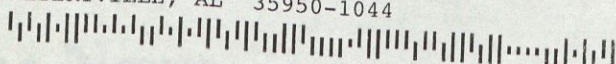

"Tall Tales and Other Lies" will fill the Old Courtroom Again on Friday Night, April 20th

The annual Renaissance Celebration will fill the old courtroom on Friday and Saturday, April 20th and 21st this year. Make your plans now to attend the two day event. New this year will be a Friday night live show in the old Courtroom. Friday night's big event will be "Tall Tales and other Lies" hosted by two of the area's biggest tale-toting, entertaining men - L. O. Bishop and Berlon Durham. It is reported that they will be telling tales of "boil weevils and chicken shoulders." One's a fast talker, one's a slow talker and the two can sing country songs while the cows come home. It's sure to be an entertaining night when the two try to outdo each other's tales.

The stage will be in the old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum on Quitman Street and the walls of the old building will again be filled with laughter, song and good time. The event begins at 6 p.m. and admission will be \$5.00 which will go to raise money for the historical museum. \$5.00 admission is cheap, so those who can, put a little extra in the plate.

Shooting Under Investigation

The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation has taken over the case of a recent shooting that occurred in Burnsville on Wednesday, April 4th. It has been reported that officers responded to a disturbance call at a residence on CR 294, off of Hwy. 365. Possible gun shots were heard during the call and officers took extra precautions when approaching the residence. When the deputies arrived on the scene a man was shot by law enforcement.

A spokesman for MBI, Warren Strain, reported that deputies were confronted by a man who was armed with a long

gun. Deputies ordered the man to drop the weapon. Strain says the man refused the commands of the officers and pointed the gun in the direction of deputies; in response to this the deputies fired their weapons, wounding the man.

The man was taken to NMMC in Tupelo, and from there was airlifted to a Memphis hospital for treatment. The man's name has not been officially released.

MBI continues to investigate the incident and local authorities are not authorized to release information at this time.

Positive Identification of Body Unconfirmed

The body found floating in Rhodes Branch Creek on Mt. Gilead Rd. on Wednesday afternoon, April 4th has still not been positively identified by the state crime lab. A cause of death is also undetermined at this time. It was reported by the County Coroner, Mac Wilemon that there were no apparent traumatic injuries to the body. The body was discovered by a power company crew member and reported to local officials. It was reported that the body had been in the water an extensive amount of time.

A vehicle registered to John Lovelace was found recently near an old share cropping house which belongs to George Yow on

CR 180. This vehicle was located less than a quarter of a mile from where the body was found. John Lovelace of Burnsville has been missing for six weeks. His last known whereabouts were in Alcorn County near Strickland. A GPS ankle bracelet registered to Lovelace, which had been cut off, was found in Alcorn County on February 21st. His vehicle was first noted to be near the residence on CR 180 in Tishomingo County on February 23rd and was then towed on February 26th. There is a possibility that this could be the body of John Lovelace though it is still inconclusive at this time.

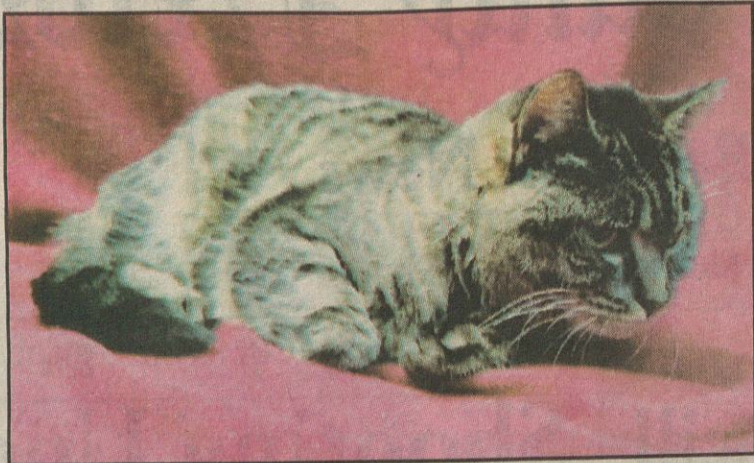

i-Pad Initiative to Include 7th and 8th Grades

The Tishomingo County School District will be moving forward with their district-wide plan to increase technology for students. The school board voted in March to proceed with the district's expansion of its 1-to-1 iPad initiative to include all incoming 7th and 8th graders next school year. The district has already begun its 1-to-1 iPad initiative with all current high school students. Great success and excitement has been observed with the implementation so far. "Our teachers and students are using the iPads in creative ways in the classroom. The iPad initiative is creating an environment that helps prepare our students for day-to-day life after high school. Technology touches almost every vocation and every post-secondary

education experience," stated Superintendent Christie Holly. "For example, Northeast Mississippi Community College has its own iPad initiative that is cutting edge and is changing how students are educated beyond high school. Their innovations with the iPad are saving families thousands of dollars in textbook fees and other areas. We want to make sure our students are able to seamlessly move from their high school experience to those type of experiences in their next phase of life." The district's technology team under the leadership of director Randy Northington has enabled this dream to become reality with all the planning and legwork he and his instructional technology specialist, Kristi Counce, and technology technician, Levi

UDC Met at Library

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met at the Iuka Public Library March 19th at 11 am. Those present were Vickie Durham, Eunell Handy and Sharon Hairrell. We did the salutes and pledges of the American, State and Confederate Flags, completed the U.D.C rituals and the singing of "Dixie". The meeting was declared open by President Sharon Hairrell, she read the minutes and they were approved. Treasurer Eunell Handy gave the treasure report and it was approved. There was no old business and the new business discussion was about our membership. We have seven paying members and three active members. Eunell Handy has four applications ready to send in for approval and she asked Vickie Durham to review them before they were submitted. We are very excited about this, there was no other new business, except we did discuss our District Meeting that will be coming up soon.

Vickie Durham presented the program, "A Soldier's Legacy" Calvin Kelley's three-year stint in Confederate Gray was difficult and an ultimately tragedy. Battle wounds twice laid the private up for months on end. But fortune also smiled on him; after his second stretch in a Southern hospital, he met a special young woman.

Kelley signed on with Company K of the 8th Arkansas Infantry on October 12, 1861. After working as a cook at Pitman's Ferry, where he enlisted,

Kelley saw his first combat in the brutal Battle of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, fought from December 31st, 1862, through January 2, 1863, along Stone's River. There he was badly wounded in the leg. Fit for action again by late summer, he fought in the September 1863 Battle of Chickamauga, Georgia, and was wounded again. He returned to a hospital bed.

While recovering in Georgia, Kelley met Cordelia H. McSpadden and fell in love with her. The couple married on January 28, 1864. Three months later, Calvin gave his new bride a two-dollar gold piece and a photograph of himself and bade her farewell. It was the last time Cordelia saw her husband alive. On May 15, 1864, he was wounded in the head during the Battle of Resaca, Georgia. He was sent by rail to Fairgrounds Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia, where he died a week later. He was buried in the city's Oakland Cemetery. Cordelia never remarried.

In addition to the photograph, it turned out that Calvin had left his wife another legacy. Five months after his death, on October 12, 1864, Cordelia gave birth to his daughter, Martha Frances Kelley. It was three years to the day after Calvin's enlistment. This was a very interesting article and a sad one also.

Services Held for Former Iuka High School Band Director

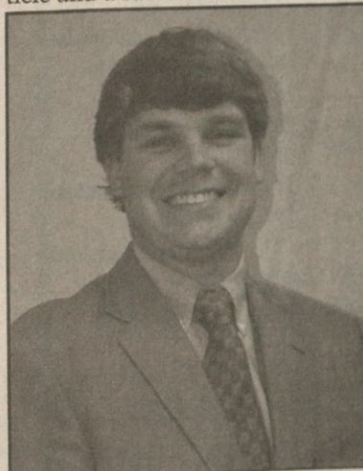

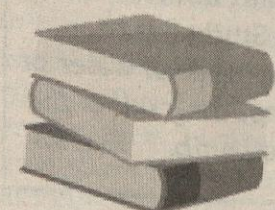

They proudly showed and demonstrated a new \$3000.00 computer program that checks every pawn shop in America as well as those items listed with the NCIC (The NCIC is an acronym for the National Crime Information Center) which is a computerized index of criminal justice information (i.e. - criminal record history information, fugitives, stolen properties, missing persons.) IT is available to Federal, State, and Law Enforcement and other criminal justice agencies and is operational 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Did you find a fossil or an artifact but aren't quite sure what you have?

...that rock to the Tishomingo County Renaissance Day on the 21st. Representatives from both the North Mississippi Gem and Mineral Society and from the Overstreet Indian Arrowhead Identification and Price Guide will be on hand to help you identify and evaluate your fossils, and artifacts.

The Overstreet Indian Arrowhead Identification and Price Guide was initiated by famous collector Robert Overstreet in the 1970s while the author was collecting artifacts from the Tennessee Valley. After years of research and compilation of photographs of artifacts, the book was first published in 1974. Now in its 14th edition, the publication has become the authority for Native American artifact identification in North America and a household name among collectors.

street Indian Arrowhead Identification and Price Guide, Brock Smith will be on hand to help identify and evaluate Native American artifacts. If you already know what you have, bring it by all the same. Overstreet is always looking for new and better examples of point-types to include in their publication—if you have an excellent piece, there is always the chance that Overstreet could use a photo of your point in an upcoming edition to their guide.

Also on-hand will be Robert Langford from the North Mississippi Gem and Mineral Society. Langford specializes in the Cretaceous fossils that can be found at nearby Twenty Mile Creek, which happen to come from the same formation many local residents may have uncovered during the construction of the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway. This Demopolis formation includes

a number of species of sharks, rays, sea turtles, fish, and shellfish...as well as few dinosaurs and a large sea reptile called the mosasaur, which was featured prominently in the 2015 film Jurassic World.

Langford will also be able to help identify other fossils and minerals that attendees would like to bring in. In addition, Robert will have a number of locally found fossils on display, and he will also be able to let you know about upcoming rock-hunting events that NMGMS will be hosting in the area.

The Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society is very excited to have these experts on hand for this year's Renaissance Day. They invite you to come on out, and bring your rocks—who knows what history you could be holding in your hand!
