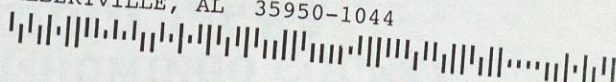

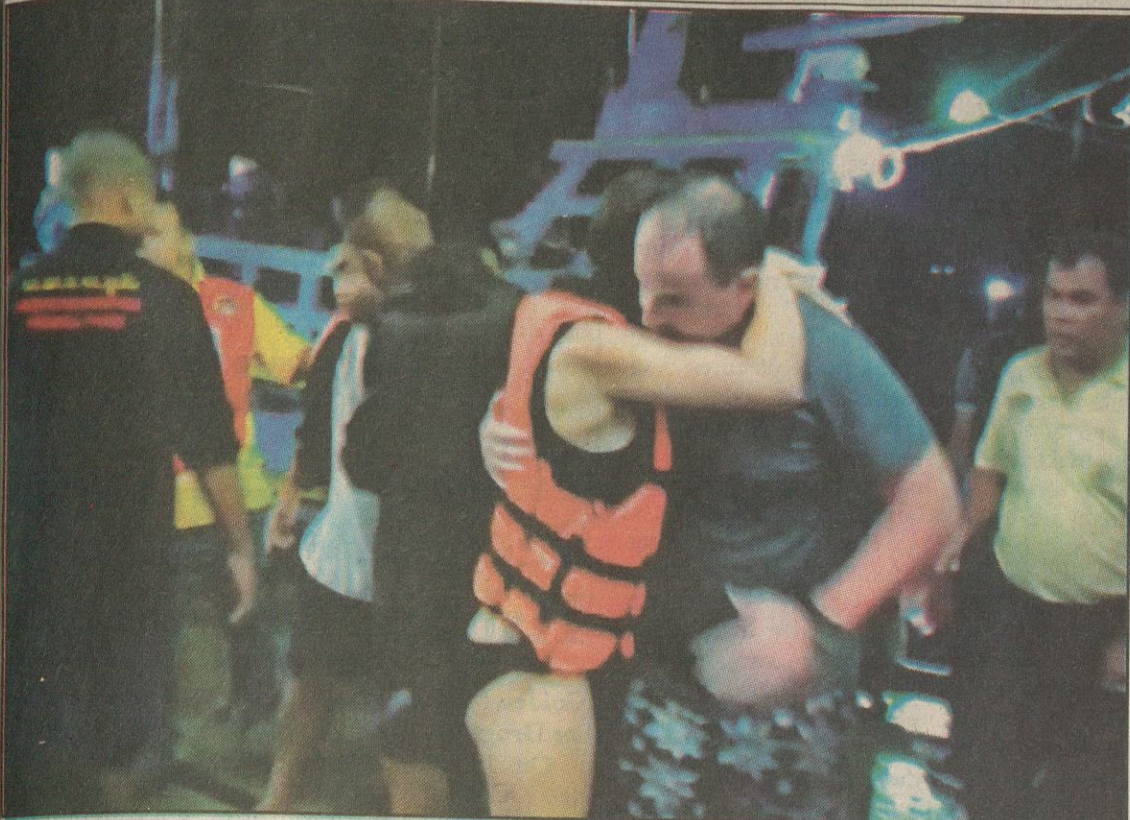

Local Man Among Those Rescued After an Excursion Vessel Capsizes Off the Coast of Phuket Thailand

Scott Casabella, III originally of Iuka, and his girlfriend Danielle Bellomo of Highpoint, NC, were among those rescued when an excursion vessel capsized in the Andaman Sea on July 5th 2018. The boat overturned in 16-foot-high seas between the coasts of Phuket and Koh He, which is the island that the excursion boat was visiting before the storms hit. The boat was reportedly carrying 105 people, including 93 tourists, 11 crew and one tour guide. At this time it seems that about half of the individuals on the boat perished.

Scott has a working visa

which has allowed him to work in China for the last ten years. He was visiting the resort island of Phuket, Thailand on vacation with the company he works for, Heing Happy Leather. The company trip was a group of Scott's coworkers and their families numbering 37 men, women, and children; and many of those individuals did not survive.

Both Danielle and Scott are licensed divers; Scott's family expressed the belief that their training and experience in the water contributed to their survival until rescuers could intervene. Scott was picked up from the water by a fishing vessel

which was working with the local Navy to rescue the victims.

The couple lost their passports, money, cell phones, and many other personal belongings. This made the return from Thailand somewhat problematic. Workers from the U.S. Embassy in Thailand and government officials here in Mississippi worked to get them temporary passports so that they could make the journey home. At press time Scott and Danielle had arrived safely to the United States and will be spending precious time reunited with each other and with their families.

Iuka Man Charged for Making Threats Against County Officials

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office has charged Brandon Adam Pendergrass with making threats against elected officials. Pendergrass, who is currently in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail, made threats to inflict bodily harm on all the County Supervisors as well as the Municipal Judge for the City of Iuka when he is released from custody.

The threats made by Pendergrass were treated as a serious incident by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office so appropriate actions were taken against Pendergrass in order to ensure the safety of the County Officials.

Brandon Adam Pendergrass, 29-year-old, white male of Iuka, Mississippi was officially

charged with five (5) counts of simple assault – elected officials. Pendergrass' bond was set by the Justice Court at \$200,000.

Pendergrass is also currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

Sheriff Daugherty states that his department will take threats like these as serious, whether it is against an elected official or a regular citizen; and the department will not tolerate this type of actions from individuals. This case will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

TCEPA Taking Nominations for Board of Directors

In accordance with the By-laws of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, nominations for positions on the Board of Directors are now being accepted. There will be five positions open for election. One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisors' districts: 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th and an area at large position.

Members of the Association may make nominations by either of the following methods:

By petition bearing the signature of at least fifteen (15) members: Petitions must be received by the Secretary of the Board of Directors at least seven (7) days prior to the day of the Annual Meeting. Petitions may be presented for qualification

at the Main Office of the Association during regular business hours, Monday thru Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

From the floor of the Annual Meeting to be held August 11, 2018: The By-laws require that five (5) percent of the membership be physically present in order that nominations may be made from the floor.

Nominees must be residents of the supervisors' districts which they will represent. Any member, regardless of place of residence, may be nominated for the area at large position; provided, that the nominees for the at large position may not be a resident of the third district. This district presently has a resident serving in an at large position.

Japanese Beetle: Attacks the Foliage and/or Blooms of Many Ornamental Plants

Although Japanese beetle is currently not well established in Mississippi, it does occur in the state and damaging infestations are common in parts of Tennessee and northern Alabama. This pest has progressively expanded its range over the eastern US since it was introduced in the early 1900s. Thus, Mississippi gardeners need to be familiar with this important pest.

Description: (adults about 1/2 inch) Adult Japanese beetles are shiny, metallic green with metallic bronze colored wings and rows of white fuzzy spots toward the end of the abdomen. This makes them fairly easy to recognize, although there are some other native scarab beetles that are metallic green in color. Larvae are 'white grubs', which are about 1 inch long when fully mature, and feed on the roots of grasses in commercial turf, as well as in pastures, roadsides, and unmanaged areas.

Damage: Damage is caused by the adults, which feed on the foliage and/or blooms of many different species of ornamental plants. This includes many trees, woody shrubs, herbaceous perennials, and annual plants. Leaf-feeding results in skeletonizing defoliation, with the severity of damage being related to the number of beetles present. Japanese beetles are also highly attracted to the blooms of many plants, especially large light-colored blooms. They feed on the anthers and petals, causing unsightly damage. White or yellow roses are favorite targets and often sustain heavy damage in areas where Japanese beetles are common.

Management: In areas where Japanese beetles are abundant, gardeners may choose to avoid growing species or varieties of plants that are especially susceptible. Care should be exercised in making this determination, because susceptibility can vary greatly within a group of plants. For example, Japanese maples are quite susceptible, while red maples are seldom attacked. Likewise, some varieties of crape myrtles are relatively resistant to attack, while others are highly susceptible. Light-flowered varieties of roses are more likely to be attacked than are varieties with darker colored blooms. Extension Publication 2333 provides information on the relative susceptibility of many common landscape plants.

Treatments or Tools that are Not Very Helpful: Biological treatments, such as the milky spore



disease bacteria and 'Japanese beetle traps' are sold commercially, but their effectiveness is not supported by results from controlled experiments. Because larvae can also develop in pastures and wastelands, controlling larvae in commercial turf may not help prevent attack of landscape plants by large numbers of adults.

Commercial traps that are sold to attract and capture Japanese beetles are quite effective at attracting the beetles to an area, but are less effective at trapping all of the beetles they attract. Consequently, the net result of placing Japanese beetle traps near plantings of roses or other plants that you want to protect from Japanese beetles may be a net increase in beetle damage. If you use these traps, place them several hundred feet away from the area you are trying to protect, and use insecticides or repellent treatments, as described below, on the plants you want to protect. This creates a "push-pull" effect than can reduce beetle damage.

Control: Carbaryl, cyfluthrin, bifenthrin, permethrin, zeta-cypermethrin, cyhalothrin, azadirachtin: Adult Japanese beetles can be controlled with foliar sprays and foliar sprays may also provide short-term residual protection. However, repeated treatments will be necessary to adequately protect susceptible plants in areas where this pest is abundant. Choose a product that contains one of the active ingredients listed above, and that is labeled for use on ornamental plants, and spray weekly for the duration of the Japanese beetle flight. Repeated applications of products containing azadirachtin (Azatin and Azatrol are two examples), a natural product derived from neem seed, will also repel Japanese beetles. Be sure to observe pollinator protection requirements when treating plants that are in bloom. Blake Layton, Ph.D. MSU Extension Entomology Specialist

Recent Arrests in Tishomingo County

Golden Men Arrested For Drugs

On July 4, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on CR 864 for a seatbelt violation. While speaking with the driver of the vehicle, Jason Allison, the deputies determined that he appeared to be under the influence of some type of alcohol or narcotic. Allison was placed under arrest and a search of the vehicle turned up some alleged methamphetamine as well as paraphernalia. The passenger, Stephen Graham, was then placed under arrest and both Allison and Graham were transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. While at the jail, another bag of alleged methamphetamine along with some needles and pipes were found on Graham's person.

Jason Allison, 38-year-old, white male of 332 County Line Road Golden, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Allison remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting bond to be set.

Stephen Graham, 40-year-old, white male of 122 CR 8 Golden, Mississippi was officially charged with the introduction of narcotics into a correctional facility. Graham remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting bond to be set.

Both of these cases will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

Occupant of Vehicle Arrested

On July 7th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies were dispatched to a business on Hwy. 264 in Burnsville; the call was in concerning a suspicious vehicle with an occupant slumped in the seat. When deputies arrived, they found Johnathan Horner, in driver's side asleep. A waking Horner, the deputies discovered there were some active warrants for his arrest.

Horner was placed under arrest and then deputies discovered a bag of alleged methamphetamine lying in the driver's seat. Horner was transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Johnathan Horner, 30-year-old, white male of 194 CR 255 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Horner's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Court at \$1,500. The rest warrants were a misdemeanor from the City of Iuka as well as a misdemeanor offense from the Juvenile Court.

Insight to Eyesight

Cataract

A cataract is an opaque or cloudy area in the normal clear lens located in the eye. The size and location of the cataract will determine if or how much vision is affected. Usually cataracts develop in people over the age of 50 but are sometimes seen in children and result of injury. There are several types of cataracts, each caused by varying factors. Common symptoms of cataracts include: blurred or hazy vision, reduced color intensity, difficulty with glare, and decreased night vision. There is no treatment to slow the progression, and the gradual changes are not usually recognized. Cataract progression is accelerated by systemic disease, UV light exposure, smoking, and of course birth defects. Vision related cataract changes are treated with spectacles and contact lenses until surgical intervention is required. A comprehensive eye exam is required to identify the type and severity of cataract and what treatment options are available.

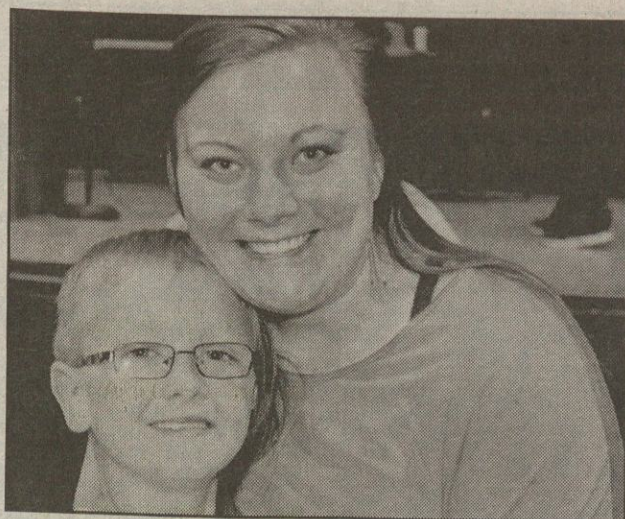

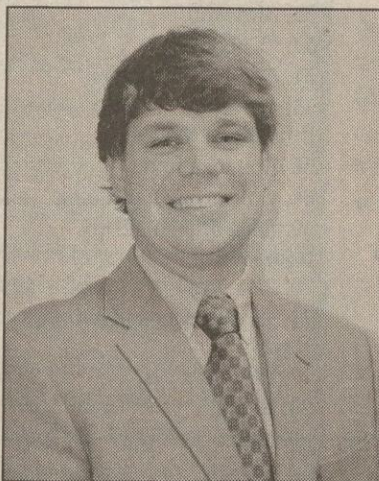

It was beautiful inside with a fireplace in every room. The Rotary Club would have their weekly meetings there. Antiques were everywhere and it was a very popular eating place. Margie ran it from 1973-77 and had a lady named Dorothy as the cook. Margie later owned the Frosty Mug in the 1990's.

The old house, turned restaurant,

shown at left was located on Aberdeen Street behind the old Woodley home and the old Courthouse. These houses were rent houses that were owned by Bob and Bob Brown and were a part of the old Mineral Springs Hotel and Anna. Many families lived in the little house over the years.

Columbus Ships Pinta and Nina to Land in Iuka!

Iuka, MS. —On Wednesday, July 11th, the ‘Pinta’ and the ‘Nina’, replicas of Columbus’ Ships, opened in Iuka. The ships are docked at Grand Harbor Marina, 325 County Road 380, Counce TN, until their departure early Tuesday morning, July 17th.

The ‘Nina’ was built completely by hand and without the use of power tools. Archaeology magazine called the ship “the most historically correct Columbus replica ever built.” In 2005, the ‘Pinta’, also a caravel, was launched in Brazil and was the first ship to sight

land in the New World. Historians consider the caravel the Space Shuttle of the fifteenth century.

Both ships tour together as a new and enhanced ‘sailing museum’ for the purpose of educating the public and school children on the ‘caravel’, a Portuguese ship used by Columbus and many early explorers to discover the world. Before him, the Old World and the New remained separate and distinct continents and ever since their fates have been bound together for better or for worse.

While in port, the general public is invited to

visit the ships for a walk-a-board, self-guided tour. Admission charges are \$8.50 for adults, \$7.50 for seniors, and \$6.50 for students 5 - 16. Children 4 and under are Free. The ships are open every day from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. No reservations necessary.
