

# Friends of Tishomingo State Park-Unfriended

This years "New Year's Day Hike in the Park" will be a sad one for Tishomingo State Park's Friends as their Park Manager, Terry Harp, has been transferred to another park. Park visitors believed that under his leadership the park was making a comeback from years of neglect by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks. Having "Parks" last in the agency's name tends to reflect the park's place in the hierarchy. That is until it comes to mismanagement from the headquarters in Jackson. For example, why did Jackson, after spending money building a new deck, close the swimming pool?

Citing a problem getting life guards, Jackson finally decided to let patrons staying in facilities swim on their own. An even greater failure to follow their mission statement to promote the Park was Jackson's closing of the Swinging Bridge, a major attraction. This was on Labor Day weekend because it had not been inspected. There were no noticeable problems with the 80 year old bridge which only allows foot traffic. Nothing wrong with conducting an inspection, but why close it when there were no issues and when the campground was full? Subsequent inspections showed everything was fine with the bridge.

In the past, the "New Year's Day Hike in the Park" allowed free admission to any state park in an attempt to get more people out to enjoy the park and in a state with the highest obesity rate encourage exercise. Well, this year Jackson decided to charge a \$4 dollars admission. For the holiday the gates may not be manned, so the \$4 dollars is on the honor system. It appears that Jackson is doing more harm than good in promoting state parks. It is time the Mississippi State Parks were moved to another department where they could get some respect.



# Scenes From The Last Chapter In The Bible (part XIII)


Revelation 22:17 says, "And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And Whosoever will, let him take of the water of life freely." Commentators have expressed different ideas as to when this call is extended. First, we may say that we know it is not extended after the events of Revelation, for the call is for all sinners who hear the message to come to Christ for salvation, even though some suppose that it is a cry of the church for Jesus' return to the earth. What is clear is what we will consider here. The Spirit of God joins hands with the church and with all who hear the message of salvation in extending a plea to the unsaved to come to Christ for salvation. Since we know that

salvation will not be offered to sinners when Jesus comes, either for the rapture of the church, or for the judgment of Armageddon, it seems the call is to go out in the present time. We know that no one can come to Jesus for salvation, unless the Spirit of God draws him, as is shown in John 6:44, so the Spirit of God has to issue a call to sinners, or else they cannot come to Christ, moreover they will see no need to come to Him. The bride is the church, as is shown in Ephesians chapter 5, so



the church is to be about the Father's business of calling sinners to come to Christ and receive the water of life freely. It might be good for all of us to consider that much of our job as believers, especially of the local churches, is to be witnessing to those who are yet unsaved. Now we see also that any who have heard the message of salvation through Christ and have received Him should be calling on other sinners to come to Christ for sal-

We also see that "thirsty people" should come to Jesus for salvation, for no one will ever receive Him, unless he is first thirsty for Him. I think we have a problem in some of the "quick fix witnessing" that pushes for a decision on the spot and maybe within a "ten minute conversation and sales pitch". I am not belittling soul winning; I am only saying that some people, judging by the "spiritual complexion of many churches" may have been brought to a profession before they were actually thirsty for it! Yes, it is certainly possible that one can be won to Christ in one witnessing encounter, for we have many examples of that in the Bible, but all of these had to be thirsty, or to become thirsty during the witnessing session. False professions are not hard to find, for all the seed that falls on good ground brings forth some amount of fruit (see Jesus' parable in Matthew 13:18-23). These verses show that only those on the good ground "understand and bring forth fruit". Matthew 13:15 shows that understanding is necessary for conversion, so the seed on the first three kinds of ground represent those who are not really saved, even though those on stony ground may appear to be saved because of an outward show of life with no root to anchor their profession in Christ. We also seen in Revelation 22:17 that "Whosoever will" may take the water of life freely. So, there has to be an act of the will for one to receive Christ, not just a moving of the emotions. Here we could get into a great controversy, but I will not seek to do that. I do want to say that the will of man will never be moved to receive the Sav. ior without a moving of the Spirit of God in conviction, but even then it seems clear that men may make a decision to accept or reject the work of the Spirit of God. In John 5:40, Jesus said to some unbelieving Jews: "And ye will not come to Me, that ye might have life." So the will of man is exercised in rejecting Christ, even though Christ desires that none perish (John 3:16. 18: II Peter 3:9). 

# The homeless: hard to track and aid

Problems such as tobacco use linger without cessation, education

Tobacco use is an alarming problem among the homeless. According to the Public Health Law Center, estimates of the homeless in the U.S. range from approximately 2.3 to 2.5 million people in any given year. At least 70 percent of homeless individuals smoke, which is four times that of the general population.

The disadvantages faced by this group of people are hard to diagnose and remedy due to many obstacles: not having an address or phone number, lack of transportation, and the list goes on. For these reasons, many of them go without healthcare, support and treatment.

"It's so hard to reach this group and give them the cessation service and education that they need because they are so hard to track and keep up with," said Dustin McCoy Director of the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Prentiss and Tishomingo. "In the meantime, they're going without proper care and are continuing to use tobacco at a disturbing rate."

The Public Health Law Center also reported that approximately 20 to 30 percent of homeless adults have a serious mental illness along with a 68 to 80 percent prevalence of cigarette smoking. Due to lack of resources, this highly populated group uses tobacco in unconventional ways that raise the likelihood of ingesting infectious agents and toxins. An example of this would be sniping. Sniping is when someone unravels several discarded cigarettes, removes the remaining tobacco and uses it to reroll a new, fuller cigarette.

"Such habits put them at a higher risk of getting gum disease, such as gingivitis and periodontitis," said Amy Winter, Director of the Office of Tobacco Control at the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH). "If these conditions go untreated, it can lead to pain, tooth loss and other health problems. Over age 65, only 20 percent of nonsmokers are toothless, but more than 41 percent of daily smokers are toothless. Tooth loss is a serious condition that can increase the risk of heart disease and other detrimental health issues."

Try to get sunlight when possible, whether that's from sitting near a window or taking a walk during a lunch break. Some people even use special light bulbs or lamps for what is known as light therapy, exposing themselves to the same frequency of light as the sun's natural warmth.

Perhaps most importantly, remember to be realistic. The holidays may not be perfect or just like they were last year, but that's ok. Most people are happy with the time they spend and memories they make with each other. Technology has even made it easy to connect with one another through phones, the internet, and video calling, which are always options to consider for friends and family who can't be together during the holidays.



Memories of Christmas holidays growing up during the Great Depression days flood my memoy box to overflowing and just have to share. This is my ninety-fourth Christmas to get to celebrate the reason for the season, the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

The changes over the years are unbelievable. From the horse and buggy days, mules and ironwheeled-wagons, an occasional Model T or Model A, and they were scarce, walking to school and church were the means of travel. I remember two cars and they sat in the car-shed most of the time. No money. No gas.

My mail carrier made his route from Iuka, rain or shine, most of the time on horseback. I remember he was a very saucy man, the aristocratic type. Some times in the summer he made the 10+ mile south of Iuka in his Model T on Model A.

I remember Mom always had Jewel or me to

watch for the mailman. When we saw him, we'd run to the box which was across a field from our house. He'd scold me and say "close your mouth and breathe through your nose! Don't you know you'll get sick?" Such was routine, but he really was a good man. Mom's family lived in the Harmony Community north of Iuka. We had no phone or radio, but we got the Vidette each week and several community writers kept us informed.

I remember Mr. Robert Carter and his lovely wife and Mr. Mac Smith and several members of his family. We made the trip about twice a year in the wagon. If it was cold, Dad put big rocks in the fireplace the night before we were to go. These he put in metal buckets in the wagon bed and with quilts we stayed warm.

We never went on holidays. Back during the Depression there were no gatherings for food and fellowship except during the summer on the Sunday of the Old Harp Sing-

ing. This was a big gathering at the local churches. There were families who followed the singers to the different churches just to get a good dinner. Some were too poor to bring food and some were too lazy to cook and share. Each community had

On Saturday morning before the Christmas holiday Dad went to town at Tishomingo and bought fruit and gifts for Santa Claus. During the Depression Santa also needed help. Apples, oranges, peppermint or lemon sticks, fire crackers and if it had been a good-cropyear we might also get a Roman candle and cheese. Our special gifts were all homemade: dolls, with a complete wardrobe of clothes; whistles made from hickory as well as a bat and string balls. Sometimes a new tablet, a coloring book and a "coat of many" colors were treats from Santa.

My Dad worked the year around. We farmed and raised potatoes (both

kinds), peas, peanuts, canned meat and vegetables, collards, turnip greens, and occasionally a wash-pot full of hominy was made and shared. Some children were more fortunate than others. Dad logged for the Dawson's steam saw-mill and for twenty-eight years he walked to Iuka and weighed and tied out bales of cotton at the Pruitt's

My Mom could tat, crocket, and make all our dresses and underwear. I was a freshman before I ever had a ready-made dress. It was so pretty. I was getting an award at graduation and they wanted me to feel special and I did. It was a Carol King

I have digressed but I must tell you that along with all the special talents of my Mom she could wield a peach-tree-limb better than any mom in the community. She practiced. She never said, "I'm going to tell your daddy when he gets home." She took care of the situations. I went to

school with stripes on my legs many times. wore dresses.






# Good Citizen Awards Presented by DAR


