Iuka to See Return of Downtown Farmers' Market

IUKA — Residents of Iuka will soon be able to buy fresh fruits and vegetables downtown. There will be a farmers market in Jay Bird Park, in downtown Iuka, from 6 a.m. to 12 p.m. beginning Thursday, July 5, and Friday, July 6, and every Thursday and Friday during those hours throughout the growing season. Iuka Alderman Kenny Carson spearheaded the effort and said this was among the things he wanted to accomplish when he was elected. He pointed out that this idea is not exactly new. "We've been wanting to do this for a long time," said Carson. "When I was a kid, my brother and I went and sold them at the farmers market. When we would go on vacation, we would use that money. My mom and dad let us use

all of our money for the arcade or anything we wanted to do. It brings back many great memories." Carson did an informal poll on social media to gauge public interest in having the market return downtown and the response was all positive. His first post quickly received a large number of people sharing the post and numerous enthusiastic comments. Erika Morgan said she wanted some fresh tomatoes and didn't want to travel far to get them. "I would love for fresh bouquets of garden flowers to be available for purchase also," said Nancy Stripling. Sandra Medlin said she thought the farmers market was "a fabulous idea" and Nikki Glidewell said she would "love for the farmers market to return to Jay Bird Park." "Everybody I have spoken to wants to bring it back where it was. It was downtown all my



life and it went away," said Carson. He added that there would be no charge for growers/sellers to set up and the farmers market would be mutually beneficial for everyone. He noted that Tishomingo County grower/sellers are preferred, but everyone is welcome. "It's a win-win situation for the sellers and for the citizens," he said. "The sellers get to make some money and the citizens get to have some fresh homegrown fruits and vegetables."



Gate fabricated at G&G Steel passes under Scruggs Bridge

G&G Steel Oversees the Fabrication of Massive Projects for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

G&G Steel has completed fabrication of a lower miter gate for Holt Lock and Dam near Tuscaloosa, AL, on the Black Warrior River. The Holt Lock & Dam is under the control of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Mobile District. Each leaf is 62' x 80' and weighs approximately 730,000 lbs. They were loaded and setup to facilitate uprighting to the operating position directly off the barge. Engineering and sub-assembly fabrication was completed at G&G Steel's Russellville, Ala., facility, then the project was finally fabricated and transported onto a 72-foot by 260-foot long flat-deck barge at the Mississippi Works Facility, located in the Tri-State Commerce Park. The mv. Jackson III, owned by Cooper Marine of Mobile, Ala., is shown in tow of the gate about to pass under Scruggs Bridge, on Hwy 25, Iuka Ms.

The original gate was constructed in the 1960s, and this is the first replacement of the gate to be installed. The Mobile District, R&D Maintenance and Barnhart Crane will work together on the gate replacement and other lock repair (while it is dewatered) which is scheduled to begin after the 4th. G&G Steel currently is working on many contracts for the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers. Mississippi Works is nearly complete with two lift gates that will travel North to the Pittsburgh area, as the company also begins their upcoming contracts which include culvert valves and more miter gates. Warrior River Steel, Cordova AL, (G&G's other satellite facility) is working on 4 tainter gates and 8 miter gates for the Illinois & Mississippi Rivers; two gates will travel as far north as Lock 2 Hastings, Minnesota.

NEMCC Announces New Multi-Million Dollar On-Campus Baseball/Softball Complex Plans

BOONEVILLE, Miss. - Northeast Mississippi Community College's "Field of Dreams" campaign for its baseball and softball programs will become a reality in the very near future.

The Northeast Board of Trustees officially approved a bid for a brand new state-of-the-art athletic complex during their monthly meeting for June on the Booneville campus.

"The new complex will provide our student-athletes with a quality facility to practice and play in," said Northeast president Ricky Ford. "This makes a statement that Northeast is serious about winning and providing great opportunities for our student-athletes."

It will mark the first time in either programs history that they will compete inside an on-campus venue. Both baseball and softball have utilized a long-standing and successful partnership with Booneville City Park.

"I think it's a game changer," said Northeast athletic director Kent Farris. "It's something that's been a long time coming. We've thoroughly enjoyed the facilities that we've been using and we appreciate everything the City of Booneville has done in conjunction with us. But it's time for us to move on."

"I know our administration and coaching staff is excited to take on this endeavor. This is going to put us on a different level. I don't know of any facility in this state or maybe even nationwide that can compete with it. It's going to be absolutely fabulous." Northeast's Board of Trustees, which represents the college's five-county district, accepted the bid of McCarty King Construction Company of Tupelo for \$8.16 million. The architect for the project was AERC Architecture from Hernando.

The new complex will be located on a parcel of land owned by the college that is surrounded by Coach Billy Ward Drive on the north, Third Street on the west, Northeast's buildings and grounds fa-

cility to the east and Booneville Funeral Home to the south.

Both stadiums will include reserved chair backs with 42 seats for baseball and 35 for softball. Total capacity for the baseball field is set at 248 while softball's maximum seating is 200.

The student-athlete experience will increase significantly with the addition of a new locker room between the two stadiums and an indoor hitting facility beyond the outfield walls.

A new parking lot will allocate 141 spaces plus places for the buses of visiting opponents.

"There's so much excitement about it," said Northeast baseball headman Richy Harrelson. "We're about to have one of the nicest facilities in the United States. It's going to be a great thing for the school and the City of Booneville."

Construction on the new stadiums is anticipated to begin within the next two months and be completed in time for the 2020 season. An official groundbreaking ceremony will also be held on location at a date still to be determined.

The Northeast Development Foundation played an integral part in this venture with its "Field of Dreams" campaign. It raised approximately half a million dollars for this project through donations from local businesses.

Justice Court Adding Contested Cases to First Tuesday Docket

In four of the last five criminal contested court dates the Justice Court has adjourned after six p.m. The Justice Court is moving some criminal cases to the first Tuesday of each month to try to reduce the time spent in court by all participants waiting on their case to be heard. Over the last few years the Mississippi Supreme Court and the Legislature have made substantial changes to criminal law which have increased the time it takes to resolve cas-

es. This combined with a recent increase in DUI charges has led to longer court sessions. Starting in July some criminal cases which do not involve officer testimony will be set on the first Tuesday of each month. If you receive a summons from the Justice Court please be sure to read the date and time so that you will not miss your court date nor be required to wait more time than necessary.

Booneville Residents Arrested For Drugs in Tishomingo County

On June 26, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on Hwy. 30 with the knowledge that the driver, Ron Alley, had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. Deputies stopped the vehicle and arrested Alley; then a search was conducted of the vehicle. Deputies were able to find several alleged oxycodone prescription pills that were concealed under the seat.

It was discovered that the passenger, William Bell, was responsible for attempting to hide the alleged oxycodone from the deputies. Both Alley, and Bell were transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Ron Alley, 48-year-old, white male of 21 CR 2130 Booneville, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (oxycodone). Alley will be presented to the next Grand Jury.

William Bell, 66-year-old, white male of 68 CR 2231 Booneville, Mississippi was officially charged with felony

tampering with evidence. Bell will also be presented to the next Grand Jury.

On June 28, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on CR 252 for seat belt violations. The deputies discovered that the driver had been drinking and after speaking with the occupants the deputies asked for consent to search the vehicle. Deputies were given permission to search and some alleged methamphetamine was found in one of the female occupants' belongings. Lisa Strickland was detained and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail where corrections officers found more alleged methamphetamine on her person as well as in her purse and a pipe was also found.

Lisa Strickland, 42-year-old, white female of 220 CR 7030 Booneville, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of controlled substance (methamphetamine), introducing narcotics into a correctional facility, introducing contraband into a correctional facility, and felony tampering with evidence. Strickland will be presented to the next Grand Jury.

Tishomingo County Health Department Holds Special Immunization Clinic

The TISHOMINGO County Health Department, located at 1508 BETTYDALE DRIVE in IUKA, Mississippi, will hold a special childhood and adolescent immunization clinic for school registration on JULY 13, 2018, from 8:00 AM until 3:00 PM.

During this clinic, health department staff will focus solely on providing childhood and adolescent immunizations so that parents can complete the process quickly and efficiently. Parents should

bring a copy of their child's immunization record, insurance card, and social security card.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, approximately 95 percent of parents nationwide choose to vaccinate their children, protecting them against potentially deadly diseases.

Immunization requirements for children entering school in Mississippi for the first time include: diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DTaP);

polio (IPV); hepatitis B; measles, mumps and rubella (MMR); and varicella (chickenpox). There is also a requirement for children entering seventh grade to receive the Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccination. Parents must provide the school with a Certificate of Immunization Compliance (Form 121) from their local health department or physician prior to school entry.

Check with your physician or the TISHOMINGO County Health De-

partment at 662-423-6100 to see which immunizations your child will need.

Shiloh to Host Second Concert-in-the-Park of 2018

Shiloh National Military Park is excited to announce our second Concert-in-the-Park for 2018. On Saturday, July 7, we will feature "rockabilly" music in a FREE twilight concert, beginning at 5:30 PM on the lawn of the Park's Visitor Center.

"Rockabilly is one of the earliest styles of rock and roll music, and it originated in this area," said Superintendent Dale Wilkerson. "Beginning in the 1950's, artists such as Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Carl Perkins, and Jerry Lee Lewis started a movement that is alive today. We would like to invite everyone to come out to the park to hear some great music performed by two excellent acts."

Noted Memphis rockabilly artist Jason D. Williams will headline the show. An uber-showman known for his energetic performances and boogie-woogie music, Jason

D. has been entertaining crowds across America for four decades. His dynamic piano playing and outlandish stage antics have drawn comparisons to Jerry Lee Lewis.

Williams career began when he left his home in Arkansas at the age of 16 to play with Sleepy LaBeef in Massachusetts. His solo career began in the 1980s, releasing his first album "Tore Up" on RCA in 1990, and the second "Wild," which he recorded at Sun Studios, in 1993. Since that time he has released four more studio albums including 2014s "Hillbillies and Holy Rollers." One of Jason D's most famous performances came on the big screen when his hands were filmed for all the piano playing scenes in the movie "Great Balls of Fire."

Jason D's music has been called enthusiastic, reckless, stormy rock-and-

roll in its natural state, with one paper even calling him the "world's greatest piano player." After seeing a live show there will be no doubt why fans and critics alike agree that this dynamic piano player from Memphis has the same innovation and on-the-edge attitude as the original rockabilly performers.

Opening the show will be Jack Curtis in a tribute performance as Elvis Presley. Curtis performed at last years' concert series, and concert goers were unanimous in requesting his return. Curtis will recreate the energy and excitement of Elvis' hit songs, including "Blue Suede Shoes," "That's All Right Mama," and "Heartbreak Hotel." Curtis has been performing for over 20 years, and placed in the top five in the "World Images of Elvis" competition.

Visitors are invited to



bring lawn chairs, blankets, and picnic baskets.

We will have a Junior Ranger booth for the kids, which opens at noon and runs through the concert. The Great White Throne Judgment Part II

There are many subjects that I would rather cover than the subject of judgment, but all who are God's messengers are duty bound to cover this most important Bible subject, so we will look again at this topic. Revelation 20:12 says, And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things that were written in the books, according to their works." I think we will look only at this one verse here, for it will likely be all we can cover in this article. I gave this verse in the last article, but I did not finish with it. We were looking at the books that will be opened at the Great White Throne Judgment,

so we will take up there. There has been much discussion, and a great deal of speculation, as to what all is in the books that are opened at the judgment before us. I indicated in the last article that the book of life could be the "Lamb's book of life", and if so, it would be opened perhaps to show that the names of the unsaved dead do not appear there. The book, however, is not called the Lamb's book of life here, so it could be a book of deeds. The other books that are opened, howev-

er, could include a book of deeds. You can see that I am only guessing, and that is because the books are not actually identified, except the one that is called the book of life. So, we speculate, if we get dogmatic about the identity of these books, thus we should say that we are speculating. It is unfair to act as if we know what is not revealed.

We do know from other Scriptures that men will give an account of their sins if they die unsaved. The saved will give

an account of their service for Christ, but not of their sins, for those have been forgiven (see Romans 2:16; I Corinthians 3:10-15). The "books" that will be opened, as indicated in Revelation 20:11, could include a number of books. Since the Bible itself says that the word of God will try men in the future, it seems that the books of the Bible will be opened at this judgment (John 12:48). Also there could be separate books for the deeds of each individual tried, but that also is a speculation, for that is not stated here. We do know, however, that those deeds will be brought up at this judgment, for each will be judged according to his works (Revelation 20:13). Granted that there is much about all of the judgments that we

do not presently know, but the good news is that God would rather forgive than to have to judge the unsaved.

We have seen that the time and place of this judgment are mentioned, yet that does not tell us all there is to know about the Great White Throne of God, for here it seems clear that this throne is in space, not in heaven, as some suppose. I heard an old man say many years ago, "Everybody is going to heaven, but not everybody is going to get to stay there." That may sound like a truth, but it is not, for the unsaved will never enter the gates of heaven (Revelation 21:27), which is why the Great White Throne seems to be movable and outside of heaven. There are many references in the Old Testa-

ment to God having "enthroned" between the cherubim" in the temple (I Samuel 4:4; Kings 19:15 etc.). The most important about this judgment is that the unsaved will be raised and judged according to their works. There will be no bargaining at this judgment! There will be no one who is saved by the blood of Christ and what they have done as sinners. The crime that will come at this judgment will be that of having rejected Christ and His offer of salvation!
