Friends of Tishomingo State Park Receive Nonprofit Designation

Friends of Tishomingo State Park has received 501c3 nonprofit designation from the Internal Revenue Service. The Friends of the Park was established in late 2015 with the goal to preserve and enhance Tishomingo State Park, Mississippi's premier nature park. Along with the Tishomingo State Park and management, the volunteers have worked diligently in renovating the nature center, improving park appearance, maintaining the 13 miles of nature trails, and sponsoring special events such as Earth Day, Springing Bridge Trail Run/ Picnic in the Park, Easter Hunt, Santa in the Park, and other activities and events. Officers of Friends of the

Park include Brian Belue, President; Toney Mobley, Vice President; Linda Johnson, Treasurer; Tina Gray, Secretary; and Emily Wadkins, Social Media Director.

Friends President Brian Belue reported that "we thank Sparks CPA Group for volunteering to file the paperwork and submit the annual IRS reports. With the nonprofit designation and the probability of more funds, we hope to increase the number of improvement projects at the park. We will be applying for funds for special projects in the park over the next few months."

Large Amount of Cash Seized, Two Charged with Introduction of Narcotics into a Correctional Facility

On January 5th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on Beachum Road in Iuka for improper equipment and erratic driving. The suspects in question are Dustin Leatherwood, and King McGee. During the traffic stop deputies could smell an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. A search was conducted and some alleged marijuana was found along with two pistols in the glove box. Deputies also seized a large amount of cash, around \$5000, during the arrest.

Once at the jail, one of the suspects tried to throw some alleged methamphetamine on the ground and then more alleged methamphetamine was found on his body by the corrections

staff and deputies. The other suspect attempted to hide some alleged marijuana in the jail and was caught.

Both Suspects are currently out on bond from other counties. This case will be presented to the next Grand Jury. Dustin Leatherwood, 21-year-old, black male of 100 North Young Street Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with the introduction of narcotics into a correctional facility. Leatherwood remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting his

bond to be set.

King McGee, 38-year-old, black male of 103 Mockingbird Lane Booneville, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance methamphetamine, the introduction of narcotics into a correctional facility, the felony tampering with evidence, and the possession of firearm by convicted felon. McGee also remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting his bond to be set.

The Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority Partners with the Tourism Council, and the Development Foundation to Support Tishomingo County

In recent months three organizations, the Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority, the Tishomingo County Tourism Council and the Tishomingo County Development Foundation have been highlighted in the news for their efforts in promoting, expanding, and supporting Tishomingo County. In order to better understand these entities Mr. Gary Matthews has provided some information about what the various councils are and how they operate within the county.

The Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority consists of a ten member volunteer board of directors that manages and maintains the Max Home building and invests in infrastructure for industrial development projects for the county. There is no paid staff associated with this authority and the board meets as needed.

The Tishomingo County Tourism Council is an eight member volunteer council that

manages and implements the county's tourism and retiree attraction effort. There is no paid staff and the council meets monthly. The Council develops and funds advertising, maintains a web site and Facebook page, contributes funds to special events, and sponsors and funds the annual Trash and Treasures along the Tenn-Tom.

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation is the flagship of the three sister organizations consisting of a 28 member volunteer board of directors. This board implements the county's industry assistance, industry recruitment, and small business development programs, plus provides staff assistance to the Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority and the Tishomingo County Tourism Council. This Foundation employs two full-time and one part time staff members and the board meets bimonthly. The staff of the Development Foundation is Gary Matthews,

Executive Director, Theresa Cutshall, Administrative Assistant, and Jim Gibson, Part-time Assistant.

Some of the tasks of the TCDF staff include marketing the county to industry via electronic marketing, they direct mail, telephone calls, newsletters, media releases, site visits, and word of mouth. They also negotiate deals with new and expanding industry; and negotiates financing, incentives, job training, infrastructure and building improvements, and other requirements for new and expanding industries. The Staff provides technical assistance, consulting, and support to existing industries and to small businesses and individuals desiring to start a small business. They also develop tourism ads and publications such as the Tishomingo County Business Guide,

During the course of the stop, the deputies recognized that both the driver and passenger of the vehicle have a recent history of drug arrests. The sudden death of Nickey Cummings, 54, of Tuesday night of an apparent heart attack has left the community and his large extended family in shock.

Nickey Cummings was a husband, father, grandfather, and community leader. He served as the Chief of Burnsville and served as a member of the Burnsville Fire Department for over 30 years. He was serving as the current President of the Board of the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association. He represented the second district and was elected to the position in 2002. He also served on the Yellow Creek Port Board. This is a loss that will be greatly felt throughout Tishomingo County as Cummings affected so many lives through his leadership, service and friendship.





On Christmas morning I quietly called several comrades up to my bunk to taste the precious fluid of...Disappointment! The bottle had been opened outside, the brandy taken and replaced with water...and sent in. I hope the Yankee who played that practical joke lived to repent it and was shot before the war ended."

Colon Cancer Rates Higher in Tishomingo County

IUKA, Miss.—Information recently released by the National Cancer Institute indicates that colon cancer rates in Tishomingo County are higher than state and national averages.

"When we looked at this data, we quickly realized that people in Tishomingo County are diagnosed with colon cancer more frequently because they are not meeting screening recommendations," said Cindy McDaniel, BSN, RN, CGRN, who serves as a nurse navigator for colon cancer patients at North Mississippi Medical Center. "Screening is the easiest way to catch and treat early colon cancers, and we really want to make sure Tishomingo County residents are getting the screenings they need."

The incidence rate of colon cancer in Tishomingo County is 54.5 percent. Mississippi's incidence rate is 49.1 percent and nationwide is 39.8 percent. Lee County's incidence rate is 47.3 percent.

"This translates to many people in Tishomingo County who are getting colon cancer diagnoses that could have been prevented with early and regular screening," McDaniel said. "Colon cancer can be prevented through colonoscopy. Colon cancer starts as a small polyp, or growth, in the colon. A colonoscopy can remove those polyps before they become cancerous. The colon cancer

death rate in the United States could be cut in half if we all followed screening guidelines."

Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States. This year, approximately 135,000 new cases of colorectal cancer will be diagnosed and 50,000 people will die from the disease, according to the American Cancer Society.

Who should be screened?

•All men and women age 50 or older.

•African-Americans age 45 and older. (African-Americans tend to be diagnosed with colon cancer at a younger age and experience decreased survival.)

Those with risk fac-

tors should talk to their doctor about beginning screening early, including those with personal or family history of:

Inflammatory bowel disease
Colorectal cancer polyps

Ovarian endometrial or breast cancer.

The American College of Gastroenterology recommends colonoscopy as the preferred colon cancer prevention strategy.

A Lotta Bud -

From our old files, this photo appeared in the August 18, 1966 Vidette. This shows a portion of the truck load of beer that was caught by Sheriff James H. Bishop (right) and Deputy Robert Skinner. At left is Shelby Greenhill who was caught driving the truck loaded with 300 cases of "tall boy" Budweiser. The officers made the catch on Hwy. 25 North of Scruggs Bridge on Yellow Creek. Owner of the truck was listed as P. O. Devaney of Russellville, Alabama. An oddity of this load of beer was the ingenious method used to conceal the beer in the truck. In the back end of the truck bed, to the casual observer, were stacks of lumber. However, upon examination, the "lumber" was found to be only short pieces of boards nailed together to look like a full load of lumber. Officers reported that six cases of whiskey and 4 cases of vodka were also found concealed underneath the beer.

A Sweet Revival Meeting

Jerrell L. McNutt
Revival meetings were usually held during the warm summer months. There were several churches in and around Dennis and Belmont, Mississippi. OUR FARM WAS ONE MILE East of Dennis. It was only three miles from

Belmont. A one week meeting was in progress at the Old Union Baptist Church. This church was several miles from our farm. We had to cross the high one lane Bear Creek Bridge and go through the Valley community to reach

the church. In our mule drawn wagon it took us almost an hour to make this trip. Some of our neighbors said, "You McNutts spend so much time going to revival meetings your crops will fail." We never lost a crop. We quit work-

ing in the field at about 3 P.M. each afternoon. This gave us enough time to eat "Supper" and get ready to load up the wagon and go to church. One evening we had to stop our wagon near the Bear Creek Bridge. A vehicle was crossing the bridge from the opposite direction. While we were waiting we smelled something very sweet. From experience we knew that there was a honey tree nearby. We did not have time to locate the honey tree but we sure could remember the sweet smell.

The next day my brothers and I loaded the wagon with a crosscut saw and the other things needed for collecting honey. We found the large hollow tree that was loaded with sweet honey. We collected several containers of honey and also brought home a swarm of honey bees. This was indeed "A Sweet Revival Meeting."

MS Legislative Report

Week of January 1, 2018

On January 2, 2018, the 132nd Mississippi State Legislature began the third session in its four-year term.

Four new members joined the House of Representatives this past year as a result of special elections. Stacey Wilkes, R-Picayune; Missy McGee, R-Hattiesburg; Cheikh Taylor, D-Starkville and Kevin Ford, R-Vicksburg joined the roster of representatives for the 2018 Legislative Session.

Though it is early in the session, there were a couple of bills passed through committees and introduced on the House floor. All of the bills discussed dealt with the maintenance and repair of roads and bridges, a topic which will likely be heavily discussed this session.

One measure introduced was House Bill 354, which aims to set aside any state revenue growth of more than two percent for the repair and reconstruction of state, county and municipal roads and bridges. This measure passed by a vote of 118-2. Another was House Bill 357, legislation that would authorize the issuance of \$50 million in bonds to cities and counties for bridge improvements. This passed by a vote of 116-4.

Finally, House Bill 359 would prohibit the con-

struction of any new roads that have not already required right-of-way. Supporters of the bill say it will help the state maintain the roads it already has before starting new projects. Those opposed say this could be an economic development. The bill passed by a vote of 71-42. All three bills were held on a motion to reconsider, which means they will be brought up again in the future.

The Speaker also announced new chairmanships of several House Committees:
