Everyone is encouraged to get out to the polls on Tuesday, June 5th to cast your vote in the 2018 primary election. Voters who are out of the precincts will be required to show photo ID. Because this is a primary election, you will be required to show the political party you wish to vote in. You will choose the Democratic or the Republican. Should there be a runoff election, you will be required to vote the same way as you did in the first primary. Mississippi Law does not allow a crossover in Primary Elections.

Tishomingo County Health Department Holds Special Immunization Clinic

The Tishomingo County Health Department, located at 1508 Bettydale Drive in Iuka, Mississippi, will hold a special childhood and adolescent immunization clinic for school registration on June 11th, 2018 from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m.

During this clinic, health department staff will focus solely on providing childhood and adolescent immunizations so that parents can complete the process quickly and efficiently. Parents should bring a copy of their child's immunization record, insurance card, and social security card.

According to the Centers

for Disease Control and Prevention, approximately 95 percent of parents nationwide choose to vaccinate their children, protecting them against potentially deadly diseases.

Immunization requirements for children entering school in Mississippi for the first time include: diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DTaP); polio (IPV); hepatitis B; measles, mumps and rubella (MMR); and varicella (chickenpox). There is also a requirement for children entering 7th grade to receive the TDap (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccination. Parents must provide the school with a Certif-

icate of Immunization Compliance (Form 121) from their local health department or physician prior to school entry.

Check with your physician or the Tishomingo County Health Department at 662-423-6100 to see which immunizations your child will need.

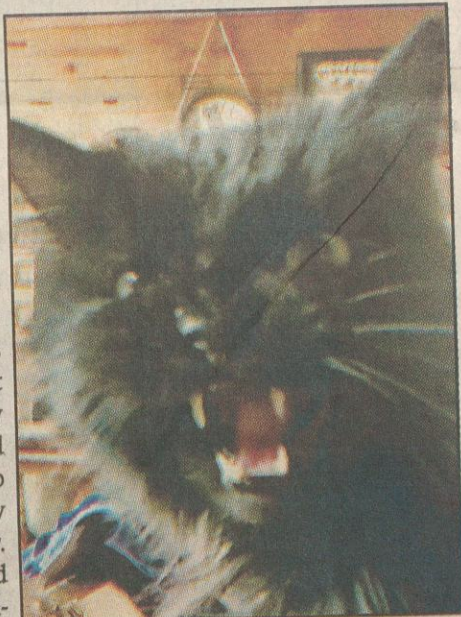
Election

to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, June 2, 2018, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting. All voters who vote by absentee in the clerk's office will be required to show a photo ID. We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone. Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are: (1) A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older; (2) A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county; (3) A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and or; (4) A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or

dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county for more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day. (5) All registered voters who are members of the Armed Services, their spouses, dependents, and overseas citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA). All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized, except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by the person 18 years of age or older. All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered. Saturday, June 2, will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office. The June 5, 2018 Primary Election. All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 4, 2018, in order to be eligible to be counted for the June 5, 2018 Primary Election.

He bonded with me & my daughter was so impressed that she let me bring him to Iuka, MS, a few years ago... along with my other fur baby, Little Bit, a 17 year old female cat. Zeb loves to beg for bacon & anything else he thinks he wants to eat. In fact, he is the designated town crier for all the felines I have adopted.



for this dramatic difference is that kittens reach maturity very quickly, and are essentially adolescents or young adults by a year of age - thus they are considered to be the equivalent of a 15-16 year old by their first birthday. During the second year, the rate of aging slows down a little so that your cat will be the equivalent of a 24-25 year old by their second birthday. After that, the rate of aging stabilizes to about 4 cat years per calendar year. This means that cats will be middle-aged by about 6 years of age and a 10 year old cat is considered to be geriatric. It is very important to keep your cat healthy with regular visits to your veterinarian.

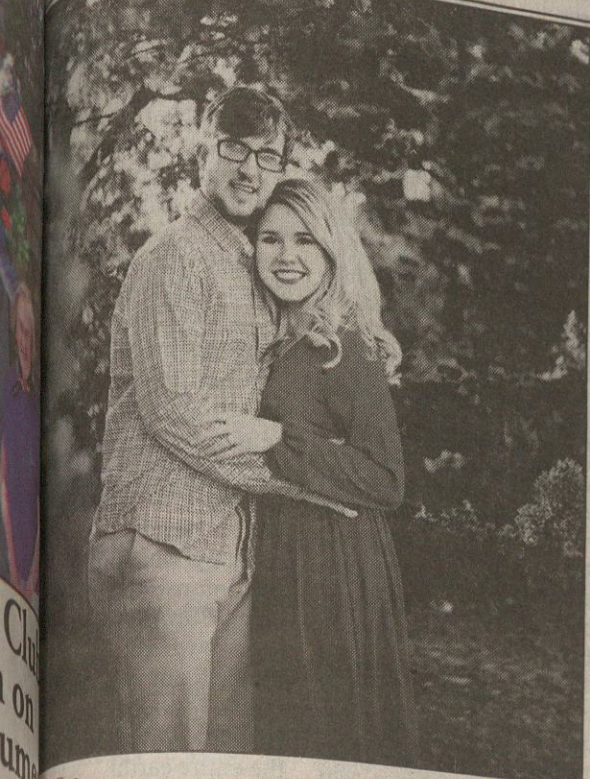

NOTICE OF PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2018-2019 on June 11, 2018, 6:00 p.m., at the Superintendent's Office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$29,012,372. Of that amount, 24% or \$7,016,650, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$29,428,407. Of that amount, 26% or \$7,559,952, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax effort, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection; on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years."

I have already mentioned "thrones" on which those who reign with Christ shall sit and rule (see Matthew 19:28; Luke 19:11-27; Revelation 2:26-29). There are also many other references in Scripture that speak of the same thing. Daniel 7:1-8 shows four world empires, with a fifth one actually being a revival of the fourth empire, which

is the Roman Empire. When these four empires, which will have ruled in various ages of history, have been put down in their final form of the fifth empire, Jesus will reign with His people. Daniel chapter seven shows re-deemed Israel reigning with Christ, but the saved of the church age will also reign, but in spiritual bodies, while many of Israel will be reigning in their physical bodies. Daniel 7:9-10 says, "I beheld till the thrones were cast down, and the Ancient of days did sit, Whose garment was white as snow, and the hair of His head

like the pure wool; His throne was like the fiery flame, and His wheels as burning fire. A fiery stream issued and came forth from before Him: thousand thousands ministered unto Him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before Him: the judgment was set and the books were opened." Now we will look at Daniel 7:13-14: "I saw in the night visions and behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought Him near before Him. And there was given Him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages should serve Him: His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom that which shall not be destroyed."

In these verses we

see God the Father as the Ancient of days in Daniel 7:9-10. We also see four world empires: Babylon; Medo-Persia, Greece and Rome, with a revival of the Roman Empire under the antichrist. Then we see Jesus, the Son of man in Daniel 7:13-14, coming to the Ancient of days (God the Father) and receiving dominion over all nations and people on earth. This is not in heaven, for the Father and Son have always had dominion there! We also see that the dominion of Jesus does not stop with the thousand years, for it is an everlasting dominion. Then we see that the antichrist (Daniel 7:21, as the horn) makes war with the "saints" (Israel in the tribulation). Then Daniel 7:22 says, "Until the Ancient of days came, and judgment was given to the saints of the most

This cannot be anywhere except on earth, for it is a kingdom that is "under the whole heaven", which means the entire earth!

UM Team to Scan Columbus Site for Unmarked Graves of Union Soldiers

Work to begin this fall using advanced remote sensing technologies

OXFORD, Miss. — The University of Mississippi's Center for Archaeological Research will use remote sensing technology to find unmarked graves of Union soldiers in a Columbus cemetery where some of the country's first Memorial Day traditions began in the 1860s.

UM researchers and students will be working with the U.S. Grant Association and Presidential Library and the Billups-Garth Foundation, a Columbus-based nonprofit, to find the unmarked graves of about 10 Union soldiers in Friendship Cemetery. They are buried alongside Confederate soldiers killed in the Civil War.

A year after the Civil War had ended, local women went into the cemetery and decorated the graves of both Union and Confederate soldiers. This act of reconciliation, the predecessor of our modern Memorial Day holiday, was called "Decora-

tion Day" and became an annual event that was adopted all over the country.

Identifying the final resting place of the soldiers in Friendship Cemetery is important work, said Tony Boudreaux, director of the UM Center for Archaeological Research and associate professor of anthropology.

"There is something very powerful about helping identify a place," Boudreaux said. "You can actually find objects and rediscover places. The cemetery is already valuable and important, but this will add another layer of interest to an already important site."

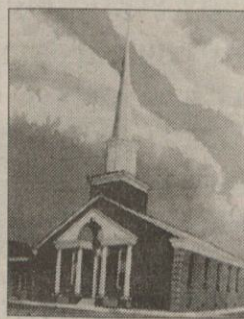
The group, which will include Ole Miss students, hopes to begin work this fall, Boudreaux said. They will use different kinds of remote sensing technology, chiefly ground-penetrating radar, to send an electronic pulse up to 20 feet into the ground. The pulses will be used to generate images of what the area beneath soil looks like.

The team also will use a magnetometer, which can pick up localized differences in underground magnetic fields.

Surveying the spot should take about a week, and events are in the works to allow the public to experience the project at the site.

All descendants of Julius Caesar and Ballie (Isabella Harris) Linton are welcome to come, bring a dish for the pot luck dinner, and enjoy the day. The festivities will begin at 11:00 a.m. Please bring old family photos and stories to share.

The Linton Family in Tishomingo County

The Linton family settled in Tishomingo County, west of Iuka in the Mt. Moriah Community in the 1800's. They are descendants of John Henry and Charlotte Linton of Spartanburg, South Carolina. John Henry was born 1776 and died 1873. Their son, Captain John Linton was born March 7, 1806. He married Rebecca Adams. Captain John brought his family from South Carolina to Talladega, Alabama, after which they moved to Tennessee near Shiloh.

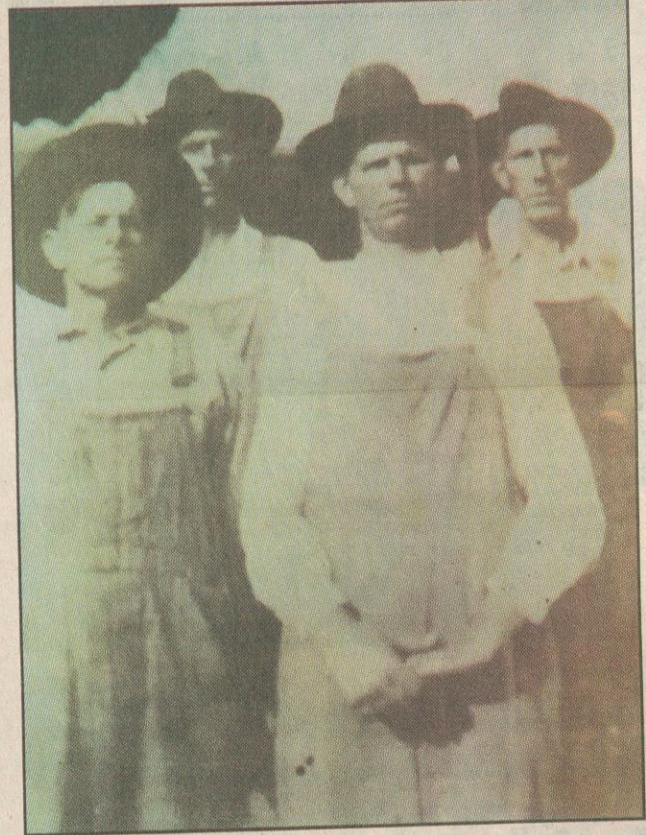
It was said they heard the first shot fired in the battle of Shiloh. Leaving Tennessee, they went back to Alabama and from there came to Tishomingo County in 1873. Captain John and Rebecca were the parents of eight children ranging in births from 1842 to 1864. Captain John died in 1899 and he and his wife are buried in Oak Grove Cemetery in Iuka.

Julius Caesar Linton and Ballie Harris Linton
Julius Caesar Linton was born March 11, 1854, near Talladega, the fifth child of John and Rebecca. After coming to Tishomingo County, he married Isabella (Ballie) Harris of Burnsville in 1881. They were blessed with nine children, two of these dying in childhood. The seven remaining children grew up and married in Tishomingo County. Claude married Cora Harris; Codie married Ethal Hale; John married Mary Farris; Jeff married Panthy Edmondson; Ina married Robert Jones; Nellie married Will Pruitt; and Eulala married Steve Dillard. All these are deceased. Five of these children, along with their spouses, are buried in Mt. Moriah Cemetery on land once owned by the Linton estate. Julius C. owned a large part of the original

place which was acquired in lesser amounts by various sons and daughters to set up their own homesteads. Julius C. Linton died in 1938, his wife in 1928. They are buried in Mt. Gilead Cemetery, as are Code and Ethel, Eulala Dillard and others of the next generation. ***** Thanks to Mary Barnes, a daughter of Jude Linton, for sharing these wonderful old photos of the family. The information on the family was taken from the Tishomingo County Histories and Families book submitted by the late Gladys Linton. 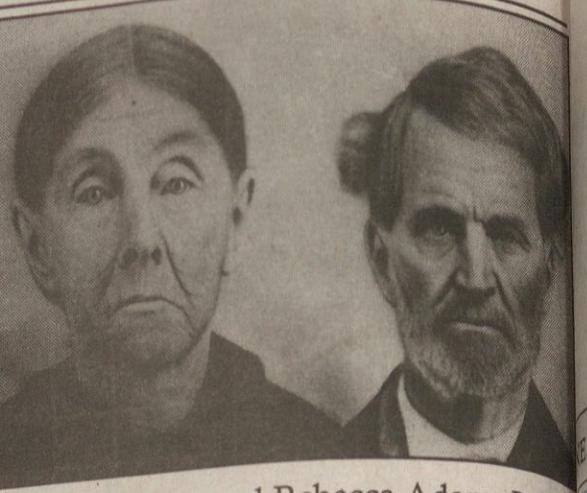

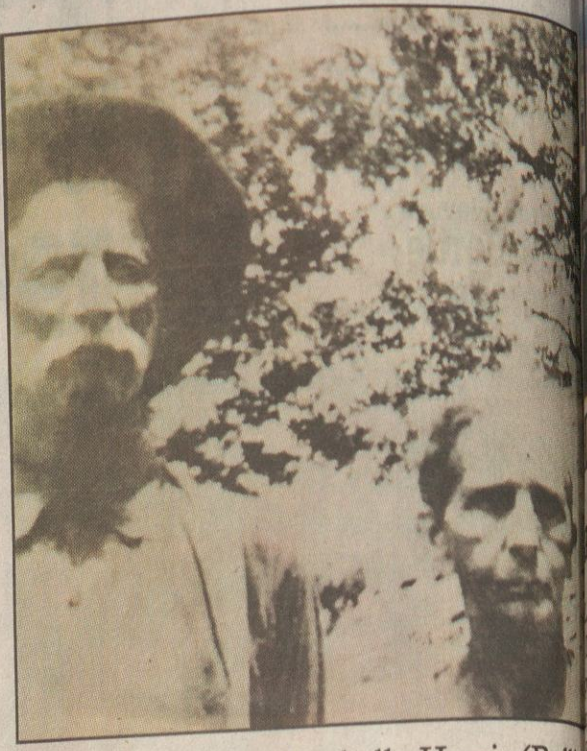
