Presley Kicks off **Tishomingo County** Task Force Meeting on Cellular and Internet Service

Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley announced today that the first meeting of the Tishomingo County Task Force on improving cellular telephone and high-speed internet service will be held on Monday, August 20, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting will take place in the upstairs courtroom of the Tishomingo County Courthouse located at 1008 Battleground Drive in Iuka.

"Rural Mississippi has an infrastructure crisis in the lack of cellular telephone service and high-speed internet service. Mississippians are sick and tired of paying for a service that doesn't work or being told that providers have no intention of serving their areas. That is unacceptable to me and through the help of these citizen task forces, we are going to highlight this problem and demand answers," Presley said. "The information gathered that we will use to prove that the FCC's maps for funding are wrong will be due soon, so we have a lot of work to do in a very short time. That is why

citizen volunteers are so very important."

Among other projects, citizens involved with the task force will be able to use a free smartphone app, approved by the Federal Trade Commission. to document the lack of cellular telephone and data service in their area. The FCC currently shows that Mississippi has adequate service in almost every county of the state. This false information could cause Mississippi to lose millions in federal funding for cellular telephone towers in rural areas. Also, the task force will meet with leaders to look at what solutions exist to bring high-speed internet service to rural areas.

"While we have had many volunteers, we always welcome more. This meeting is open to the public and all are welcome to attend," said Commissioner





Tishomingo County Extension Agent Emily Cox and Nutrition Educator Diane Ham are recognized for successfully meeting the prescribed requirements by examination of the National Restaurant Association's ServSafe Food Protection Certification Manager Course. The course was offered by the Mississippi State University Extension Service.

The ServSafe Food Protection Manager Certification Course offers the most up-to-date, management-oriented information on food safety. The course also addresses the issues of employee training, receiving, storing, preparing and serving food, safety regulations and standards, HACCP (hazard analysis critical control points), foodborne illness, pest control, cleaning and sanitizing, and accident prevention.

The Mississippi State Department of Health, through the Regulation Food Code, mandates food safety certification. Cox and Ham are to be congratulated on their successful completion of the course, commitment to food safety, and for joining other dedicated individuals in the industry committed to serving safe food.






The New Heavens and The New Earth (part II)

If anything excites the believer, it should be that God has a whole new creation coming. We were looking at Revelation 21:1-2; Isaiah 65:17: Isaiah 66:22 and II Peter 3:13 in the last article. I will return to those references for more information, but first I want to go to Romans 8:19-23: "For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of Him Who has subjected the same in hope. Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groaneth and tra-

vaileth in pain together until now. And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our bodies." (The words "creature" and "creation" in our verses are the same word in the Greek.) The

Paul mentioned in Romans 8:23 that even the saved still groan, awaiting the redemption of the body. (Even the "faith healers" still get sick and die!) The only time and place where we will have perfect health and no sickness will be in the new body and in the new creation. Isaiah 66:22







Jerrell L. McNutt



tory rotted. My brother Orville McNutt recovered the metal parts and rebuilt it at the Voc-tech facility in Tishomingo. Orville died in 1986.

The broom factory was stored in a small building on his farm. History was again about to be repeated. Part of the roof caved in and rain was falling on the equipment. His widow, Juanita McNutt, asked me to clean up the equipment. I cleaned it and arranged to have it displayed in the Museum located in the Old Tishomingo Court House at Iuka, Mississippi.



In 1908 bonds amounting to \$15,000 were issued for the purpose of building

a public school plant (pictured at left) in Iuka. This building was used until 1960. The beautiful old building was sufficient until 1942 when Howard Auditorium and four elementary classrooms were built to help the rapid growth. A modern gymnasium

was built in 1949 at a cost of \$50,000 and a cafeteria was built in 1952. These facilities were adequate until consolidation of the community schools added such growth that a new modern facility was built and opened in 1960.

Some of us are for-

tunate enough (or old enough) to remember both high school buildings. A school reunion would be a wonderful place to gather and swap stories of all the wonderful memories from these two buildings.




