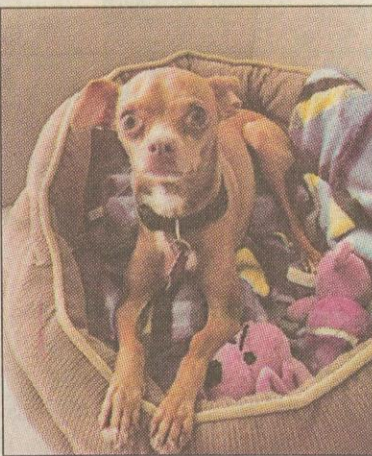

Pet Of The Week

Congratulations to Fred Benedict. This cute little guy is our Pet of the Week at Iuka Animal Clinic. Fred's owners are Kevin & Regina Benedict. Fred is a Min Pin/Chihuahua mix around 6 years old. He showed up at the Benedict's door in IL one Sunday morning in 2016, in about 20 degree weather. He weighed only 4 and one half pounds. They welcomed him into their home and nursed him back to health. The Benedict's have since moved to Iuka. He loves being a country dog and they love Tishomingo county. He has a little "attitude" now and then, but he is a good boy. Fred is a big part of the family and is loved

dearly. November is designated National Pet Diabetes Month as a way to raise awareness of the disorder, promote vigilance and early detection, and to help pet owners recognize the symptoms of diabetes in cats and dogs early. Diabetes is an endocrine disorder that impedes the body's ability to process sugars at the cellular level, and it can have damaging effects on the muscular, neurologic, and circulatory systems. As in humans, diabetes often goes undetected in pets until more serious symptoms manifest. The prognosis for pets with diabetes improves with early detection. Twice-yearly wellness exams for your cat or dog can help your veterinarian detect chronic illnesses early, but it's also important to recognize the most common symptoms of diabetes. These include excessive thirst (polydipsia) and excessive urination (polyuria), which may result in frequent "accidents" around the house or outside the litter pan. Increased hunger and food consumption accompanied by weight loss is another symptom of the disorder. Lethargy, cataracts (in dogs), and poor grooming or "oily" fur (in cats) are also common. Insight to Eyesight

Legal Blindness
Legal Blindness is defined as vision corrected to 20/200, or a visual field of less than 20 degrees. There are numerous conditions and diseases that can cause legal blindness. There are many misconceptions that many people believe they are legally blind without glasses or contact lenses. However, this does not meet the correct definition as stated. The two classifications of legal blindness are completely different. A person with corrected vision only 20/200 can have adequate peripheral vision that can enable them to function but have difficulty with detailed tasks. A field of vision less than 20 degrees will restrict a person's peripheral vision but allow them to perform detailed tasks. Those persons that suffer both definitions have difficulty with both detailed tasks and foreign environments.

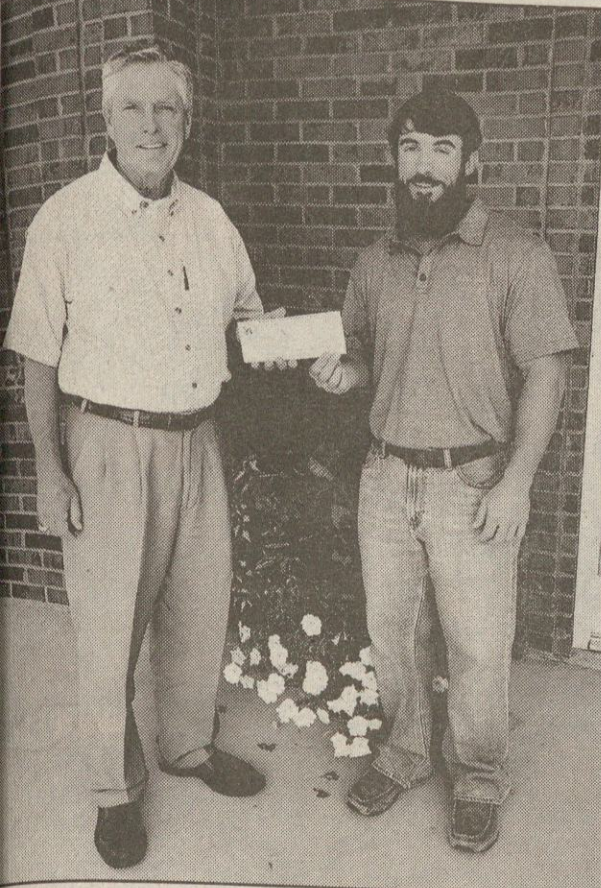

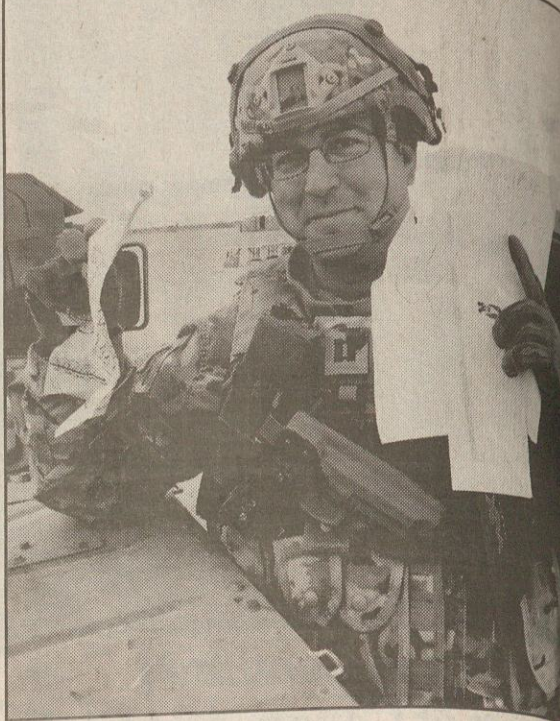

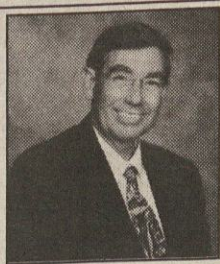
Scenes From The Last Chapter In The Bible (part VII)

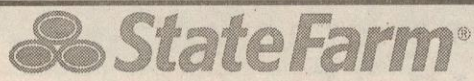

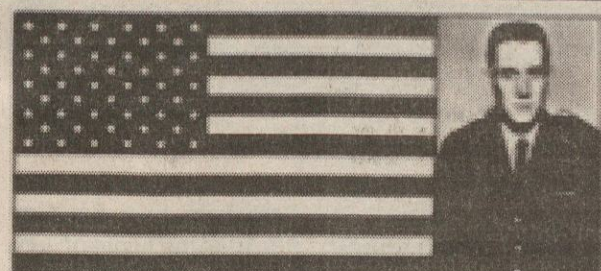

A Highway for a Vietnam War Hero

CHEROKEE-

On Saturday, November 17, 2018 beginning at 11 a.m. the Town of Cherokee will honor one of its sons of the community, Lt. Frankie Lee Wallace, recipient of the U.S. Army Silver Star, the nation's second highest award to the Congressional Medal of Honor. The town's recognition of Lt. Wallace's devotion to duty and ultimate sacrifice resulting in the dedication of 18 miles of Highway 72 beginning at the Alabama and Mississippi borders will officially be dedicated as the "Lt. Frankie Lee Wallace Memorial Highway." All patriots are invited to attend this ceremony in downtown Cherokee where the program will promptly begin at 11 a.m.

Home for Wallace was Cherokee, where he lived and graduated from Cherokee High School, according to his first cousin, Curtis Wallace.

Lt. Wallace was awarded The Silver Star for gallantry in action where on 4 February 1966 he led a squad patrol on a routine search of several villages in the Republic of Vietnam. As his squad approached a village, they were suddenly engaged by small arms and automatic weapons fire by an estimated Viet Cong squad. Exposing himself to the deadly insurgent fire, Lt. Wallace led an assault was so aggressive that the Viet Cong were forced to withdraw. Lt. Wallace then led his patrol across an open rice paddy, skillfully executing fire and movement in pursuit of the enemy insurgent force. The Viet Cong squad joined an estimated platoon size force who were well entrenched.

Lt. Wallace directed effective artillery fire and air strikes on the hostile positions.

When the supporting fires lifted, Lt. Wallace led his squad in an assault and was met by intense automatic weapons and mortar fire which forced him to withdraw. In the withdrawal, one fire team leader fell wounded. Without hesitation, Lt. Wallace ran in to the open rice paddy to aid his wounded comrade and was wounded in the leg before he could reach him. Unmindful of his wound, Lt. Wallace got up and continued toward the wounded man.

As he approached the stricken soldier, he killed two Viet Cong who were also attempting to reach the wounded man. Fully exposed to the intense Viet Cong fire concentrated on him, he aided the wounded soldier. Lt. Wallace was mortally wounded by hostile automatic weapons fire while assisting his wounded comrade to safety. Due to his courage, inspiring example, and his leadership, he was instrumental in saving the life of a fellow soldier and accounted for twenty-seven Viet Cong killed. Lieutenant Wallace's unimpeachable valor in close combat against a numerically superior hostile force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, the United States Army, the Town of Cherokee and a grateful nation.

Tayvius is a Warrior!!...only 3 practices out of football and he is playing at an extremely high level.

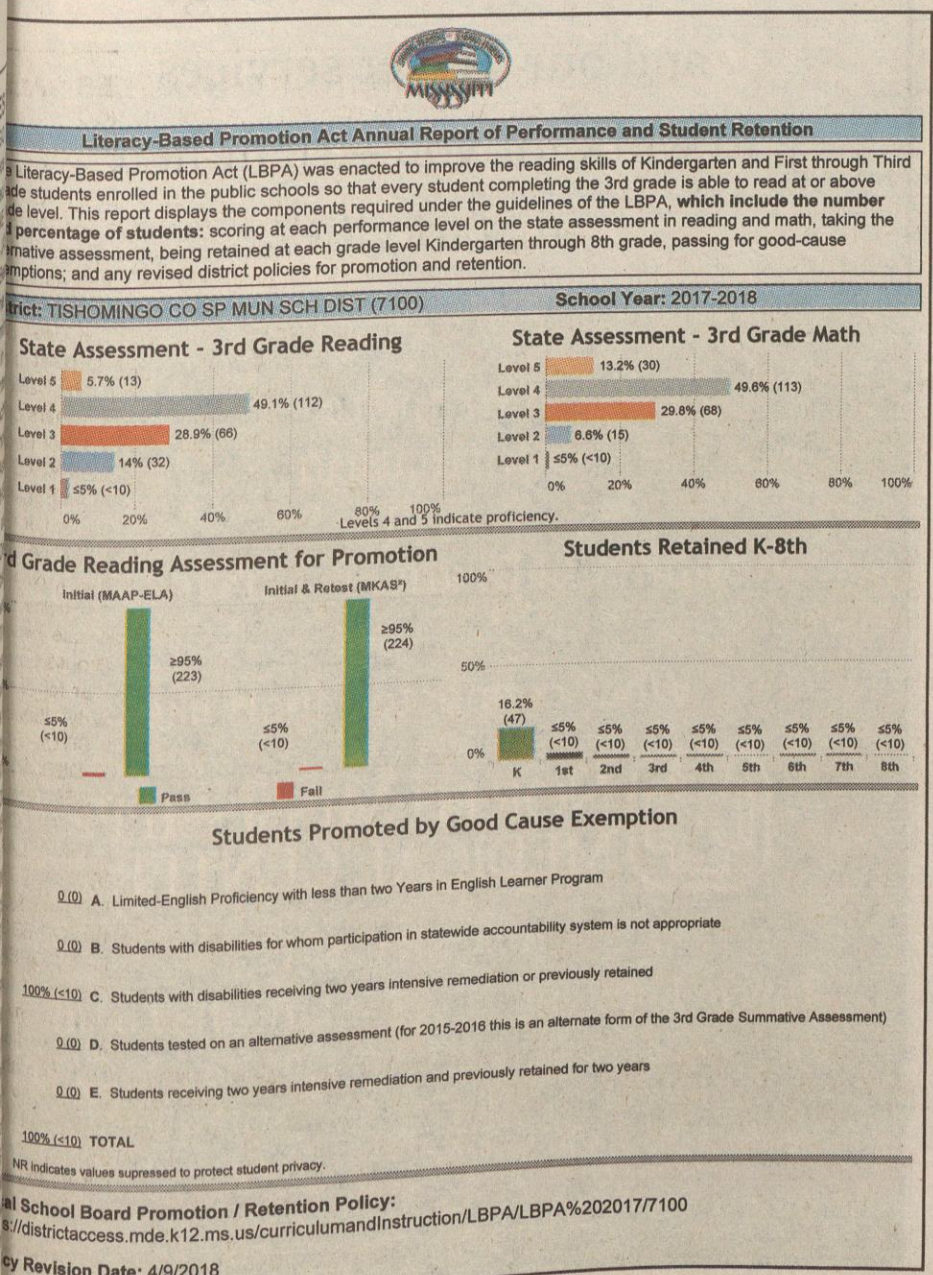

Spelling of Veterans Day

While the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements (spellings that are grammatically acceptable), the United States Department of Veterans Affairs website states that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling "because it is not a day that 'belongs' to veterans, it is a day for honoring all veterans.

NEVER FORGET WHAT OUR VETERANS DID FOR US!

As I began this journey a few weeks ago to honor our soldiers on Veterans Day, I didn't have any idea how my emotions would be stirred by these many photos that were brought by the news office. Everyone who shared their loved one's photos had a story to tell and I just wish that every story could be written down and shared. We just wanted to honor the men and women who serve our country so

proudly today and those in the past. Thank you families for sharing your photos with us, the response was so much more than we had expected.

I grew up hearing stories of my uncles who served in World War II, not from my uncles, because they didn't discuss their service time with us kids. We didn't know they were the "greatest generation," they were just the uncles, dads and granddads we loved so much. I just wish

I could go back and talk with them one more time and ask the questions that I never thought about asking when I was a kid. They were all just too busy getting along with life, not discussing their military time. I think they wanted to talk, especially when they got older, they just didn't think anyone wanted to hear their stories – how wrong they were.

All my life my mother told me of her cousin, Bill Lomenick, who didn't

make it back from the War. She had the pictures of his funeral in her belongings and I thought it would be a fitting tribute to Bill and all the soldiers who never returned home to print the stories that ran in the Vidette when Bill's body did come home four years after he was killed. In doing my research I found there were many from Tishomingo County who came home in flag draped coffins.

According to Ingrid

Singleton Rhodes, whose mother Dora was married to Bill Lomenick, when he was killed, her mother received a letter from the Army saying he was killed on October 2, 1944 at Bock, Germany. His body was interred at Lorraine American Cemetery at St. Avold some 23 miles east of Metz, France. During the World Wars the burial of service men was left up to the family, so Bill was brought back to Iuka in 1948 at Dora's request.

Five Local War Dead Returned From Europe

Date: July 15, 1948

Tishomingo County and families living near the county lines will pay delayed respect to the memory of five young men, whose bodies are among the 63, that have arrived in the United States, aboard the USAT Oglethorpe Victory.

Pft. Emmett W. Curtin, son of Mr. and Mrs.

Oscar E. Curtin of Route 3, Iuka, was inducted in August 1943 and went overseas in May, 1944. He was killed in France, Nov. 19, 1944. Burial will be in Snowdown Cemetery, with a full military funeral. Date of arrival of the body to Iuka has not yet been announced.

Pvt. William H. Lomenick, husband of Mrs. Dora Robinson Lomenick

and son of Mrs. J. H. Lomenick, lost his life in Italy shortly after entering active service there. Brother of Mrs. Ava Lou Hamilton, he was one of Iuka's most popular young men. Just before news of his death reached Iuka, the family saw young Bill in a movie news reel, in the Italian sector. Funeral services will be announced later.

T-4 Turner H. Williams, son of W. H. "Hub" Williams is also among the group who will be buried in the home town. (This is the father of Turner Gene Williams and he was buried at Pleasant Hill Cemetery near Iuka).

Pvt. Earnie E. Ballard, whose wife is Syble H. Ballard of magerum will be buried in Corinth.

Pfc. John M. Keeton,

whose wife is Annie G. Keeton of Red Bay, Ala. The body has been consigned to Deaton Funeral Home in Belmont.

Each of the bodies will be accompanied by a military escort to the home town, where families have made funeral arrangements.

The following articles were taken from pages of The Vidette in July 1948:

Services to be Held for W. H. Lomenick

Mrs. Dora R. Lomenick received word Tuesday that the body of her husband will arrive in Iuka Friday at noon, aboard the Southern.

Accompanied by a military escort, the remains will be taken to the home of his mother, Mrs. J. H. Lomenick until time for the funeral, which will be held at Pleasant Hill Cemetery with Rev. L. P. Jumper of Corinth officiating. V.F.W. and the American Legion will be in charge of the military funeral.

Pvt. Lomenick was killed at Brock, Germany, Oct. 2, 1944, after going through Belgium, Luxembourg and Achken. He landed in England August 16 of that year.

Services for Bill Lomenick at Pleasant Hill Sunday

The Stars and Stripes were lowered at half-mast for Pvt. Wm. H. (Bill) Lomenick in his home town as his remains, accompanied by a military escort, arrived from Memphis on Friday, July 23, on Train No. 36. His wife and son, also mother and family with approximately 300 friends, gathered at the station awaiting his arrival. Comrades of World War II served as pallbearers. Cutshall Undertakers in charge. He was carried out to the home of his mother, Mrs.

J. H. Lomenick, three miles south of Iuka, and kept until Sunday, July 23, at 2:35 p.m. when burial was in Pleasant Hill Cemetery, on the family lot, with full military honors, the V.F.W. and American Legion in charge, funeral services conducted by Rev. L. P. Jumper, assisted by Rev. W. C. Hamilton. Mrs. C. L. Woodley was in charge of selected music. A loud speaker was installed in the church, so that the many friends might hear the message.

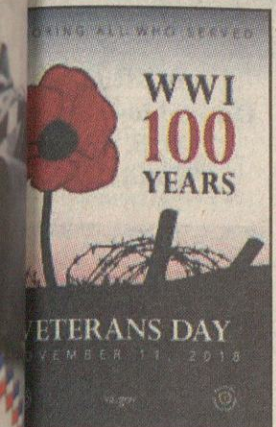
His wife, Mrs. Wm. H. Lomenick, was presented the flag that draped his casket, by the military escort and no lovelier and pathetic scene was witnessed than when his little four-year-old son, Wm. H. Jr. stood beside his fallen hero father's casket with his little hand on it just before it was lowered into Mother Earth and

the photographer, Mr. Demorse, clicked the camera.

It is estimated that approximately 2,500 people attended Pvt.

In the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 an armistice between Germany and the Allied nations came into effect. On November 11, 1919, Armistice Day was commemorated for the first time. In 1919, President Wilson proclaimed the day should be "filled with national pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and a gratitude for the victory." There were plans for parades, public meetings and a brief suspension of business activities at 11 a.m.

In 1926, the United States Congress officially recognized the end of World War I and declared the anniversary of the armistice should be commemorated with prayer and thanksgiving. The Congress also requested the president should issue a proclamation directing upon the officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on November 11 and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day at schools and churches, at other suitable places, and at appropriate ceremonies of friendly relations with all other peoples."

An Act (52 Stat. 351; U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) was approved on May 13, 1938, which made November 11 in each year a national holiday, known as Armistice Day. This day is originally intended to honor veterans of World War I. A few years later, World War II required the largest mobilization of service men in the history of the United States and the American forces fought in Korea. In 1954, the veterans service organizations urged Congress to change the word "Armistice" to "Veterans". Congress approved this change and on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor all American veterans, wherever and whenever they had served.

In 1968 the Uniformed Services of the Americas Holiday Bill (Public Law 90-363 (82 Stat. 250)) was passed. It made Armistice Day to the fourth Monday of October. The bill took effect in 1971. However, this caused a lot of confusion as many states disagreed with this decision and continued to hold Veterans Day activities on November 11. In 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed Public Law 94-97 (89 Stat. 479), which stated that Veterans Day would again be observed on November 11 from 1978 onwards. Veterans Day is still observed on November 11.
