Burglary Arrests Made Over Easter Holiday Weekend Tisho-

mingo County Sheriff's Office recently made two arrests connection with the Deputy Thomas MyNatt (left) and Investigator Joseph burglaries Marlar (right) with items recovered from the suspects at the Mill that were stolen at Mill Creek Marina

Creek Marina near Iuka.

Mark Anthony Michael and Jaret Ray Taylor were taken into custody. During the past several days, officials from the Sheriff's Department had received reports of numerous items Pictured above: Camouflage Gillie Suit, brown which were stolen from used by the suspect(s) during the burglaries some boats that were staged at the marina.

In the early morning hours of Friday, March, 30th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop of a truck in the city limits of Iuka. During the course of the traffic stop, several firearms were found in the vehicle along with a "wig" and a camouflage gillie suit. The driver of the vehicle was recognized as a suspect in the recent case of theft in which some farming equipment was stolen. This, paired with the knowledge of the recent events that had occurred at the Mill Creek Marina, allowed the deputies to detain all of the individ-

uals in the vehicle. After further investigation, "permission to search" was granted from both of the suspects; their residences in Prentiss County were searched. Sheriff John Daugherty stated that his deputies and investigators were able to recover everything that has been reported stolen. Those that were charged are listed as follows:




War Ration Book (below)

The Battle Of Armageddon

Perhaps no battle mentioned in the Bible has been the subject of more conversation and conjecture than the battle of Armageddon. It is interesting that we just finished with the Marriage of Christ and the church, and now we are into a "negative subject" that speaks about death and desta .ction. It may come as a surprise to some people, but those who study the whole Bible will not be surprised, to learn that Scripture probably says much more negative stuff than positive! I just finished reading through several prophetic books of the Bible, as I do on a regular basis, and I noticed in this reading that the prophets had much to say about God's judgment against sin. I wonder why modern preachers and

those who wink they are prophets do not major on thes themes, since the world today is at least as sinful as the vorld of the prophets' times. I v uld much rather write, preach and teach about heaven, but the sad note is that most people will not be in heaven, thus the need of our day, and any day, is to warn the unsaved, as well as to console believers when needed, that the world is headed for judgment. In our present chapter of Revelation, one

the battle of Armageddon in Revelation.

Revelation 19:11-13 says, "And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and He that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He doth judge and make war. His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns; and He had a name written that no man knew, but He Himself. And He was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and His name is called The Word of God."

John the apostle, who wrote the Book of Revelation, is seeing a vision, and in this vision he sees one sitting upon a white horse. The context here shows clearly that this is Jesus, who once rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, but is here coming back to earth on a white horse. horse was an animal used in battle; whereas the donkey on which Jesus rode into Jerusalem almost two thousand years ago was an animal symbolizing peace. The Lord Jesus is not coming at this point in time to call for repentance or to heal the sick; He is coming to judge and make war. He is called Faithful and True, because the judgment He is about to execute is in accordance with the plan and will of God. He will make war

in righteousness, whereas most wars started by men are not "righteous wars" Those who think that God is all about love, forgiveness, acceptance etc. need to pay close attention to our passage. Yes, God is a God of all of the things I mention here, but there will be a time when it is too late for any of these, at least for those who have followed their own ways and rejected God and His way!

The eyes of the Lord Jesus, at this point in time, will not be filled with compassion on the unsaved, rather they will be like a flame of fire, symbolizing judgment. (Have you noticed that the "all positive preachers" never cover subjects like the one before us?) There are many crowns on the head of

the Lord Jesus when comes back to whip battle of Armagedd Some of these crowns evidently be those that laid at the feet of Jesus the saved who have y them in this life (Rev tion 4:10). The name sus has here is one only He knows, perh because it is a sper name given to Him for particular battle, but is conjecture, for no really knows this na or why it is given, exc God. The clothing of sus is "dipped in bloo showing that the battle is about to whip will b battle of human block shed. Revelation 14:14 gives us a preview of battle of Armageddr and Revelation 16:16 gir us the name "Armage don" for this battle.
