The Holidays Arrive, Parades to Roll this Week

Make plans to attend the local Christmas Parades and other Christmas celebrations happening in Tishomingo County and the surrounding areas.

The Iuka Christmas Parade will take place on Friday, December 7th at 6:30 p.m. At press time on Wednesday, November 28th, it was announced that the Iuka Christmas Parade had been rescheduled for December 7 because of the threat

of rain.

The Tinsel and Trees Festival at the Old Courthouse Museum will also begin on December 7 with an Open House. Display and voting on the trees will begin next Tuesday, Dec. 4 daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The township of Tishomingo will hold their annual Christmas Parade on Saturday, December 1st at 6 p.m.

Cherokee Christmas Parade will be Saturday, December 1st

at 2 p.m.

Corinth Christmas Parade will be held Saturday, December 1st at 5 p.m.

Burnsville will host a Christmas Parade December 3rd at 6 p.m.

Rienzi will host a daytime parade on December 9th at 2 p.m.

"A Dickens Christmas" will be held on December 21st Downtown Iuka.

First Female Elected Senator from the State of Mississippi

Tennison and Mims will take up seats in our Local Court System.

A special run-off election was held Tuesday, November 27th across Mississippi to elect a candidate to the U.S. Senate given that neither candidate received a high enough percentage of the vote during the general election on November 6.

Cindy Hyde-Smith won the vote to become Mississippi's first woman elected to the U.S. Senate.

Tishomingo County also voted in the election concerning District 1, Chancery Court Judge, place 1, which was won by Brad Tennison and District 1, Circuit Court Judge, place 3, in which Kelly Mims received the majority of the vote.

At press time, in the Senate

race, Hyde-Smith, the Republican candidate received 474,471 votes statewide. Mike Espy, the Democratic candidate received 405,486 statewide. A further breakdown of the election results for Tishomingo County is provided here.

Gene and Beverly Jourdan to Lead Iuka Christmas Parade as Grand Marshals

Friday, December 7th is Iuka's official beginning of the Christmas season highlighted by the annual Christmas Parade. Beverly taught in the Iuka School System and retired in 1996 after 33 years of service. She was selected Teacher of the year during her tenure and served on the Committee for Southern Schools Accreditations. They have two children, Raymond



(Cindy) and Babs Jourdan Hall (Mike), four grandchildren, Barbara Jane Hall Ellenburg (Luke), John Hall, Mary Jourdan and Jay Jourdan and one great-grandchild Beverly Jane Ellenburg.

Both Gene and Beverly have always been very active in the community and consider it a great honor and privilege to be this year's Grand Marshals of the Iuka Christmas Parade.

Bubba Carpenter Chosen as Burnsville's Citizen of the Year

President Makes Stop in Tupelo to Campaign for Cindy Hyde-Smith, Republican Candidate for U. S.

President Donald Trump attended a rally for Cindy Hyde-Smith in Tupelo on Monday November 26th 2018. He made this stop and then continued on to Biloxi to campaign and attend a roundtable discussion about the First Step Act. This marks Trump's second visit to Mississippi since taking office as president.

Local photographer Jerry Charbauskis attended the campaign rally at the Tupelo regional airport and was able to take photographs like the one shown here.

Trump joins the ranks of other presidents who have made the journey to Mississippi while in office beginning with William McKinley in 1901. Many U.S. presidents have visited the Magnolia State, most often after times of disaster and in some cases to campaign. Some of the visits made to our state by other presidents are listed here.

In 1902 Theodore Roosevelt went on a hunting trip in Mississippi where he refused to shoot a bear in an unsportsmanlike manner. This story became wildly known and popularized the production of the stuffed animal which became known as the "Teddy Bear." Roosevelt later returned when he made a speech in Vicksburg in November of 1907.

William Howard Taft



made 3 trips to the state in 1909. He took a river tour in October from Vicksburg to Natchez. In November he visited Jackson and later in November made a speech at the Mississippi University for Women.

Woodrow Wilson spent Christmas in Pass Christian in 1913 at a home of a relative that would later go on to be known as "The Dixie White House."

Franklin D. Roosevelt delivered a speech in Tupelo in November of 1934 and visited the Mississippi Gulf Coast in 1937. He inspected the troops of Camp Shelby in September of 1942.

Richard Nixon came to the naval air station in Meridian in 1973 and delivered a speech in Jackson in 1974. He also made a trip to the Mississippi Coast in 1969 after Hurricane Camille.

Gerald R. Ford campaigned in Mississippi in 1976.

Ronald Reagan held a campaign rally in 1984 on the Mississippi Coast.

George H. W. Bush came to Meridian in 1991 and made a campaign stop in Gulfport in 1992 after the Republican National Convention; he also stopped at the Greenville Airport the same year.

Bill Clinton visited Clarksdale in July of 1999 attending a forum on economic development in the Delta.

George W. Bush visited the Mississippi Gulf Coast several times after Hurricane Katrina in 2005.

Barack Obama visited Gulfport in 2010 after the BP oil spill.

MDE Announces 3rd Annual "Celebration of Excellence" Tour to Recognized District Achievements

The Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) announced a schedule of visits to recognize the achievements of all "A" districts. District leaders and school board members will join Dr. Carey Wright, state superintendent of education, at each location to thank teachers and students for their hard work.

ementary School's Commons Building. Iuka Elementary also earned an "A" rating for its performance in 2017-2018.

"We look forward to celebrating this accomplishment with Dr. Wright and our communities on December 3rd at Iuka Elementary. It is definitely a celebration richly deserved due to the hard work of our students, teachers, administrators, board, and communities," stated superintendent Christine Holly.

Pet of the Week

Congratulations to Spot Parsons. This handsome fellow is our Pet of the Week at Iuka Animal Clinic. His owner is Earline Parsons. Spot is a 5 year old feist. He loves living in the country where he can chase the birds in the backyard. When Spot is finished with a good chase he comes inside to rest at Earline's feet. As the days grow colder, Spot loves to curl up on his blanket in front of the heater. He awakens every now and then to get a nice pat on the head for being such a loyal friend.

Dental health is a very important part of your pet's overall health, and dental problems can cause, or be caused by, other health problems. Your pet's teeth and gums should be checked at least once a year by your veterinarian to check for early signs of a problem and to keep your pet's mouth healthy. Early detection and treatment are critical, because advanced periodontal disease can cause severe problems and pain for your pet. Mac McAnally Concert Airs Dec. 3 and Dec. 7 on MPB Television to Benefit Extra Table, MPB

JACKSON, Miss. – Mississippi songwriter and Belmont native, Mac McAnally in concert at 8:30 p.m. Monday, Dec. 3 on Mississippi Public Broadcasting Television in a program to benefit MPB and Extra Table, a Mississippi-based non-profit dedicated to feeding the hungry.

The encore presentation of "Mac McAnally in Concert with Festival South Orchestra" is set for 7:30 p.m. Friday, Dec. 7. Fellow members of Jimmy Buffett's Coral Reefer Band will also perform. The special will air during pledge programming on MPB Television.

"Extra Table, which is doing amazing work feeding the neediest Mississippians, is worthy of our attention during the holidays," said MPB Executive Director Ronnie

Agnew. "Many people quietly suffer during the holidays because they don't have food to put on the table. Mac and Robert (St. John), who is the face of Extra Table, were generous to allow us to broadcast a previously recorded concert benefiting Extra Table performed at the University of Southern Mississippi."

St. John, a well-known Mississippi chef and restaurateur, actually founded Extra Table in 2009. The non-profit and its partners make a difference in the lives of Mississippians by fundraising in order to stock food pantries and soup kitchens across the state with wholesome, nutritious food delivered by Sysco.

The concert is one of several that came to fruition after St. John and McAnally hosted an event

in Jackson, Mississippi several years ago and their discussion turned to hunger in the state.

"When I explained Extra Table and its mission, Mac said, 'Robert, if there is anything I can ever do to help out with Extra Table, just let me know,'" St. John recalled. Eventually, the pitch was made to do a symphony concert in Hattiesburg with McAnally requesting the Coral Reefer Band join him. "Six concerts, and hundreds of shipments of healthy food later, Mac and I are glad to share this special night with our fellow Mississippians to help bring attention to this great need in the state we love," St. John said.

McAnally was recently named the 2018 Musician of the Year by the Country Music Association.

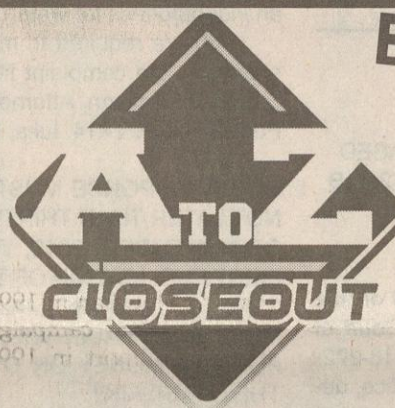

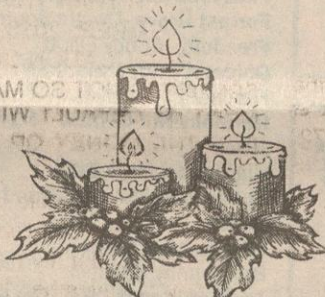

Scenes From The Last Chapter In The Bible (part 9)

I will give Revelation 22:12 again, because I did not give any comments on it: "I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the first and the last." Jesus spoke these words, so we are right in saying that Jesus said that He is the Alpha and Omega etc. The words "alpha" and "omega" are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. It is like our saying of Jesus: "He is everything from A to Z". This statement is made in the following places in Revelation: 1:8; 1:11; 21:8 & 22:13. The Old Testament gives the same idea in the words: "First and Last" in Isaiah 41:4; 44:6 & 48:12. Isaiah 44:6 says, "Thus saith the LORD the King of Israel, and his Redeemer the LORD of hosts; I am the first and I am the last; and beside Me there is no God." Isaiah 43: 11 says, "I, even I, am the LORD; and beside Me there is no Saviour."

These all use the word "LORD", which has the word "Jehovah" behind it in the Hebrew, so the LORD says that He is the first and the last, and that there is no God or Savior beside Him. He also said that He was Israel's King. Zechariah 9:9 says, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion, shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold thy King cometh unto thee: He is just and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass." Then Matthew 21:5 says, "Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and

sitting upon an ass, and a colt, the foal of an ass." These verses put together show without a doubt that Jesus is one with the Father and is God the Son; there is no other way for Jesus to be the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end and the first and the last, without being God! Isaiah 43:11 has the LORD saying that there is no Savior beside Him, but Titus 2:13 says, "Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ." If Jesus is the Savior, He has to be "the great God", along with the Father and the Holy Spirit!

Revelation 22:14 says, "Blessed are they that do His commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city." This verse causes some people to believe, and also teach, that people "go to heaven" because they obey God until the day they die. Please keep in mind that the Bible does teach that we should obey God, especially after we are saved, but it plainly teaches that we are not saved by our works. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." This is too clear to miss, for the verses say we are not saved by works, yet verse 10 shows where works come in: "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God has before

ordained that we should walk in them." Yes, God has ordained that all saved people should walk in good works. Titus 3:5 says, "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost." Have you ever looked much at the life of Lot, Abraham's nephew? Genesis chapter 19 gives his sordid story. To say the least, he was not a man of great faith or works, yet II Peter 2:6 tells of God's destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah, then verses 7-9 say: "And delivered just Lot, vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked. (For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, vexed his righteous soul from day to day with their unlawful deeds;)" The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of tempta-

tions, and to reserve the unjust unto the day of judgment to be punished." Would you think of Lot as a "just, righteous and godly man"? Likely we might not think of him in that way, but God did.

How are the saved to enter into the New Jerusalem by keeping God's commandments? The answer is that we are accounted as "commandment keepers" in Christ, although none of us have always kept God's commandments, even after salvation. Our righteousness is His righteousness put on our accounts. II Corinthians 5:21 says it well: "For He hath made Him to be sin for us, Who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him."

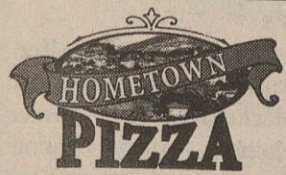

"This is the second year Shiloh National Cemetery has participated in the Wreaths Across America day," said Superintendent Dale Wilkerson. "The laying of wreaths on the graves of honored dead has been done since the time of Ancient Greece. The circular shape of the wreath represents eternity, for it has no beginning and no end, and the greenery represents everlasting life. Laying a wreath is an act of remembrance for someone's life and service, and it is our privilege to honor the soldiers buried here by participating in this event. We invite everyone to come and help place the wreaths."

Wreaths Across America, a non-profit 501-(c)(3) organization, was founded by Mr. Morrill Worcester of Harrington, Maine. When Mr. Worcester was 12 years old he visited Arlington National Cemetery, an experience he would never forget. Decades later, in 1992, his sent his company's surplus of 5,000 wreaths to be placed at Arlington, and he continued sending wreaths every year. In

2005, a photo of the stones at Arlington, adorned with wreaths and covered in snow, circulated around the internet. Suddenly, the project received national attention and thousands of requests poured in from all over the country from people wanting to help. Today the event has expanded to the placement of over 1.2 million wreaths in over 1,400 locations across the nation.

The event will begin at 11:00 a.m. with a short patriotic ceremony. Following the ceremony, everyone in attendance will be invited to come forward and assist with laying the wreaths on the graves. In case of rain, the ceremony will be held in the Visitor Center



auditorium.

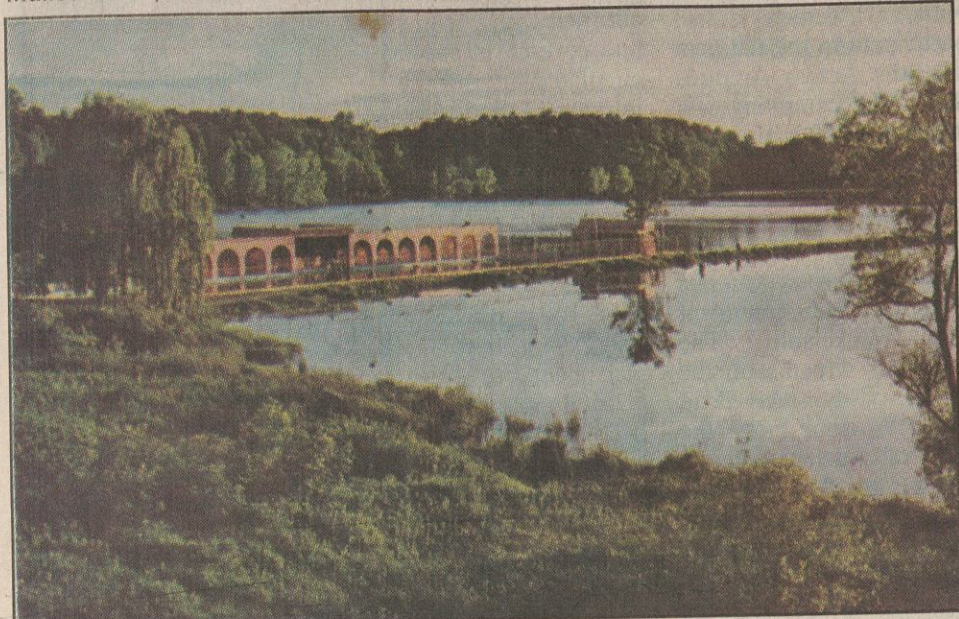

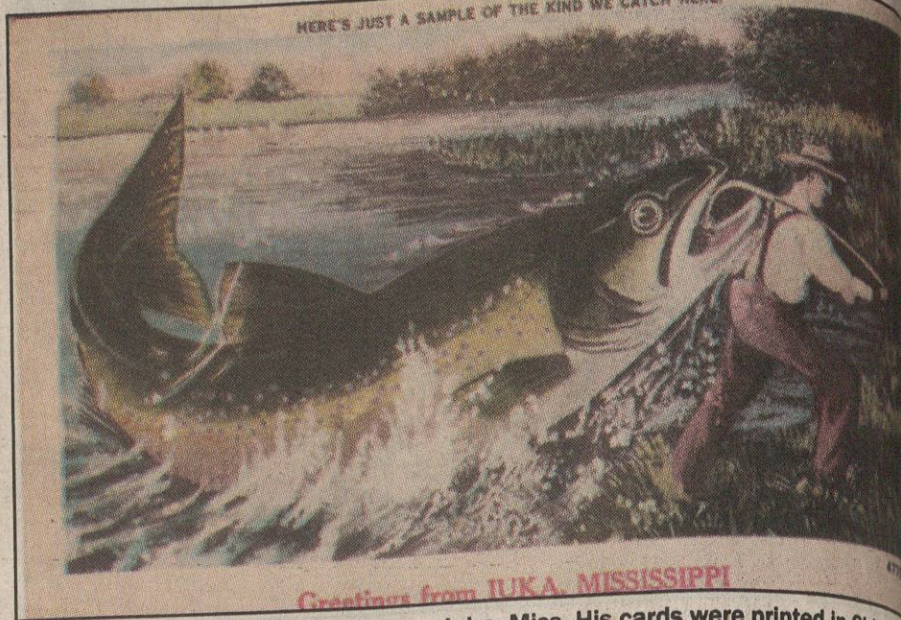

Kelly spends Thanksgiving Day with the 155th Armored Brigade Combat Team

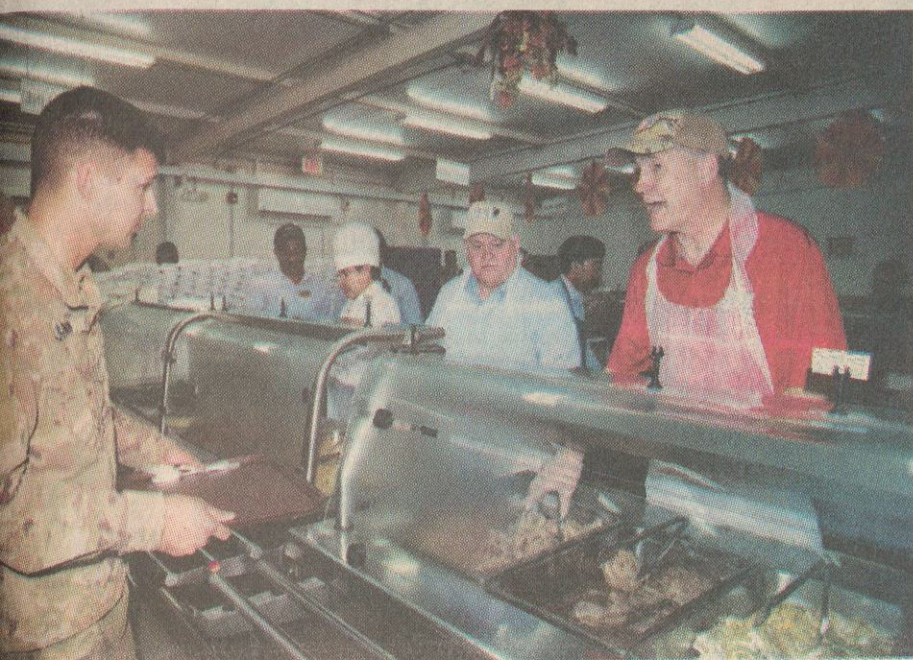

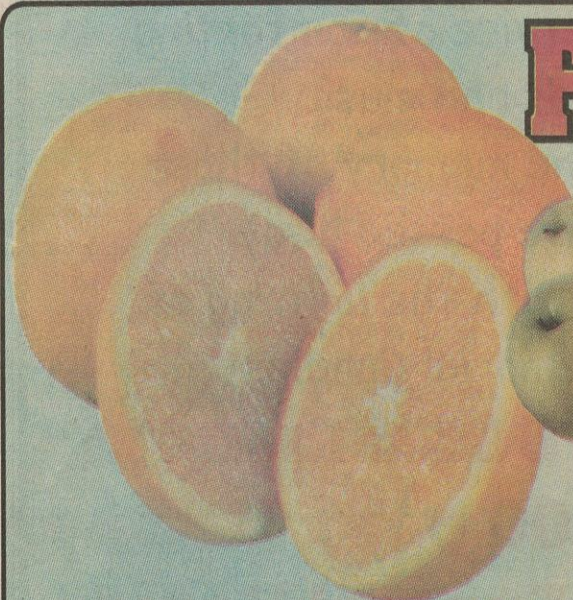
