will monitor weather conditions and respond accordingly." During a typical winter MDOT's workers use an average of 3,500 tons of salt, 2,200 tons of sand and 4,650 tons of slag, in addition to a combined 30,000 gallons of salt brine and calcium chloride.

MDOT offers these tips to stay safe when traveling in icy conditions to help everyone "survive your drive" during the winter weather. Buckle up for safety; slow down, allow more space between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of you. Remember to brake early to allow plenty of time to stop and brake gently to avoid skidding and never slam on the brakes. Always turn on lights to be more visible to other motorists and do not use cruise control or overdrive on icy roads. It is important to stay alert and look farther ahead in traffic than you normally do.

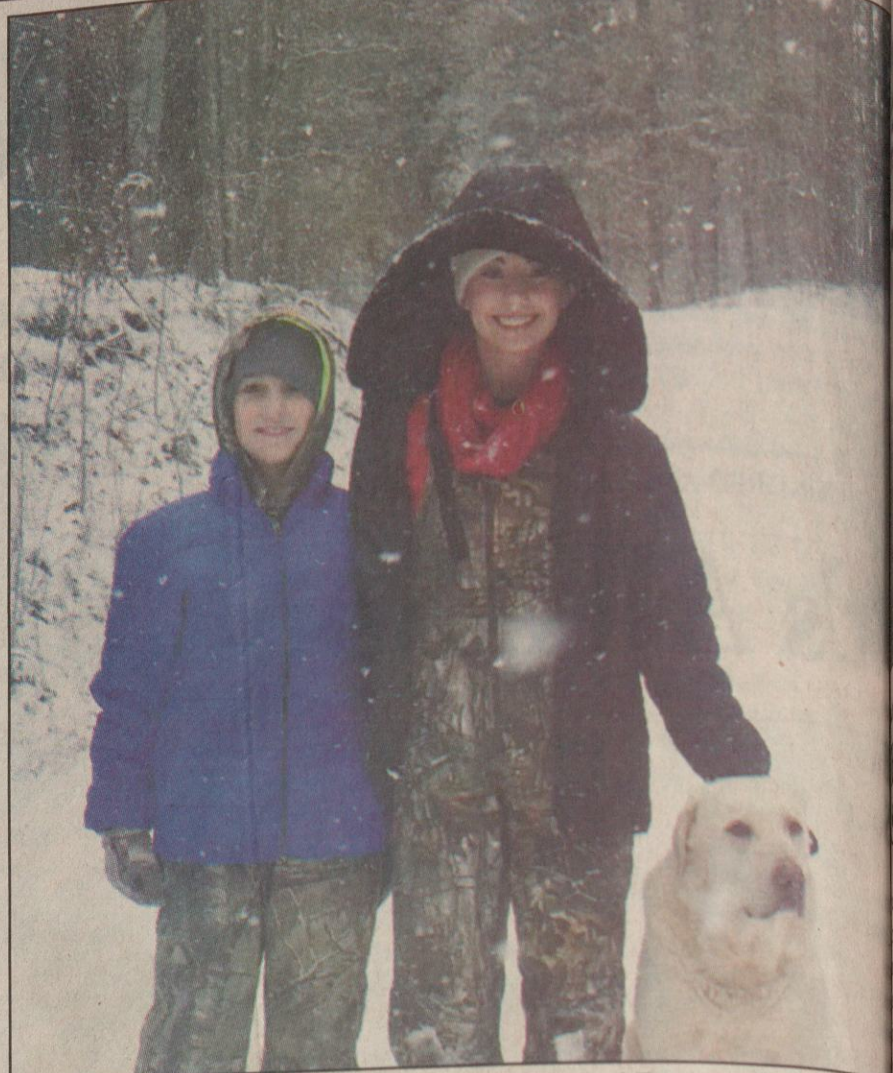

### SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

Monday, April 9, 2018 by 4 p.m. Photos may be submitted in person or mailed to Crossroads Museum, 221 N Fillmore St., Corinth, MS. 38834.

### ELIGIBILITY:

The contest is open to anyone, regardless of age. Photos that have won a previous museum contest are ineligible.

### GUIDELINES:

Photos must be submitted unframed and unmat as a 8x10 or 8.5x11 print. A completed entry form is required per entrant. Photos must have name, address, phone number, title of the photo and category of entry on the back. Entry grants museum right to publish photos. Photos will be treated as works of art and displayed in page protectors.

### ENTRY FEE:

\$10 per entry for the first 3 entries; then \$5 per entry thereafter (1 photo = \$10, 2 photos = \$20, 3 photos = \$30, 4 photos = \$35, 5 photos = \$40, etc.). Cash, checks or credit cards are accepted. Checks should be made payable to the Crossroads Museum. This is a museum fundraiser.

EXHIBIT & RECEPTION: Photos will be on display from April 29-June 3, 2018 at the Crossroads Museum. Winners will be honored and prizes will be awarded at the opening reception on Sunday, April 29, 2018 at 2 p.m. at the Crossroads Museum.

### CASH & PRIZES:

Best of Show will receive \$100. A 1st, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded in each category. Each 1st place will receive \$50. Each 2nd place will receive a 2019 entry fee waiver worth \$10. A Staff Pick photo will also be chosen in each category. All winners will receive ribbons.

### AWARD AREAS:

All photos will be judged by use of lighting, clarity, composition, expressions, creativity, exposure and color. Judges assign winners according to areas of strength. A photo may be moved to a different category as deemed by museum.

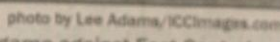

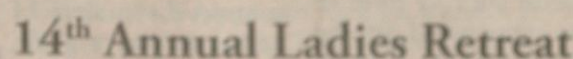

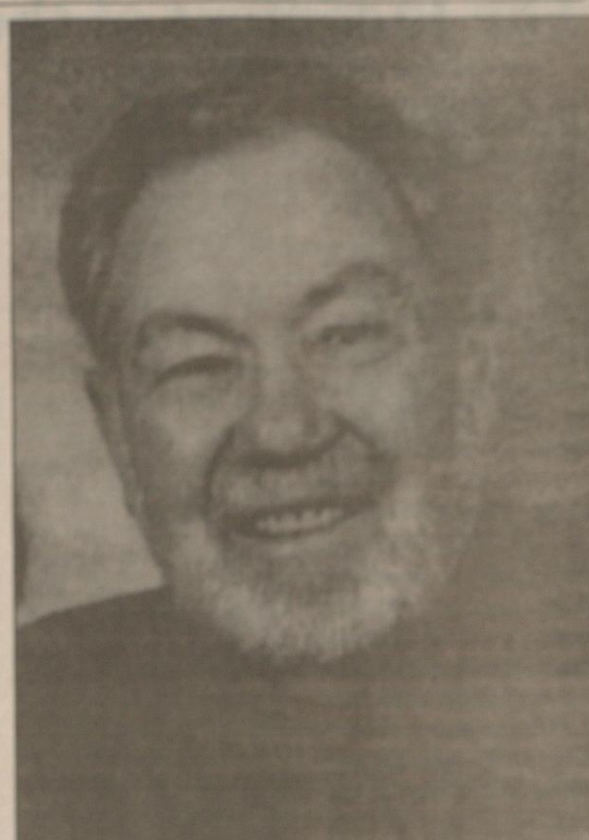

# The Judgment of the One-World Government VI

Perhaps some of my readers wish we could hurry through this series, but when God begins to judge the one-world government it will be swift, and it will be horrible, so we need to see and learn all we can about this process. Revelation 18:7-8 picks up with God's judgment on the one-world government: "How much she hath glorified herself, and lived deliciously, so much torment and sorrow give her: for she saith in her heart, I sit a queen, and am no widow, and shall see no sorrow. Therefore shall her plagues come in one day, death, and mourning, and famine; and she shall be utterly burned with fire: for strong is the Lord

God Who judgeth her." I may not have space to cover all of the material in these two verses, but I needed to give them both, since they go together. Notice that one of the sins of Babylon will be that she glorifies herself. The Greek meaning of this word is: "to render glory or esteem; to magnify". All of these words are good, if used properly, but Babylon will bring glory to herself; she will hold herself in high esteem; she will magnify

herself. I like the statement that somebody made years ago: "a man all wrapped up in himself makes a very small package". Although Babylon will be a "big package" in her own eyes and will make her claims stick by force in the entire world, yet she will be brought down by the Master of the universe, the Lord Himself!

Notice that our verses say that the judgment of the one-world government will be in proportion to the glory

that she had heaped on herself. May I say that I am concerned for our nation and the nations of the world in our day, for we are making things glorious that may not be glorious at all in the eyes of God. We praise beauty, handsomeness, strength, ability to win at sports, shrewdness in business and a dozen other things that do not rank nearly as high on God's honor roll as some other things. We praise those who get a contract for millions of dollars to play a game, but we forget those who train extensively to be able to bring health care to those who cannot help themselves. We laud the shrewd politician, but we take little thought about what he

or she may be like on the inside! We have all kinds of gimmicks and gadgets to attract the attention of young and old, but we have forgotten that nothing is as important as a right walk in the eyes of God. Our world manufactures all kinds of beauty aids, but spends little time teaching people how to be beautiful in the eyes of God. I am not surprised that our world has become filled with selfish people, for they have been trained well by other selfish people. God says that He is going to judge the very capitol of the one-world government for its glorying in itself! She will live deliciously on earth, which means, from the Greek word, luxurious

living. We are teaching people, as fast as we can, both in the secular world and in the religious world, that God wants us to live in luxury, but here we see God about to judge for a very thing! It is not necessarily wrong to have nice things, for many godly people have them, but it is wrong to make them the focus of our attention, and in essence, our gods! As says in our verses that He will judge Babylon in accordance the way she has lived high esteem for herself and for her luxury!

## MS House of Representatives Passes Additional Road and Bridge Funding Legislation

Jackson, MS— Today the Mississippi House of Representatives passed an additional measure that will dedicate a new annual income stream to cities and counties for road and bridge maintenance.

House Bill 722 will create a new diversion of state use-tax collections directing funds back to the cities and the counties to be used for road and bridge maintenance. The move is a redirection of existing dollars.

House Bill 722 passed by a bipartisan vote 118-0

"This is one of the best things we've done for local government," said Speaker of the House Philip Gunn. "Our efforts will put money back in the hands of the local people. This increases the diversions back to cities and counties, which is something our mayors and supervisors have been requesting for years."

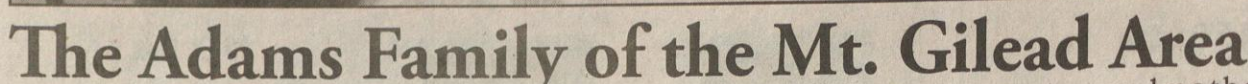
Use-tax is gathered from sales tax collected on any out-of-state purchases, including those made on-line. Approximately \$3.5 million was collected last year. The new diversion will divert 35 percent of use tax collections, which is approximately \$108 million by today's estimates. The diversion would be broken down as follows: \$50 million toward road and bridge repair;

15 percent of all tax collections (approximately \$46.5 million today's estimates) of tax collected will to cities, dispersed in proportion with their current sales tax diversion

15 percent of all tax collections (approximately \$46.5 million today's estimates) of tax will go to counties, dispersed according to the current state aid road formula.

5 percent of all use collections (approximately \$15.5 million by today's estimates) will fund an annual grant program administered through the Mississippi Development Authority where cities and counties can request up to \$1.5 million additional funding per road bridge project.
