Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. Established in 2013, the Alumni Hall of Fame's purpose is to recognize the achievement of an outstanding Northeast alumnus who has excelled personally and professionally, making a continued and significant difference in their community on a local, state, national, or international level. Off-Duty State Trooper Killed in Hatchie Bottom Sunday

On Sunday, September 30th at approximately 12:45 a.m. State Troopers and local law enforcement responded to Hatchie Bottom, near the Tippah County/Alcorn County line in response to a shooting. The gunshot victims were identified as Rickie Dale Vick, 38, of Michigan City, and off-duty Trooper, Kenneth Joshlin "Josh" Smith, 32, of Walnut. Trooper Smith was mortally wounded during this event and was pronounced dead at the scene. Vick was transported to a local hospital with non-life threatening injuries

The suspect was identified as Troy Anthony Eaton, 43, of

Rienzi, MS. He surrendered to law enforcement authorities at approximately 5:30 a.m. a host of local, state, and federal authorities assisted with the search for Eaton.

Eaton was formally charged with one count of Capital Murder and one count of Attempted Murder in the Benton County Courthouse on Monday for the death of State Trooper Smith and the shooting of Rickie Vale. The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation has taken up the case and is looking into the matter thoroughly at this time.

The Mississippi Department of Public Safety released this statement in regards to the inci-

Iuka Couple **Arrested For Drugs** and Theft

On September 25th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on Hwy. 25 in Iuka in correlation with the ongoing complaints of theft in that immediate area. During the traffic stop the driver of the vehicle, Richard Hammett fled on foot and ran into a house that the deputies discovered was his residence. Hammett was found hiding in the bathroom of his residence. A female passenger, Antonette Hodel, was also detained. While the deputies were in the residence, several bags of alleged methamphetamine were found as well as some items that had been reported as stolen. Both Richard Hammett and Antonette Hodel were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

After further investigation it came to light that Hammett had a Mississippi Department of Corrections arrest warrant in place for not reporting to his probation officer in Desoto County. Investigators also learned where some of the items were stolen from. For one of the victims of the theft, officers were able to recover approximately 80% of the stolen items. These items consisted of assorted steel parts, assorted machines, antique farm items, and

cylinders. The total approximant value of the items recovered is \$9,600. Antonette Hodel, 40-year-



On October 1, 2018, Tishomingo County Sheriff deputies went to a residence on CR 192 in Iuka in reference to an earlier report of a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was stolen from a residence on CR 173 in Iuka and deputies located the vehicle, hidden behind a residence on CR 192.

Deputies questioned the occupants of the residence and some alleged methamphetamine was discovered on one of the occupants, Anthony Ralph Vescio. Vescio then attempted to destroy the evidence and did not succeed. Deputies then transported all the occupants of the residence to the Tishomingo County Jail. After

Alcatraz, The Citadel From the very beginng of the Civil War, the overnment considered ort Alcatraz to be one of estrongest and most fornidable military fortificaions in the entire United ates. During the Civil r, the country's new ision pitted brother inst brother, turning mer friends and allies o enemies. Fort Alcabecame a political kdrop, illustrating how and rumors called cerpeople's military allence into question. Colonel Albert Sid-Johnston's role durthe Civil War tells a npelling story about y and loyalty during rtime. Johnston, born Kentucky and raised in as, served in three difent armies: the Texas my, the United States my and the Confeder-States Army. Jefferson wis, the President of Confederate States, sidered Johnston to be finest military officer the United States. By wary 1861, while still nember of the Union ny, Johnston was rerded with the appointnt of Commander of Department of the Pac in California; one of many responsibilities luded the protection of t Alcatraz. Despite Johnston's at military experience leadership capabilihis southern roots association with Jefon Davis undermined public's faith in his nmitment to defend Golden Gate from ntial southern attack. ny San Francisco citizens who questioned his loyalty spread rumors that local confederates had approached him to seek his help in attacking the city. However, while Col. Johnston served the Union Army, he did faithfully fulfill his duty to calm the threat of war locally and to protect San Francisco. Fearing an attack on Benicia Arsenal, he ordered the transfer of rifles and ammunition to Alcatraz for safekeeping.

While the Union Army was confident that Col. Johnston would not do anything dishonorable, they feared that he was still too vulnerable to potential Southern influence. In April 1861, Col. Johnston was relieved of his post. After returning to the South, Johnston accepted a commission as general in the Confederate Army and died at the Battle of Shiloh as one of the greatest heroes of the Confederacy.

The first threat to California»s security occurred in March, 1863. The Union government learned that a group of Confederate sympathizers planned to arm a schooner, the J.M. Chapman, use it to capture a steamship which would raid commerce in the Pacific, and threaten to blockade the harbor and lay siege to the forts. However, the Confederates' plans were thwarted when their ship captain bragged about their scheme in a tavern. On the night the Chapman was to sail, the U.S. Navy seized the ship, arrested the crew and towed the Chapman to Alcatraz, where an inspection revealed cannons, ammunition, supplies, and fifteen hiding men. Out of pride for Alcatraz' grand fortifications, the Fort Alcatraz commander Captain Winder, who took Johnston place, authorized noted commercial photographers Bradley and Rufolson to take photos of the island in the summer of 1864. The photographers were very

One local newspaper stated that while commanding Alcatraz, Captain Winder "was feeding the rebel prisoners held there on the fat of the land and off from silver plates." This printed exaggeration was a particularly charged assertion because his father, Brigadier General John H. Winder, was vilified in the North as the Confederate officer in charge of prisoner-of-war camps for Union Soldiers, camps notorious because of near-starvation rations and unhealthy conditions.

Two of Captain William Winder's half-brothers were also captains in staff positions for the Confederate Army, while his second cousin, Brigadier General Charles S. Winder died in combat at the head of the famous Stonewall Brigade, an elite unit once commanded by Stonewall Jackson himself!

As the Civil War lingered on and the Union seemed likely to win, the U.S. Army was willing to devote more resources to the Pacific Coast. The city erupted in great celebration, with citizens cheering in the streets and guns booming from many of the forts around the bay. Less than a week later, on April 15th, another telegraph came bringing less joyous news: this telegraph told the city of President Abraham Lincoln's assassination. This time the city descended into chaos. During the city's official mourning period, Alcatraz' batteries were given the honor of sending out a half-hourly cannon shot over the bay as a symbol of the nation's grief.

thorough, capturing fifty different views of the island...In order to offset the photographers' expenses, prints of the photographs were to be made into portfolios and sold to the public for \$200 a set.

However, the War Department in Washington, D.C. did not commend Winder for his initiative and pride in his post, but rather questioned Winder's motives because his father was an officer in the Confederate Army. The Secretary of War ordered all the prints and negatives to be confiscated as a threat to national security. Later, Captain Winder humbly requested a transfer to Point San Jose, a small defense post on the mainland, later renamed Fort Mason.

Besides dividing the nation, the Civil War sometimes divided families, especially in the border states of Maryland, Missouri and Kentucky. The family of Captain William A. Winder was one example, and their commitment to the Confederacy cast the pall of suspicion on the commander of Fort Alcatraz.
