Old Pleasant Hill Church Burglarized

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office is asking for the public's help in finding information that will lead to the arrest of the individuals involved with the recent burglary of a local church. Several electronic items were stolen from Old Pleasant Hill Church on County Road, 304. Some of those items were as follows: a Tascam CD-A5-80 CD/USB Cassette Player and Recorder, and a Musysic 4800W Power Mixer - 24bit.

On March 10th the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office responded to the report of a burglary at Old Pleasant Hill Church, located on CR 304 in the Doskie Community of HWY 365 North.

When the deputies arrived they spoke with some members of the congregation who informed them that someone had recently used force to gain entry into the church building. The thieves stole approximately \$3,100 worth of new sound equipment. The equipment was installed around the first part of March.







According to family, Myra Cooper needed a man to farm and chop wood and Mose Nunley needed a woman to cook, can, and wash the clothes so they married out of necessity.
