

Run-off Election November 27th for Senator, Circuit Court Judge, and Chancery Court Judge

Fifty percent (6,000) of the registered voters in Tishomingo County went to the polls to cast their vote on Tuesday in the General Election. There will be three run offs on the ballot on November 27th, which will include the Senate Special Election race, Chancery Judge District 1 Place 1 race and the Circuit Judge District 1 Place 3

Tishomingo County voted 84% for the reelection of Republican incumbent senator Roger Wicker. In unofficial numbers, Wicker received over 58 percent of the votes.

In the un-offs, US Senate Special Election, Republican Senator Cindy Hyde-Smith and Democrat Mike Espy will face off on November 27th; in the Chancery Judge District 1 Place

1 seat, Brad Tennison and Lisa Ann Koon will face each other; and in the Circuit Court Judge District 1 Place 3 race, Sadie Gardner and Kelly Mims will also rally voters for their run-off.

In the US Representative race, Trent Kelly won with unofficial results at press time, with



Legal Blindness

Legal Blindness is defined as vision corrected 20/200, or a visual field of less than 20 degree There are numerous conditions and diseases can cause legal blindness. There are

The two classifications of legal blind are completely different. A person with correct vision only 20/200 can have adequate peripher vision that can enable them to function but ha difficulty with detailed tasks. A Highway for a Vietnam War Hero

CHEROKE

Saturday, No-2018 vember 17, beginning 11 Town of Cherokee will honone of its sons of the communi-Lt. Frankie Lee Wallace, recipient U.S. Army Silver the nation's second highest award to the Congressional Honor. The town's recognition of Lt. Wallace's devotion to duty and ultimate sacrifice resulting in the dedication of 18 miles of Highway 72 beginning at the Alabama and Mississippi borders will officially be dedicated as the "Lt. Frankie Lee Wallace Memorial Highway." All patriots are invited to attend this ceremony in downtown Cherokee where the program will promptly begin at 11 a.m.

Home for Wallace was Cherokee, where he lived and graduated from Cherokee High School, according to his first cousin, Curtis Wallace.

Lt. Wallace was awarded The Silver Star for gallantry in action where on 4 February 1966 he led a squad patrol on a routine search of several villages in the Republic of Vietnam. As his squad approached a village, they were suddenly engaged by small arms and automatic weapons fire by an estimated Viet Cong squad. Exposing himself to the deadly insurgent fire, Lt. Wallace led an assault was so aggressive that the Viet Cong were forced to withdraw. Lt. Wallace then led his patrol across an open rice paddy, skillfully executing fire and movement in pursuit of the enemy insurgent force. The Viet Congsquadjoined an estimated platoon size force who were well entrenched. Lt. Wallace directed effective artillery fire and air strikes on the hostile positions.

When the supporting fires lifted. Lt. Wallace led his squad in an assault and was met by intense automatic weapons and mortar fire which forced him to withdraw. In the withdrawal, one fire team leader fell wounded. Without hesitation, Lt. Wallace ran in to the open rice paddy to aid his wounded comrade and was wounded in the leg before he could reach him. Unmindful of his wound, Lt Wallace got up and continued toward the wounded man.

As he approached the stricken soldier, he killed two Viet Cong who were also attempting to reach the wounded man. Fully exposed to the intense Viet Cong fire concentrated on him, he aided the wounded soldier. Lt. Wallace was mortally wounded by hostile automatic weapons fire while assisting his wounded comrade to safety. Due to his courage, inspiring example, and his leadership, he was instrumental in saving the life of a fellow soldier and accounted for twentyseven Viet Cong killed. Lieutenant Wallace's unimpeachable valor in close combat against a numerically superior hostile force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, the United States Army, the Town of Cherokee and a grateful nation.

As I began this journey a few weeks ago to honor our soldiers on Veterans Day, I didn't have any idea how my emotions would be stirred by these many photos that were brought by the news office. Evervone who shared their loved one's photos had a story to tell and I just wish that every story could be written down and shared. We just wanted to honor the men and women who serve our country so

proudly today and those in the past. Thank you families for sharing your photos with us, the response was so much more than we had expected.

I grew up hearing stories of my uncles who served in World War II, not from my uncles, because they didn't discuss their service time with us kids. We didn't know they were the "greatest generation," they were just the uncles, dads and granddads we loved so much. I just wish I could go back and talk with them one more time and ask the questions that I never thought about asking when I was a kid. They were all just too busy getting along with life, not discussing their military time. I think they wanted to talk, especially when they got older, they just didn't think anyone wanted to hear their stories how wrong they were.

All my life my mother told me of her cousin, Bill Lomenick, who didn't

make it back from the War. She had the pictures of his funeral in her belongings and I thought it would be a fitting tribute to Bill and all the soldiers who never returned home to print the stories that ran in the Vidette when Bill's body did come home four vears after he was killed. In doing my research I found there were many from Tishomingo County who came home in flag draped coffins.

According to Ingrid

Singleton Rhodes, whose mother Dora was married to Bill Lomenick, when he was killed, her mother received a letter from the Army saying he was killed on October 2, 1944 at Bock, Germany. His body was interred at Lorraine American Cemetery at St. Avold some 23 miles east of Metz, France. During the World Wars the burial of service men was left up to the family, so Bill was brought back to Iuka in 1948 at Dora's request.

Mrs. Dora R. Lomenick received word Tuesday that the body of her husband will arrive in Iuka Friday at noon, aboard the Southern.

Accompanied by a military escort, the remains will be taken to the home of his mother, Mrs. J. H. Lomenick until time for the funeral, which will be held at Pleasant Hill Cemetery with Rev. L. P. Jumper of Corinth officiating. V.F.W. and the American Legion will be in charge of the military funeral.

Pvt. Lomenick was killed at Brock, Germany, Oct. 2, 1944, after going through Belgium, Luxembourg and Achken. He landed in England August 16

Oscar E. Curtin of Route, and son of Mrs. J. H. Lomenick, lost his life in 3, Iuka, was inducted in August 1943 and went Italy shortly after entering overseas in May, 1944.
