Corinth Man Arrested in **Tishomingo County** 

On February 10th Tishomingo County Sherriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on Hwy. 72 West in Iuka for Careless Driving. The vehicle was a "rental" but the driver was not on the "rental agreement" to

drive the vehicle. At this time, the driver began showing signs of nervousness and the passenger of the vehicle, Timothy Rashard Davis, appeared to be

Deputies were granted consent to search of the vehicle by the driver and some alleged methamphetamine was found in the floorboard. Davis then claimed ownership of the alleged narcotic and was transported to the Tishomingo

County Jail. Timothy Rashard Davis, 40-year-old, black male of 1601 Gaines Road Apt #8 Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of controlled substance, methamphetamine. Davis' bond was set by the Justice Court at \$1,500. This case will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

# Iuka Attorney, Tacey Clark Pleas Guilty to Three Felony Charges

On February 20th 2018, former Iuka attorney, Tacey Clark, 54, pled guilty to two felony counts of insurance fraud and one felony count of aggravated DUI. At this time it appears she will serve no jail time for the cases with which she is associated. Originally charged with arson, Clark opted to plea down to the lesser charges.

This case was taken out of the hands of local authorities; assistant Attorney General, Jim Giddy of Jackson, Mississippi was brought in to prosecute the case and Judge Larry Roberts of Meridian presided over the case and handed down the sentence.

On April 16th 2016 both Clark's law office on Eastport St. in Iuka and her home in the Mill Creek area burned down within a few hours of each other. During the course of the investigation into the alleged arson case, Clark was involved in a wreck in which a motorcyclist was severely injured. Clark was reported to be under the influence at the time of the accident. She was arrested and eventually charged, by the Iuka Police Department with arson and DUI/ maiming.

On March 2nd 2017, Clark was indicted by a special Tishomingo County grand jury on two charges of arson, and one charge of driving under the influence/maiming.

The February 20th 2018, sentencing was held at the courthouse in Iuka, though the local area Judges and District Attorney did not participate in the final litigation.

From the Circuit Court of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, on February 20th 2018, Judge, Larry Roberts. The defendant, Tacey Clark, age: 54, Convicted of: CTI: Insurance Fraud, CTII: Insurance Fraud and Aggravated DUI. All three are felony charges.

Insurance Fraud CTII- Sentence Imposed by order: 3 yrs MDCO/ 3 yrs Susp

Aggravated DUI- Sentence Imposed by order: 5 yrs MDOC/ 5 yrs Susp/ 5 yrs Supervised Probation



# Smokeless Tobacco Not a Safer Alternative to Cigarettes "A lot of people think

Tobacco use is started and established primarily

during adolescence. Because young people who use smokeless tobacco can become addicted to nicotine, they may be more likely to also become cigarette smokers. Although Mcfarland dips tobacco and stays away from cigarettes, his health risks are no better than smoker's.

Smokeless tobacco is associated with many health problems. It can lead to nicotine addiction; cancer of the mouth, esophagus, and pancreas; increase risks for early delivery and stillbirth when used during pregnancy; can cause nicotine poisoning in children; increase the risk for death from heart disease and stroke, and is associated with other diseases in the mouth.

"Smokeless tobacco can cause gum disease, tooth decay, and tooth loss," said Amy Winter, Director of the Office of Tobacco Control at the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH).

"A lot of people think that just because it's not a cigarette it's safer, but it's not. All tobacco products are harmful, addictive and can cause cancer."

tobacco Preventing use among youth is critical to ending the tobacco epidemic in the United States. Flavorings in tobacco products can make them more appealing to youth. In 2014, 73 percent of high school students and 56 percent of middle school students who used tobacco products in the past 30 days reported using a flavored tobacco product during that time.

"There is evidence that youth may be sensitive to nicotine and that teens can feel dependent on nicotine sooner than said Jenniffer adults," Palmer, director of the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties. "There is a strong relationship between youth smoking and depression, anxiety and stress. Expectations of positive outcomes from smoking, such as coping with stress and controlling weight, are related to youth tobacco use.

# Legislative Report

By Bubba Carpenter Week of February 12, 2018

With general House Bills out of the way, representatives began working on House Appropriations Bills, which will determine how much money is given to various state organizations.

The House was responsible for looking at the preliminary budgets of 51 state agencies, including the Departments of Transportation, Public Health, Medicaid and Public Safety.

Budgets included reverse repealers, a clause which ensures that a bill cannot become law before going to a conference committee for further revisions. With reverse repealers in place, most appropriations bills

were voted on in a block to help speed up the process.

Among these was House Bill 1592, the appropriations bill for the Mississippi Department of Education. During discussion for this bill, a conditional amendment was offered that would prevent MDE from receiving any money from the state budget unless the department removed its requirement for students to pass all end-of-course tests, commonly known as "exit exams." The amendment passed the House by a voice

The House Ways and Means committee also introduced several bills on the House floor this week.

Under House Bill 1550, recent college graduates could file for a tax deduction within one year of graduating from a four-year college or university. Those graduates would be entitled to this deduction for up to three consecutive years if they remain a resident and employee in the state of Mississippi, and an additional two years if they purchase property in the state for residential or commercial use.

Next week is the deadline for action on appropriations and revenue bills. After that, House committees will begin considering bills which passed through the Senate.

On Tuesday, the House recognized Tony Brown, Mississippi's Gatorade Player of the Year in football. House Resolution 14 commended the senior running back from East Central High School in Jackson County for his accomplishments on the gridiron.

Several groups visited the Capitol this week, including medical students from the University of Mississippi Medical Center, the Mississippi Egg Marketing Board, the NAACP, Canopy Children's Solution, the National Alliance of Mental Illness and the Women's Foundation of Mississippi.



# The Community of Ingleton

(This story is being shared with our readers by Bob Hodge of Iuka. Many have not heard of this community located North of Hwy. 72 in the Dickson Community, West Colbert County, but it did exist in the late 1800's. According to Google it was 3 miles SE of Cherokee, 10 miles west of Iuka and 7 miles from Riverton. All that is left now is Fossick Lane near the Mill Creek Loop.)

The community of Ingleton in West Colbert County was established in 1870 by Thomas Lancelot Fossick, Sr. who came to north Alabama to construct the bridgeheads and culverts of the railroad from Tuscumbia to the Tennessee line.

He was born in England in 1817 and moved to the United States in 1849. Over the next ten years, Fossick built a lot of the mason work on the James River Canal near

in 1870, he established a business in the production and wholesale dealership of golitic limestone, with quarries in Colbert and Franklin counties.

Fossick and his wife, Margaret Richardson Fossick, named their community Ingleton

their home in England. A three-mile spurt tract was built from Dickson (now Chisca) north to the quarry ending at a 100foot millshed with a boiler room facing west where the cut stone was manufactured. There was an adjoining millshed yard which extended into the branch. An underground waterway was constructed to provide water for the sawing operation. A twostory office and commissary building was located west of the underground waterway.

A number of houses were constructed in Ingleton during the 1870's, including the residence of several members of the Fossick family. The family brought with them their English lifestyle and heritage. Their children were sent to Europe to school. Mr. Meriwether, their gardener, came from England to landscape the grounds. Magnolia and Yew trees

abounded. Rose gardens were cultivated and orchards established.

The only remaining house is located in a beautiful setting on a hill above the quarry site and is known as the George Fossick home. The twostory dwelling faces south. The two large chimneys accommodate eight fireplaces, one in each of the main rooms. Stone steps lead to a wide front porch. and the solid front door is surrounded by panes of etched glass with an ornate octagon shaped glass above the front door. The circular staircase begins to the left of the hallway. The wide railing curves to the right to a landing with three more steps from the landing to the north and to the south to reach the upper rooms. The home is now owned by Mr. Jimmy Davenport. Mr. Davenport's father purchased the property in 1911 and the Davenport family has

lived in the house s that time.
