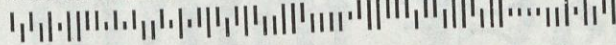

## 1st Annual Big Event Clean Up Day in Iuka May 12th

Residents of Iuka will get an opportunity to do some cleaning this Saturday May 12th.

Sponsored by the Iuka Development and Economic Association (IDEA), Iuka's "Big Event Clean Up Day" will take place from 8 until 11 a.m. Saturday.

Event organizers ask for volunteers to come to Jaybird Park at 8 a.m. Saturday for street assignments to pick up trash and clean up streets. Garbage bags will be provided.

Everyone in the City of Iuka is asked to participate in the Big Event Clean Up Day to do those yard tasks they have a meaning to do and take advantage of the opportunity to have some of their unwanted items hauled off.

"All you have to do is get it off the curb," said Kenny Carson, Iuka Alderman and IDEA Vice-President. "We're asking people to take this opportunity to help the community and choose this day to clean their yards, porches and haul them off the road. If you live in the city limits, the city workers will come by and pick it up and take it to a dump."

The alderman added that it will be any item — old lawn chairs, appliances, limbs or anything around the house — it will be taken away.

He said they were also asking people to help their neighbors.

"If your yard is in good shape, that's great. Why not help an elderly neighbor or help clean up the street where you live?" asked Carson. "We have a great little town. It's just in need of some de-cluttering."

The alderman said that those who are physically unable to participate, or those who would like help with their clean up, to call and let IDEA know.

IDEA's stated mission is "Making Iuka a better place to live and work while providing different events for the community."

"IDEA has really tried to get involved in doing things for Iuka. We're all about promoting Iuka and this is a way for us to give back. We're looking for any and all volunteers," said Shana Hollon, IDEA President.

Carson said the idea of a clean up was something that was near and dear to his heart when he ran for the office of alderman.

## Suspect Wanted for Firing Weapon at Law Enforcement has been Apprehended

A recent exchange of fire took place in Tishomingo County between law enforcement officers and a suspect near Dennis on Thursday, May 3rd around 9:30 p.m.

Brian Russell Turner of the Tishomingo area has been charged with two counts of aggravated assault on law enforcement- against a Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputy, and one count of aggravated assault on law enforcement- against a Belmont Police Department officer.

During an attempted traffic stop Turner allegedly drove into a Tishomingo County Sheriff's patrol car; he then pointed a rifle at a Sheriff's deputy and a Belmont Police officer and began firing the weapon. It was reported that the bullets caused damage to the Belmont Police patrol car. The law enforcement officers returned fire. Neither

of the officers were injured during the incident.

The Justice Court has denied bond to be set on Turner due to the nature of the charges against him and additional charges are expected to be added at a later date.

Following a two day search for the suspect, Turner was apprehended in Wayne County TN. Turner has signed his extradition papers and is awaiting transportation back to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Sheriff Daugherty would like to thank all the many law enforcement agencies that assisted not only his agency but Belmont Police Department as well during this time.

When he is not going places with his Mom, Laurie Degraw, he spends his days playing with his cat sisters (Lucy and Psycho) and taking long naps. He is always up for a game of chase. Trevor also loves to visit with his dog cousin Gemma. He gets so excited to see everyone at Iuka Animal Clinic for his biweekly baths and thanks them for selecting him for Pet of the Week.

Grooming your dog keeps him healthy and is also an important part of your relationship. When you're grooming your dog, you're not only keeping his coat, skin, feet, ears, and teeth healthy,

you're becoming familiar with his body so that you'll notice early on if anything is unusual and needs veterinary attention. When you're learning to groom your dog, be patient and use lots of treats. Start slowly and add more as your dog accepts what you're doing. If you start getting frustrated, stop and come back to it later. Remember to keep it positive and fun, and take your dog to a professional groomer if needed. Make sure to use a shampoo that's made for dogs. Human shampoo can be too harsh for your dog's skin and coat. Lather up the coat, and then rinse thoroughly. Be sure to rinse them completely. Avoid getting shampoo



and water directly in the eyes, mouth, and inside the ears. Brushing is also very important because brushing removes dead hair, distributes natural oils for a clean and healthy coat, stimulates the surface of the skin, gets rid of dead and dry skin, and helps you become familiar with your dog's body. You should brush your dog every couple of days no matter the length of his coat. Sometimes your brushing can have a specific purpose, such as removing hair mats or helping your dog shed his seasonal coat, but most often you'll be doing general-purpose brushing or combing. Follow these tips for a nice clean pooch.

## Property Owner Charged in Wooden Nickel Fire

CHEROKEE — A Mississippi man who claimed he was going to rebuild one of the oldest buildings in Cherokee after it was heavily damaged by a March fire has been arrested for starting the fire.

Jennifer Bowen, public affairs specialist with the Alabama State Fire Marshal's Office, said Jamie Shawn Whitfield, 42, 411 Indian Creek St., Iuka, Mississippi, is charged with second-degree arson. "He is charged in connection with a March 23 fire at 195 Main St. in Cherokee," Bowen said. Whitfield is accused of setting fire to the building that housed the Wooden Nickel Restaurant in order to collect insurance money. The building was severely damaged by the fire. "We would like to thank Cherokee Police and Cherokee Fire for their assistance in the investigation," Bowen said.

"We were able to recover some evidence that helped clear some things up, and things that Whitfield was telling us just didn't match with what we were finding," Jason Wil-

liamson said.

After completing the investigation, the deputy state marshal met with Colbert County District Attorney Bryce Graham Jr., and an arrest warrant was issued. At the time of the fire, Whitfield told Cherokee officials that he was remodeling the building to open a restaurant. Williamson said after the fire, Whitfield had told town officials that his plan was to "rebuild." Reports indicate the fire started in the back of the building from an "open flame." "It looks like he just started the fire and walked out and left it," Williamson said. "From all indications it looks like this was just to collect insurance on the building."

Cherokee Mayor Terry Cosby said the building, located near the post office, is one of the oldest structures in town. He said he had always been told it was one of the first wooden structures ever built in Cherokee. "Everyone knew where the Wooden Nickel was, and everyone in town was excited that it was going to be opened as a restaurant," Cosby said. "Even after it burned, Whitfield kept telling everyone he was going to rebuild and open the restaurant. That's not going

to happen."

"Now we have a building which is an eyesore right in the middle of town," Williamson said.

Cosby said the town has ordinances that it will rely on to try and get the damaged facility cleaned up. "We can try and force him to clean it up, or we can clean it up and put a lien on the property," Cosby said.

Cherokee's attorney, John McReynolds, said he has made contact with the deputy state fire marshal and his investigation is completed. "I have the names of the insurance companies that were insuring the property, and I plan on contacting them to see if they will clean up the property so the town can avoid that cost," McReynolds said.

Williamson reported to the Tishomingo County News that more charges are expected in this case. Whitfield is currently out on a \$10,000 bond.

After general discussion and with no further business the meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon.

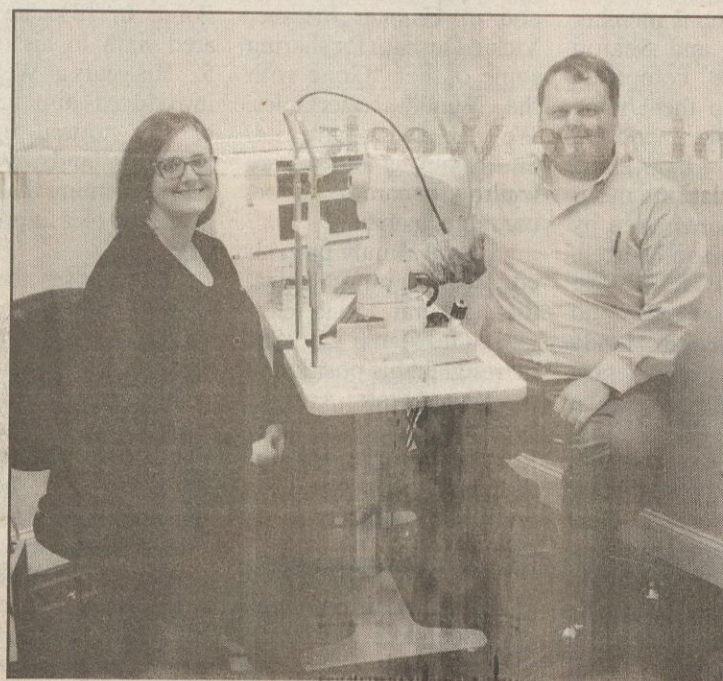

## Brigadier General Josiah Gorgas Remembered at UDC Meeting

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met April 16th, 11 am, at the Iuka Public Library. Those present were Vickie Durham, Eunell Handy, potential member Gail Smith, and Sharon Hairrell. We completed the salutes to the United States, Ms. State, and the Confederacy flags, the UDC rituals and the meeting was declared open by President Sharon Hairrell. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Eunell Handy gave the treasure report and it was approved. The old business was the applications that Vickie was looking over before they were to be sent in. New business: Librarian Gwen Spain asked if we would like to decorate a Display Cabinet in honor of Confederate History month and we said yes. Sharon Hairrell and Vickie Durham met and completed the project. We would like to thank Librarian Gwen Spain for this opportunity, Jeff Hamrick, Director of the Tishomingo Archives and History Museum for loaning us several items and to Chapter member Vickie Durham for sharing some of her "Gone with the Wind" collectables. We were glad to have Gail Smith join us and we are looking forward to her becoming a member.

Eunell Handy presented the program, "Brigadier General Josiah Gorgas". On March 21, 1861 he resigned his position in the United States Army to become a Major of Artillery in the Confederate Army. He was one of a few Union Officers to do so.

He was born July 1, 1818 and was the youngest of ten children. His family was poor; his father was a clock maker, mechanic and farmer. Josiah had very little education except a few years his father was able to send him to school. He eventually read law in the office of Graham Chapin. Chapin recognized his potential and nominated him to West Point. In 1841 he graduated sixth in his class of 52. His years at West Point introduced him to many of his cultural interests, especially landscape painting, something that would give him pleasure the rest of his life.

He chose the Ordnance Corps as his branch of service. It was the perfect choice for someone of his intelligence. He was assigned to the Ordnance Department of the US Army. In 1851, he transferred to Fort Monroe Arsenal. It was here that he developed a relationship with Tredegar Iron Works in Richmond, which would prove valuable to the Confederacy.

He was later assigned to the Mount Vernon Arsenal, just 30 miles from Mobile, AL. He was unhappy with the intense heat and the lack of "society," he was anxious to return to the north. He quickly changed his mind when he met Amelia Ross Gayle, the daughter of the former Governor of Alabama. That ended his request to transfer.

Amelia was not a beautiful girl, but she was well educated, kind and patient. Theirs was an instant love match. They were best friends. They married in Mobile on December 26, 1853. They had six children. William, their first son, would become Surgeon General of the US Army and later the President of the American Medical Association. His work in Cuba and the Panama Canal to eliminate yellow fever brought him international fame.

In 1858 Josiah Gorgas political winds were changing and his own personal beliefs were starting to align with those of the south. After his marriage to Amelia, he learned to love the south. In 1862, he became the Chief of Ordnance of the Confederate Army, and was stationed in Richmond Virginia.

He was faced with the difficult task of providing weapons and ammunition for the Confederacy. He realized that the only source, until factories were established in the South, would be from Europe. Factories were established and the labor was provided by women, children, and quite often, by men who were unfit to fight. He ordered the Ordnance Bureau to provide food, clothing and medical care for the laborers.

He also used his enormous ingenuity to provide materials: Church and plantation bells were melted for bronze, and women saved contents of their chamber pots from which saltpeter could be leached. Copper was also mined and saved from brandy stills. For his efforts he was promoted to Brigadier General November 9, 1864.

He and his family was sitting in church on Sunday April 2, 1865, a few pews behind President Davis, when word came that Richmond was to be evacuated. Lee surrendered on April 9. Amelia and her family returned to Alabama.

Gorgas began writing his journal, it contains some of the best Confederate history. He died May 15, 1883 and is buried in Tuscaloosa's Evergreen Cemetery in the shadow of Bryant-Denny Stadium. Amelia and five of their six children were later brought to rest beside him.

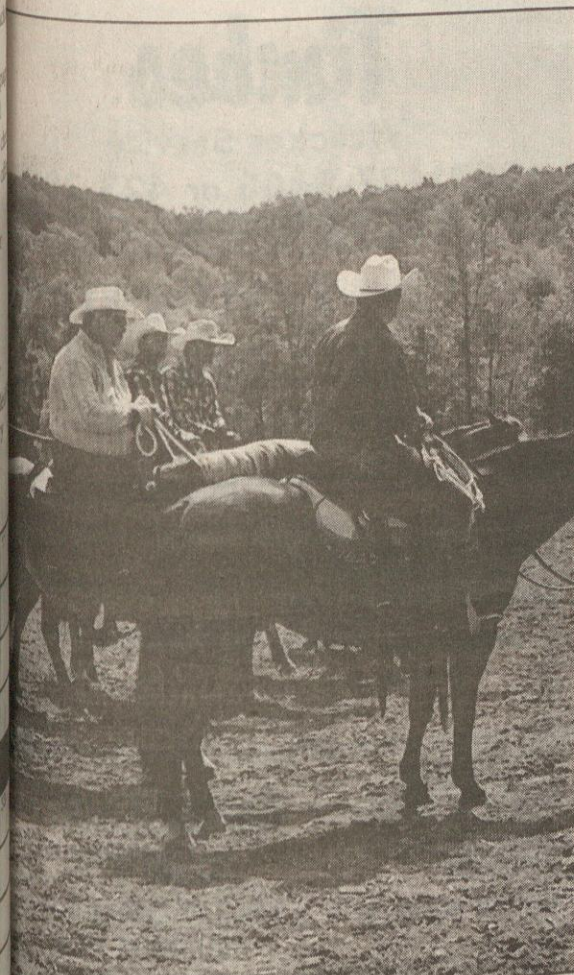

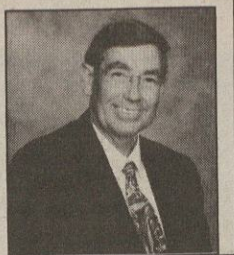


# The Battle Of Armageddon VI
