## Ledbetter Home Destroyed by Fire

The home of the late Virgil Ledbetter located on Highway 240 was completely destroyed by fire late Friday night, April 20th. According to Iuka Fire Chief Grissom, the call came in at 4:44 p.m. and when the fire department arrived on the scene the home was engulfed in flames. The home was occupied by their son, Johnny Ledbetter, who was saved from the fire by his brother Clyde. Johnny kept going back into the burning home to save his beloved wife who was slightly burned in the fire. Johnny was at home during the fire and had been in his bedroom for a short

period to take his insulin shot and returned to find his bed completely covered in flames. It is believed the fire started from a propane gas heater in the room. Iuka Fireman, Brandon Grissom, has passed the house at 4:00 going to the firing range just down the road and saw nothing unusual. Just a short time later he saw the heavy black smoke and he arrived at the scene just shortly after the fire began. It was a hot, fast burning fire that was out of control in just minutes. One fireman who was not aware that the house built in 1946 had a basement under the kitchen, fell through the floor but his fall was stopped by

a floor joist. Thankfully no one was seriously injured in the fire. Everything Johnny Ledbetter owned was destroyed in the fire; if you would like to help him send donations to Ledbetter Fish Market 240 CR 956.

L. and Ida Gregson Sweeney. He attended Iuka Elementary School and graduated from Iuka High School in 1954. He was recognized for twelve years of perfect attendance. Charles was also a member of the Boy Scouts of America and attained the rank

ingo County Fair and also previously worked with Rotary Club of Iuka, Tishomingo County Cattlemen's Association, Tishomingo County Forestry Association, Tishomingo County 4-H and Mississippi County Agents Association. Belmont senior Sarah Berryman will try to carry on her winning tradition at the next level. The Lady Cardinals' point guard has signed her letter of intent to play basketball at Itawamba Community College next season.

"Belmont is all about winning," Berryman said.

"We don't like to lose, and at ICC, I feel like Coach Gray is the exact same, so it's going to be fun going into that, when they expect the best out of you."

Itawamba Community College has excelled in women's basketball under the direction of Coach Nanci Gray. The Lady Indians have claimed the North MACJC title six times in her twelve-year tenure, as well as, two MACJC State titles.

"ICC will be fortunate to have Sarah on their team next season," said Coach Chris Higginbottom. "Any time a team can inherit a player with a 77% winning percentage in four years, it is a win for both the player and the program."

Sarah has been a starting guard for the past four

years. She helped lead the team to the quarter-finals of the state tournament during her senior season, and a 3A State Championship during her freshmen season.

Sarah has led her team this season with some very impressive statistics. She averaged 10.8 points per game, and she made 98 out of 138 free-throws (71%). Sarah led the team with 205 assists and 224 steals. She also combined for 502 overall assists and 1,315 total points in four years.

"It's very exciting to see how hard work pays off," said Coach Chris Higginbottom. "Sarah's a very hard worker, and being able to see her continue her basketball career at a very good school, with ICC, is just exciting."

## Letter to the Editor

Charles "Tubby" Aldridge died on April 11, 2018. I'm sorry that I did not learn of his passing until the obituary was published in the Tishomingo County News.

I interacted with Tubby many times through the years in my capacity as a news reporter for the Daily Journal's Corinth Bureau, covering Alcorn, Prentiss, Tippah and Tishomingo Counties.

First in 2010, Tubby called me to say he was gathering names on a petition to bring to a vote whether Tishomingo County would become a "wet" county, selling beer and liquor.

From the beginning he met opposition, of course. Churches, primarily, launched vigorous opposition to his efforts.

But whether you agreed with Tubby or opposed him, I always felt he was doing what all citizens are called upon to do - let your voice be heard in the political arena, using your rights and responsibilities as voters to influence the issues that concern you. Bringing the taxes that alcohol sales would generate to support the tax base of Tishomingo County and tourism were the issues that were important to Tubby.

In 2011, when Tubby and his cohorts were in the midst of gathering the almost 2,600 valid signatures needed to get the measure on the ballot, the Daily Journal published another article.

"This is 14th month I've been at it, and I am not going to quit until I get

an election," Aldridge was quoted as saying. "It's not whether it goes wet or dry, but I think people need to vote on it."

Tubby finally got the election he sought in 2013, and the Daily Journal ran its last article about him then.

During those three years of effort Tubby told me he had spent in the neighborhood of \$55,000 in advertising to promote the petitions. The Tishomingo County News and other advertising outlets got many of those dollars.

There was another issue dear to Tubby's heart - supporting the shelter of homeless people in the community through the efforts of Jacqueline Bunns. In another newspaper article Ms. Bunns told me how financially generous he was to aid her work.

Many people in the community may not be pleased that one can go into several local stores to buy their beer, wine or liquor, but whatever tax dollars are generated can be largely attributed to Charles "Tubby" Aldridge.

His son, Charles L. "Tojo" Aldridge, tells me that although Tubby lived with lung cancer for two years before his passing, he apparently died peacefully in his sleep.

I expect that's all any of us can ask when we feel our work here on Earth is done. I pray that he is resting in peace.

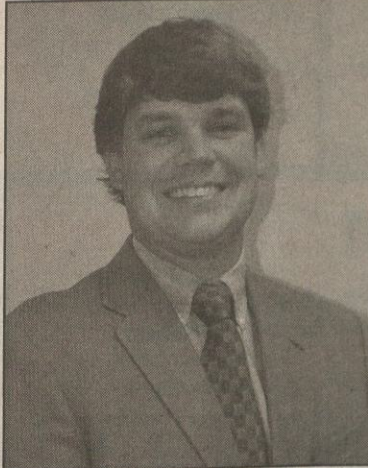

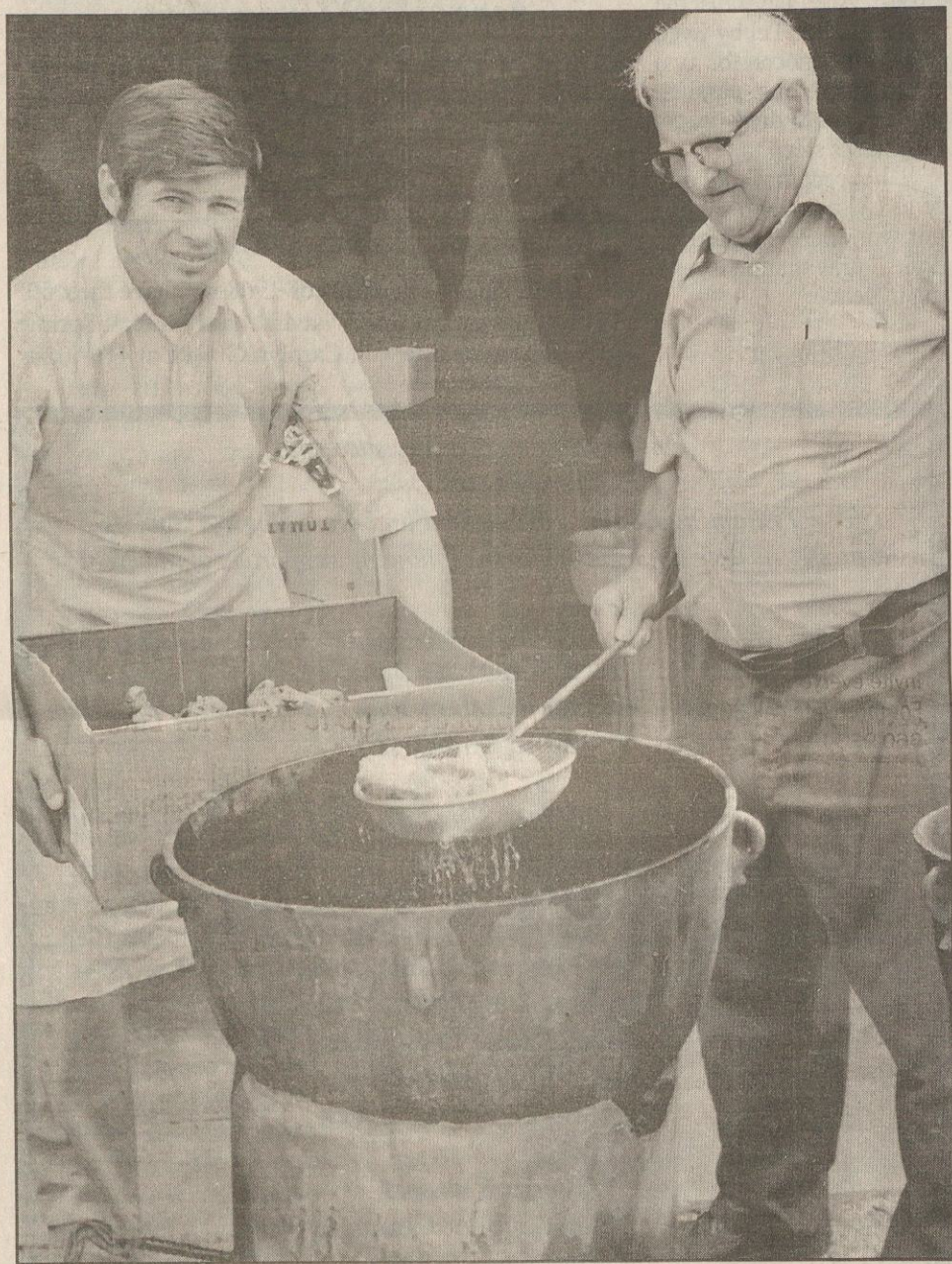

## Memories of Virgil Ledbetter

When I heard last Friday evening that Ledbetter's was on fire, my mind immediately thought of the old fish market on Eastport Road. That is the beauty of living in a small town all your life, just one word can open your mind to many memories of long ago.

I can still feel and smell the magic of that place. On many Saturday afternoons Mama and Daddy would take me with them to Mr. Virgil's to get some fresh fish for our planned fish fry. The fish fries usually meant the whole family would gather either at my grandmother's house or even at the old Jourdan's Cabin at Eastport. On occasion I can remember going to the road side park near the Alabama and Mississippi state line and meeting everyone for a catfish fry. The road side park is no longer there on the old high-

way. It was a beautiful spot with a small stream (or ditch) running by. It had picnic tables, which was all you needed for a gathering in those days. The new four-lane did away with the little road side park, but the deadly state line curve where many were killed was bypassed too, and that was a good thing!

I can still see the large display cooler where Mr. Virgil kept the fish. It was exciting for a little girl to watch the master carver as he threw the fish on the cutting board and cut the Tennessee River cat-

fish into perfect fry pieces. He knew everyone wanted the fish cut and wrapped. Today his son Cl keeps the business going but not in the market that I played as a child.

Friday evening I learned that it was the market that burned, but the Ledbetter home that had been built in 1946 next to the market. The Ledbetter children raised there and they only have memories of the place called home.

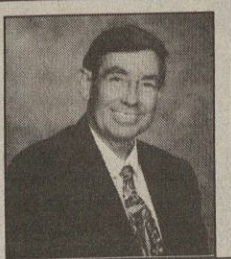


# The Battle Of Armageddon IV

It is not wrong to take care of the human body, but it is wrong to worship it! In our verses above, we see the fact that human bodies will be ripped apart by preying birds, because the ones who occupied those bodies will have forgotten that God is the Creator, Owner and Boss of all that is done in the human body.

The spirit of man is more important than the body, thus when the spirit is not in tune with God by salvation and dedication to His cause, men wind up with bodies that have been, in essence, thrown on the garbage heap! I believe in taking care of the physical body, this is why I walk to exercise the body, but I do not believe that the body is my most important possession. It is because men have praised both the human body and brain, as unregenerate men, that wars take place. But there

is another force behind this thinking of men; it is the power of Satan and his helpers, who are continually telling mankind that he can be his own boss, his own god. The battle of Armageddon is the culmination of such thinking!

Notice that our verses say that an angel beckons the fowls of the air to come to the supper of the great God. 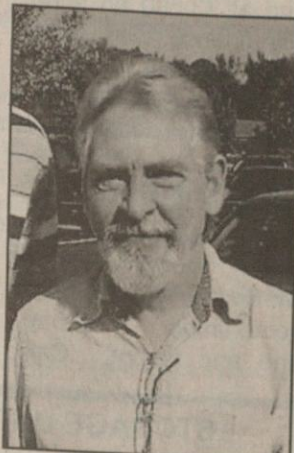

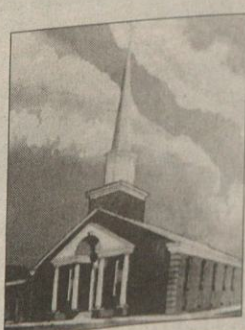

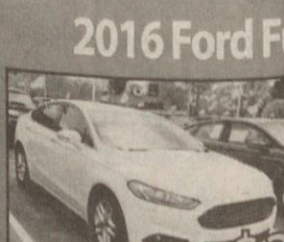

Bid documents are being made available via original paper copy or electronically. All planholders are required to have a valid email address for registration. Bid documents are non-refundable and must be purchased through the website. Each proposal must be accompanied by a bid guaranty in the amount of five (5) percent of the total amount of the bid. The bid guaranty may be by certified check or bid bond made payable to Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors.

Bids may be held by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors for a period not to exceed 90 days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of evaluating bids prior to award of contract.

Each proposal submitted must be marked on the outside "Bid for Seal Coat at Tishomingo County Airport, Iuka, Mississippi". 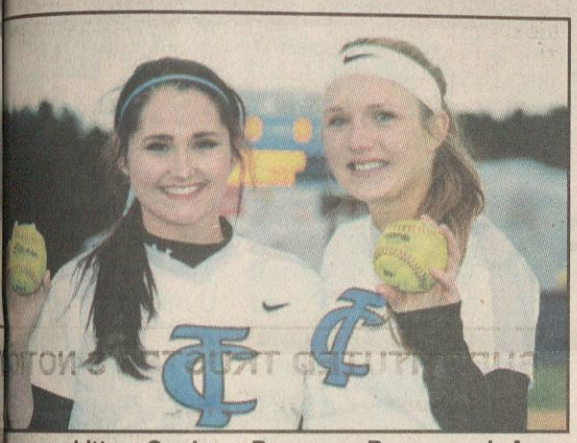

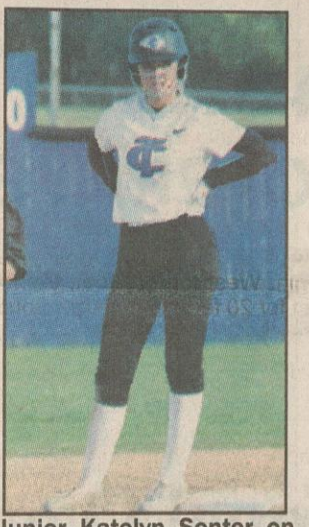

dedicated to preserving and honoring those who served in the CCC.

The Friends of Tishomingo State Park recently received a \$17,000 grant from the Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area to place a statue of a CCC worker at Tishomingo State Park. The Hills grant is a 50/50 matching grant as the Friends of Tishomingo State Park will need to match the grant with both funds and in-kind work at the Park.

A statue fund has been established at First American National Bank in Tishomingo to collect contributions to help pay for the statue. It is customary to name the statue for a CCC member. This one will be named for Clifford G. Wortham who designed and oversaw the construction of the Swing Bridge and other park features. Clifford Wortham served in the Navy in the Pacific in World War II before coming home to Cornish and starting

a construction company with his brother. Many of the bridges and much of the North Mississippi was built by them. After retirement he designed the new five water treatment facilities that draw water from the Tishomingo Troughway. When water ground water sources became limited, this system is capable of supplying water to Adams, Deaton and Tishomingo Counties.

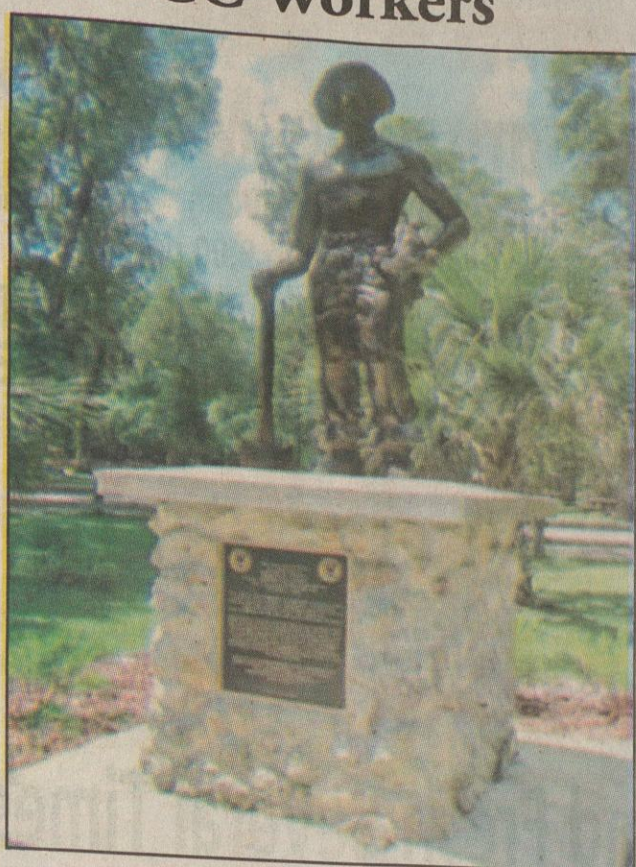


# Friends of Tishomingo State Park Tribute to CCC Workers

When visiting Tishomingo State Park (shame on you if you have not experienced Mississippi's state park) do you ever wonder who built the Nature Center, and the rustic cabins? Not to mention who was responsible for the hiking trails, the Swinging Bridge, the Mississippi Landmark? Tishomingo State Park was built in the mid 1930s during the Great Depression by Civil Conservation Corps workers. For their service they were paid \$30 a month or a "Dollar a day." While that seems a small amount today, it was significant back then, as there was practically no money. Actually, the CCC workers only received five cents a month with the money sent home to their families.

The CCC workers built nine state parks in Mississippi and 800 across the nation. The CCC program was the largest construction program ever, over 3 million men worked. The camps were run by the U.S. Army and the conservation efforts were directed by the U.S. Service and the National Park Service. The men did not receive military training per se, but their military life style helped their adjustment when most later returned in World War II. They have even given the CCC men credit in ultimate victory.

Tishomingo State Park is open to the public in 1939. To commemorate the 80th anniversary of the park, the Friends of Tishomingo State Park will erect a statue of a CCC worker to show visitors who made this beautiful park for all of us. Standing six feet tall and weighing over 400 lbs, the cast figure is made by CCC Legacy, a national organization

dedicated to preserving and honoring those who served in the CCC.

The Friends of Tishomingo State Park recently received a \$17,000 grant from the Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area to place a statue of a CCC worker at Tishomingo State Park. The Hills grant is a 50:50 matching grant so the Friends of Tishomingo State Park will need to match the grant with both funds and in-kind work at the Park.

A statue fund has been established at First American National Bank in Tishomingo to collect contributions to help pay for the statue. It is customary to name the statue for a CCC member. This statue will be named for Clifford G. Worsham who designed and oversaw the construction of the Swinging Bridge and other park features. Clifford Worsham served in the Navy in the Pacific in World War II before coming home to Corinth and starting

a construction company with his brothers. Many of the bridges and roads in North Mississippi were built by them. After retirement he designed the surface water treatment system that draws water from the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway. When underground water sources become limited, this system is capable of supplying water to Alcorn, Prentiss, and Tishomingo Counties.
