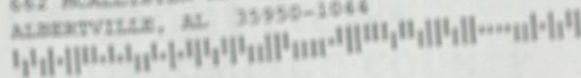

Three Picked Up on Warrants Found with Possible Drugs

Recently, several individuals with outstanding warrants were taken into custody by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department. During these arrests the suspects were found to be in possession of alleged drugs. Kenneth Sides, 33 of Tishomingo, Christopher Smith, 24, of Iuka, and Jason William Puckett, 34, of Burnsville, were all arrested over a three day period.

On January 16th Tishomingo County Sheriff, John Daugherty and his deputies responded to a call from a home owner who wanted some individuals removed from their property. One of the individuals, Kenneth Sides, was present on the property and the deputies had a warrant for his arrest. Deputies found a bag of alleged methamphetamine on Sides' person and he was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. Kenneth Sides, 33-year-old, white male of 1002 Hwy. 25

South, Tishomingo, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance, methamphetamine. Sides' bond was set by the Justice Court at \$3,500.

On January 17th the Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop in front of a business in Iuka due to the deputies having knowledge that the driver, Christopher Smith, had a warrant for his arrest. During a search some alleged methamphetamine was found on Smith, he was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. Christopher Smith, 24-year-old, white male, of 1370 Pike Street, Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance methamphetamine, plus a felony warrant - the sale of a controlled substance, and the simple possession of a controlled substance. Smith's bond was set at \$5,000 for both

the warrant and the felony possession charge. Smith is also currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

On January 18th the Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop in the city limits of Iuka due to the driver, Jason William Puckett, having an outstanding warrant. Once the deputy made contact with Puckett, the deputy smelled a strong drug odor coming from the vehicle. Puckett was asked to step out of the vehicle and a search yielded some alleged methamphetamine, as well as alleged marijuana in the vehicle. Puckett was then arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. Jason William Puckett, 34-year-old, white male, of 170 CR 294 Burnsville, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance, methamphetamine. Puckett's bond was set at \$3,500.

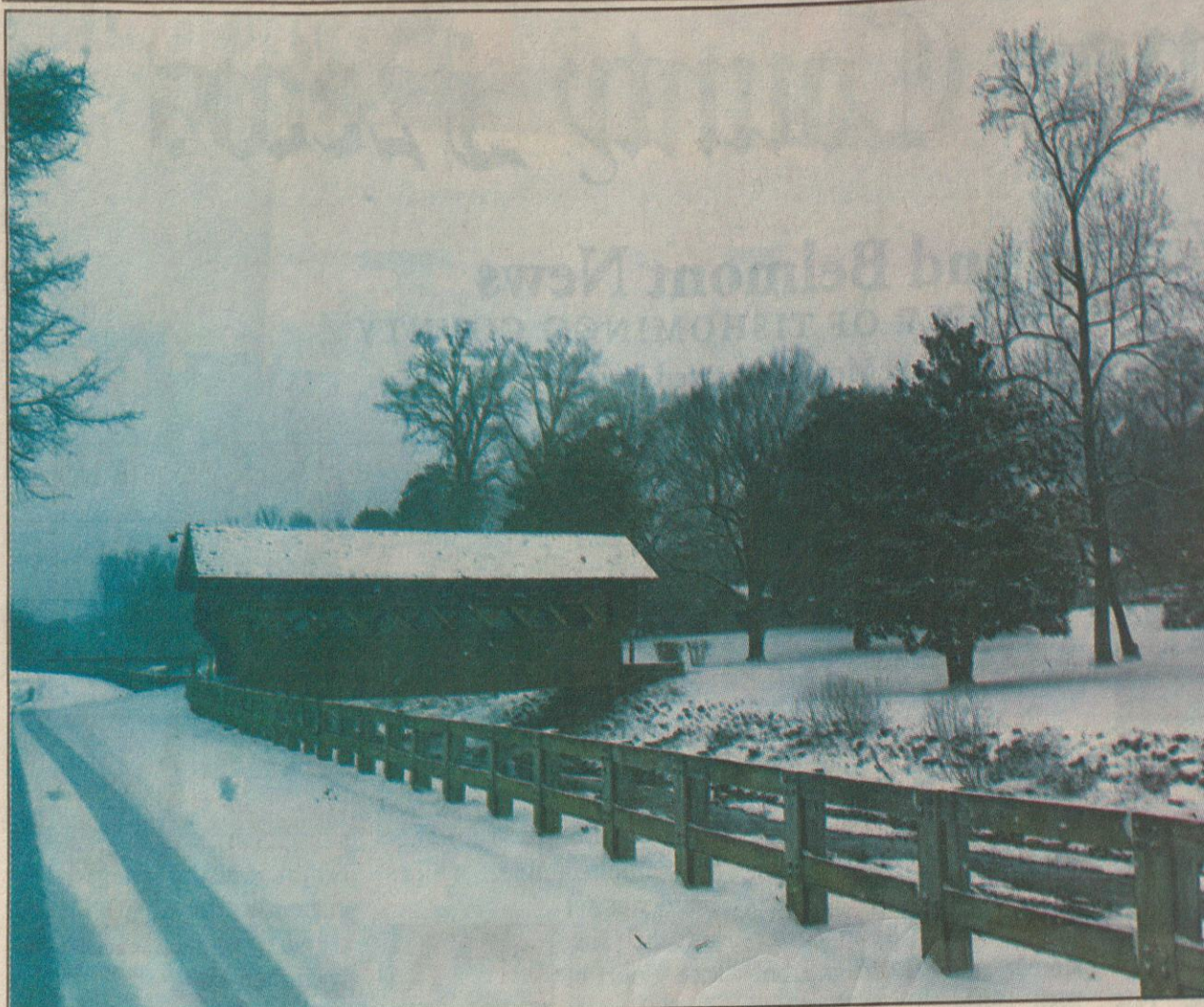

Tennessee Woman Charged with Introduction of Narcotics into a Correctional Facility

On January 11th, Jennifer D. Harmon, 39, of Pickwick, Tennessee was arrested for an outstanding warrant from another agency, during a routine traffic stop just off of Hwy. 72 in Burnsville. Once at the Tishomingo County Jail, Correction Officers discovered that the driver had hid some alleged methamphetamine on her person during the booking process.

Jennifer D. Harmon, 39-year-old, of 11895 HWY 57 Pickwick, Tennessee was officially

charged with introduction of a controlled substance, methamphetamine, into a correctional facility. The Justice Court set her bond for the felony charge at \$2,500. Harmon's case will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

All year long animal clinics see many dogs infected with different viruses and disease. Some of these dog's lives cannot be saved despite extreme efforts and treatment.

Fortunately, there are vaccines to help prevent many illnesses that affect dogs. Vaccinating your dog has long been considered one of the easiest ways to help them live a long, healthy

life. Not only are there different vaccines for different diseases, there are different types and combinations of vaccines. Certain vaccines are considered vital to all dogs. Canine parvovirus, distemper, canine hepatitis and rabies are considered core vaccines. Also vaccines against Bordetella bronchiseptica, Borrelia burgdorferi and Leptospira bacteria are needed. Puppies should receive a series of vaccinations starting at six to eight weeks of age. A veterinarian should administer a minimum of three vaccinations three- to four-week intervals until 16 weeks of age. It is also recommended to get your puppy an additional parvovirus vaccine at 6 months of age to help prevent this deadly virus. Make an appointment today to get your dog the road to good health. Tishomingo County is considering applying to the Mississippi Development Authority for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant of an amount up to \$500,000.00 for an Economic Development/Public Building construction and infrastructure improvements project. The State of Mississippi has been allocated approximately \$11,750,000.00 million that will be made available to cities, towns, and counties on a competitive basis to undertake eligible community development activities. These funds must be used to benefit low- and moderate-income persons.

Activities for which these funds may be used are in the areas of public facilities and economic development. 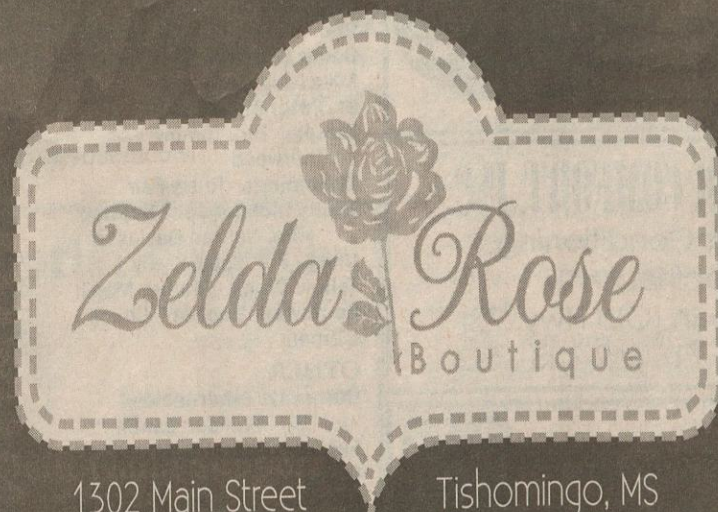

then struck six years later and she had to become the complete caregiver for her husband. She was a gentle soft spoken woman who was found recently to be quite funny.

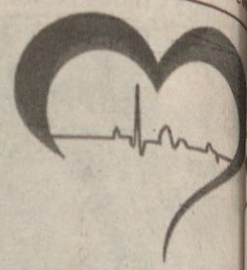

Legislative Report

Week of January 15, 2018

Winter weather affected the Capitol City in the same way it affected much of the state this week with many schools and state departments closing, but the legislature continued with meetings as planned.

The sole piece of legislation discussed on the House floor this week was House Bill 957, which aims to overhaul the current MAEP education funding formula and replace it with the Mississippi Uniform Per Student Funding Formula. The bill, based on a series of recommendations from the consulting group EdBuild, would base school funding on student enrollment rather than teacher units. It sets the base student cost at \$4,800 per student with additional weights added for students with individual needs, such as special education, gifted, low income and English language learners.

Supporters of the bill say it provides an easier way to predict how much funding a school will receive and ensures fairness across school districts. They also say it will gradually increase the overall investment in education by an estimated \$107 million once the formula is fully established. Opponents of the bill expressed concerns about how the state would be able to finance the new formula. Some questioned why the bill made no provisions to recalculate for future inflation, and some said poor and rural districts would be adversely affected by the bill's wording. In total, 17 amendments were offered to make adjustments to different aspects of the bill and all were voted down. Two amendments were adopted to resolve technical errors.

After a floor debate that spanned four hours, the bill passed by a vote of 66 to 54. The bill will continue to face possible changes as it goes to the Senate for a vote and, if amended by the Senate, to conference, where both House and Senate members will meet to finalize the proposal. Assuming the bill is signed by the Governor, it still involves a five-year "phase-in," which would not begin until 2020.

Visitors at the Capitol this week included the Mississippi Primary Health Care Association, the Mississippi Economic Council and supporters of Autism Awareness Day.

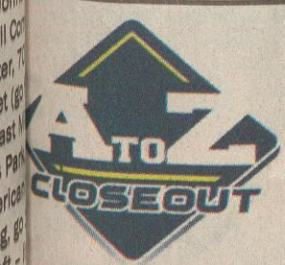

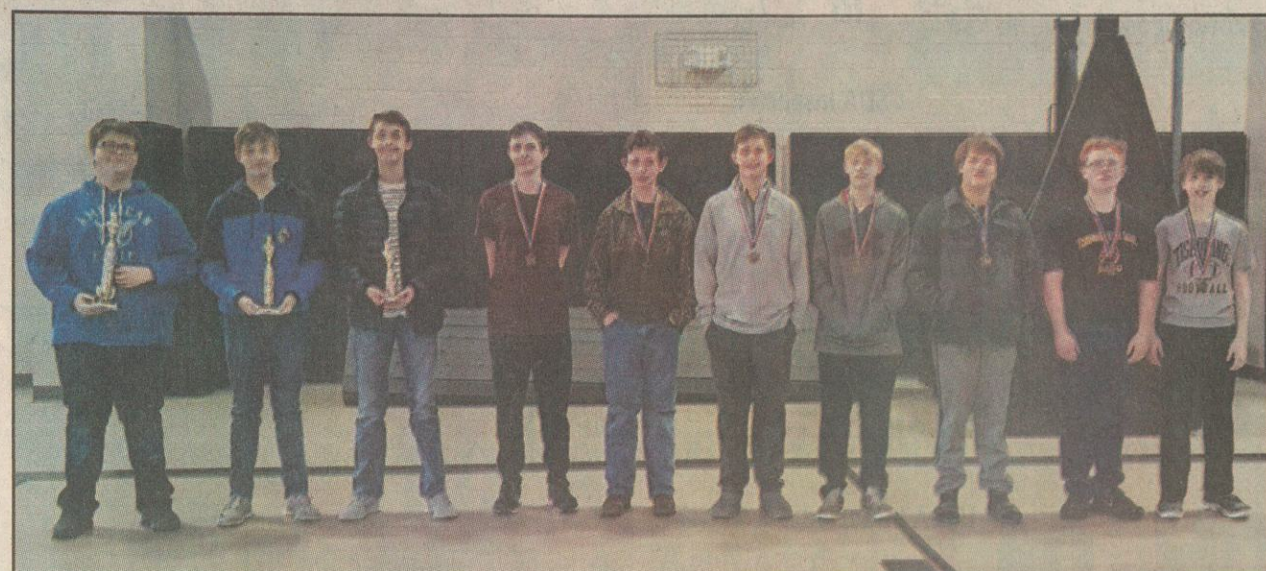

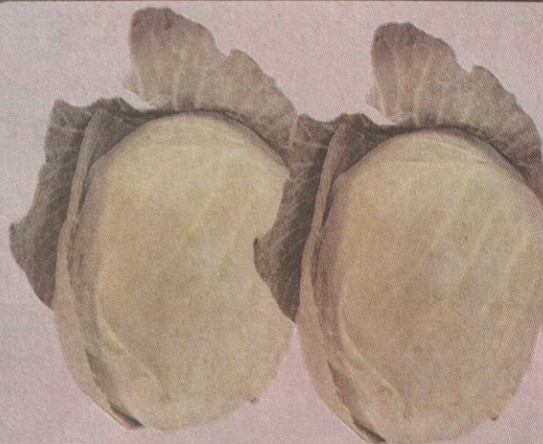

The photo at left, taken in 1963, was brought by the office by Martha Couch. It is the old covered bridge near Cherokee. She said several times when the Buzzrd Roost Creek flooded, the bridge came off its foundation, and the county would pull it back in place. The Nat-

chez Trace was planning on making this one of their attractions along the Trace, but vandals burned it. The county then closed the road.

Charlotte's note: the photo at right hung in my mother's house for many years. The framed photo and article was given to

her by the late Mrs. Twila Tapp, who lived in the area many years ago. The following words from a Colbert County paper was also framed: This picture was submitted to us Mrs. Twila Tapp. the date on the picture was July 18, 1965. The bridge was constructed around 1824.

Mrs. Tapp stated that it brought back many happy memories of her three children: Betty Jo, Glenda Joyce and Dale. They used to follow a trail through the woods that led to a place under the bridge. Mrs. Tapp remembered there were lots of rocks for the children to sit on and

that is where they went to fish. They also rode the bus through the bridge every day on their way to school. The birdge was located on what was then Old Memphis Highway. The Commissioners at that time had worked hard to repair damages that had occurred to the bridge.

Those commissioners were: M. J. Hale, Chairman; Hall Keeton; Ed Waldrep; Curtis Spangler and Al Harden. Unfortunately, the bridge burned sometime in the 1970s. Many people believe arson was involved.



Found in family files at home was this photo of the Iuka Concert Band. Written on the back are the names Bea Stephens, Corbett Stephens, and Mr. and Mrs.. E. T. Boone of Birmingham, AL. Bea Stephens probably brought the photo to the Vidette for sharing. It had no names of the musicians pictured.

The Iuka Concert Band performed at the old Mineral Springs Hotel in Iuka. After the yellow fever epidemic hit the south in 1878, the mineral springs in Iuka became a visiting place for people from all over the nation. By 1880 Iuka was a famous spa and wealthy health seekers came to Iuka. During this time the Iuka Mineral Springs Hotel was famous for its ballroom and orchestra music.



From our old files, two of Iuka's business women from the 1950's and before. At left, Mrs. R. S. Williams, owner and operator of the 5 and 10 cent store in Iuka and at right, Mrs. Emma Brown Wakefield, owner and operator of a women's clothing and shoe store which was once known as T. L. Brown and Company. Her brother, W. S. Brown, Sr. and his wife, Mrs. Blanche Hubbard Brown owned the store next door, the two stores were known as Mrs. Blanche's and Mrs.'s Emma. After the death of the ladies, the two stores merged and became W. S. Brown & Company, owned by W. S. Brown, Jr.
