

One Vehicle Accident Claims he Life of Picayune Man

A fatal one vehicle accident curred in Tishomingo County North Cross Roads on Coun-Road 333, Sunday, September d at 12:50 a.m. Tishomingo ounty Coroner, Mac Wilemon ported that Mark Christopher nith, 45, of Picayune, MS, was onounced dead at the scene the crash from the traumatic uries he received during the eck. A second occupant of the

vehicle, David Wayne Johnson Jr. of Corinth initially walked away from the accident but was later airlifted because of his injuries. It is unclear at this time who was driving the vehicle.

It was reported that the two men were returning from Tennessee and in the course of the trip they apparently missed the turn of the road and crashed into the woods at a presumably

high rate of speed. With the help of a witness the vehicle, an '04 Acura, was located a fair distance into trees. It was upside down and facing the opposite direction from which the men were originally traveling.

David Wayne Johnson Jr. works in the roofing business in Corinth; he is expected to recover from this accident.



Is There A Path To End The Autism Epidemic?

New published science and the screening of at-risk children before they receive any vaccines may provide a middle ground between the "all or nothing" positions of the two warring sides of the vaccine-autism debate, according to one of the leading critics of the government's current vaccination program.

On one side of the debate are parents who believe that today's high number of manvaccinations datory (children in the 1960s received three vaccinations, today's children receive 38) can cause autism in vulnerable children. On the other side are government health officials who deny any a link.

However, critics claim the government is being influenced by pharmaceutical companies whose revenues from vaccines exploded from \$170 million in the early 1980s to more than \$60 billion today. A study published in 2013 in the European Journal of Clinical Investigation concluded that the pharmaceuticalindustry "masterfully influences evidence base production" and also "exerts direct influences on professional decisions and health consumers."

"There is a wealth of relevant scientific studies that prove that prevalence autism skyrocketed United States," says J.B. Handley, the father of a child with autism and author of the book How To End The Autism Epidemic(https:// www.chelseagreen. com/product/howto-end-the-autism-epidemic/.)

"And since 2004 there have been 11 groundbreaking discoveries in separate but related scientific fields that, taken together, reveal one of the causes of autism."

Handley says those discoveries, published in peer-reviewed journals, include the work of such respected researchers as Dr. Carlos Pardo-Villamizar, a neurologist at Johns Hopkins; Dr. Christopher Exley, a professor of bioinorganic chemistry at Keele University in England, and the late Dr. Paul Patterson, a professor of biological sciences at the California Institute of Technology.

"Because of this new, published science," Handley says, "we now know that autism is created by activation immune events in the brain during critical phases of development, typically by the time a child is 36-months-old, and that these immune activation events in the brain can be triggered by the aluminum adjuvant in vaccines. While the first of these discoveries occurred in

2004, the critical miss- if a booster shot is reing pieces have only fallen into place since 2010."

All the while, the autism rate has exploded. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention noted that the rates for autism in children went from 1 in 150 children in 2000 to 1 in 36 children in

Handley says returning to the vaccine schedule used in the mid-1980s provides a moderate solution. He also believes that there should be thorough screening before any vaccines are given to determine which children are at-risk from serious vaccine injury.

"We have the capacity to systematically assess the children who are more vulnerable before they receive a vaccine," Handley says. "These children are at risk and it is the duty of our public health program to protect them."

Handley believes these are some of the steps that should be taken:

Removing vaccine safety from the Centers for Disease Control. Having the same agency that is in charge of promoting vaccinations also in charge of vaccine safety is an inherent conflict, he says.

Screening vulnerable children should implemented immediately.Some vulnerabilities are because of genetics, parental health histories of autoimmunity, and other children have problems that are apparent with a physical exam. Children who may have adverse reactions to vaccines also frequently have such conditions as ear infections. dark circles under

the eyes and eczema. Test children before giving booster shots. Booster shots are provided for most vaccines. Handley believes many of these shots are unnecessary, as immunity has already been accomplished through the initial vaccine. A simple blood test would reveal

ally necessary, he says. Establish clear rules when a child should not receive child vaccinations.A should not be vaccinated when the child is sick, has eczema, is taking antibiotics, and several other conditions.

"I'm not against all vaccinations all the time," Handley says. "But more screening to spare at-risk infants would be a positive step in the right direction, and it's something that could be achieved today. Based on his health history, my son with autism never should have been vaccinated."

He is an honors graduate of Stanford University and lives in Portland, Oregon, with his wife, Lisa, and their three children.







photo This was found among my family photos. It is very special to me as it shows my dad, Johnny Biggs, in the center front row holding a baseball bat in front of Central School. He lived just down the hill from the school and two of his sisters and one brother all taught at some time at Central. "Old Central" was very special to him and I love sharing this photo with all those who attended the school over

The school, located about four miles from Iuka, was founded in the spring of 1927 when qualified electors and patrons of the Helton, Patrick and Harmony school districts took on the issue of consolidation of the three schools with provisions for other neighboring schools to come in later if they desired. Land was acquired from the Ayer and Lord Tie Company just off Highway 25. Three trustees, one from each of the school districts, were appointed, M. E. Hudson, Charlie Grisham and E. F. Parnell. The Ross Bassett Construction of Alcorn County was hired to erect the building which was ready for use by the latter part of October 1927.

The above photo was taken in the early 1940's. The school usually had around 150 students in attendance and George Strickland (shown at right) was the Principal. Identifying the students was

attempted by Mary Biggs and V. W. Grisham, but it was impossible to recognize all the faces. Front row, from left: J. W. Whitfield, unknown, Joe Bonds, Roy Neil Adams, unknown, Buster Morgan, Eugene Miller, known, Johnny Biggs, V. W. Grisham, Vernon Carson, Jim Ed Yarber, Edsel Bullard, and Durell Miller. On the next row is Sam Dean, unknown 2, then Wilbern Akers, behind V.W. is Jim Kirk, J. T. Skinner

and Billy Akers. To the left with a bow in her hair, is Noleve Bugg and Virginia Carson. Carl Bonds is the taller boy on the third row.
