Shooting Under Investigation

The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation has taken over the case of a recent shooting that occurred in Burnsville on Wednesday, April 4th. It has been reported that officers responded to a disturbance call at a residence on CR 294, off of Hwy. 365. Possible gun shots were heard during the call and officers took extra precautions when approaching the residence. When the deputies arrived on the scene a man was shot by law enforcement.

A spokesman for MBI, Warren Strain, reported that deputies were confronted by a man who was armed with a long gun. Deputies ordered the man to drop the weapon. Strain says the man refused the commands of the officers and pointed the gun in the direction of deputies; in response to this the deputies fired their weapons, wounding the man.

The man was taken to NMMC in Tupelo, and from there was airlifted to a Memphis hospital for treatment. The man's name has not been officially released.

MBI continues to investigate the incident and local authorities are not authorized to release information at this time.

Positive Identification of Body Unconfirmed

The body found floating in Rhodes Branch Creek on Mt. Gilead Rd. on Wednesday afternoon, April 4th has still not been positively identified by the state crime lab. A cause of death is also undetermined at this time. It was reported by the County Coroner, Mac Wilemon that there were no apparent traumatic injuries to the body. The body was discovered by a power company crew member and reported to local officials. It was reported that the body had been in the water an extensive amount of time.

A vehicle registered to John Lovelace was found recently near an old share cropping house which belongs to George Yow on

CR 180. This vehicle was located less than a quarter of a mile from where the body was found. John Lovelace of Burnsville has been missing for six weeks. His last known whereabouts were in Alcorn County near Strickland. A GPS ankle bracelet registered to Lovelace, which had been cut off, was found in Alcorn County on February 21st. His vehicle was first noted to be near the residence on CR 180 in Tishomingo County on February 23rd and was then towed on February 26th. There is a possibility that this could be the body of John Lovelace though it is still inconclusive at this time.



The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met at the Iuka Public Library March 19th at 11 am. Those present were Vickie Durham, Eunell Handy and Sharon Hairrell.. We did the salutes and pledges of the American, State and Confederate Flags, completed the U.D.C rituals and the singing of "Dixie". The meeting was declared open by President Sharon Hairrell, she read the minutes and they were approved. Treasurer Eunell Handy gave the treasure report and it was approved. There was no old business and the new business discussion was about our membership. We have seven paying members and three active members. Eunell Handy has four applications ready to send in for approval and she asked Vickie Durham to review them before they were submitted. We are very excited about this, there was no other new business, except we did discuss out District Meeting that will be coming up soon. Vickie Durham presented the program, "A Soldier's Legacy" Calvin Kelley's three-year stint in Confederate Gray was difficult and an ultimately tragedy. Battle wounds twice laid the private up for months on end. But fortune also smiled on him; after his second stretch in a Southern hospital, he met a special young woman. Kelley signed on with Company K of the 8th Arkansas Infantry on October 12, 1861. After working as a cook at Pitman's Ferry, where he enlisted,

Kelley saw his first combat in the brutal Battle of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, fought from December 31st, 1862, through January 2, 1863, along Stone's River. There he was badly wounded in the leg. Fit for action again by late summer, he fought in the September 1863 Battle of Chickamauga, Georgia, and was wounded again. He returned to a hospital bed

While recovering in Georgia, Kelley met Cordelia H. McSpadden and fell in love with her. The couple married on January 28, 1864. Three months later, Calvin gave his new bride a two-dollar gold piece and a photograph of himself and bade her farewell. It was the last time Cordelia saw her husband alive. On May 15, 1864, he was wounded in the head during the Battle of Resaca, Georgia. He was sent by rail to Fairgrounds Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia, where he died a week later. He was buried in the city's Oakland Cemetery. Cordelia never remarried. In addition to the photograph, it turned out that Calvin had left his wife another legacy. Five months after his death, on October 12, 1864, Cordelia gave birth to his daughter, Martha Frances Kelley. It was three years to the day after Calvin's enlistment. This was a very interesting article and a sad one also.

Services Held for Former Iuka **High School Band Director**

William Chester Cox, age 91, died Saturday, April 07, 2018 at Baptist Memorial Hospital, Columbus, Mississippi. A Mass of Resurrection was held Tuesday, April 10, 2018 at 11:00 AM at Annunciation Catholic Church with Father Jeffery Waldrep officiating. Burial with U.S. Army Honors followed Tuesday at 3:00 PM at St. Thomas



Aquinas Cemetery near Saltillo, MS.

Mr. Cox was born on March 23, 1927 in Jericho, MS to the late William Leslie and Sula Sample Cox. He was a graduate of both Ole Miss and Mississippi State University and was a band director retiring from S. D. Lee High School. He was a Communicant of Annunciation Catholic Church.

Chester Cox came to Iuka High School in 1961 and left in 1971, leaving a legacy of Iuka having one of the best bands in North Mississippi. In the 1962 annual it read, ""New" was the word to describe the Iuka High School Band this year. New uniforms, new director, new members (some 60 strong), new contests and clinics, new practice period ... all of this combined to make the IHS band the greatest ever." Mr. Cox was a stern leader and earned the respect of all his students. His leadership and talent showed in all the choreographed performances the band presented.

Survivors include: his wife: Marjorie Barrett Cox of Columbus; daughters: Angela Boykin and husband Scott; Phyllis Taylor; and Mary Beth Vickers, all of Columbus. 





Letter to Editor:

Some of you will recall that several months ago I wrote a lengthy letter to the editor, about the thieves living among us. I listed several items that were expensive, as well as having sentimental value that were stolen during a burglary of my home five years ago. I had hoped that I could shame someone into alerting the Sheriff as a Christian duty, or to receive a \$1000.00 dollar reward that I have offered if a tip leads to the arrest and conviction of the thieves (I will let the Sheriff decide to whom I pay the reward.)

Imagine my pleasant surprise when I recently received a phone call from Chief investigator Greg Mitchell at the Tishomingo County Sheriff's office, informing me that they have recovered one of the stolen guns in Tennessee, and have recently learned that there have been guns found in two other states!

When I visited the Sheriff's office to retrieve the recovered handgun, I thanked Sheriff Daugherty and Chief investigator Greg Mitchell, and asked how they had made such amazing progress, when the burglary occurred so long ago. They proudly showed and demonstrated a new \$3000.00 computer program that checks every pawn shop in America as well as those items listed with the NCIC (The NCIC is an acronym for the National Crime Information Center) which is a computerized index of criminal justice information (i.e. - criminal record history information, fugitives, stolen, properties, missing persons.) IT is available to Federal, State, and Law Enforcement and other criminal justice agencies and is operational 24 hours a day, 365 days a

The Sheriff and Chief investigator Greg Mitchell soon lost me with their explanation and demonstration of the new computer program. My lack of understanding was somewhat mollified when I recalled that during his campaign for election to his current position, Sheriff Daugherty posted his resume on the computer so that we might learn that he had extensive training with NCIC and other law enforcement programs along with a broad experience in law enforcement. a number of species of sharks, rays, sea turtles, fish, and shellfish...as well as few dinosaurs and a large sea reptile called the mosasaur, which was featured prominently in the 2015 film Jurassic World.

Langford will also be able to help identify other fossils and minerals that attendees would like to bring in. In addition, Robert will have a number of locally found fossils on display, and he will also be able to let you know about upcoming rock-hunting events that NMGMS will be hosting in the area.
