Services for Retired Iuka Dentist, Joe Barlow

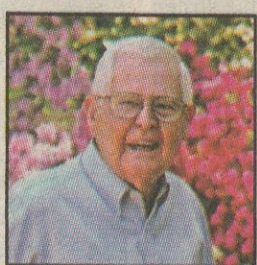
Dr. Joe Ray Barlow, 83, of Iuka, MS, died Thursday, August 23, 2018, at his residence. Dr. Barlow was a U. S. Army veteran and achieved the rank of Captain serving as the dentist for the Guard Sentinels of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery. He was also a long-time local dentist, serving the Iuka area for 42 years. Joe attended Corinth High School for 10 years prior to transferring and graduating from Columbia Military School in Columbia, TN. He then attended the University of Tennessee and earned a Doctor of Dental Science degree. Dr. Barlow was a long-time member of the Iuka Rotary Club and received the distinction of Paul Harris Fellow. He was also a former member of the American Dental Association, and was a former president of the Iuka Country Club. Joe was a big Tennessee Volunteer football fan. He loved traveling, as well as boating and spending time on the water.

He is survived by his wife, Jan Akins Barlow of Iuka; two daughters, Diana Barlow Cosby and husband Harry of Tupelo, and Rachel Barlow Adelman

and husband Matt of Austin, TX; one sister, Betty Barlow Agee of Memphis, TN; four grandchildren, Cole Cosby, Grier Cosby, Sean Adelman, and Audrey Adelman; his favorite sister-in-law, Barbara Akins Aldred of Hoover, AL; and a special friend, Mike Borden of Iuka. He was preceded in death by his parents, Howard and Jewel Hodge Barlow.

Long Time Educator Hubert Rhay Robinson Dies at 89

Hubert Rhay Robinson, 89, of Burnsville, MS, passed away Monday, August 26, 2018 at Carleton House in Iuka, MS. He was born September 3, 1928 in Iuka, MS, the ninth of 11 children born to Ollie Mae Robinson and Massey E. Robinson.

Hubert Rhay attended school in Burnsville and graduated from Burnsville High School in 1947 where he was president of his senior class. Hubert graduated from Millsaps College with a Bachelor of Arts. He entered the United States Army during the Korean War, was sent to San Diego for boot camp, and spent most of the next four years in Norfolk, VA. Hubert Rhay returned to Burnsville where he taught school for the next 32 years. Being very talented, he taught French, Math, Music, directed school plays, announced football games, and kept basketball stats. As an accomplished pianist/organist, he played for graduations, weddings, funerals, and church services, along with civic events. He was a caregiver for his brother, his mother and later a sister, as well as helping others.

Hubert was a member of the Burnsville Methodist Church where he proudly opened the services with special music as long as he was able. Hubert was

Teacher of the Year in 1979-1980 and was the first person to be chosen

as Burnsville Citizen of the Year by the local Chamber of Commerce. The new gymnasium at Burnsville School was named in his honor. He bragged that though he was a bachelor, he was still looking. In recent years, Hubert enjoyed shopping at Walmart, eating at Cracker Barrel and making people smile.

Hubert was preceded in death by his parents; his siblings, Richard LaFayette Robinson, Sr., William David Robinson, James Rex Robinson, and Mary Robinson Ligon Mayfield; four infant brothers; two nephews, Allen Ray Ligon and Jimmy Lee Robinson; and a niece, Nancy Robinson Steele. Iuka Heritage Festival Set for Labor Day Weekend

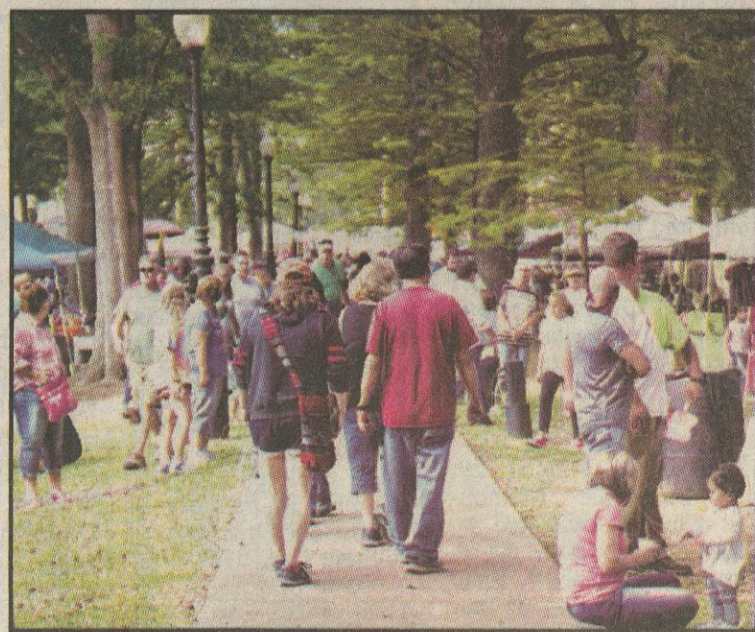
It Starts Friday the 31st

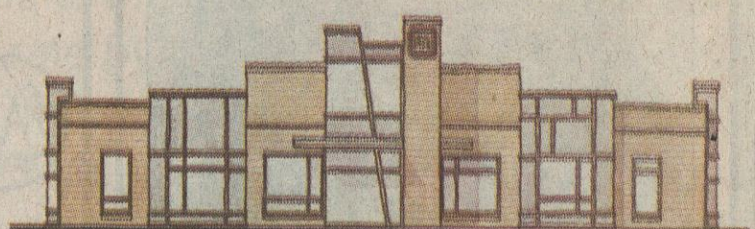

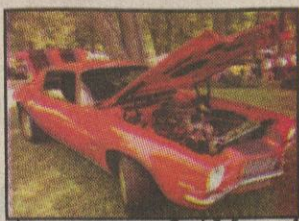

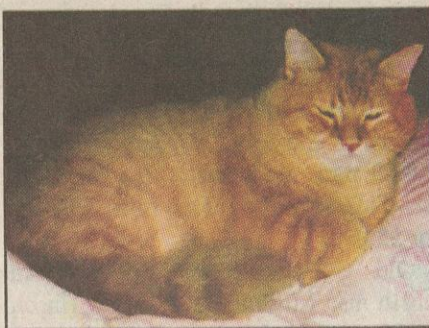

Glen Resident Arrested for 4-Wheeler Theft

Dry Eye Disease

The tears that lubricate and nourish the eye surface are an important factor in good comfortable vision. Each time the eye blinks the tears are spread across the ocular surface. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$5,642,000.00. Of that amount, (5.51 percent) or \$311,000.00 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For next fiscal year, the City of Iuka proposes to increase your ad valorem tax millage rate by 1.72 mills from 17.23 mills to 18.95 mills; it will result in a tax increase. Carrie and Henry's son, Henry A. Underwood, Jr. was killed in France July 21, 1918.

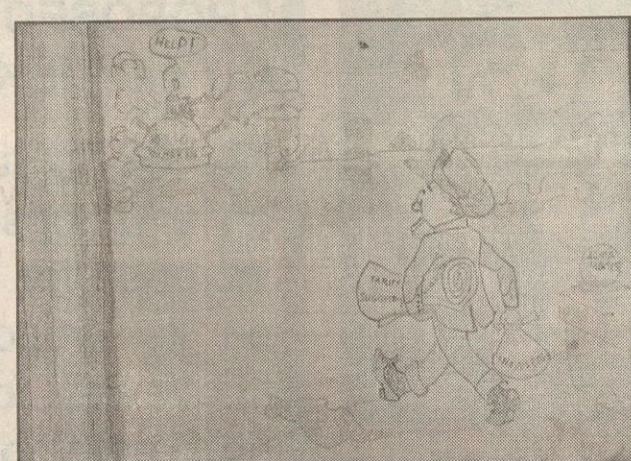
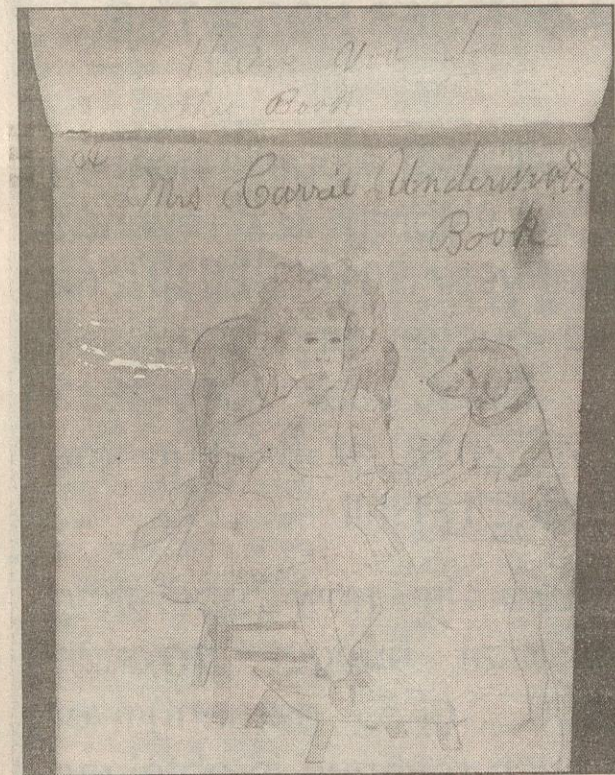
Ms. Carrie was the great-grandmother of

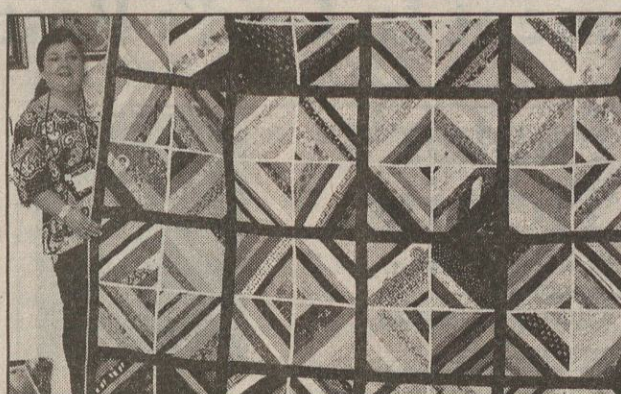

The fact is: God is always right, thus it would not fit His nature to allow the wicked to live forever with the righteous. More than that, those of us who know God do not want to be forever associated with those who hate God. Death is not a cure all, for it does not make wicked men righteous, nor does it cause them to suddenly love God. When men die in their sins, there has to be a punishment for those sins, or else God would not be just. Yes, we all have sinned, but Jesus took the justice of God for our sins, thus those who receive Him are forgiven for their sins.

our verse. First, we see the fearful, and this seems to mean those who are afraid to trust God; they are afraid that God will not really forgive them if they ask Him to do so. Then we have the unbelieving, which are the people who just cannot seem to believe that God is Who He says He is, and that He will do what He says He will do. They also have trouble believing the record that God the Father has given of His Son in the Bible. They believe those who have written world history,

but they cannot believe that God could inspire men to write the story of God's love, power and forgiveness. Next we see the abominable, and this means those who do acts that are hated in the eyes of God. There are people who seem to have no concern about what God thinks about their sins, so they continue committing them. They often delight in doing what God has forbidden. The word "abomination" means: a thing that God hates, and He hates all sins.

Then we have murderers mentioned, and the Bible says that they will be judged. The interesting thing is that any of these people could have been forgiven, but they were too stubborn to believe God. Murderers will not get away from God's justice, if they never repent.

Our list goes on to mention whoremongers, or those who commit sexual sins, sorcerers, and this means those involved in witchcraft etc. While some people think that the matter of seeking to contact the dead, or the matter of holding séances, is innocent, God says it is not. We are seeing a growing interest in witchcraft etc. in our day, but it all falls under the judgment of God. Those who worship idols are the people who make

something else their god other than the God of the Bible, so they will be judged. Liars are often thought to be faithful, innocent, especially when there seems to be a good reason to lie, but God never receives Jesus who is cast into the lake of fire. Notice that all of these have their "part" or destiny and judgment in the lake of fire, which is called the second death. Death means: separation so these will be forever separated from God and all that is good. The good news is that there is time to repent and believe in Christ to escape this awful place.

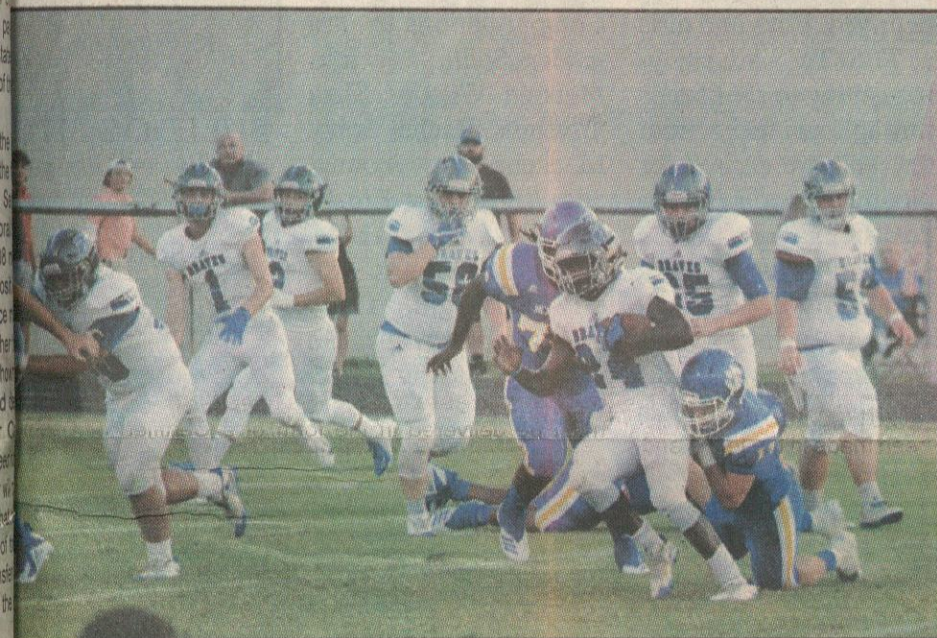

Shiloh National Military Park and Visit Corinth to Present Live Music at the Corinth Civil War Interpretive Center

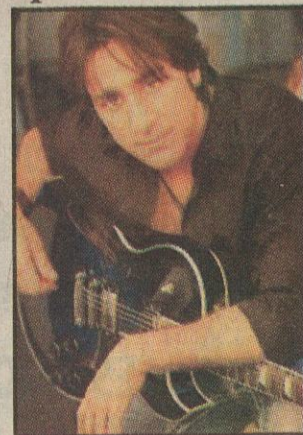

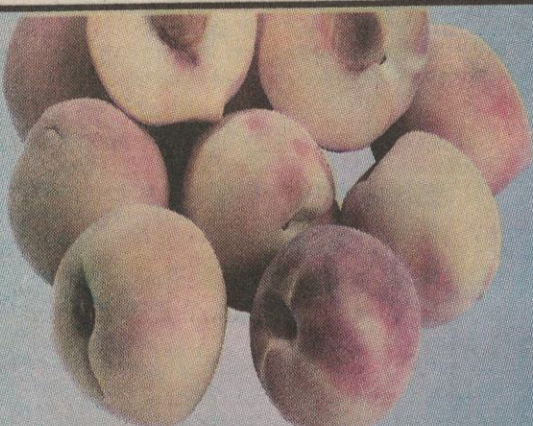

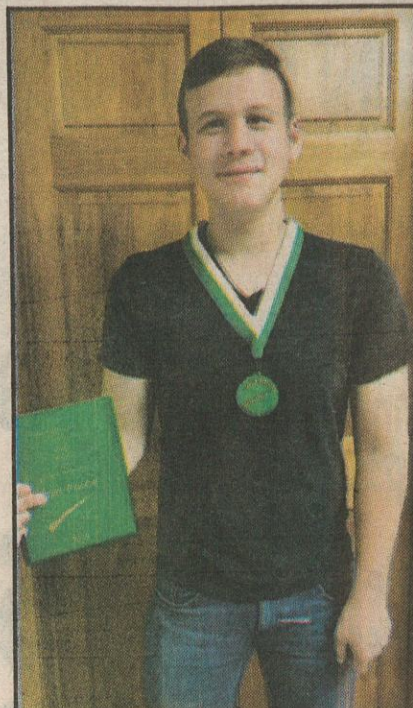

Signs Returned to Shiloh Park

SHILOH, Tennessee – On the morning of August 23, 2018, three location identification signs that were taken from Shiloh National Military Park were returned. As previously reported, the signs identify the locations of the "Bloody Pond," "Pittsburg Landing," and the "Larkin Bell Field."

Around 9:00 a.m., a male juvenile and his parents came into the park visitor center and returned the signs. The young man admitted to having taken the signs as a prank, but then realized how serious his actions were. When he told his parents, they all came to the park to return the signs and to admit to what had happened.

"After talking with this family, it was clear that the young man was truly remorseful for his actions and wanted to atone for his behavior," said Superintendent Dale Wilkerson. "We made it clear to him that this kind of behavior is unacceptable, but also acknowledged that his desire to admit his wrong and try to right the mistake was the right thing to do. In light of his repentance, and in support of his family, the park will not press charges but will accept the community service hours from the young man."

Shiloh National Military Park was established in 1894 to preserve the scene of the first major battle in the Western theater of the Civil War. The two-day battle, April 4 and 5, 1862, involved about 65,000 Union and 44,000 Confederate troops. This battle resulted in 23,000 killed, wounded, and missing. The decisive victory enabled the United States forces to advance and secure control of the strategic Confederate railroad junction at Corinth, Mississippi, on May 30, 1862.

The mission of the National Park Service is to preserve and protect natural and cultural resources and values of the national park system for the enjoyment, education, and inspiration of this and future generations.
