Absentee Ballots are Now Available for June 5, 2018 Primary Elections

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the June 5, 2018 Primary Elections. You may come to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, May 26, 2018, 8 a.m. to 12 noon and on Saturday, June 2, 2018, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting. I would like to remind all voters who vote by absentee in the clerk's office that

you will be required to show a photo ID. Also, all voters who go to the voting precincts on Election Day will be required to show a photo ID.

Because this is a Primary Election, you will be required to tell the election officials the political party that you wish to vote in. You will choose the Democratic Party or the Republican Party. Should there be a run-off election, you will be required to vote in the same primary in the run-off as you did in the first primary. Missis-

sippi Law does not allow any crossover voting in Primary Elections.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit

TCHS 2018 Graduation Ceremony A Success

The 2018 TCHS graduation ceremonies were held at the Broadlands Arena in Corinth on Friday, May 19th. This new arena provided plenty of space

and air-conditioning for graduates and their families, possibly becoming a new tradition for the school. Reports from graduates and parents were that the ceremony was a complete success.

There were 155 graduating seniors in the class of 2018 for TCHS. Twenty-one seniors scored above 25 on the ACT,

7 of which scored 30 or above. Nearly 2 million dollars in scholarships were awarded to students. Twelve of the seniors graduated with high honors - 95

or above GPA; 35 students graduated with honors - 90-94.99 GPA.

Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are: (1) A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older; (2) A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county; (3) A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and or; (4) A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day. (5) All registered voters who are members of the Armed Services, their spouses, dependents, and overseas citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older.

All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered.

Saturday, June 2, will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the June 5, 2018 Primary.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 4, 2018, in order to be eligible to be counted for the June 5, 2018 Primary Election.

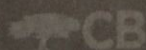

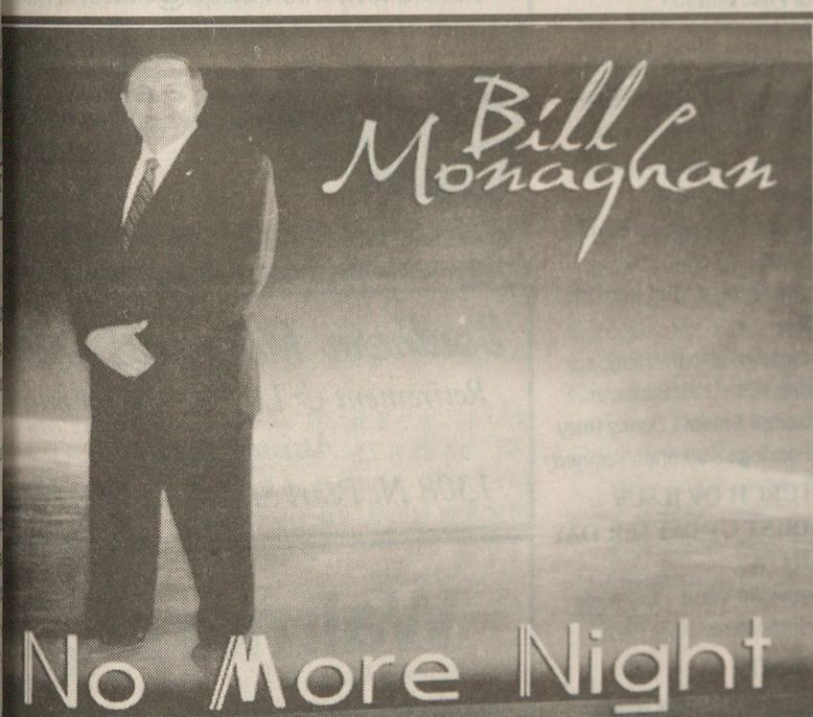

The Thousand Year Reign Of Christ On Earth

The literal, bodily sign of Christ on earth has been a debated subject through centuries of time. Some Christians in our day say that the teaching that Christ will reign on this earth for a thousand years is a modern day theory of a few preachers and believers, but I would beg to differ with that! I have a thirty-eight volume set of the teaching of the church fathers, which I have had for over thirty years. They were given to me by a friend, and I treasure them very much. I have researched certain subjects through those volumes, and I found that the church of the first century had pastors and teachers who taught that Christ would come back to earth and reign on earth for a thousand years, so the teaching is very old. More than that, we could look at Luke 1:30-33 to get Bible information that

is clear on the subject: "And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. And behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shall call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of His father David: And He shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of His kingdom there shall be no end." David has never had a throne in heaven, but he has had a throne in earthly Jerusalem! Jesus must fulfill

the prophecy of our verses above, and to do that He must sit on the throne of David, which was in Jerusalem, except for the 7 1/2 years he reigned in Hebron. Dozens of other Scriptures confirm the things I am saying here. For a start, one could read Psalms 2; 16; 45; 72; 89; 110; Isaiah 9:6-7; 11; 35; 42:1-4; Daniel 2:44.

This will introduce the thousand year reign of Christ on earth, but He will actually reign forever, with the thousand years only a particular period of His everlasting kingdom. Now we will look at Revelation 20:4-

6: "And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years. But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. This is the first resurrection. Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection, on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years." I will not be able to finish the things I want to say on these verses in this post, but we will get started with some comments. Notice

that there are thrones on which believers sit and reign with Christ. We see more on this subject in Revelation 2:26-27: "And he that overcometh, and keepeth My works unto the end, to him will I give power over the nations. And he shall rule them with a rod of iron; as the vessels of a potter shall they be broken to shivers: even as I received of My Father." It seems that Jesus will be the One breaking the nations to shivers, but the saved will be with Him when He does this. To be given power over the nations cannot be a heavenly scene, for nobody of any nation will be in need of being brought into subjection there. Also Matthew 19:28 gives more information on the reign of Christ on earth: "And Jesus said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That ye which have followed Me, in the regeneration when

the Son of man shall sit in the throne of His glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel." This is not heaven, for no such judgment is mentioned concerning heaven. We have also the parable in Luke 19:11-27 that teaches that some believers will be given rule over certain numbers of cities, but this is not a heavenly scene either. This parable shows a nobleman going into a far country (evidently meaning heaven) to receive for Himself a kingdom and to return. Then Luke 19:15 shows that when the nobleman (Jesus) returns to earth He has received the kingdom and judged his servants and places them over cities on earth, evidently for the thousand year reign. 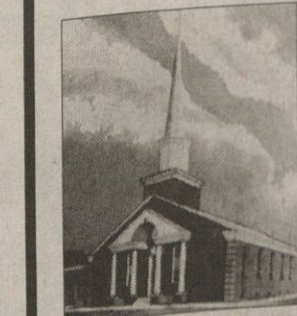

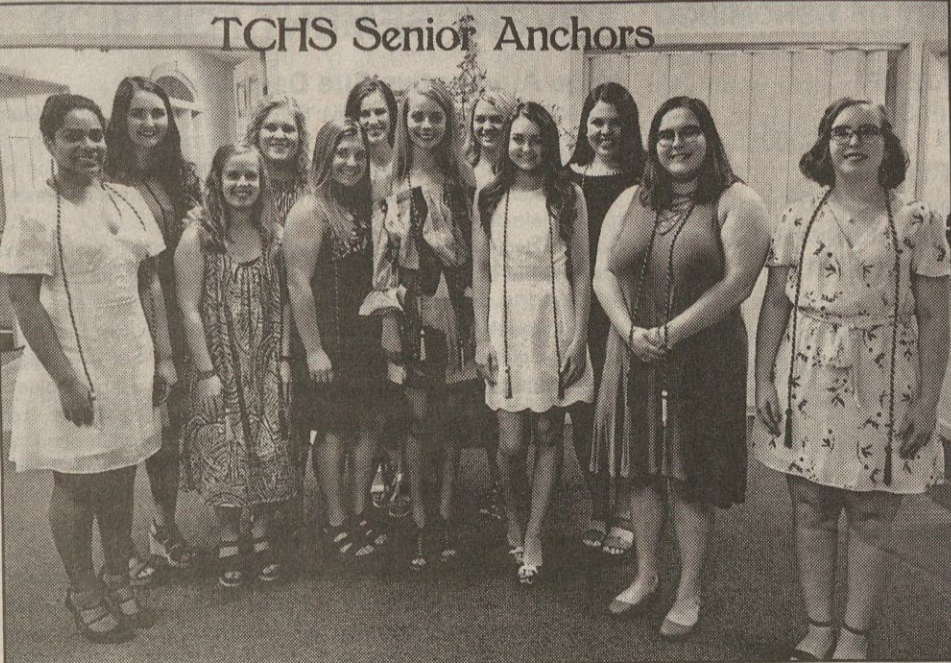

2018 Belmont and Iuka Farmers' Markets Rules

ELIGIBILITY: Growers eligible to sell at the Belmont and Iuka Farmers' Markets are those living in Tishomingo County and bordering counties (Alcorn, Prentiss, and Itawamba). All items offered for sale must be grown by the farmer/grower whose name appears on the "Vendor Permit", with the exception of fruits.

VENDOR PERMIT: Prior to their first sale, all growers must secure an annual "Vendor Permit" with photo ID at either the 1st American Insurance Office in Belmont or the Farm Bureau Insurance Office in Iuka. The application will allow the grower to be a vendor at both markets. There is no charge for the permit. The permit must be displayed in clear view of customers and inspectors.

LOCATIONS AND SCHEDULE: Markets officially open Saturday, June 16th / Market officially close Saturday, October 27

- Belmont Farmers Market**
 - Location: C.C. Shook Park
 - Days and Times: Friday and Saturday – 2 p.m. - 6 p.m.
- Iuka Farmers Market**
 - Location: Between Wal-Mart in Iuka and the old Tishomingo County Jail

 - Thursday – 1 p.m. - 6 p.m.
 - Saturday – 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

VENDOR SALE SPOTS: Vendor sale spots will be available on a first-come first-serve basis. Each vendor using the Farmers Market shall be responsible for maintaining his or her plot in a clean and sanitary manner. Vendors are responsible for set up, display, and packaging of their products. All growers must take with them trash and any unsold products. No permanent structures can be placed on the property. Any awnings, tents, umbrellas, etc. shall be removed at the close of business each day.

TAXES: A Mississippi Sales Tax Form will be provided should you need to charge sales tax for your products. Money collected should be turned into the Extension Office at 238 Kaki Street, Iuka. Please contact the Extension Office if you have any questions about taxes at 662-423-7016.

Conduct: Fraudulent, dishonest, or deceptive merchandising or collusion to set prices among growers is prohibited. Camaraderie and cooperation among growers is encouraged.

GENERAL RULES: The following general rules will be in effect during the year for all persons using the Farmers' Markets.

- Only produce (with the exception of fruits), plants, home processed, and/or handcrafted items grown or made by the certified vendor will be allowed for sale.
- Produce should not be sold by weight unless the grower has scales that have been certified by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce.
- No drinking alcoholic beverages.
- No using profanity.
- No gambling.
- No loitering.
