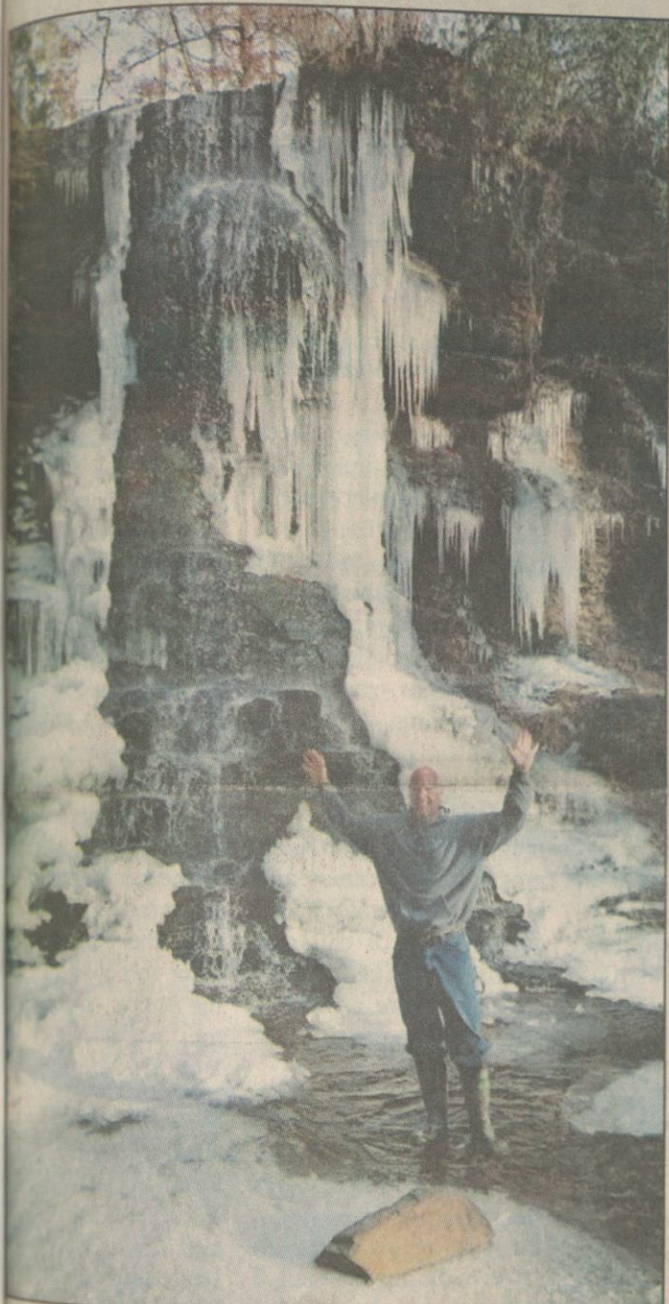
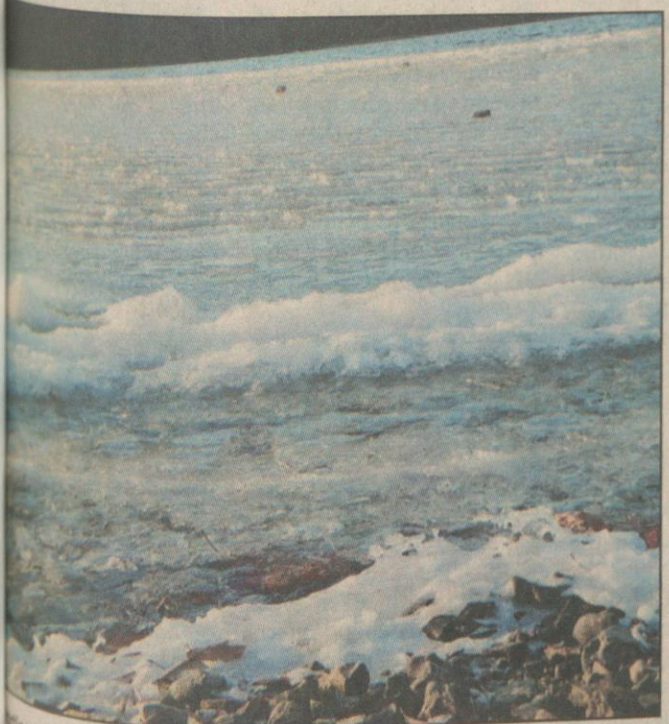

New Year's Day Fire Destroys Lake Home at Eastport

The lake-front cabin of Scotty and Patti Casabella at Eastport was completely destroyed by fire early Sunday morning, New Year's Day.

According to Rickey Cummings of the 911 office the fire was a total loss and the cause of the fire is being investigated.

It was reported that six different fire departments re-

sponded to the call due to a water supply shortage. When firemen arrived on the scene around 11:00 a.m. the top floor of the 2 story cabin was engulfed in flames. The cabin was unoccupied at the time.

One fireman was injured at the scene when he was struck on the head by a falling tree limb; he was later reported to be

alright. Cummings also stated that the severity of the fire was worsened due to windy weather conditions.

On January 2nd firefighters were called back out to the scene because the fire had resumed burning.

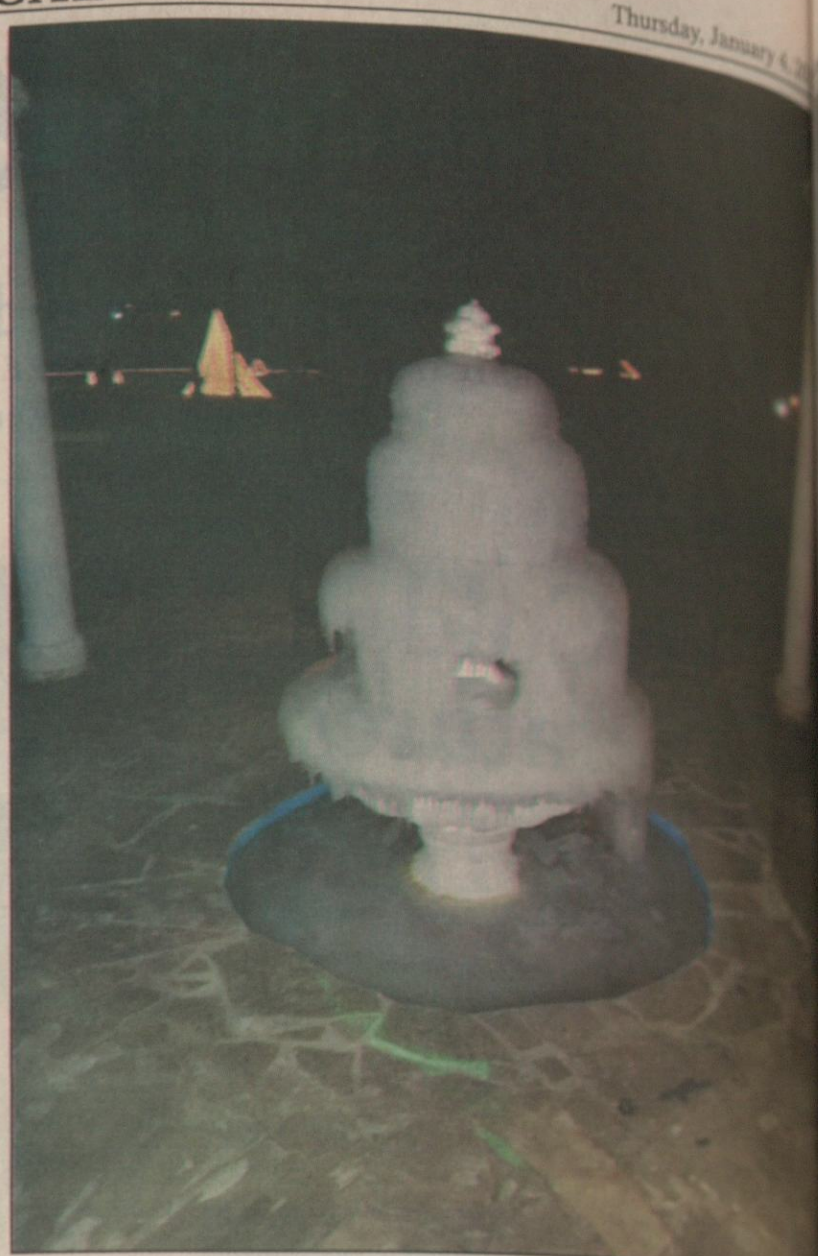

Mississippi Hills Announces \$150,000 Available in Community Grants

The application period for the Mississippi Hills Community Grant Program begins on January 3rd and ends on Feb 28th. The Alliance is the coordinating entity for the Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area, which covers all or portions of 30 counties in North Mississippi and are eligible to apply for grants.

Grants available include Transportation grants up to \$1,000 for school field trips. Flash grants up to \$2,500 for local cultural and heritage projects. Small Cap grants up to \$1,000 and Large Cap grants up to \$20,000 for larger community or regional initiatives. The Large Cap grants are available to Alliance dues paying members only. The Mississippi Hills Com-

munity Grant program is in its third year and has already made a significant impact within the region by awarding nearly \$300,000.00 in grants. Mississippi Hills Executive Director Mary Cates Williams said, "These grants can make a significant impact by funding all types of cultural and heritage endeavors. We have established a \$150,000 grant fund in this year's budget and we hope to see it fully dispersed." All awarded grants carry a Federal match requirement of 1:1 with the applicant's match coming from either cash or a cash/in-kind combination. "Don't miss out on this great opportunity for your cultural and heritage projects," Williams said.

The Mississippi Hills NHA is comprised of 30 counties (19 whole and 11 partial) with boundaries being the Tennessee state line to the North, the Alabama state line to the East, Highway 14 to the South and I-55 to the West and is one of the 49 NHA's in the United States. Operations are funded through a combination of member dues, legislative support and an annual congressional appropriation to the Interior Department and is administered by the National Park Service. Antlers, Not Horns by James L. Cummins

In many deer camps throughout Mississippi, it is not uncommon to hear someone refer to a white-tailed buck's headgear as "horns." In reality, those "horns" are actually antlers.

Horns are made of a bony core covered by layers of keratin. They are slow growing and permanent and are usually grown by both sexes. Horns grow in yearly rings which may be an age indicator.

Antlers, on the other hand, are made of fast growing bone and are shed every year (except in rare cases). Antlers are usually grown by males and are branched instead of singular like a cow horn.

White-tailed bucks in Mississippi grow their first set of antlers during the first 1.5 years of their life and generally that first set of antlers is spikes. Young deer are growing rapidly during this time and most of their nutritional intake is used in muscle and bone development. In cases where young deer have excellent sources of nutri-

tion, it is not uncommon for a 1.5 year old deer to have 6 or maybe even 8 points.

A white-tailed buck's antlers begin to grow around June. During this growing period the antlers are covered in a soft skin, which is called "velvet." The velvet is made up of blood vessels which supply calcium, phosphorus and protein to the growing antlers. By October, they are usually completely formed and are no longer growing. When this occurs, the blood vessels begin to dry up, and the velvet begins to detach.

Bucks speed up this process by rubbing their antlers on trees. This rubbing process also helps to polish antlers and strengthen the buck's neck muscles for the rut.

A white-tailed buck's antlers generally increase in size with each year of his life, dependant on availability of food and nutritional intake. After about 4.5 years, a buck's body will stop growing and almost all nutritional resources will go into antler development. If a white-tailed buck is al-

lowed to mature to age, this is when he really grow an impressive "rack." Bucks in their will generally peak around their 5.5 year and from then on antler growth usually declines.

Around late February a buck will shed his antlers due to a change in hormone levels following the end of the rut. But sheds do not go to waste. They provide a rich source of nutrients (calcium, phosphorus) to mammals such as deer, chipmunks and rodents.

Learning more about Mississippi's fish, wildlife and plant resources enable us to be better stewards of these precious resources. Spread the word.

They have cried with us. They have told us Gary stories. They have emailed and sent us cards and memorials. They have traveled miles and miles to hug and kiss us and love us. They have thought of us, made themselves available to us, listened to us, and have prayed for us. They have expressed love for us in scores of ways and, they continue to do so.

Gary did so love his home—God's country he called it. Iuka is an idyllic place with angels living amongst us. I would add angels come from other places, too, like all over Tishomingo County, the state of Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee, Texas, and across the land, many with Iuka roots! God made these places and these angels. He is good all the time, and I believe our prayer of Him bringing good from bad is being answered. Even in the midst of tragedy, He is our peace, our strength, our faith, our hope, our grace, our mercy, our comforter, our protector, our healer, our Savior.....our everything.

Gary loved Iuka and its people, and I do, too. I am so thankful to live among good, generous, hospitable, loving people.....I am so grateful and so blessed to call Iuka my home.

Since we are not told Who is speaking, we can only surmise that God is speaking, but we cannot be dogmatic on the point. Whatever the case, God is calling His people who are living on earth during the tribulation to come out of Babylon. Some say that this is God's message to His people Israel, and it may very well be, yet there will also be a great multitude of Gentiles, who have not heard the gospel and rejected it, that will be saved in the tribulation, according to Revelation chapter 7. Whoever it may be, God is calling His people to separate themselves from the wicked government of the tribulation. Why could not both Jews and Gentiles be in the group called to come out of Babylon? The admonition to come out states:

that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues." It is not unthinkable that some of God's people could partake of these sins and plagues as a chastening for staying in Babylon.

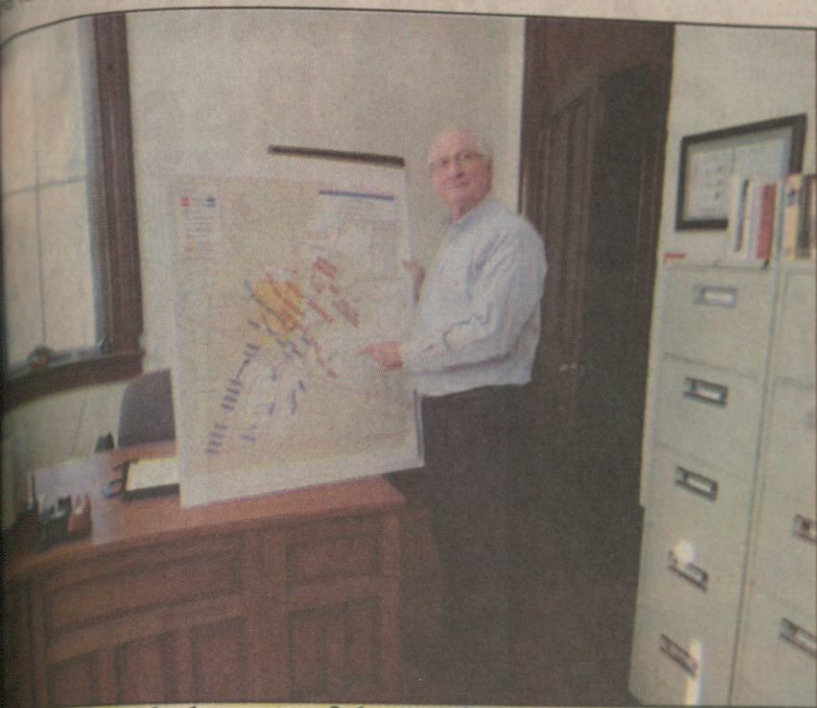

The doctor's room is filled with bottles and all the equipment needed by the traveling country doctor.

Some bottles were from the once famous Dr. M. A. Simmons Liver Medicine that was made in Iuka at one time.

Doctor M.A. Simmons first practiced medicine in Georgia, where he brewed up Simmons Liver Medicine (curing costiveness, lowness of spirits, colic, foul breath, dyspepsia, etc.) and drove through the countryside with a five-gallon keg of it, dispensing however much anyone wanted to buy. He moved to Mississippi, first living in Holly Springs, but located in Iuka when the proprietary medicine tax became effective in 1862. Simmons moved to Saint Louis in 1878 and sold the business to his son in 1879.

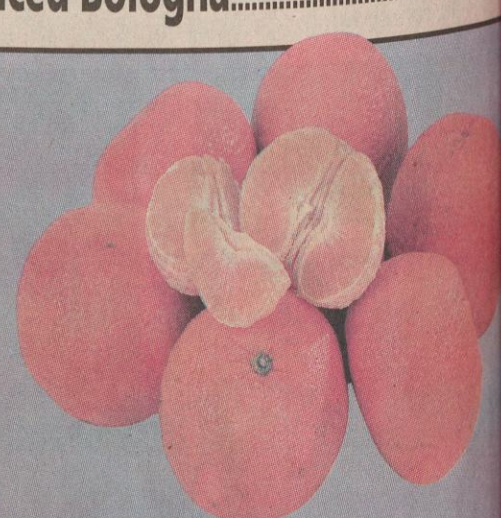

Tishomingo Grammar School Basketball

Dolan Owens was the coach of our basketball team in 1941-42. The first player in this picture is James Fred McCallister; next is Fairless Southward; Vaudrey Carter; Jack Pennington; Jerrell L. McNutt; and Coach Dolan Owens.

It has been said that Dean Smith the highly successful coach at the University of North Carolina originated the "weave" which was used to freeze the ball. He perfected this system of running out the clock in order to keep the other team from scoring. But Coach Owens taught us the "weave" about 50 years before Dean Smith came along.

Every day our team worked on the weave.

Our version of the weave called for the two guards and two forwards to pass the ball to one another out near the center line. One player would receive the ball and dribble once and stop. Then our next player would move by and as he did the ball would be placed in his hands. Our four players were able to "freeze" the ball and run out the clock.

I played center jump and Pivot near the basket. During the weave there was absolutely nothing for me to do. All that I did was stand near the goal with my hands on my hips.

We were playing Pleasant Ridge Grammar School that was located near Mt. Gilliard Baptist Church. My cousin who

considered himself be a Hot shot basketball player was guarding me. We had a one point lead. Coach Owens yelled out "Freeze the ball." There was one minute and 30 seconds left in the game. I did my usual part and just stood a short distance from the goal. My loud mouth cousin jumped up and down yelling and cussing. With only a few seconds left my cousin said, "I be damned if I don't stop this." Jack Pennington saw him coming and flipped the ball over his head to me. I dribbled once and dropped it in the basket for two points. The game was over. He wanted to fight, but quickly decided that one licking was enough.
