Runoff Election to Decide Democratic Candidate for the November General Election

There will be a primary runoff election on June 26th, 2018, due to the fact neither candidate took 50% of the vote in the June 5th primary. This race will be between David Sherman of Meridian and State Rep. David Baria of St. Louis. The winner will become the Democratic candidate who will face Republican Senator Roger Wick in the upcoming November general election for U.S. Senate. The Circuit Clerk's Office

will be open Saturday, June 23rd from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. for absentee voting. The 23rd is last day to vote by absentee ballot in the Circuit Clerk's office. All mail in absentee ballots must be received in the clerk's office by 5 p.m. on Monday, June 25th. In a primary election, no crossover voting is allowed by Mississippi law. Therefore, if you voted Republican in the initial primary election on June 5th, 2018, you will not be eligible to vote in this Democratic Primary Election.

Highway 72 West Resurfacing Underway - Use Caution!

Highway 72 is currently under construction from Glen through Burnsville to just east of the waterway bridge.

According to APEC representative Adam Wyers, this project "consists of a mill and overlay of the existing roadway and will also include shoulder gravel, a guardrail replacement, and a new stripe." Wyers also reports that "the project is on schedule and should be completed sometime in August if the weather allows. As always we ask that the traveling public to be mindful of the workers and please slow down when driving through the work zones, as safety is our top priority. Thank you for your patience while this enhancement is underway."

The road work extends into Alcorn County as well. According to State Representative Bubba Carpenter, the Highway

72 project is broken down into two separate projects. "One is for Alcorn County which consisted of 3.5 miles in resurfacing which cost \$2.1 million. In Tishomingo County the project covers 4.7 miles and is costing \$2.57 Million." Carpenter went

on to say "this was a very much needed project in our area. As the legislator continues to search for a means of revenue to fund our highways and bridges, I am optimistic that we will come up with a solution soon."

MDEQ Awards Solid Waste Assistance Grant to Tishomingo County

(Jackson, Miss.) -- The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) awarded Tishomingo County a solid waste assistance grant of \$10,871 that will be used by the county for an unauthorized dumpsite cleanup program.

"The Solid Waste Assistance Grants support a variety of useful solid waste management activities for cities and counties, and this grant will as-

sist Tishomingo County's efforts in improving their management of solid waste," said Gary Rickard, MDEQ Executive Director.

Cities and counties may apply for Solid Waste Assistance Grants through the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality. These grants are used by local communities for programs to prevent and clean up unauthorized dumps; to aid

in hiring local solid waste enforcement officers; for public education efforts on solid waste disposal and recycling; and to establish programs for the collection of white goods, bulky wastes and recyclables

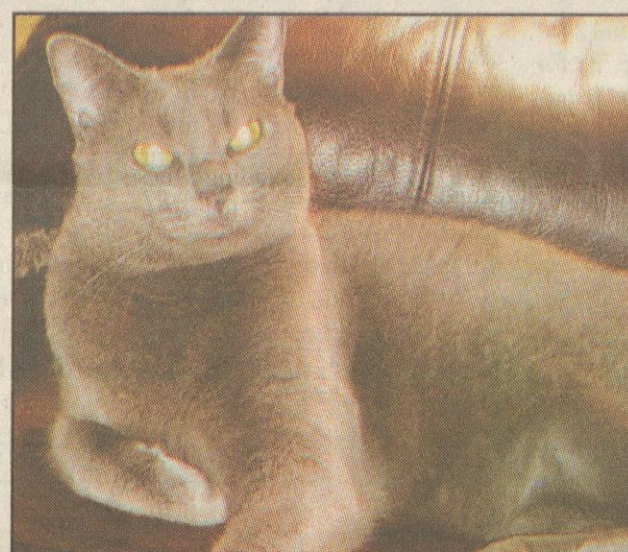

Iuka Man Detained For Burglary and Grand Larceny

On June 11th the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office received a call from employees of Ershigs, Inc, a fiberglass and plastics company, which is located at the Tri-State Industrial Park. It was reported that a work truck was missing from the facility. Employees stated that they later saw the missing vehicle drive by the facility with some aluminum panels in the bed of the vehicle.

The vehicle was followed into the State of Tennessee where the driver and passenger of the vehicle were apprehended in Counce, by the Hardin County Tennessee Sheriff's Office. Jarod and Peggy Johnson were arrested by the Tennessee authorities and later admitted to several crimes at the Tri-State Industrial Park with a value of approximately \$12,000, plus damages to Ershigs, Inc.

Jarod Johnson, 37-year-old, white male of 751 CR 989 Iuka, Mississippi is being held on felony warrants pending extradition back to Tishomingo County. Johnson has been charged with

burglary of a commercial building, grand larceny of a vehicle, and grand larceny of property. This investigation is still ongoing and further arrests and or charges may surface.

Stranded Motorist Arrested After Trying To Hide Drugs

On June 11th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies stopped to assist a stranded motorist with his vehicle that appeared to be broken down around Hwy. 350. As the deputies approached the driver, James Moore, they noticed the driver attempting to hide something. The Sheriff deputies then asked Moore to step out of the vehicle and a search of his person revealed some alleged Hydrocodone in his clothing. Deputies also recovered some more alleged narcotics from the vehicle. Moore was arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

James Moore, 36-year-old, white male of 30011 Hwy. 15 Walnut, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of controlled substance (Hydrocodone). Moore's bond was set by the Justice Court in the amount of \$2,500. Moore remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail.

Tishomingo Woman Charged with Methamphetamine

On June 12th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on Hwy. 25. This vehicle was involved in another investigation. The driver, Melinda Clark, was brought to the Tishomingo County jail. After speaking with narcotic investigators, the driver was charged with a felony drug crime. This incident is part of an ongoing investigation and another person of interest is being sought in relation to this arrest.

Burnsville Man Arrested For Stolen Property

On June 14th Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputies arrested a suspect, Jammie Moore, who was wanted in connection to the theft of a vehicle which occurred back in April of this year. The vehicle was stolen from the area around County Road 2 in Tishomingo County. It was later found at a residence on County Road 375. Investigators were able to determine that Jammie Moore was involved in the theft and a warrant was issued for his arrest. Moore was located in Alcorn County and brought back to Tishomingo County where he was also recently indicted by Grand Jury for burglary dwelling.

Jammie Moore, 47-year-old, white male of 262B CR 209 Burnsville, Mississippi was officially charged with receiving stolen property as well as a capias warrant for burglary of dwelling. Moore was out on a felony bond when he was accused of being involved in the recent crime. Moore remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail. Sheriff Daugherty states that this particular case is still under investigation and more charges and or arrests are pending.

Amateur Radio "Field Day" June 23 and 24 Demonstrates Science, Skill and Service

Members of the Tishomingo County Amateur Radio Club will be participating in the national Amateur Radio Field Day exercise, June 23 - 24 at the Tishomingo State Park. Since 1933, ham radio operators across North America have established temporary ham radio stations in public locations during Field Day to showcase the science and skill of Amateur Radio. This event is open to the public and all are encouraged to attend.

For more than 100 years, Amateur Radio — sometimes called ham radio — has allowed people of all walks of life to experiment with electronic and communications techniques, as well as provide a free public service to their communities during a disaster or emergency without needing a phone or the Internet. Field Day demonstrates a radio's ability to work reliably under any

conditions from almost any location and create an independent communications network. More than 35,000 people from thousands of locations participated in Field Day in 2017.

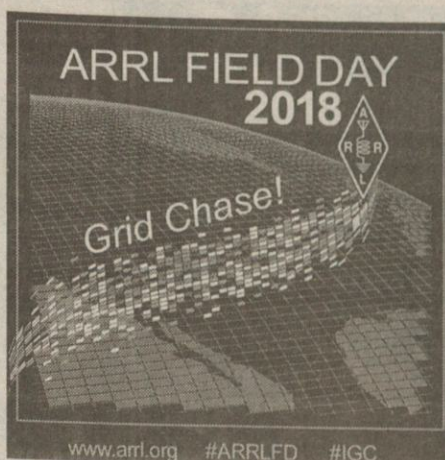
"It's easy for anyone to pick up a computer or smart phone, connect to the Internet and communicate, with no knowledge of how the devices function or connect to each other," said David Isgur, communications manager for the American Radio Relay League, the national association for Amateur Radio. "But if there's an interruption of service or you're out of range of a cell tower, you have no way to communicate. Ham radio functions completely independent of the Internet or cell phone infrastructure, can interface with tablets or smart phones, and can be set up almost anywhere in minutes. That's the beauty of Amateur Radio during a communications

outage."

"Hams can literally throw a wire in a tree for an antenna, connect it to a battery-powered transmitter and communicate half-way around the world," Isgur added.

"Hams do this by using a layer of Earth's atmosphere as a sort of mirror for radio waves. In today's electronic do-it-yourself (DIY) environment, ham radio remains one of the best ways for people to learn about electronics, physics, meteorology, and numerous other scientific disciplines, and is a huge asset to any community during disasters or emergencies if the standard communication infrastructure goes down."

Anyone may become a licensed Amateur Radio

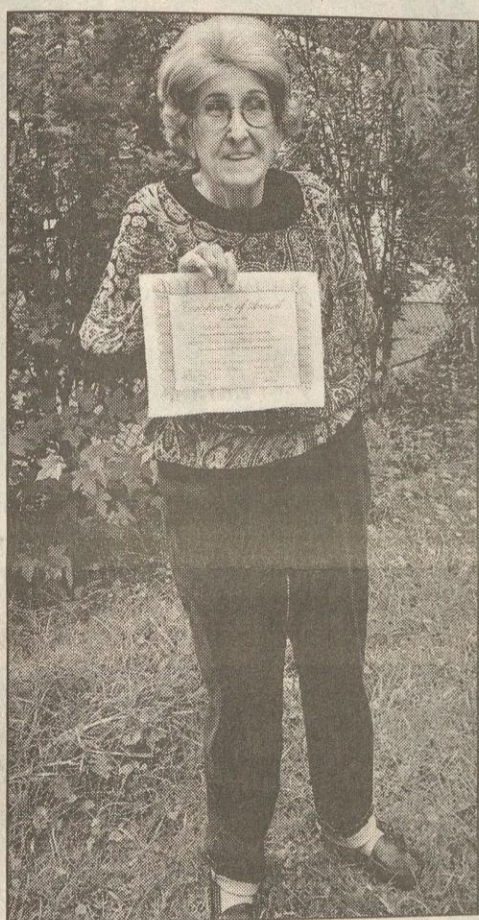

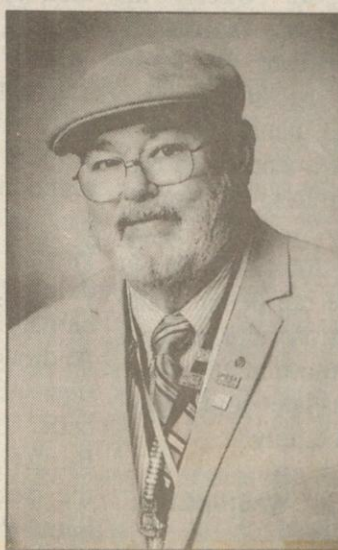

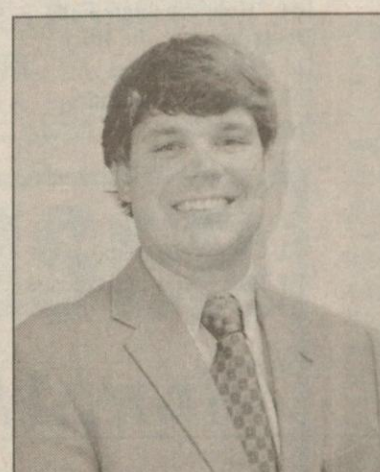

George Washington Cutshall and Ola Carson Cutshall Family Home

Leone Cutshall is sharing this wonderful old photo of the Cutshall family home that was located at the old Linton place off of Coleman Park Road north of Iuka. Shown in the photo are, from left, Clarence Cutshall, Ola Carson Cutshall (mother), Everett Cutshall, two women not identified, and Lawrence Cutshall. The father, George Washington Cutshall was not in the photo. (Lawrence, who was Leone's father is 13-years old in the photo and had been plowing the mules just before the photo was taken.)

According to the "Tishomingo County History and Families" book, George Washington Cutshall and Ola Gillian Carson were married in Savannah, Tennessee. They settled north of Iuka in the Rocky Springs Community and George saw milled and operated a country store for a living. Their four sons were Barton (who died at age four, Wil-

liam Lawrence (1901 to 1995), Clarence Euel (1906 to 1978), and Everett Earl (1908 to 1972). The family moved from the Rocky Springs Community to Iuka in 1929 and George worked for Sam P. Reid Furniture and Undertaking. He bought the business from Mr. Reid in 1935 and started Iuka's first funeral home with his son, Everett. It is still owned and operated by Everett's daughter, Dianne, and her sons today. George and Ola's children: Lawrence married Otha Hudson and they had three children, George William, Sr., Ola Mae and Mary Leone. Clarence married Ferrell Ray and they had one son, Euel Ray. Everett married Lois Lyle Dugger and they had four daughters, Lois Ellene, Jane Carol, Nellie Josephine and Sarah Elizabeth. After Lois Lyle died with tuberculosis, Everett married Maxine Creel from Golden and they had one daughter,

Anita Dianne. Ola and George are buried at Oak Grove Cemetery in Iuka. Most of their years were spent on Eastport Street in Iuka always sitting on their front porch in their rocking chairs. The Cutshalls owned what is known as the Stone-Reid Home. Early records show that John M. Stone (governor of the State of Mississippi) owned the house in 1869 and it was later sold to the Reid family.

GEORGE WASHINGTON CUTSHALL
Was a direct descendant of John Cutshall who was born in 1810 in Pennsylvania. He moved to Kentucky and married Nancy Flinn. They had four children, one of which, John Samuel married Malvina Shippy. John Samuel (known as Johnny) and Malvina and their children moved to this area (Eastport) from Ohio in 1883. John Samuel and Malvina are buried at Patrick Cemetery north of

Iuka. Their children were, William H., Joseph J., George Washington, Dempsey C., and Bessie K. They all married and raised their families in Tishomingo County.

OLA GILLIAN CARSON CUTSHALL
Was a direct descendant of James Carson and Ann Hayne from Lauderdale County, Alabama. Their son, Andrew Carson married Sarah Elizabeth Broadway of Burnsville. She was the daughter of William Broadway and Mary Belue. Andrew Carson is buried in Shanghi Cemetery in Hardin County and his wife Sarah is buried in Campground Cemetery in Iuka. They had seven children, Mary Elizabeth Carson, William Atlas Carson, Cordelia Carson, Ola Gillian Carson, Ella Carson, Levi "Lee" Carson, and James Milas Carson.

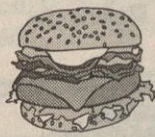

claim in their religious teaching. Notice that the Bible never says anything, anywhere, about the devil being the "master of hell" or the lake of fire, for he will likely be punished more than anyone there. The pictures that show Satan as the "boss of hell" are all in the imaginations of men, with absolutely no Bible foundation. The fact shown in Revelation 20:10 is that Satan will be punished in the lake of fire forever and ever. The terms "day and night" picture the idea that there will be no time of release from the torments of the lake of fire for Satan; the beast; the false prophet; fallen angels or unsaved humans. We will see in the next series of articles that hell and the lake of fire are not the same place, with hell being the

place of the wicked dead at present, and the lake of fire being the final abode of all fallen angels and unsaved men. Those who suppose that they are going down to hell to have a good time with the devil and his crowd will have a rude awakening at some point in the future, for Satan will have no power there, nor will anyone have any "fun" or "joy" in either hell or the lake of fire.

The need today is for people to come to their senses and realize that God, though loving and kind, is a God of judgment. If He were to allow Satan, fallen angels or unsaved humanity to get to heaven after rejecting and crucifying Jesus, He would not be dealing justly with Jesus and avenging His rejecters and

enemies. Moreover, all of the saved who have died as martyrs for the cause of Christ would have died in vain. The wicked who have done basically what they have pleased and have mistreated the just would be the "winners" in the whole "play" of earth life. The good news is that Jesus still saves those who trust Him, even though they have followed Satan and his helpers and have done terrible things against Christ and His church. It is foolish to presume that sinners will get off scot-free, even if they never repent, but it is a fact that sinners who repent and put their faith in Christ will be saved.
