Alderman John Reeder Kent, Sr.

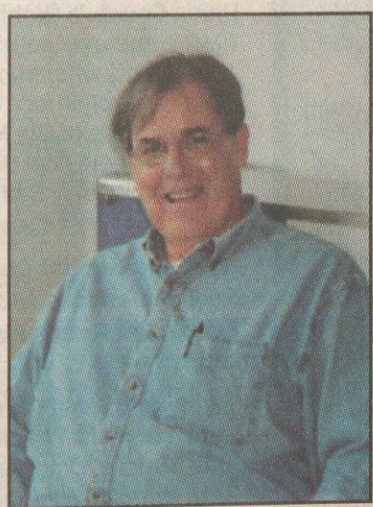
On October 2, 2018, John Reeder Kent, Sr., 72, left this world to enter the glorious presence of our Almighty Savior and Lord, Christ Jesus.

Electronic Filing System Active for Tishomingo County

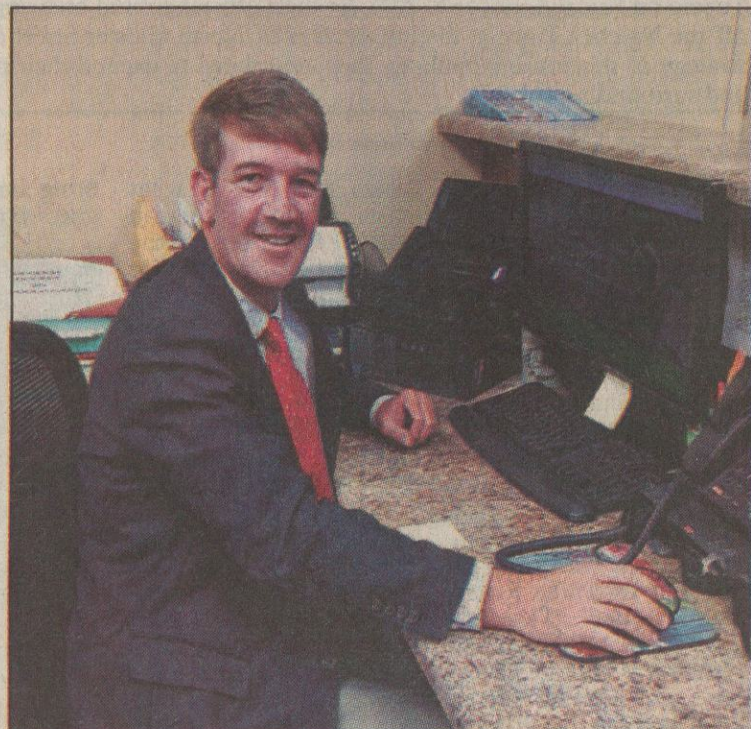
Electronic document recording services now available in Chancery Clerk offices within the Three Rivers PPD area

Three Rivers PDD, Mississippi State University and County Partners Complete the Final Element of the County Records Management System

Three Rivers Planning & Development District in conjunction with Mississippi State University's National Strategic Planning & Analysis Research Center (NSPARC) and technology partner Simplifile have completed the final element of the County Records Management System (CRMS) allowing eligible participants to electronically file deeds, marginal notations and similar documents with chancery clerks.

Electronic filing (E-File) is now fully operational for chancery clerk offices in Calhoun, Itawamba, Lee, Monroe, Pontotoc, Prentiss, Tishomingo and Union Counties.

CRMS is the computerized document filing system that the chancery clerks use to electronically file all land and court records that come into the county. It handles all land records such as deeds, deeds of trust, power of attorneys, etc., as well as court cases such as estates, probates and divorces on the chancery side, and civil and criminal cases on the circuit side. Boards of Supervisors minutes can also be recorded in the same manner on this system. These records are uploaded into the system and indexed so they can be searched in the record rooms at the county courthouse. This system also allows the records to be backed up by the county to an additional server in case of hardware failure and is also replicated to Three Rivers Data Center in Tupelo in case of a disaster. CRMS leverages open

source technologies that allows for conversion, support, training and maintenance at a fraction of the cost of applications built on proprietary technologies. Three Rivers and MSU have both made substantial investments in the CRMS project.

With the final electronic filing element in place, attorneys, banks, businesses and other eligible participants may file deeds and similar documents with the chancery clerk without having to physically appear at the courthouse. After creating an account with Simplifile, they upload their document to the Simplifile platform, which electronically transmits the uploaded documents to the appropriate clerk's office. The clerk inspects the document, accepts and records it, and Simplifile returns the recorded document to the sender. There is no additional cost to the clerk, and appropriate fees for filing are billed

to the sender through Simplifile, providing convenience and cost savings for all parties involved.

Three Rivers PDD Executive Director Vernon R. Kelley III, said, "Again, we have partnered with our counties and the experts at NSPARC to create a better way to file and preserve valuable legal documents. The electronic transfer of deeds and similar legal papers is the final element in a years-long process to revolutionize and streamline the county records management process."

Tested in Lee County, Chancery Clerk Bill Benson said, "We have nothing but praise for this system. It saves time and money for everyone involved. It allows the professionals requesting the filing to make better use of their time than coming to our office, and the electronic format allows us greater efficiency our

This makes recording documents much easier on financial institutions and would not have been possible without the support of the Prentiss County Board of Supervisors and the hard work of everyone at Three Rivers Planning and Development District. The CRMS system was built by Chancery and Circuit Clerks for Chancery and Circuit

Clerks and that is what makes it special. It can handle every aspect of the Chancery Clerks office unlike any other system in the state." "We were happy to assist in this electronic document recording project," said Domenico "Mimmo" Parisi, executive director of NSPARC at Mississippi State University. "This kind of e-government innovation that makes access to data and data technology is exactly what NSPARC does best. This was a great opportunity to streamline the submission of county records and

bring innovation to local government." "The court system requires the highest degree of transparency, and making court records available to the public reinforces that," he continued. "We made it possible for document submitters such as banks, attorneys and title companies to file documents electronically and remotely, eliminating the need to physically go to the county office. This will ultimately save time and money—two things every person wants from his government." "We are pleased to live in the digital era where government provides services that mimic the way their constituents conduct other transactions on a daily basis," said Paul

Clifford, president of Simplifile. "Today, these Mississippi counties join thousands of jurisdictions nationwide that have chosen to streamline the document recording process, and we look forward to seeing other Mississippi counties follow suit to reap the benefits electronic document recording provides."

Insight to Eyesight

Cataract A cataract is an opaque or cloudy area in the normally clear lens located in the eye. The size and location of the cataract will determine if or how much vision is affected. Usually cataracts develop in people over the age of 50 but are sometimes seen in children and result of injury. There are several types of cataracts, each caused by varying factors. Common symptoms of cataracts include: blurred or hazy vision, reduced color intensity, difficulty with glare, and decreased night vision. There is no treatment to slow the progression, and the gradual changes are not usually recognized. Cataract progression is accelerated by systemic disease, UV light exposure, smoking, and of course birthdays. Vision related cataract changes are treated with spectacle and contact lenses until surgical intervention is required. A comprehensive eye exam is required to identify the type and severity of cataract and what treatment options are available.

Nothing New Under the Sun

Readers of this column know that I believe there is nothing new under the sun. Times change. Faces change. Technology advances. But all the basic themes of humanity were established long ago. As King Solomon wrote in Ecclesiastes 1:9. "What has been will be again. What has been done will be done again. There is nothing new under the sun."

Regarding the Kavanaugh affair, we don't have to look far. Twenty-seven years ago, Anita Hill stunned the country with accusations of sexual harassment leveled at conservative U.S. Supreme Court nominee Clarence Thomas.

The Hill-Thomas timeline is almost an exact replica of the current situation. Hill was a college professor. The charges came during the last days of the confirmation process. The charges involved sexual harassment. There were no other witnesses other than Hill and Thomas.

Both Thomas and Hill were unswerving and convincing under oath. In both cases, conspiracy theorists claimed the charges were last-ditch fabrications by the left to prevent conservative from sitting in the nation's highest court. Hill passed a polygraph test. Thomas declined to take one.

According to National Public Radio, Anita Hill spoke with dignity, reciting the dignities she testified were visited upon her. Hill testified, "He talked about photographic materials depicting individuals in large penises or large breasts, involved various sex acts. On several occasions, Thomas depicted me graphically of his sexual prowess." She said he asked her out multiple occasions, despite her consistent refusals.

During the controversy, Thomas supported Hill as delusional or had been misled, leading her to seek revenge. Hill said she came forward out of a sense of patriotic obligation.

It was a classic "he said, she said" battle with other witnesses. One of them had to be lying.

In the end, Thomas was confirmed 52-48 – the closest vote in a century. Male voters rebelled, leading to what came to be known as "The Year of the Woman" in 1992. Elected were four new female – and Democratic – members of the Senate, including Dianne Feinstein of California, now ranking Democrat on Judiciary Committee. Thomas has sat on the Supreme Court ever since without further accusations of sexual harassment. He is considered one of the most conservative members of the court.

Hill returned to academia and became a tenured professor at Brandeis University. She went on to write three books about her experience. She has been a frequent commentator in the media on sexual harassment issues. She now heads the Commission on Sexual Harassment and Advancing Equality in the Workplace, headed by co-chair of the Nike Foundation, Dr. Freda Kapur Klein, and film President Kath-

leen Kennedy and talent attorney Nina Shaw.

Since then there have been several books written about the affair, some supporting Thomas, others Hill. The truth remains as elusive today as it was back then.

Watching the hearings, the whole spectacle seemed almost surreal and grotesque, as though the dirty laundry of our culture was exposed for all to see.

I am not surprised the hearings ended in a horrific brawl. The stakes are incredibly high. If Kavanaugh is appointed to the Supreme Court, the court will have a solid conservative majority for the first time in a century. It will change the very fabric of our government and country.

Politicians come and go, but our nation is run by a massive bureaucracy comprised of millions of federal employees, many protected in the jobs by civil service laws. The latest term for this is the Deep State. Kavanaugh is known most for his rulings in favor of weakening this massive apparatus.

Simultaneously, the Trump versus anti-Trump debate is at a crescendo. Midterm elections are weeks away. Time is of the essence. It is a battle for the heart and soul of the nation.

If one wants to look on the positive side, vicious Senate confirmation hearings beat the heck out of war and bloodshed as a way to decide the fate of our nation. We should count our blessings. Let's not forget the horror of the Civil War.

He said. She said. How can anyone resolve the truth? Alleged witnesses have no recollection of the party.

Perhaps one or both were too drunk to remember accurately. We've all witnessed young teens when they first encounter alcohol. Perhaps one or both are delusional. Serious mental illness infects 10 percent of our population. We all have the capacity for delusional recollections.

As I write this, there are hundreds, if not thousands, of men sitting in jail cells convicted of rape based almost exclusively on the testimony of the woman. The jury believed the woman. The man claimed it was consensual sex.

Likewise, there are also hundreds, if not thousands, of sexual predators roaming free, terrorizing innocent women, because they live in a system that tolerates such behavior. The jury believed the man. The woman said it was rape.

The Senate hearing reflects one of the great unresolvable problems plaguing our culture and our society today. There are no easy answers.

The Bible recounts the stories of men driven by lust to inflict damage and harm on innocent women. Thou shalt not commit adultery. There are also stories of deceitful, conniving women manipulating events to their own advantage. Thou shalt not bear false witness against your neighbor. Both sexes are human. Both mired in sin. There is nothing new under the sun.

So where do I stand? On the side of the time tested tenets of our court system. Innocent until proven guilty. Lynchings and witch trials were based on rumors. We don't need to revert to that.

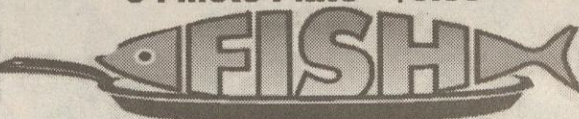

Heaven will be the one place where those who have been saved can see the face of God, meaning that we will see Him like He is and in His full glory. I John 3:2 says, "Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that when He shall appear, we shall be like Him; for we

shall see Him as He is." This verse clearly says that believers are sons of God in the present time, so it is not a matter of going through a judgment to see if we may become the sons of God, for we are already sons and daughters of God. Our verse also says that we have not yet seen what we shall be, so the "trips to heaven and back" seem fraudulent according to this verse. Notice that it is when "He shall appear", which means Jesus' coming, for the Father is

never shown to be coming back to earth. Notice also that we shall be like Him, or like Jesus, for we shall see Jesus as He is. Again, the "testimonies" that claim to have seen Jesus in our day do not match what is said here. (See I Peter 1:8 and I Timothy 6:14-16, which teach that we have not yet seen Jesus, nor can any man see Him now, as I Timothy 6:16 clearly says.)

Revelation 3:12 states: ".....I will write upon him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from My God: and I will write upon him My new name." Jesus says that we will be identified by these names, so the teaching in Revela-

tion 22:4 concerning the name of the Father in the foreheads of believers is also proven from these other references. The Braves were ahead 13-10 at halftime.

Corinth had several unanswered scores in the third quarter and finished with 52 points.

With the loss, Tishomingo County moves to 2-6 on the season. The Braves travel to New Albany this Friday for a division game against the 5-3 Bulldogs. New Albany won 38-35 in their recent league outing against Byhalia.

In Class 5A, Neshoba Central took top honors

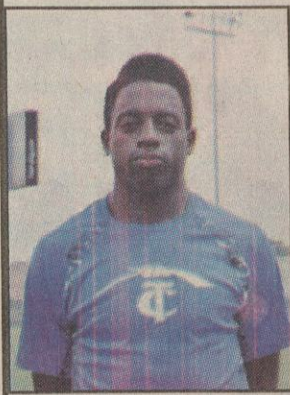
while Saltillo High School was second and Lafayette County High School was third.
