## Weekend Wrecks Injure Two

Two Iuka residents were injured in two separate accidents this weekend. The Ford Taurus shown at left was involved in a one car wreck on Hwy. 365 near the Tishomingo County Line Friday morning around 6:45. Leigha Brown, 18, a recent graduate of Tishomingo High School, was severely injured in the wreck and flown to the Med Center in Memphis. Leigha suffered a broken back, broken shoulder, broken ribs and extensive facial

According to reports the driver was traveling at a high rate of speed when it went out of control, hit a ditch and went airborne some 80 feet flipping over and landing on the hood. According to Crystal Skinner, who witnessed the wreck from her yard, she ran to the car, and she and another person arrived on the scene used a crowbar to break out the passenger window and attempted to free Leigha from the wreck. The apparent pain from her injuries stopped them from pulling her from the wreck, but rescue workers arrived on the scene and she was flown to the Med in Memphis. The driver of the car, Teeter of Iuka, walked away with no injuries. He was charged with DUI, no driver's license, improper passing, and seat belt violation.



Leigha was released from the hospital on Tuesday. She will be in a back brace for at least three months.

In another wreck which happened on Sunday afternoon, Buddy Bullard was severely injured and flown to the Med following a two vehicle crash near his home on the TVA access road 321. The accident which occurred around 2:35, involved Buddy's vehicle and a work truck registered to J. A. Harris

of Tupelo, the company that assists funeral homes in putting up tents.

According to Rodney Pannell, who visited Buddy on Tuesday, Buddy is improving and did not lose his arm as first feared. He has a broken arm and shoulder. He will undergo more surgery but should recover. Buddy remembers reaching over to get something from the floor before the wreck happened; he had to be extracted from the vehicle by emergency crews.

The witness to this incidence notified 911 while they were on the scene and saw three individuals inside the church. When the deputies arrived on the scene they immediately detained all three suspects. Two of the individuals were juveniles and the other was an adult. The juveniles were transported to the Juvenile Detention Center after speaking with Youth Court officials and the adult, Zachary Wayne Wilbanks,

18, of Burnsville, was arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

## Traffic Stop Leads To Felony Arrest of Tennessee Man

On June 10, 2018, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop for Reckless Driving on Hwy 72. During the traffic stop, deputies learned that the driver, Shawn Strickland, did not have a driver's license, so he was immediately arrested. While Strickland was being searched for any contraband, some alleged methamphetamine was found in his pocket. The driver was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

away the pills. Timothy Thompson, 34-year-old, white male of 5645 HWY 24 Red Bay, Alabama was officially charged with the felony introduction of narcotics into a correctional facility. Thompson is currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections. Thompson's bond was set at \$5,000 by the Justice Court and the MDO has placed a hold on Thompson as well.

### Nearsighted or Farsighted?

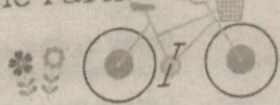

# The Final Battle On Earth, Gog and Magog

There is much about Satan, fallen angels and demons that we do not know, yet we do know some things that are clearly shown in Scripture. Revelation 20:7-9 says, "And when the thousand years are ended, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison, and shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle; the number of whom is as the sand of the sea. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city; and fire came down from God out of heaven and devoured them." Actually, these three verses prove, without a doubt, that the thousand year reign of Christ is on earth. Notice that it is at

the other end of the thousand year reign that Satan is loosed out of his prison in the bottomless pit (see Revelation 20:1-2, which shows when Satan was chained and cast into the bottomless pit). Also notice that Satan will go out to deceive the nations that are in the four quarters (directions) of the earth, so again we see that this final battle is on earth and after the thousand year reign. (More than that, the thousand years cannot be an event in church history, for there has never been a

time that Satan was bound and in the bottomless pit, until Revelation 20:1-2.) The bottomless pit is also called Satan's prison, but he is not in prison now, nor has he ever been before the present time.

This final battle is called "Gog and Magog", because of the designation that we have in Revelation 20:7-9. The name "Gog" appears 10 times in the Old Testament and 1 time in the New Testament. The combination of "Gog and Magog" appears 4 times in the Old Testa-

ment and 1 time in the New Testament. There is one man named "Gog", as mentioned in I Chronicles 5:4, plus the name "Gog" refers to a prince of Scythia, as shown in Ezekiel chapters 38 and 39. The name "Magog" is that of one of the sons of Japheth in Genesis 10:2 and I Chronicles 1:5, then it is applied to those who battle against God's people in Ezekiel 38:2; 39:6 and Revelation 20:8. The term means: "a barbarous people" in the Old Testament usage; it means: "an Antichristian party" in the New Testament. There is also the indication of a northern army in the term "Gog and Magog". We do not have much more information on these people, or the area from which they come, but we do have the fact that the battle of

Revelation 20:7-9 is the final battle of Satan and his people against God and His people!

Please notice several things about Satan and his army from Revelation 20:7-9. First, Satan, when loosed from the bottomless pit, goes out to deceive the nations from all directions of the earth. Second, these nations are called "Gog and Magog", meaning that they are against God and righteousness. Third, notice that they come to do battle in numbers that one would not try to count, so the armies of men that are in this battle against God are all born during the thousand years of Christ's reign. Fourth, notice that these armies go against the camp of the saints, and this has to be on earth, for no such thing can happen

in heaven or the eternal state. Fifth, notice that they encamp against the beloved city, which is the earthly, millennial Jerusalem, not the heavenly Jerusalem. Sixth, notice that God sends down fire from heaven and devours the armies. So, there is not really much battle to this final defiance against God by the devil and his armies, for the fire of God devours them before they can do anything against the earthly, beloved city of Jerusalem! It is interesting to "watch" God's victorious actions against the forces of evil that oppose Him and His people. Yes, we will have trouble with Satan and his hordes for a time, but the end of his usurped rule will finally end!

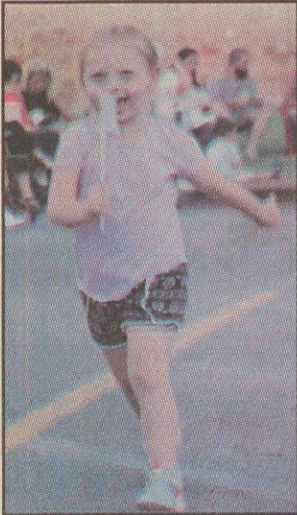

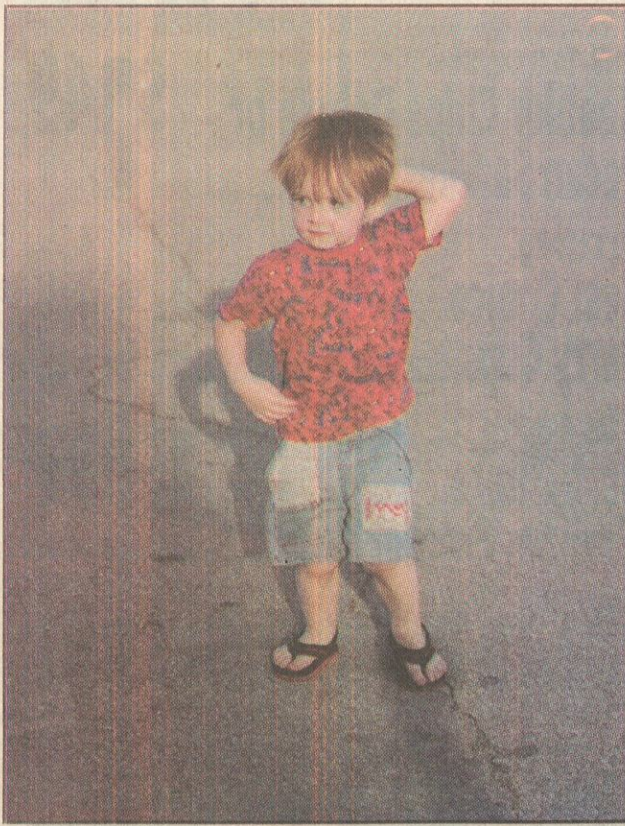

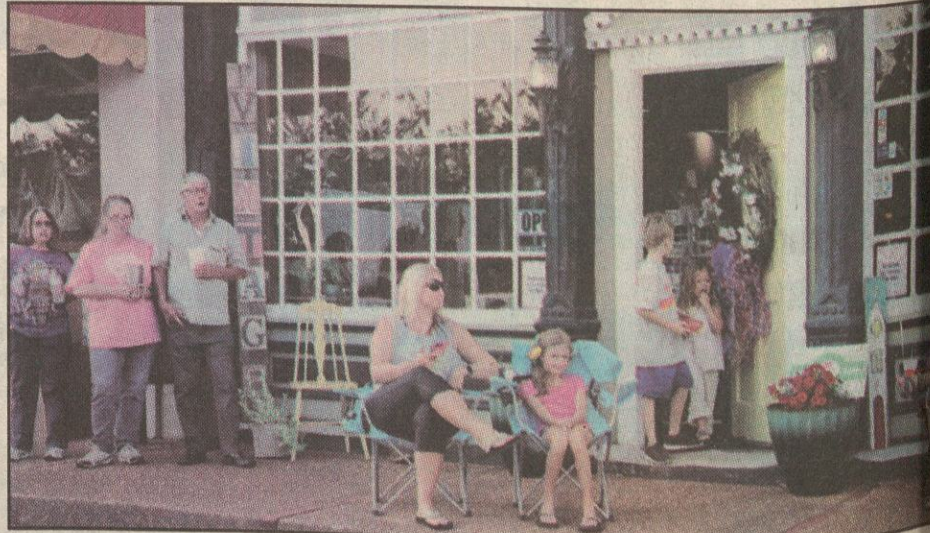
