Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office Conducts Investigation into Late Night Assault on Local Law Enforcement After Police Chase

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office has officially charged Samuel Jacob Rice, 32, of luka with five counts of aggressated assault with a deadly weapon on a law enforcement officer, for the events that occurred early Friday morning in Sharp's Bottom. He is also being charged with two counts of kidnapping for the situation that occurred later that same day in Burneville.

According to Sheriff John Daugherty the injured deputy is still undergoing tests and will hopefully be back in service for the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office in the near future.

On Fridey, February, 2nd the Tishomingo County Shereff's Office received a call for assistance from Alcora County Law Enforcement. An active chase was in progress and officers from the Alcora County Sheriff's Department, and the Farmington Police Department had pursued a green Jorg Wrangler into Tishomingo County, around County Rd. 202, in the Sharp's Bottom area.

The pursuit was ended by the Alcoen County agencies insolved and an Alonea County Sheriff's patrol whicle became stuck on a logging road just off of CR 302. A Game Warden, for the Mississippi Department of Wildlife Faheries and Parks (MIFWFF), was in the area and assisted the Alcorn County depany Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies arrived in the area and smod at the end of the logging road and on CR 302 while the patrol which was bring pulled from the mid.

The Josp Wrangler that was being pursued by the Altern officials suddenly appeared on the logging road treeding at a

high rate of speed and hit the MIDWFF truck. Rice then appeared to have turned the leep in the direction of a Farmington Police officer before

Donnie Joe Marlar was notified Thursday that their 20-year-old son had been killed in Vietnam. The Burnsville man died by enemy fire, speculatively on patrol near Saigon. He had recently been promoted to the rank of sergeant. He is the son of Mrs. Bryce Marlar and the late Mr. Marlar. The photo above was received by his mother only a few days before he was killed.



Legislative Report

Committee meetings to discuss House bills wrapped up on Tuesday, and the House convened as a whole Wednesday through Friday to discuss the legislation that made it to the calendar. Bills considered dealt with a variety of topics on different subjects.

House Bill 192 would make it lawful to transport unopened beer and light wine on state and federal highways in dry areas of the state. This bill passed by a vote of 91-19. Similarly, House Bill 840 would give maritime retailers operating in the Mississippi Sound or on the Mississippi River the ability to obtain a permit to sell alcohol. This bill passed by a vote of 83-29.

A tax credit would be offered to taxpayers who employ persons convicted of certain non-violent crimes by House Bill 175, which passed by a vote of 110-5.

The House voted unanimously to pass House Bill 826, which outlines criminal penalties for the embezzlement or misapplication of perpetual care trust funds. These trusts are established so that earnings may be used for the repair and overall maintenance of public cemeteries. Another unanimous vote occurred on House Bill 1028, known as "Nancy's Law." This bill would allow the Department of Human Services to relocate an individual or provide a new caretaker when investigations reveal abuse of a vulnerable person.

The House Committee on Public Health and Human Services introduced House Bill 709. This bill would create the Prescription Drugs Consumer Affordable Alternative Payment Options Act, which allows pharmacists to provide additional information to patients detailing options for medication that might be more

affordable. The bill passed by a vote of 118-1.

government County would receive more power under House Bill 164, which would allow the president of a county board of supervisors to issue a proclamation declaring a local emergency. This measure passed by a unanimous vote of 118-0.

On Friday, the House voted to expand the Mississippi Virtual School Program with the passage of House Bill 1037, which creates an online application process for course providers in an effort to provide students in the program with a wider range of classes.

The House also passed House Bill 1510, sparking debate among members. This bill would prohibit abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Supporters of the bill say it would protect both the lives of unborn children and their mothers. Those opposed argued that this seemed unconstitutional and that the state should not be making decisions about women's health. The measure passed by a vote

A number of noncontroversial bills also passed through the House this week, including a bill creating the Mississippi Travel and Tourism Council, a bill adding veterans diagnosed PTSD to the list of persons who may use support ani-

Belmont High School Named MBS 2017 High School of the Year - North


