All giveaways are on a first come, first served basis while supplies last.

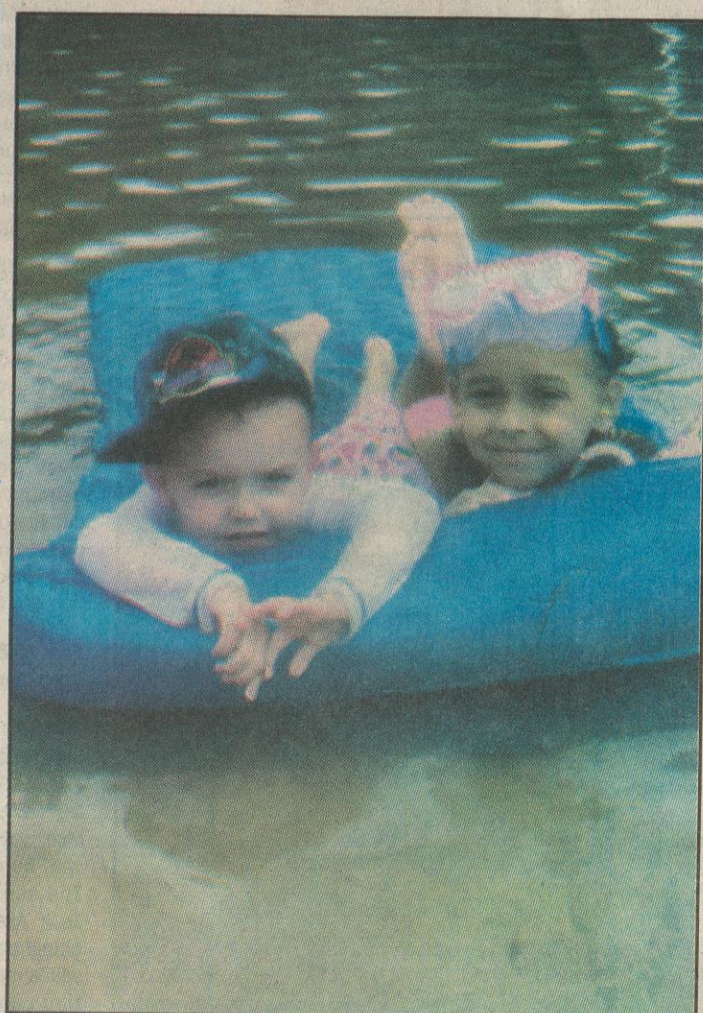

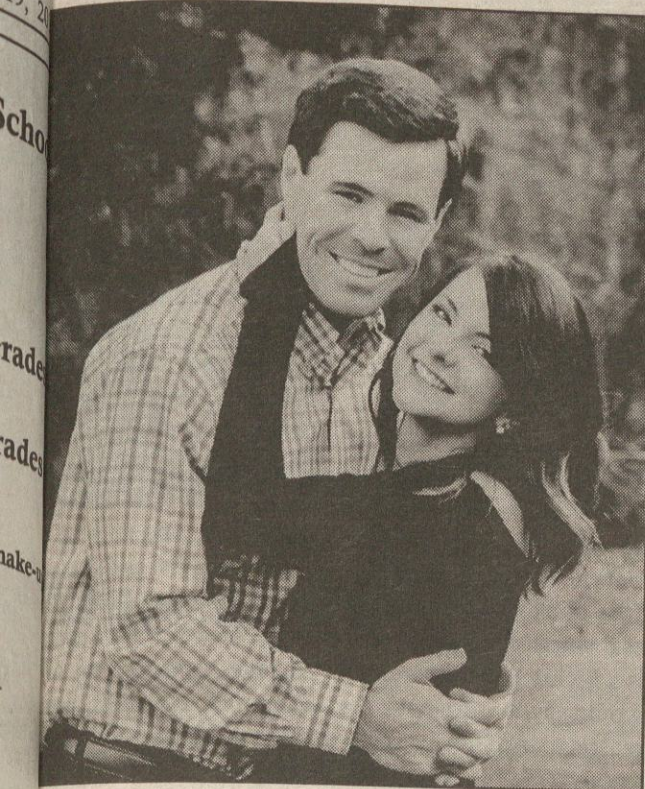

The couple will exchange vows at 6 o'clock, July 21st at Pickwick Pines Resort in Iuka, MS with reception to follow.

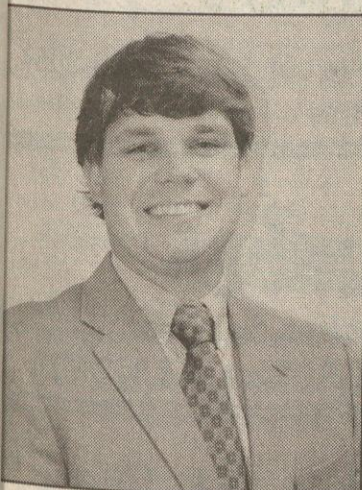
Food Depot News:

Danny Clingan brought this clipping by the office this week. It is from an old Vidette his grandmother had kept in her Bible. It appeared in the June 17, 1976 issue. This is a photo of the old courthouse on Quitman Street as it looked after it was closed and the county business moved to a new location. These boys worked with the Summer Youth Program in the City of Iuka under Mayor Biggs. Danny said they cleaned out the inside and outside of the courthouse. He said many collectible papers were thrown away because of the pigeons that roosted in the old structure. He also said the group worked all summer picking up trash and doing many useful jobs around the city.

The cutline read: WELL OVERDUE - Clean up work around the old Tishomingo County Courthouse got underway Monday morning, June 14 (1976) when these young men showed up to work under the Summer Youth Program. Much concern has been expressed by citizens about the poor condition of the old landmark during our Bicentennial year. 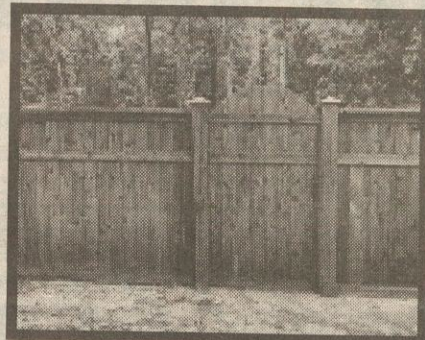

The Great White Throne Judgment Part III

We are looking at the judgment of the unsaved who have died, been raised and then stand before the judgment of the great white throne. As is indicated in John 5:22, 27, Jesus is the judge before Whom the unsaved dead will stand. Revelation 20:14-15 says, "And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire." I have covered this before, but I need to say again that death basically means separation, not annihilation. This means that the spirits of humans do not ever cease to exist. Many people have had strange requests concerning their dead bodies, because they have hoped

that the destruction of the body would avoid any future abode in a place of punishment, but the Bible teaches that the spirit exits after the body is dead. Here we see death and hell both cast into the lake of fire, which means that all who have died and gone to hell will be brought before the great white throne to be judged for their works and cast into the lake of fire. It is not that there is any possibility of being saved after death, but there is a need for each individual to be judged for his sins to see what punishment

he deserves. After being judged, these who are unsaved, with no opportunity to be saved, are cast into the lake of fire as their everlasting abode. Their physical bodies are raised and stand before Jesus for judgment, then body and spirit are cast into the lake of fire. So, hell is not the final abode of the unsaved, rather the lake of fire is the final abode.

The lake of fire is called the second death, because it is a final and forever separation of the unsaved from God and all that is good. More than

that, the bodies of the unsaved that are raised are cast into the lake of fire, so it is a second time of "dying", or separation, that will last forever. I need to say that this does not mean that the unsaved will cease to exist, but they will be tormented forever for their sins, because they were never forgiven. It is not that God desires to send anyone to the lake of fire, rather it is that people make a choice for the lake of fire when they make a choice not to receive Christ for the forgiveness of their sins. II Peter 3:9 shows clearly that God is not willing that any should perish, but most people are unwilling to accept the only payment for their sins, namely the death and resurrection of Christ.

All whose names are

not written in the book of life will be cast into the lake of fire after the great white throne judgment, but this is their own choice, not God's. Since the "book of life" is mentioned here as the place where names must be written for one to escape the lake of fire and live forever with God, it seems that the "Lamb's book of life" is indicated here, as may be also the case in Revelation 20:12, in the term: "the book of life". Some ask whether or not there is a literal "lake of fire". I would say that we have no reason to take the meaning as anything but literal, for all of the places in Scripture that mention either hell or the lake of fire indicate that there is literal fire in both of these and that the unsaved will finally be

forever tormented in the lake of fire. Notice that the unsaved are said to be "cast into the lake of fire" which is likely the work of God's angels. This "casting" into the lake of fire is only the matter of carrying out the sentence that the unsaved have chosen. The positive side to the picture is that those not living still have an opportunity to turn to Christ in repentance and faith to be saved from the awful place called the lake of fire. Too much is at risk for anyone to take a chance on a supposed possibility that there is no future and everlasting punishment for those who refuse Christ and die unsaved!

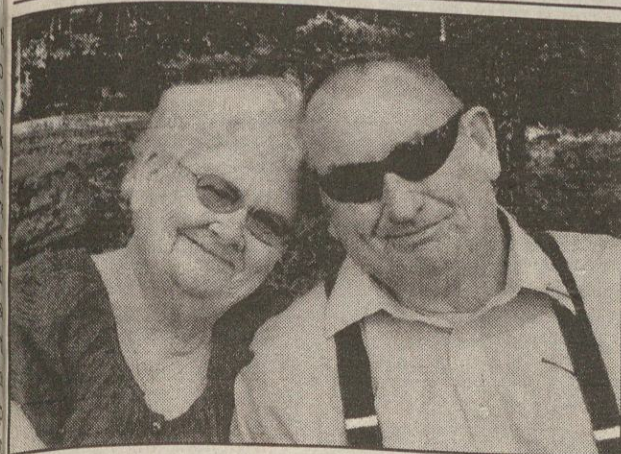

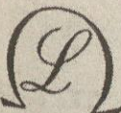

Tug Boat Iuka was a "Happy Ship"

Charles Bonds of Iuka was recently at a convention on the Gulf Coast when he took a seat beside a man who soon proved that it is a "small world."

When Charles told the man he was from Iuka, the man's eyes lit up. He said, "I was told all the boats were named after Indian Chiefs, but I had never heard of Chief Iuka."



It seems Charles's new friend, William Chisolm, had served on the U. S. Navy Tug Boat Iuka (YT819) during his service in the U. S. Navy. He retired as a Senior Chief Petty Officer USN and makes his home in Meridian.

According to Mr. Chisolm, he trained and qualified as craft master aboard Iuka. She was a good vessel and easy to operate. She assisted many ships in and out of the harbor at Port Hueneme in California. To his knowledge she never suffered an operational breakdown.

The Iuka was also utilized as the burial-at-sea platform for Veterans. He officiated in several of these Honorable Ceremonies.

The contract for the tug boat Iuka was awarded 9 August 1971. She was laid down on 20 September 1972 at Marine Corps Shipyard, Astoria, Oregon, and launched on 10 November 1972. She was stricken from the Navy List on 10 October 1995 and transferred to another government agency in March 1996. She is currently used as a training vessel for the Seamanship program at Tongue Point Job Corps Center, Astoria, OR. The Natick-class large harbor tug was 108 feet long and had a 2000 HP diesel engine.

Mr. Chisolm transferred back to the fleet in October of 1972 and was unaware of her disposition in Port Hueneme, California. He said "she could be considered a happy and lucky ship which in Naval jargon is a very good thing."

The name "Iuka" circled.

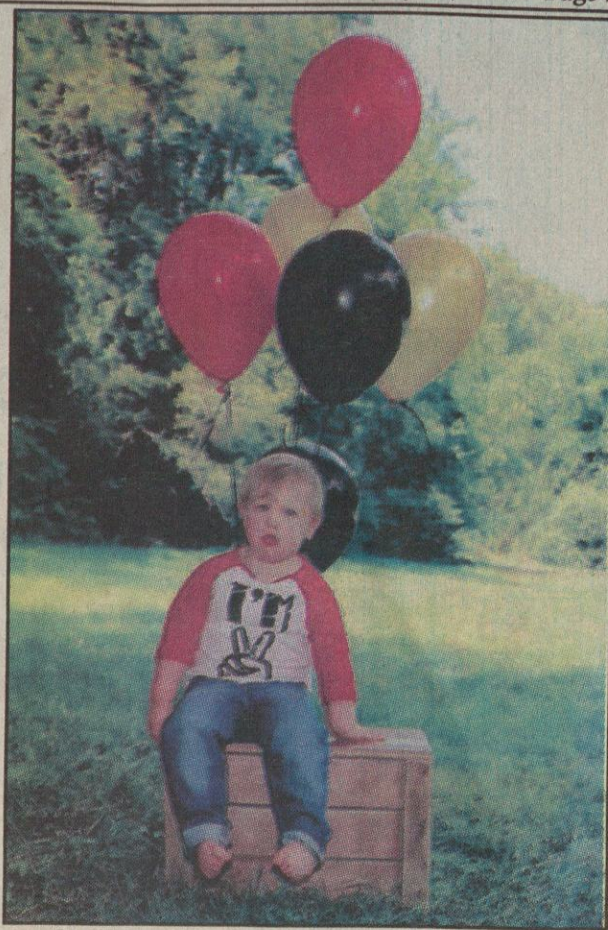

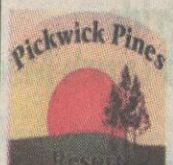

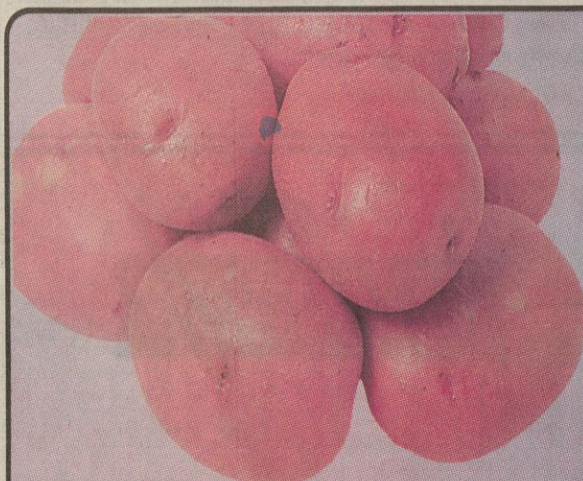
