## Local Businessman Harold Lomenick to be Inducted into the Northeast Mississippi Community College Alumni Hall of Fame

-Business man and Brigadier General in the Mississippi National Guard, Harold E. Lomenick of Iuka, is the newest inductee into the Northeast Mississippi Community College Alumni Hall of Fame.

Induction is set to take place at the annual Homecoming Alumni & Sports Hall of Fame ceremony Thursday, October 4 at 4 p.m. Recognitions will also be made during pre-game activities prior to the Homecoming football game later that evening when the Tigers take on Mississippi Delta. Kick-off is set for 7 p.m.

Established in 2013, the Alumni Hall of Fame's purpose is to recognize the achievement of an outstanding Northeast alumnus who has excelled personally and professionally, making a continued and significant difference in their community on a local, state, national, or international level.

To be considered for induction, a nominee must be an alumnus (any person that has a verifiable academic transcript

with the college) of Northeast Mississippi Junior/Community College, distinguished in his or her profession and have demonstrated a high level of integrity in his/her personal life, as well as have gained the recognition of various other persons around. Accomplishments to be recognized may be achieved through the nominee's career, service, or volunteer efforts.

Preference is given to nominees who demonstrated continuing interest in and support of Northeast through contribution of time, talent, or resources.

The award is presented to the alumnus who has demonstrated outstanding traits of leadership and character to such an extent that it has brought great credit to the recipient and to the alma mater.

After attending Northeast where he was a member of the football team (1968-1969), Lomenick graduated from Mississippi State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education in 1972 and followed that by earning a Master of Science degree in education from MSU in 1976.

## Off-Duty State Trooper Killed in Hatchie Bottom Sunday

On Sunday, September 30th at approximately 12:45 a.m. State Troopers and local law enforcement responded to Hatchie Bottom, near the Tippah County/Alcorn County line in response to a shooting. The gunshot victims were identified as Rickie Dale Vick, 38, of Michigan City, and off-duty Trooper, Kenneth Joshlin "Josh" Smith, 32, of Walnut. Trooper Smith was mortally wounded during this event and was pronounced dead at the scene. Vick was transported to a local hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

The suspect was identified as Troy Anthony Eaton, 43, of

Rienzi, MS. He surrendered to law enforcement authorities at approximately 5:30 a.m. a host of local, state, and federal authorities assisted with the search for Eaton.

Eaton was formally charged with one count of Capital Murder and one count of Attempted Murder in the Benton County Courthouse on Monday for the death of State Trooper Smith and the shooting of Rickie Vale. The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation has taken up the case and is looking into the matter thoroughly at this time.

The Mississippi Department of Public Safety released this statement in regards to the inci-

# Iuka Couple Arrested For Drugs and Theft

On September 25th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on Hwy. 25 in Iuka in correlation with the ongoing complaints of theft in that immediate area. During the traffic stop the driver of the vehicle, Richard Hammett fled on foot and ran into a house that the deputies discovered was his residence. Hammett was found hiding in the bathroom of his residence. A female passenger, Antonette Hodel, was also detained. While the deputies were in the residence, several bags of alleged methamphetamine were found as well as some items that had been reported as stolen. Both Richard Hammett and Antonette Hodel were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

After further investigation it came to light that Hammett had a Mississippi Department of Corrections arrest warrant in place for not reporting to his probation officer in Desoto County. Investigators also learned where some of the items were stolen from. For one of the victims of the theft, officers were able to recover approximately 80% of the stolen items. These items consisted of assorted steel parts, assorted machines, antique farm items, and

cylinders. The total approximate value of the items recovered is \$9,600.

Antonette Hodel, 40-year-old, white female of 1995 Hwy. 25 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Hodel's bond was set by the Justice Court at \$2,500.

Richard Hammett, 30-year-old, white male also of 1995 Hwy. 25 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and grand larceny. Hammett is currently in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting bond to be set. The Mississippi Department of Corrections has placed a "hold" on Hammett; he is also wanted in Tennessee for theft charges and also has warrants for his arrest in Desoto County and the City of Corinth.

# LOCAL Traffic Stop Leads to the Felony Arrest of an Alabama Woman

On September 30th Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputies conducted a traffic stop on CR 116 in the Tishomingo area for Careless Driving.

Once the deputy informed dispatch of the driver's information the records indicated that the driver, Jordan Michelle Pounders had some outstanding warrants in Tishomingo County. She was also listed as a wanted individual in Colbert County, Alabama.

During the course of the arrest the deputy found a plastic container which contained alleged methamphetamine. The driver was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Pounders also had a Tishomingo County Justice Warrant served for Failure to Appear (all drug related charges), and also a Circuit Court arrest warrant from Colbert County, Alabama. Pounders' remains in custody of the Tishomingo County Jail, awaiting a bond to be set by the Justice Court.

# Iuka Man Charged With Multiple Felonies

On October 1, 2018, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies went to a residence on CR 192 in Iuka in reference to an earlier report of a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was stolen from a residence on CR 173 in Iuka and deputies located the vehicle, hidden behind a residence on CR 192.

Deputies questioned the occupants of the residence and some alleged methamphetamine was discovered on one of the occupants, Anthony Ralph Vescio. Vescio then attempted to destroy the evidence and did not succeed. Deputies then transported all the occupants of the residence to the Tishomingo County Jail. After

the investigation was completed, most of the individuals were released.

Anthony Ralph Vescio, 54-year-old, white male, of 206 CR 173 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with felony possession of controlled substance (methamphetamine), felony tampering with evidence, and felony taking of motor vehicle. Vescio's bond was set at \$50,000 by Justice Court. Vescio is also currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

# Insight to Eyesight

**Astigmatism**

# United Daughters of the Confederacy Met at Iuka Library

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone Chapter 94, met at the Iuka Public Library at 11 a.m. on September 17th. Those present were Jean Works, Gail Smith, Vickie Durham and Sharon Hairrell. Jean and Gail are future members waiting for application to be approved. We were saddened by the deaths of Eunell Handy and Mary Etta Ledbetter, they both will be missed. Our prayers are with their families.

We completed the D.C. rituals, singing "Dixie", and saluting of the flag and the meeting was declared open. Minutes of the May meeting and Treasure Report was read and approved. Old business was the four applications that are ready to be sent in. New business was Sharon Hairrell will resume the office of President/Sec. and Vickie Durham will be Treasurer, Registrar and Chaplin until new members are approved and willing to take an office. We also voted to put Vickie's name in the bank account and remove Eunell's (due to death). It is now time to start collecting our dues for 2018/2019. We passed out the schedule and topics for our program for this coming year.

Sharon Hairrell went over the "Correct Use Of the Confederate Flag, and How And When To Fly It, Display It And Revere It. She presented the program on Alcatraz, The Citadel.

Alcatraz, The Citadel From the very beginning of the Civil War, the government considered Fort Alcatraz to be one of the strongest and most formidable military fortifications in the entire United States. During the Civil War, the country's new position pitted brother against brother, turning former friends and allies to enemies. Fort Alcatraz became a political backdrop, illustrating how war and rumors called certain people's military allegiance into question.

Colonel Albert Sidney Johnston's role during the Civil War tells a compelling story about duty and loyalty during wartime. Johnston, born in Kentucky and raised in Texas, served in three different armies: the Texas Army, the United States Army and the Confederate States Army. Jefferson Davis, the President of the Confederate States, considered Johnston to be the finest military officer in the United States. By January 1861, while still a member of the Union Army, Johnston was rewarded with the appointment of Commander of the Department of the Pacific in California; one of many responsibilities included the protection of Fort Alcatraz.

Despite Johnston's military experience and leadership capabilities, his southern roots and association with Jefferson Davis undermined the public's faith in his commitment to defend the Golden Gate from a potential southern attack. Many San Francisco citi-

zens who questioned his loyalty spread rumors that local confederates had approached him to seek his help in attacking the city. However, while Col. Johnston served the Union Army, he did faithfully fulfill his duty to calm the threat of war locally and to protect San Francisco. Fearing an attack on Benicia Arsenal, he ordered the transfer of rifles and ammunition to Alcatraz for safekeeping.

While the Union Army was confident that Col. Johnston would not do anything dishonorable, they feared that he was still too vulnerable to potential Southern influence. In April 1861, Col. Johnston was relieved of his post. After returning to the South, Johnston accepted a commission as general in the Confederate Army and died at the Battle of Shiloh as one of the greatest heroes of the Confederacy.

The first threat to California's security occurred in March, 1863. The Union government learned that a group of Confederate sympathizers planned to arm a schooner, the *J.M. Chapman*, use it to capture a steamship which would raid commerce in the Pacific, and threaten to blockade the harbor and lay siege to the forts. However, the Confederates' plans were thwarted when their ship captain bragged about their scheme in a tavern. On the night the *Chapman* was to sail, the U.S. Navy seized the ship, arrested the crew and towed the *Chapman* to Alcatraz, where an inspection revealed cannons, ammunition, supplies, and fifteen hiding men. Out of pride for Alcatraz' grand fortifications, the Fort Alcatraz commander Captain Winder, who took Johnston place, authorized noted commercial photographers Bradley and Rufolson to take photos of the island in the summer of 1864. The photographers were very thorough, capturing fifty different views of the island...In order to offset the photographers' expenses, prints of the photographs were to be made into portfolios and sold to the public for \$200 a set.

However, the War Department in Washington, D.C. did not commend Winder for his initiative and pride in his post, but rather questioned Winder's motives because his father was an officer in the Confederate Army. The Secretary of War ordered all the prints and negatives to be confiscated as a threat to national security. Later, Captain Winder humbly requested a transfer to Point San Jose, a small defense post on the mainland, later renamed Fort Mason.

Besides dividing the nation, the Civil War sometimes divided families, especially in the border states of Maryland, Missouri and Kentucky. The family of Captain William A. Winder was one example, and their commitment to the Confederacy cast the pall of suspicion on the commander of Fort Alcatraz.

One local newspaper stated that while commanding Alcatraz, Captain Winder "was feeding the rebel prisoners held there on the fat of the land and off from silver plates." This printed exaggeration was a particularly charged assertion because his father, Brigadier General John H. Winder, was vilified in the North as the Confederate officer in charge of prisoner-of-war camps for Union Soldiers, camps notorious because of near-starvation rations and unhealthy conditions.

Two of Captain William Winder's half-brothers were also captains in staff positions for the Confederate Army, while his second cousin, Brigadier General Charles S. Winder died in combat at the head of the famous Stonewall Brigade, an elite unit once commanded by Stonewall Jackson himself!

As the Civil War lingered on and the Union seemed likely to win, the U.S. Army was willing to devote more resources to the Pacific Coast. The city erupted in great celebration, with citizens cheering in the streets and guns booming from many of the forts around the bay. Less than a week later, on April 15th, another telegraph came bringing less joyous news: this telegraph told the city of President Abraham Lincoln's assassination. This time the city descended into chaos. During the city's official mourning period, Alcatraz' batteries were given the honor of sending out a half-hourly cannon shot over the bay as a symbol of the nation's grief.

## 56th Anniversary of the Battle of Corinth This Weekend

Shiloh National Military Park will commemorate the 156th anniversary of the battle of Corinth by offering a Living History Weekend at the Corinth Civil War Interpretive Center, Saturday, October 6th, and Sunday, October 7th, 2018. "The living history programs presented by the 6th Missouri Infantry Regiment, Confederate States Army, will be conducted on the field where the battle was fought," announced Superintendent Dale Wilkerson. "Their devotion to ensuring the historical accuracy in all aspects of their impressions is rarely equaled."

The 6th Missouri Infantry Regiment was assigned to Confederate Major General Earl Van Dorn's Army of West Tennessee at the Battle of Corinth. Led by Col. Eugene Irwin, the grand orator Henry Clay, the 6th Missouri Infantry started the fight with 300 men and suffered 71% casualties; 31 killed, 130 wounded, and 53 miss-

ing. The regiment would see action throughout the Civil War at battles which included Iuka, Corinth, Port Gibson, Vicksburg, and Atlanta, until only a remnant was at their final surrender in May, 1865.

Living history programs will be presented by 15 members of the 6th Missouri Infantry Regiment on both Saturday and Sunday. Park Staff will also present several programs during the two-day event. A period camp will be open to the public and children can participate in period games as well as earn the Corinth Junior Ranger badge. # Scenes From The Last Chapter In The Bible (part 2)

We are getting closer to the end of this particular study, but we will begin a new one when this one is finished. Revelation 22:3 says about the New Jerusalem, as well as about all the new creation: "And there will be no more curse; but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it; and His servants shall serve Him." This short verse speaks volumes of information. First, there will finally be a place where the curse will be absent. Some may want to ask what is meant by the "curse". When Adam sinned, God put a curse on the earth, according to Genesis 3:17-19. Verse 17b says, "...cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat

of it all the days of thy life." The next verses say that thorns and thistles will be brought forth from the earth etc. There are those in our day who are preaching and teaching a "kingdom now" philosophy, but that teaching does not "hold water", for the earth is still under God's curse (which means: judgment); people are still getting sick and dying; the land still has to have weed killers to get rid of the weeds that hinder

good crop growth etc. It is a joke to suppose that the kingdom described in the Bible in Psalm 72, 89, 110; Isaiah 9:6-7; 35; 60-66 and various other places in the Bible either is, or can be, a reality before the King of kings sets His feet on the earth at the end of Armageddon. If this were true, there would be no need for an Armageddon, or a battle of Gog and Magog (see Revelation 19:11-19; 20:7-9 etc.). The only time when there will be no

more curse, or judgment, on the earth will be in the new creation described in Revelation chapters 21 and 22!

Luke 19:11-27 has a parable that Jesus gave of a Nobleman Who went away into a far country to receive for Himself a kingdom and to return to earth. When He returned, he called His servants together and gave reward to those who had faithfully served Him. This is a picture of Jesus, now in heaven awaiting the Father's command to come back to earth and institute the kingdom here, so we do not have a "kingdom now" in the sense that this parable shows it. God has always had a kingdom, but it has not yet been fully

realized on earth, with peace, full joy and no problems for the saved. Even the thousand year reign of Christ on earth will have some death and problems (Zechariah 14:5-21), but the eternal state will have none for God's people. Notice that Revelation 22:3 also says that the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the New Jerusalem, again showing the deity and equality of the Son with the Father. Then we see that God's servants will serve Him in the eternal state. For those who do not want to serve God now, I would suggest that they do no go to be with God eternally, for all who are there will serve God forever. Please understand that there is

more to eternity with God than singing, shouting and putting one's feet into the river of life, or eating from the tree of life. I am not denying any of these, but we will serve God forever yet this service will be a joy, for our "energy" will never be low; our desire will always be right, and the devil will not be there to hinder or tempt us etc. I am glad we will be serving, yet the Bible new specifically says what will be involved in our service. I cannot imagine eternity being composed of simply sitting around doing nothing!
