Mrs. Laci McClung has successfully created a student-centered learning environment in her seventh grade ELA classroom. She is







To the Community,

The recession of 2008 hit hard in Iuka and Tishomingo County. At that time, the City of Iuka had been paying for one person to work 2 hours in the evening (at minimum wage) so that the library could stay open until 6:00 Mon-Thu. But the recession forced the City to suspend their support for the evening worker, meaning that the library would have to close at 5:00 every day. A generous member of the community was so alarmed by this situation that the library received an anonymous donation to ensure that the library's evening hours were safe. Of course this donation eventually ran out, and when it did the City was still unable to resume re-

sponsibility for the position. Once again, the library's evening hours were in jeopardy, and again, an amazing thing happened: another anonymous donation came in so that the evening hours would continue! Again, the position was funded and the library remained available until 6:00.

Now it is 10 years later, and the second private gift has also been exhausted. We have asked the Mayor and Aldermen to resume funding the position; at their next meeting (Tues., Feb. 6, 7:00 p.m.) they will be voting Yes or No on our request. If they vote Yes, the position continues and the library keeps the current hours. If they vote No, the library will close at 5:00 Monday-Friday, starting Feb. 7.

If access to the library

in the evenings is important to you, then it is vital that you let your Iuka Aldermen know. As your representatives, they count on you to let them know what choice you want them to make.







"Built Ford Tough"

Attached is a photograph taken circa 1952, of Brice Stricklen from Burnsville (center) known in the community as "Mr. Brice". This photo was taken at the request of V.M. Box (pictured on the left) who owned the local Ford dealership in Burnsville, MS for many years. Mr. Box asked Mr. Brice to bring his new Ford work truck, loaded with heavy logs, to his dealership and pose for a professional photograph to be used in advertisements in the local and Memphis newspapers to demonstrate how "tough" Ford work trucks were for hauling heavy loads. Standing atop those huge logs was Mr. Brice's brother-in-law and truck driver, Darrell Honeycutt.

Mr. Brice was well-known and respected in the Burnsville area for many years. He employed many local men at his sawmills and at one time

had five active sawmills. It was a well-known fact that Mr. Brice paid his workers every Saturday afternoon, at the Public Well in downtown Burnsville. He had a sharp mind for math, kept his payroll in his head and always paid his workers in cash. The local merchants at the time had a custom of allowing customers to buy essentials, such as groceries or gasoline, during the week on credit. This was way before credit cards or debit cards, and most transactions were in cash. The customers only had to say to the merchants "I'll pay you when Mr. Brice pays me!" That was money in the bank for those store owners because they not only knew who Mr. Brice was, but that he was definitely going to pay his employees on Saturday.

Brice Stricklen was born January 25, 1901, the oldest of thirteen children of Marcus and Blanche

Stricklen. He was married to Mary Alma Adams. They had two daughters, Wilma Elizabeth Gilliland (of Burnsville) and Laura Blanche Lindsey (of Iuka).

TVA Begins Prep Work for Construction at Pickwick

TVA is beginning exploratory work this week at Pickwick Landing Dam in preparation for upcoming construction to fortify the dam against potential impacts from a severe earthquake.

February 22, 2017—TVA is conducting exploratory drilling, clearing, and operating barges and other work on the reservoir and shoreline areas at Pickwick Landing Dam. The work will last about two weeks and be visible to travelers on State Route 128 which crosses the entire length of the dam. This initial work will not impact traffic; however, installation of elements in April and May will require some temporary lane closures. The dam will continue to operate on its regular schedule.

This exploratory work will provide important information for a major project to later this year to help Pickwick Landing Dam

withstand a major seismic event. That project will include upgrades to both the upstream and downstream sides of the dam's South Earthen embankment. Berms will be constructed along the toe of each side of the embankment and areas of extended fill would be placed in select locations.

Construction of the upgrades is planned to start this fall, ending in late 2021. The project is not expected to change operation of the reservoir—lake levels are expected to continue to follow the existing seasonal patterns. TVA issued a Final Environmental Assessment on Sept. 30, 2016, that proposes how the project will strengthen the dam's south embankment to lessen potential harm in case of a severe earthquake.

Pickwick is located near the New Madrid Fault Zone, which in 1811-12 experienced some of the most extreme

earthquakes in American history. TVA continually monitors and evaluates the overall health of its 49 dams, including seismic stability. A 2014 analysis at Pickwick Landing showed that, in a large seismic event, the dam's South embankment has the potential for damage.

TVA's Dam Safety team took immediate action to mitigate the risks to the public downstream. TVA installed an early warning system to notify downstream-residents in the unlikely event of an earthquake large enough to damage the dam's South earthen embankment. TVA also worked with local emergency management agencies, media and other stakeholders to raise awareness of the alert system and educate the Pickwick community, using informational materials, public meetings and exhibits at local venues.

"We have a long history of operating our dams

across the Valley, and they have performed well," says Bernie Auld, senior program manager, TVA Dam Safety. "Pickwick Landing Dam is a good operational dam, and our work here will stabilize the south embankment to meet dam safety criteria for an extreme seismic event."


