MDOT Adopt-A-Highway Program is Building Partnerships to Keep Mississippi Beautiful



This van is the latest addition to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department's "Inmate Litter Removal Program." The van was used by the county was very worn and this van was donated by the Mississippi Department of Transportation. The Sheriff's Department will use it in transporting inmates to the roadways throughout the county for trash removal. Sheriff Daugherty is working with the Justice Court system to help those with warrants and misdemeanors work off their fines. Rather than housing these individuals, they become active in the community service program and meet with officers Friday and Saturday. This program is paying fines will promote a more positive attitude for the individuals with warrants while helping the community in the process. For the housed inmates who are, namely, the non-felons, will be given the opportunity to work off fines or time in this manner on Monday through Thursday. When inmates are available for community service, the plan is to use the old van on county roads and the newer van on state roads to enhance the cleanup effort. Last year the Tishomingo

County Sheriff's office was the recipient of the "Green Team" award, from the Mississippi Department of Transportation, for the implementation of the "Inmate Litter Removal" program. As we move into the warmer seasons, Sheriff Daugherty would like to remind the public to remove trash from the back of pickups and dispose of it properly to assist in keeping the roadways clean.

Nelson Johnson, Chairman of the Tishomingo County Adopt a Highway Program, also continues to sign up individuals and businesses for highway litter control. Brook's Grocery, Lambert's Building Supply, Sid's Trading Company, and Jack's Restaurant have signed up for highway sections, along with two new ones, Aqua Grill and Farmhouse Restaurant. The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office is asking for the public's help in finding information that will lead to the arrest of the individuals involved with the recent burglary of a local church. Several electronic items were stolen from Old Pleasant Hill Church on County Road, 304. Some of those items were as follows: a Tascam CD-A5-80 CD/USB Cassette Player and Recorder, and a Musysic 4800W Power Mixer - 24bit.

On March 10th the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office responded to the report of a burglary at Old Pleasant Hill Church, located on CR 304 in the Doskie Community of HWY 365 North.

When the deputies arrived they spoke with some members of the congregation who informed them that someone had recently used force to gain entry into the church building. The thieves stole approximate-

ly \$3,100 worth of new sound equipment. The equipment was installed around the first part of March.

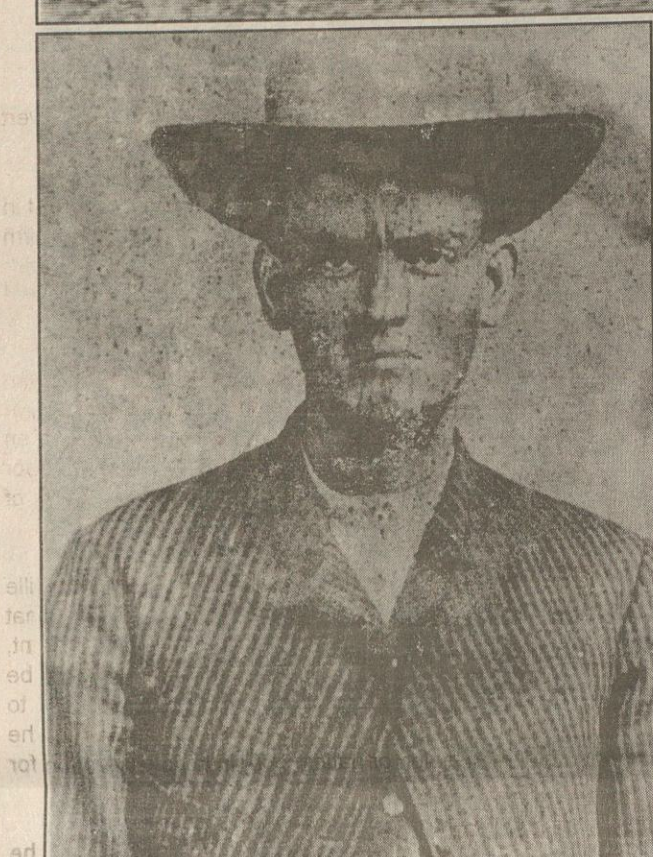

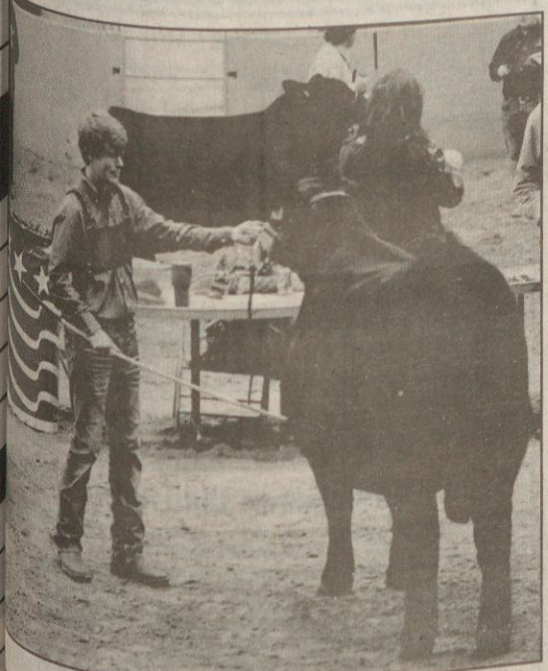

Deuteronomy 18:18-19 says, "I will raise them up a prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee (Moses), and will put My words in His mouth: and He shall speak unto them all that I shall command Him. And it shall come to pass, that
