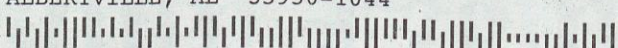

Tishomingo County High School students will be "Brave" and kick off the new school year in a big way.

On Friday, Aug. 10, beginning at 6:30 p.m. at Mineral Springs Park in Iuka, the Iuka Development & Economic Association (IDEA), in conjunction with the Touchdown Club, will host the annual Back to School Bash - Meet the Braves.

They will be selling a variety of things like BBQ nachos, hamburgers, hotdogs, ice cream, pizza and Braves attire like bracelets and T-shirts as well as some face painting.

"The funds raised goes toward anything the teams may need throughout the season," said TCHS Touchdown Club President, Gingar Pannell.

Iuka Baptist Church will also be sponsoring a movie after the pep rally and local businesses have donated many door prizes. In the past, we have had over 200 door prizes to give away.

"Our community has always been so generous for this event because it's so huge," said Hollon. There will also be opportunities for people to win prizes

playing games, said Anne Marie Brown.

After the movie, around 9:30 p.m., there will be the annual Blue and White scrimmage game at TCHS.

The turnout is usually great for this event and it's heartwarming to see the younger children watch the high school students, such as the little boys holding footballs looking up to the high school football players. There is an opportunity to get pictures made with the high school players.

"The little kids think they're really big then," said Hollon.

## County Schools Open with Emphasis on Student Safety and School Attendance

The Tishomingo County School District is back in session for the 2018-2019 school year. Teachers returned on Wednesday, August 1st, at an opening professional development assembly at John B. Moore Auditorium at Belmont School. The featured speaker was Mr. Jeffrey Franks, a retired FBI agent, with specialties in school safety and active shooter response. "We are excited to have our faculty and staff back to begin a new school. We have several new teachers and staff members, with many of them being products of our school system. It's always encouraging to see our former students go into education and then return to us as employees. We are very blessed to have high quality employees, both current and new, in our district," said Superintendent Christie Holly. Each school has conducted Open House sessions or registrations to get schedules and other important information to parents. Students are in session beginning Monday, August 6th.

One of the exciting initiatives the district is implementing this year is providing an iPad for each 7th and 8th grader in the district. The district implemented iPads for students in 9th through 12th grades in January of the 2017-2018 school year. "We are excited about the move toward more technology for our teachers and students as we strive to prepare them for college and career opportunities after their K-12 experience ends. We are blessed to have a Board that supports our vision of excellence and to have such knowledgeable and dedicated staff

in our technology department. Likewise, we want to thank our communities for their continual support of our initiatives and of our schools," stated Holly. Parent meetings for 7th, 8th, and 9th grade students are being held at each applicable school to discuss this implementation.

As another school year begins, Mrs. Holly wanted to bring attention to the importance of school attendance to our parents and community. "School attendance is vital to student achievement. Research shows that students who miss school regularly are more likely to become involved in at-risk behaviors, such as crime, drug use, and failure to receive a high school diploma. It is especially detrimental to young students because they miss essential skills in reading and math. Likewise, the funding formula for our schools is directly tied to the attendance of our students. Our district actually lost money last year due to students' lack of attendance. Parents need to be aware of these negative consequences and make sure students come to school," Holly explained. "We ask that parents try their best to make doctor and dentist appointments after school, but we understand that is not always possible. However, we do ask that parents return students to school after those appointments so students won't miss as much work, and likewise, the school gets to count them as being present that day. It's a win-win situation when that happens."

## Multimodal Grants Awarded for Northern Transportation District

Tupelo, Miss.—Commissioner Mike Tagert has announced grant awards for multimodal projects in Mississippi's Northern Transportation District.

The Mississippi Transportation Commission (MTC) recently approved the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) to award grants to regional and municipal airports, ports and public transit systems throughout north Mississippi.

"MDOT's responsibilities include maintaining and improving the state's highways and interstates, but also focuses on providing a safe intermodal transportation network for airports, ports and waterways, railroads and public transit," Tagert said. "Each of these modes of transportation play a vital role in transporting people, goods and services that promote economic growth and development throughout Mississippi."

Funding for these multimodal grants comes from the Multimodal Transportation Improvement Fund. Money from this fund is allocated specifically to support multimodal grants each year. Grant applications, which include project details and funds requested, are reviewed and approved by a multimodal committee specific to each separate mode of transportation.

Grants were approved for the following regional and municipal airports in Northern Mississippi.

\$34,880 - Monroe County Airport, Aberdeen: Acquisition of an aircraft ground power unit.

\$73,369 - Golden Triangle Regional Airport, Columbus: Renovation of the rental car facility.

\$15,500 - Iuka Airport: Upgrade the fuel management system.

\$136,842 - New Albany-Union County Airport: Rehabilitate the county hangar.

\$14,251 - University-Oxford Airport: Finalize the aircraft fuel system upgrade.

\$17,183 - Tunica Municipal Airport: Expand the north apron at the Tunica Airport.

\$23,850 - McCharen

Field Airport, West Point: Upgrade the self-service fuel terminal controls.

\$20,880 - Okolona Municipal Airport: Rehabilitate the access road to main apron.

Grants were approved for the following ports in Northern Mississippi.

\$95,000 - York Creek Port, Iuka: Improve barge terminal access.

\$466,317 - Lower County Port: Extend at the west bank.

\$301,158 - Port Itawamba, Fulton: Repair and installation of mooring dolphin.

Grants were approved for the public transit systems in Northern Mississippi.

\$64,298 - Aaron Henry Community Health Services Center, Clarksdale: Vehicle match: \$9,298 for one 17-passenger ADA van and \$55,000 for vehicle insurance.

\$56,052 - Oxford University Transit: Vehicle insurance.

\$23,018 - Starke

Mississippi State University Area Rapid Transit: Vehicle match: \$23,018 for two 24/25 passenger ADA buses.

\$23,600 - Mississippi Valley State University Mass Transit: Vehicle insurance.

\$50,309 - North Mississippi Community Services, Booneville: Vehicle match: \$11,500 for one 24/25 ADA and \$38,800.00 for vehicle insurance.

\$28,405 - Union Community Action Committee, Ashland: Vehicle match: \$10,405.00 for 17 passenger ADA and \$18,000 for vehicle insurance.

Grants were approved for the following airports in Northern Mississippi.

\$307,838 - Itawamba Rail Authority, Fulton: Upgrade to 115 lbs. along 780 feet of track to replace 2,726 crossties.

\$319,902 - Mississippi Delta Railroad, Clarksdale: Upgrade to 101.45 lbs. rails from mile 101.45.

\$266,805 - Mississippi Alabama Railroad Authority, Belmont: Replacement of crossties between mile posts 531 and 532.

### Pink Eye

The eye can become pink or inflamed for a variety of different reasons. True pink eye, which can be spread through direct contact, is usually caused by a virus called adenovirus. Bacterial eye infections are less common and not only cause red eyes but also contain mucus and pus. Eye allergies are the most common form of red eyes and are commonly mistaken for a contagious condition. Examination of the eye with a microscope can determine if the red eye is caused by a virus, bacteria, allergy, or other condition. 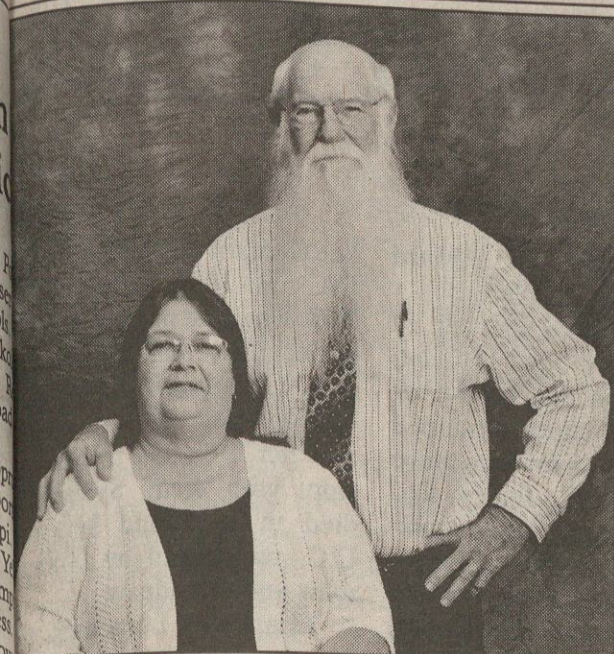

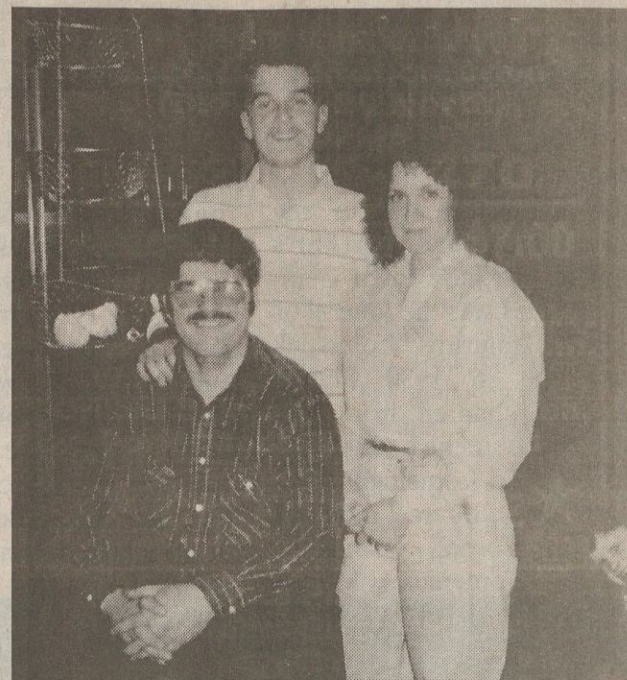

## The New Heavens and The New Earth (part III)

I get excited when I read the last two chapters of Revelation, for I see again that the end is going to be great for all the children of God. There is the idea of ownership here on the part of God and the idea of relationship here on the part of the saved. Eternity is going to be far more interesting and wonderful than any of the saved can presently imagine.

Revelation 21:4 says, “And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away.” Tears are a definite part of earth life! As many of you know, my wife went to heaven on July 27th, and I can truly say that it left a “hole in my heart”, but that sorrow will all be gone when I am with the Lord in eternity. Many of you have had tears of sorrow, but for the saved all of those will be wiped away by

the hands of a loving Heavenly Father! Think about how a Father or Mother has often wiped away the tears of a sad child, yet this will be far beyond that! ## Pleasant Grove Church Of Christ Cemetery By-Laws And Regulations Article #3

Grave sites are to be level, with NO obstructions such as Stone coping or other enclosures of graves and iron or iron work of any kind preventing grave site to be mowed, will not be permitted in the new section (back acre). As of 8/1/2018 this also pertains to the old part of the Cemetery. Owners may have the boundaries of the grave indicated by cornerstones, to be located at their expense, by, or under, the direction of the Board of Trustees. These stones shall not project above the ground and may not be altered once set. Excavations for monuments or other memorials will be overseen by the Board of Trustees and will be performed by the Monument Company setting the

stone. From time to time, it may be necessary to move headstones and/or plantings in order to open a grave for burial. This should be seen as a normal part of conducting the business of the Cemetery.

The temporary disruption will be corrected as soon as is practical. Any losses that occur due to the necessary moving of headstones or plantings are not the responsibility of the Church.
