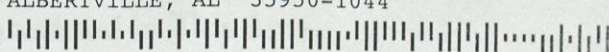

## Iuka Man Dies in Corinth Shooting

An Iuka man was one of two murdered in the Farmington Community near Corinth on Monday evening.

Christopher Smith, 24, of Iuka was killed during a shooting that occurred at the Farmington School Apartments, at 4160 County Road 200, around 5:45 p.m. Jason Lovell, 39, of Corinth, was also pronounced dead at the scene and Paula Russell, 33, of Corinth was shot and is reported to be in stable condition. She was transported to the hospital in Corinth the night of the shooting.

This incident has become an ongoing investigation for the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department and many details have not been released at this time.

two counts of murder and one count of attempted murder following the incident. He turned himself in at the Alcorn County Sheriff's Office around 6:45 a.m. Tuesday morning. Boyd remains in custody at the Alcorn County Jail. No bond has been set at this time. According to Alcorn County Sheriff Ben Caldwell, it is suspected that Boyd knew one or more of the victims prior to the incident.

Christopher Smith is the son of former Tishomingo County Sheriff, David Smith. Cutshall Funeral Home will be in charge of the arrangements but at press time the arrangements were incomplete.

Jason Lovell, who was also killed, is the son of retired Prentiss County Sheriff's Deputy, Keith Lovell.

One person was injured and air lifted out.

## Mural Unveiling and Celebration in Tishomingo

Monday, April 16, 2018, Tishomingo, Mississippi. A ribbon cutting and dedication ceremony was held in this small northeast Mississippi community. Secretary of State, Delbert Hosemann gave the keynote address.

Sponsored by the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society, Mississippi Humanities Council, Tishomingo County School System, Tishomingo County Tourism Council, the Town of Tishomingo, the Bicentennial mural depicts Tishomingo scenes past and present and scenes pertaining to Tishomingo's history and culture. Artist Tony Bullard painted the mural and was assisted by lo-

cal students.

The Tishomingo Mural was the result of a "Portraits of the Past" Bicentennial Project created by the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society and Tishomingo County School Students. Planners studied buildings throughout the county for the creation of a mural that would celebrate the history of Tishomingo County, our state, and our nation, and the Whitfield building at 1302 Main Street in the town of Tishomingo was designated, courtesy of David and Cindy Whitfield.

Over the course of several meetings, students made the final decision on what images to include in the mural to best de-

picture the history of Tishomingo and its impact on Mississippi. Local artist, Tony Bullard, was hired to create the mural which evolved over a six-month period. The second phase of the Portraits of the Past project included full day celebrations in the local schools that would allow all students of the county to celebrate Mississippi's 200-year history.

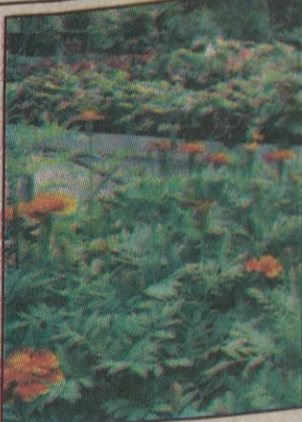

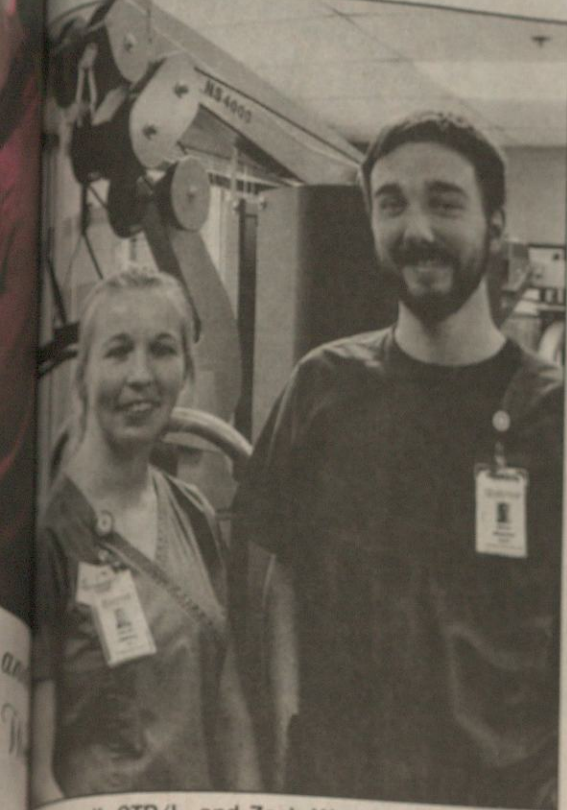

## NMMC-Iuka Celebrates National Occupational Therapy Month

On March 17, 1917, individuals - a nurse, a psychologist, a secretary, a social worker, two architects - came together to establish the profession of occupational therapy.

Occupational therapy is a health care career that uses activities, also called "occupations," to help patients and help restore their independence in everyday activities such as bathing and getting dressed. While many people are not familiar with occupational therapy, professionals in this field have played essential roles throughout American history - including providing care and treatment to thousands of wounded soldiers returning from World War I. These occupational therapists, at times called "reconstruction aides," provided services to restore the lost independence of those men and women

during and following the war.

Today, occupational therapy is provided not only in the hospitals, but in other settings, such as nursing homes, schools and the community. At North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka, occupational therapy is provided for outpatient therapy services, swing bed rehabilitation, and inpatient acute care, with expanded services to treat the children of the Tishomingo County School District.

Now, 101 years later, occupational therapy continues to use activities to help individuals, both young and old, live life to its fullest potential. NMMC-Iuka is proud to offer occupational therapy services for this community, along with comprehensive physical and speech therapy programs. Physician referral is required. child must register at the school in which he/she is zoned to attend.

Parents/Guardians will need the following documents to register - birth certificate, Immunization Compliance Form from the Health Department, Social Security card, and two (2) proofs of residency.

The Office of the State Auditor mandates two proofs of residency, and these documents must be on file before a child is officially enrolled in our district. The information required is to prove that each student physically resides full time, weekday/nights and weekends, at the place of abode located within the limits of the school district. Please notice the requirements below and keep in mind that the proofs must be current. This means that a utility bill must be within 30 days of the date it is presented. Other documents must be the latest available. Example: driver license and auto registration must be current. All proofs must contain the child's physical address and date of proof. Listed below are items that will be accepted as proof:

Home Mortgage Documents or Property Tax receipt  
Apartment or Home Lease (hand written rent receipt must be notarized)

Current Utility Bills: (Water, Electric, TV, Phone (no cell phone will be accepted, bill must be for a land line or internet service)

Current Driver License or Firearms Permit (only one can be accepted)

Current Automobile Registration

Document from a government agency that proves residency in our district

Homeowners Insurance  
Other document: this must be an official document that objectively and unequivocally establishes that the parent or guardian resides in the school district, and CAN NOT be an envelope showing the address

"As it has in the past, the BancorpSouth Rebel Road Trip is going to provide an excellent plat-

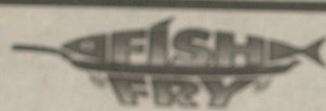

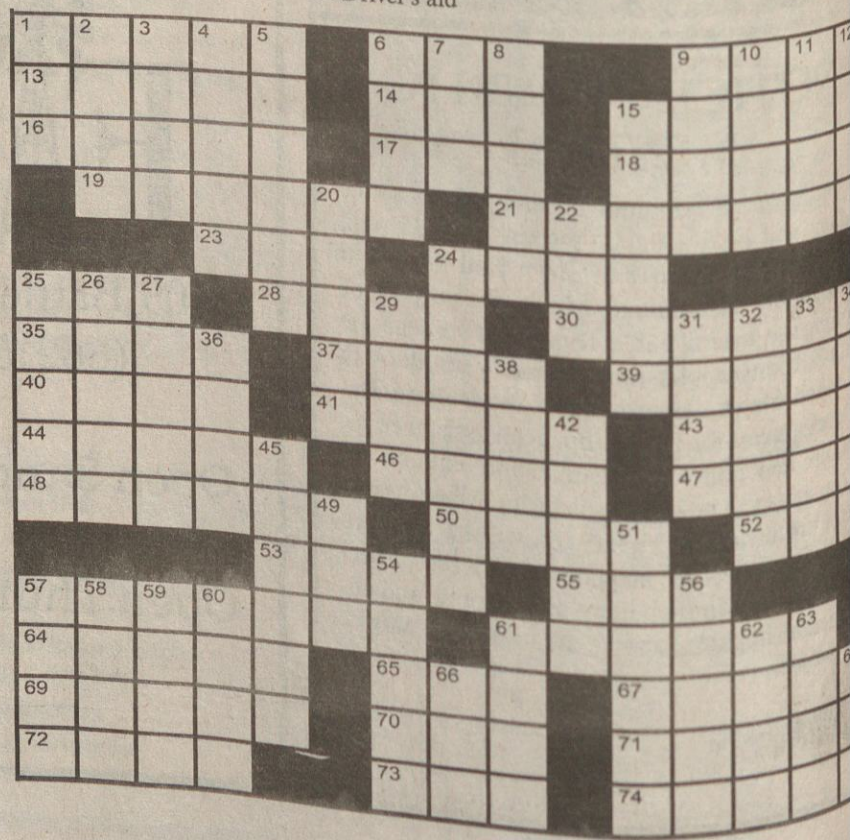

District Clubs for their participation in the project.

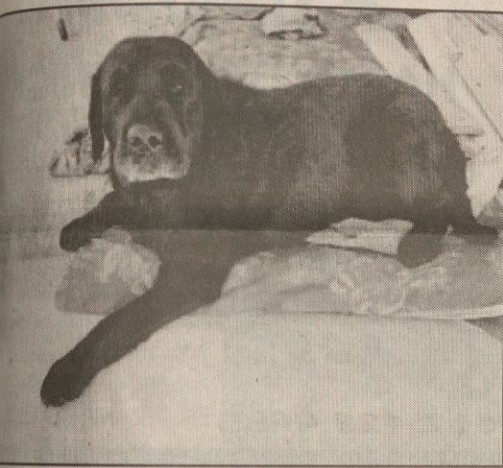
We were served a delicious box lunch. After lunch more awards were given. Our club scrapbook and yearbook won 1<sup>st</sup> place and went to State Competition.
