# Highway 72 West Resurfacing **Underway - Use Caution!**

Highway 72 is currently under construction from Glen through Burnsville to just east of the waterway bridge.

According to APEC representative Adam Wyers, this project "consists of a mill and overlay of the existing roadway and will also include shoulder gravel, a guardrail replacement, and a new stripe." Wyers also reports that "the project is on schedule and should be completed sometime in August if the weather allows. As always we ask that the traveling public to be mindful of the workers and please slow down when driving through the work zones, as safety is our top priority. Thank you for your patience while this enhancement is underway."



"It's easy for anyone to pick up a computer or smart phone, connect to the Internet and communicate, with no knowledge of how the devices function or connect to each other," said David Isgur, communications manager for the American Radio Relay League, the national association for Amateur Radio. "But if there's an interruption of service or you're out of range of a cell tower, you have no way to communicate. Ham radio functions completely independent of the Internet or cell phone infrastructure, can interface with tablets or smart phones, and can be set up almost anywhere in minutes. That's the beauty of Amateur Radio during a communications

outage."

"Hams can literally throw a wire in a tree for an antenna, connect it to a batterypowered transmitter and communicate halfway around the world," Isgur added

"Hams do this by using a layer of Earth's atmosphere as a sort of mirror for radio waves. In today's electronic do-it- yourself (DIY) environment, ham radio remains one of the best ways for people to learn about electronics, physics, meteorology, and numerous other scientific disciplines, and is a huge asset to any community during disasters or emergencies if the standard communication structure goes down."

# George Washington Cutshall and Ola Carson Cutshall Family Home

Leone Cutshall is sharing this wonderful old photo of the Cutshall family home that was located at the old Linton place off of Coleman Park Road north of Iuka. Shown in the photo are, from left, Clarence Cutshall, Ola Carson Cutshall (mother), Everett Cutshall, two women not identified, and Lawrence Cutshall. The father, George Washington Cutshall was not in the photo.

(Lawrence, who was Leone's father is 13-years old in the photo and had been plowing the mules just before the photo was taken.)

According to the "Tishomingo County History and Families" book, George Washington Cutshall Savannah, Tennessee. They settled north of Iuka in the Rocky Commu-Springs nity and George saw milled and operated a country store for a living. Their four sons were Barton (who died at age four, Wil-

liam Lawrence (1901 to 1995), Clarence Euel (1906 to 1978), and Everett Earl (1908 to 1972).

The family moved the Rocky from Springs Community to Iuka in 1929 and George worked for Sam P. Reid Furniture and Undertaking. He bought the business from Mr. Reid in 1935 and started Iuka's first funeral home with his son, Everett. It is still owned and operated by Everett's daughter, Dianne, and her sons today.

George and Ola's children: Lawrence married Otha Hudson and they had three children, George William, Sr., Ola Mae and Mary Leone. Clarence married Ferrell Ray and they had one and Ola Gillian Car- son, Euel Ray. Everson were married in ett married Lois Lyle Dugger and they had four daughters, Lois Ellene, Jane Carol, Nellie Josephine and Sarah Elizabeth. After Lois Lyle died with tuberculosis, Everett married Maxine Creel from Golden and they had one daughter,

Anita Dianne.

Ola and George are buried at Oak Grove Cemetery in Iuka. Most of their years were spent on Eastport Street in Iuka always sitting on their front porch in their rocking chairs. The Cutshalls owned what is known as the Stone-Reid Home. Early records show that John M. Stone (governor of the State of Mississippi) owned the house in 1869 and it was later sold to the Reid family.

#### **GEORGE WASHINGTON** CUTSHALL

Was a direct descendant of John Cutshall who was born in 1810 in Pennsylvania. He moved to Kentucky and married Nancy Flinn. They had four children, one of which, John Samuel married Malvina (known as Johnny) and Malvina and their Ohio in 1883. John Samuel and Malvina are buried at Patrick Cemetery north of

Iuka. Their children were, William H., Joseph J., George Washington, Dempsey C., and Bessie K. They all married and raised their families in Tishomingo County.

#### **OLA GILLIAN CARSON** CUTSHALL

Was a direct descendant of James Carson and Ann Hayne from Lauderdale County, Ala-Their son, bama. Andrew Carson mar-Sarah Elizaried beth Broadway of Burnsville. She was the daughter of William Broadway and Mary Belue. Andrew Carson is buried in Shanghi Cemetery in Hardin County and his wife Sarah is buried in Campground Cemetery in Iuka. They had seven children, Mary Elizabeth Carson, William At-Shippy. John Samuel las Carson, Cordelia Carson, Ola Gillian Carson, Ella Carson, children moved to this Levi "Lee" Carson, area (Eastport) from and James Milas Carson.





bound in the bottomless pit during the thousand year reign of Christ on earth, then he is released for a little season and gathers together an army of men for the battle of Gog and Magog, as we saw in Revelation 20:7-9. After the beast and false prophet have been in the lake of fire for a thousand years, they are still there. and Satan is then cast into the same lake. So, a thousand years in the lake of fire will not cause the beast and false prophet to "burn up", as some falsely

claim in their religious teaching. Notice that the Bible never says anything, anywhere, about the devil being the "master of hell" or the lake of fire, for he will likely be punished more than anyone there. The pictures that show Satan as the "boss of hell" are all in the imaginations of men, with absolutely no Bible foundation. The fact shown in Revelation 20:10 is that Satan will be punished in the lake of fire forever and ever.
