

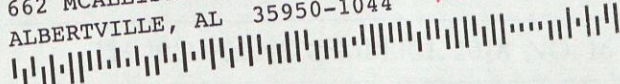

Local Teen Dies in One Car Accident

Andrew Dakota Balius, a 14 year old, 8th grader at Burnsville School died Friday, October 19th from injuries he sustained during a one vehicle automobile accident near his home on County Road 346 in the Goat Island area.

The accident occurred Friday morning around 8:25 a.m. when the weather was rainy and foggy. Balius was driving his grandmother's 2006, Chrysler 300 from his home to his grandmother's house which was half a mile down the road.

Balius lost control of the vehicle which then slid off the narrow slick road and hit a tree near the Goat Island boat ramp. A family friend was following behind Balius, when they pulled up to the scene of the accident they called the authorities.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mac Wilmon, Balius was taken from the scene of the accident to North Mississippi Medical Center in Iuka where he died from his injuries around 1 p.m. later that day.

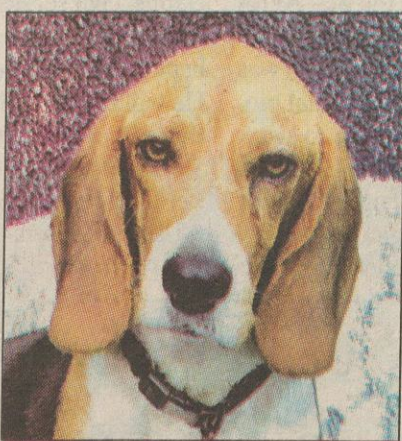

CIRCUIT CLERK'S OFFICE TO BE OPEN SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2018 8:00 A.M. - 12:00 P.M. FOR ABSENTEE VOTING

The Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's Office will be open on Saturday, November 3, 2018, 8 a.m. to 12:00 noon for absentee voting in the November 6, 2018 General Election. This will be the last day that a voter may come to the circuit clerk's office to vote an absentee ballot.

All absentee ballots that were mailed to tem-

porary or permanently disabled voters, students attending school out of county or state, a registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county, or a registered voter who is 65 years of age or older HAS to mail their completed absentee ballot back to our office. They cannot be hand delivered to us.

All mailed absentee

ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 5, 2018, from the postal service in order to be eligible to be counted for the November 6, 2018 General Election.

Daughters of the Confederacy Met at Iuka Library

The Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone met Oct 15th, 11 am at the Iuka Public Library. Those present were Vickie Durham and Sharon Hairrell.

We completed the DC rituals and the singing of "Dixie" and the meeting was declared open by President Sharon Hairrell. The minutes of the October meeting were read and approved and the treasure report was given by Treasurer Vickie Durham and it was approved. Vickie is now collecting the 2018-2019 dues.

The only business was to need to get four applications signed and sent in for approval. We just got these applications due to the death of Ms. Eunell 'Vickie' Durham presented the program from the Pens of Confederate Steel Magnolias" by Diarist Betty Herndon Maury (1835-1903) (1861 June 3-1863 February 18) written by Betty at Fredericksburg, containing detailed

comments on the progress of the Civil War, especially the local area, hardships suffered by Confederate soldiers, and military activities of Mrs. Maury's father, Matthew Fontaine Maury (including the attempt to capture the U.S.S. Pawnee), cousin, Dabney Herndon Maury (1822-1900), and other members of the Maury family.

The papers of diarist Betty Herndon Maury (1835-1903) contain a diary kept by her from June 3, 1861, to February 18, 1863. The volume diary was bound from one reel of film. Maury wrote the diary primarily in Fredericksburg, Virginia, it contains detailed comments on the progress of the American Civil War especially in the lo-

cal area; contributions by women to the Confederate war effort; hardships suffered by Confederate soldiers; and military activities of Betty Maury's father, naval officer and oceanographer Matthew Fontaine Maury (1806-1873), her cousin, Dabney Herndon Maury (1822-1900), and other members of the Maury family. Betty Maury also discusses the professional impact of the war on her husband (and second cousin), lawyer William A. Maury (1832-1918), the emotional impact of the conflict on her young daughter Nannie Belle Maury (1858-1939), and Maury's concerns about finding accommodations while a refugee in Fredericksburg and Richmond, Virginia. Maury's diary was donated to the Library of Congress in 1928 by her daughter, Alice Maury Parmelee (1863-1940), the child with whom Betty Maury was pregnant when the diary ends in February 1863.

Here is some copies of diaries pages for April 23 and 24, I am not sure if these are Betty Herndon Maury or another southern lady, but they explain the suffering of many.

April 23—A young man whom I have been attending is going to have his arm cut off. Poor fellow! I am doing all I can to cheer him. He says that he knows that he will die, as all who have had limbs amputated in this hospital has. It has been said that the reason is that none but the very worst cases are left here, and they are too far gone to survive the shock which the operation give the frame. The doctors seem to think that he enemy poisoned their musket balls, as the wounds inflame terribly. Our men do not seem to stand half so much as the Northerners.

Many of the doctors are quite despondent about it, and think that our men will not be able to endure the hardship of camp-life, and that we may have to succumb on account of it, but I trust that they are mistaken. None of the prisoners have died; this is a fact that can not be denied; but we have had very few of them in comparison with the number of our own men.

April 24—Mr. Isaac Fuquet, the young man who had his arm cut off, died today. He lived only a few hours after his amputation....it is reported that an engagement is going on at Monterey. A wounded man has just been brought in.

The amputating table for this ward is at the end of the hall, near the landing of the stairs. when an operation is to be performed, I keep away from it as possible. Today, just as they got through with Mr. Fuquet, I compelled to pass the place, and the sight I there beheld made me shudder and sick at heart. A stream of blood ran from the table into a tub in which was the arm. It has been taken off at the socket, and the hand, which but a short time before grasped the musket and battled for the right, was hanging over the edge of the tub, a lifeless thing...

LOCAL WAR VETERAN USED BY HYDE-SMITH FOR POLITICAL GAIN:

Local war veteran Mario Barnes used for political gain by Cindy Hyde-Smith's campaign and the Clarion-Ledger following his arrest last month in Tupelo.

The Hyde-Smith campaign pushed news of Mario Barnes's arrest into the news after a reported scuffle occurred in which the veteran defended his military service to our country in the armed forces, Barnes says.

Mario Barnes is a Tishomingo county businessman from Iuka and war veteran who is currently a member of the V.F.W. and has served as a Commander of American Legion Post #2002 of D'Iberville, MS and currently Vice Commander of Post #15 in Iuka. Mario was booked for allegedly punching a man who accused him of lying about his service in the Middle East.



A video of the aftermath shows police officers sided with Barnes, the war veteran, over the man who questioned his service. Cindy Hyde-Smith's campaign pushed that allegation to the Clarion-Ledger paper in order to smear a war veteran to help her political campaign. Ultimately, multiple news sources throughout the state aided in smearing the war veterans name. Cindy Hyde-Smith in effect sided with a man who questions our war veterans' service.

An article from *Big League Politics* on October 25th, 2018 Barnes explains "Her campaign's use of this incident for political purposes was personally injurious to me, and they even lied about my role with the McDaniel campaign, which had ended months prior, as was reported by the Tishomingo County Vidette,"

"Cindy Hyde-Smith is so desperate to win this election she smeared a Mississippi war veteran for political gain, and she worked together with the Democrat-run Clarion-Liar to do so," said Barnes.

This is not the first time the appointed Senator disrespected our Veterans, either. The Vietnam Traveling Wall Memorial made its way to Flora, MS on Saturday October 27th. Hyde-Smith was scheduled to appear at the Traveling Wall Memorial event to Honor Mississippi veterans and lay a wreath in memorial, however she was a no show sending someone in her place. Rather than honoring her commitment Cindy chose to make an appearance at a peanut festival in Aberdeen and a chamber of commerce event in Pontotoc.

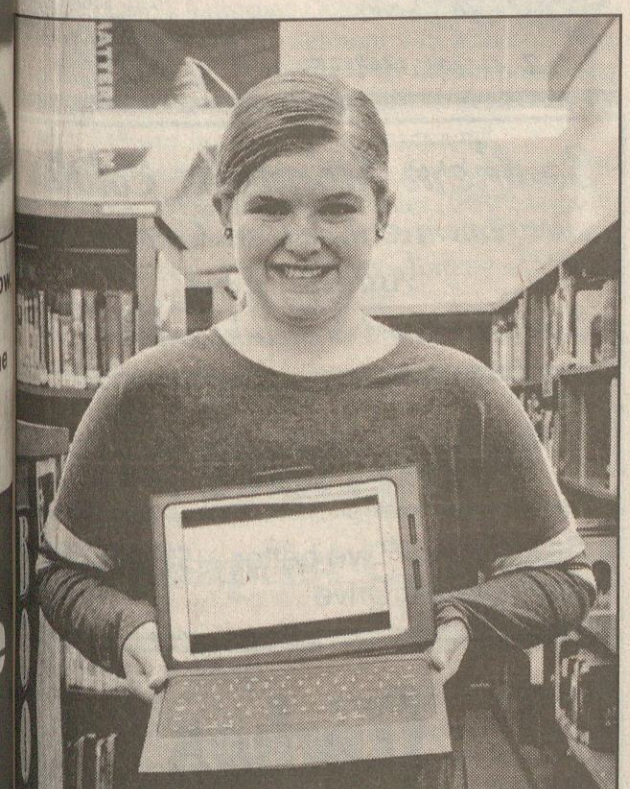

Tishomingo County won a Federal Opportunity Zone that may create jobs in the near future.

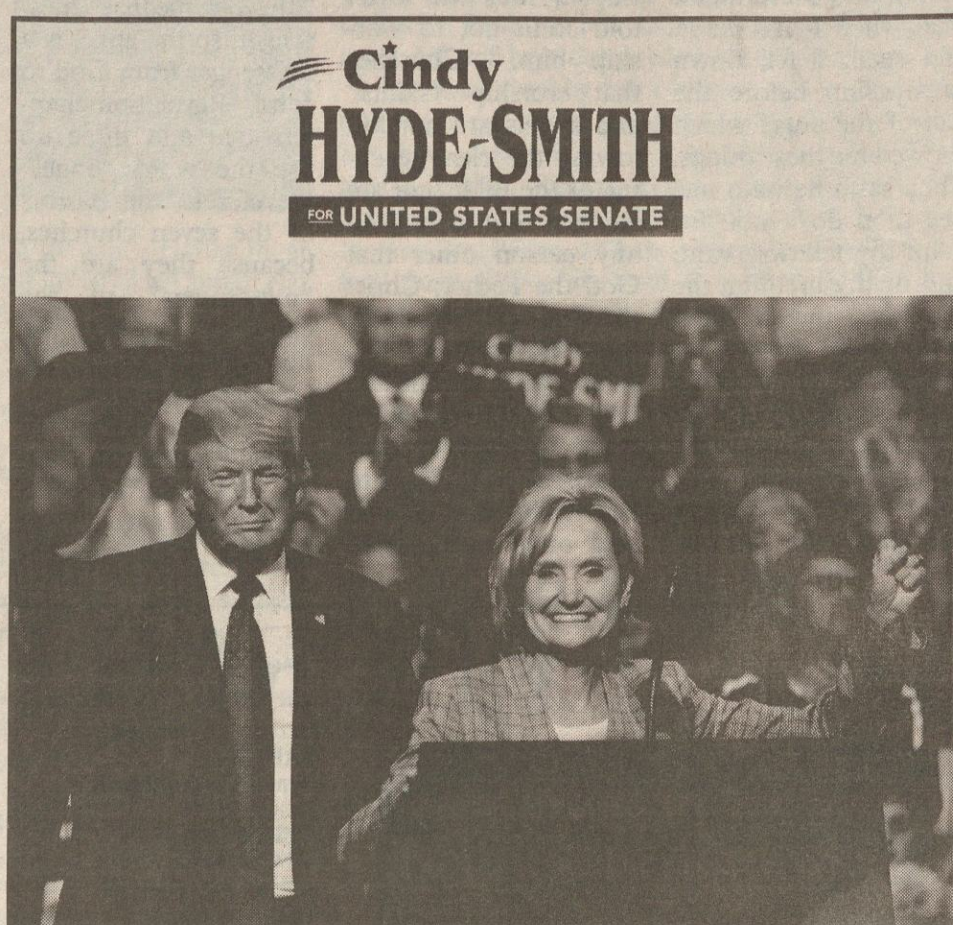

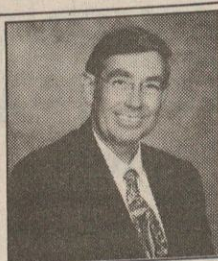
Scenes From The Last Chapter In The Bible (part VI)

It may seem that I am taking a lot of time on this last chapter, but I think it is worth the time that we spend in trying to understand this last chapter of the last book of the Bible. Revelation 22:8-9 says, "And I John saw these things, and heard them. And when I had heard and seen, I fell down to worship before the feet of the angel which showed me these things. Then saith he unto me, See thou do it not: for I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren the prophets, and of them which keep the sayings of this book: worship God." Notice that John both saw and heard the things that are recorded in Revelation, evidently meaning that he saw

a vision of them and heard the voice of the angel who related these things to him. It would be quite normal for one to revere an angel who had shown such things as John saw, but to worship angels is wrong, for only God is to be worshiped, thus the angel told John not to worship him. Churches that worship "saints" and angels are not following the clear teaching of the Bible, nor are we ever told to pray to any person other than God the Father; Christ the Son and the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 2:18). Many people mistakenly think that believers are going to become angels when they get to heaven, but that is never said or even indicated

in Scripture. The word "angel" means: messenger, so the angel is a messenger from God to John. Revelation chapters two and three do use the word "angel" to refer to the pastors of the seven churches, because they are the "messengers" to the churches, but they are not actually angels like Gabriel or Michael. When John fell down to worship the angel, he was forbidden to do so by the angel. Then the angel told John that

he was a fellowservant, meaning that he was serving God, just as John was serving God, although in a different capacity. Some suppose that this angel is a human being who had lived and died, because he said that he was a fellowservant, but that does not seem to be at all true, for angels serve God, yet are distinct from men. The angel said he was the servant of John, as well as the servant of John's brethren, the prophets, so the

angel had been serving God in different ages in helping men, as they served God. Now the angel told John clearly that he should worship God. Matthew 4:10 has the words of Jesus: "Then saith Jesus unto him, Get thee behind Me Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and Him only shalt thou serve." Jesus was not saying He was not God, rather that He was not going to worship Satan, for only God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) should be worshiped. The angel also told John that he was a servant to those who were keeping the saying of this book. Again I say that no one can keep the saying of a book that he does

not at least understand to some degree, that the Book of Revelation should be studied by all believers. It may, of course, be wise not to start young Christians in the Book of Revelation, until they have a good background in the other books of the New Testament. Since II Timothy 3:16 shows that all Scripture is inspired of God and is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction and instruction in righteousness, then the Book of Revelation is to be profitable for these things!
